

Bicillin[®] L-A Quick Tips for the treatment of syphilis in adults

The standard first-line agent for treatment of syphilis is <u>long-acting penicillin G benzathine</u> 2.4 million units IM (**Bicillin**[®] L-A). Penicillin G sodium and other short-acting or controlled-release penicillins are NOT adequate to treat syphilis when given as injection.

Bicillin[®] L-A comes in pre-filled syringes

Reconstitution is NOT required

Each pre-filled syringe of **Bicillin[®] L-A** contains 1.2 million units of medication



A complete dose of 2.4 million units requires TWO syringes

Administer Bicillin[®] L-A as a divided dose of 1.2 million units IM bilaterally to the left and right **VENTROGLUTEAL** (preferred) or **DORSOGLUTEAL** muscle only. Do **NOT** administer to the deltoid or quadriceps muscles.
