# Wyoming Growing and Declining Industries Report, 2024Q2

In second quarter 2024 (2024Q2), Wyoming had six growing industries and eight declining industries. It is worth noting that this marked the first time that Wyoming had more declining industries than growing since 2021Q1 during the most recent economic downturn.

A growing or declining industry is defined as an industry's employment level increasing or decreasing for two consecutive quarters by 5% or more compared to the prior the year. For example, all industries that grew or declined in employment by at least 5% from 2023Q1 to 2024Q1 and subsequently from 2023Q2 to 2024Q2 were included in the respective tables in this report.

Industries are defined by the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS). For this research, growing and declining industries were determined at the three-digit subsector level. For more information on NAICS, please see https:// www.census.gov/naics/.

The database used to generate this information was the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW) file, which has roughly a half-year time lag from the distribution of this report. Growing and declining industry information is updated every quarter when new QCEW data become available. Only subsectors with employment sizes of 100 or more are included in these lists. Consequently, while employment in other industries may meet the growth criteria, that growth is taking place in industries with employment of less than 100.

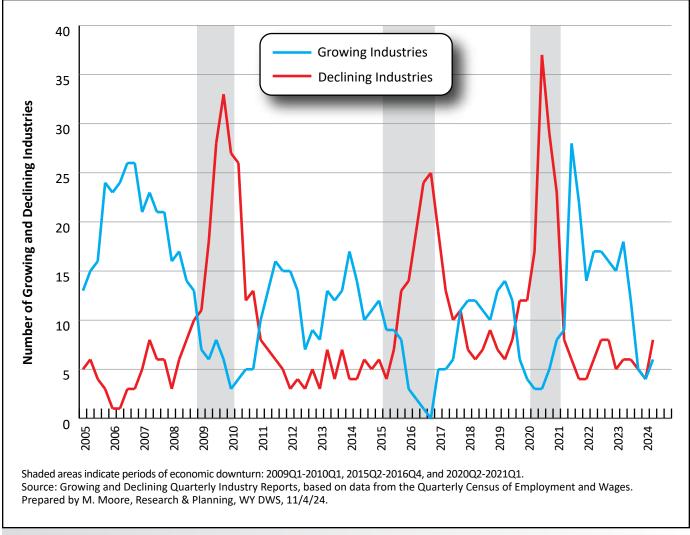


Figure 1: Number of Growing and Declining Industries in Wyoming by Year and Quarter, 2005Q1-2024Q2

2024Q2, up from four growing industries last quarter (see Figure 1, page 4). Heavy & civil engineering construction grew the most, adding 832 jobs (a 15.1% increase) over the year in 2024Q2 and 823 jobs (19.5%) in 2024Q1 (see Table 1, page 5). On average, this industry subsector added 828 jobs, an increase of 17.3%. The other growing industries were construction of buildings (an average increase of 317 jobs, or 6.5%); amusements, gambling, & recreation (289, or 10.1%); administration of economic programs (188, or 6.3%); electrical equipment & appliance manufacturing (103, or 24.0%); and computer & electronic product manufacturing (25, or 7.3%).

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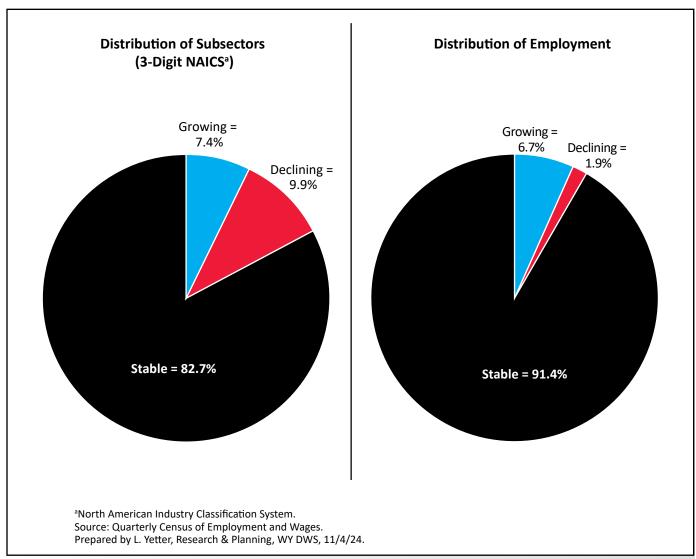
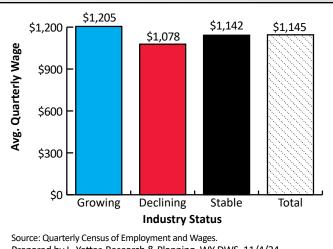


Figure 2: Distribution of Growing and Declining Industries (NAICS 3-Digit Subsector) in Wyoming, 2024Q2

Wyoming's six growing industries in 2024Q2 accounted for 7.4% of all industries and 6.7% of the state's total employment (see Table 3 and Figure 2, page 7).

The declining industries table (see Table 2, page 6) reads the same way, except with negative changes, and therefore, declining industries. There were eight declining industries in 2024Q2, compared to four last quarter. The greatest decline was seen in support activities for transportation, with an average loss of 239 jobs, or 11.9%. Other declining industries included furniture, home furnishings, electronics, &

appliance retailers (-78, or -5.9%); plastics & rubber products manufacturing (-62, or -14.1%); performing arts & spectator sports (-51 jobs, or -10.1%); and publishing industries (-45, or -6.3%).

Declining industries made up 9.9% of all industries and 1.9% of total employment.

The average weekly wage is calculated by dividing total wages for a particular subsector by the total number of jobs and the number of weeks in the observed quarter. In 2024Q2, the average weekly wage was \$1,205 for growing industries and \$1,078 for declining industries (see Table 3 and Figure 3, page 7). Overall, the state's average weekly wage for 2024Q1 was \$1,145.

During periods of economic expansion, the number of growing industries is much greater than the number of declining industries (see Figure 1). For example, the number of growing industries in Wyoming peaked at 26 in 2006Q3 and 2006Q4, compared to three and five declining industries, respectively.

But during economic downturns, there

are far more declining industries than growing industries. R&P has defined an *economic downturn* as a period of at least two consecutive quarters of overthe-year decrease in average monthly employment and total wages based on data from the QCEW. Over the last 20 years, Wyoming has experienced three periods of economic downturn: 2009Q1-2010Q1, 2015Q2-2016Q4, and 2020Q2-2021Q1. During the most recent economic downturn, which was driven by the COVID-19 pandemic and declining energy prices, Wyoming had 37 declining industries in 2020Q3 compared to just three growing industries.
