

Initial, Continued Claims Increase as Summer Ends

Initial Unemployment Insurance (UI) claims (see Definitions, page 9) increased from August to September, while continued claims decreased. Both initial and continued claims increased over the year.

Initial Claims




Figure 1: Total Number of Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims for Wyoming by Year and Month, January 2014 to September 2024

There were 1,021 initial claims in September 2024, up from 899 in August (122, or 13.6%). It is normal for initial claims to increase in September as some employers lay off summer staff (see Figure 1). The greatest over-the-month increase was in leisure & hospitality (87, or 75.7%).

The industries with the largest numbers of initial claims included

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


Figure 3: Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by Major Industry in Wyoming, September 2023 and September 2024

construction (202); leisure & hospitality (202); trade, transportation, & utilities (167); and professional & business services (110; see Table 1, page 5, and Figure 3, page 6).

Over the year, initial claims increased by 74, or 7.8%. Leisure & hospitality increased the most with 44 more claims (27.8%) over the year. This was followed by manufacturing (32, or 110.3%) and trade, transportation, & utilities (31, or 22.8%).




Figure 4: Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence, September 2023 and September 2024

Laramie County had the greatest number of initial claims with 166, followed by Natrona (148), Campbell (76), and Sweetwater (71; see Figure 4, page 6, and Table 3, page 9). In addition, there were 180 out-of-state claimants.

Continued Claims

The total number of continued weeks claimed followed their normal seasonal pattern and decreased over the month by 563, or 8.7% (see Figure 2).


The total number of continued weeks claimed increased from 5,481 in September 2023 to 5,922 in September 2024 (441, or 8.0%; see Table 2, page 7). The total number of unique claimants increased from 1,957 to 2,080 (123, or 6.3%) over the year, and decreased by

8.7% over the month.

The industries with the most continued weeks claimed included trade, transportation, & utilities (1,123); construction (1,026); leisure & hospitality (670); and education & health services (668).




Figure 5: Continued Unemployment Insurance Claims by Major Industry in Wyoming, September 2023 and September 2024

Most industries showed over-the-year increases in continued weeks claimed, led by leisure & hospitality (184, or 37.9%) and natural resources & mining (136, or 42.5%; see Figure 5, page 8).




Figure 6: Continued Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence in Wyoming, September 2023 and September 2024

Laramie County had the largest number of continued claims with 995, followed by Natrona (963), Sweetwater (500), and Campbell (447) counties (see Figure 6, page 8, and Table 4, page 9). There were 874 out-of-state continued claims as well.

Box: Definitions

Initial Claim: An initial claim is filed by an unemployed individual after a separation from an employer. The claim requests a determination of basic eligibility for the Unemployment Insurance benefits.

Continued Weeks Claimed: The number of weeks of UI benefits claimed during the reference period. An unemployed individual who has already filed an initial claim and who has experienced a week of unemployment and then filed a continued claim to claim benefits for that week of unemployment.
