

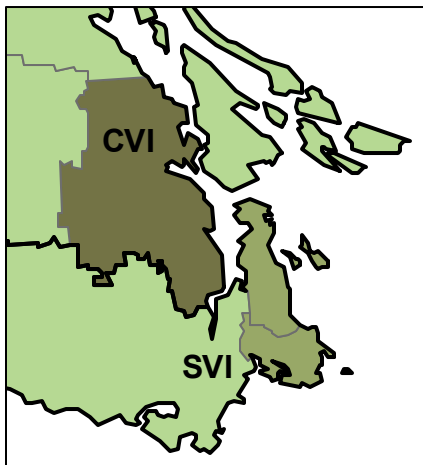
Opioid Agonist Therapy Prescriber Rates in British Columbia by Local Health Area 2024 (June)

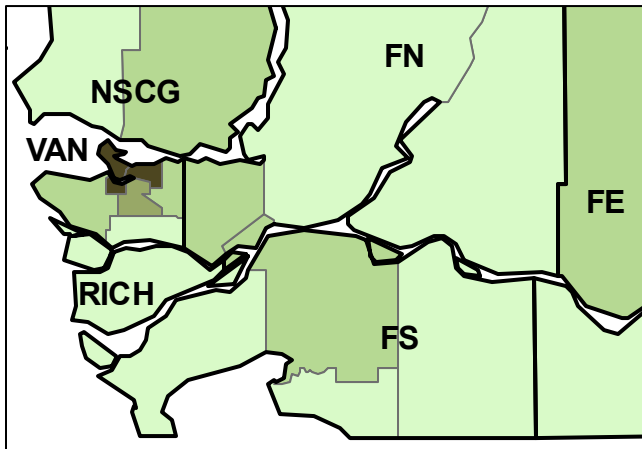
Inclusion criteria:

- OAT prescribers are clinicians with at least one dispensation from a prescription they have written for a given OAT drug in a given month.
 - Even though pharmacists cannot initiate an opioid prescription, they can renew a prescription or dispense opioids as emergency supply and are therefore included in prescriber counts.
 - Colour indicates prescriber density rates; deeper shade = higher density.
