DUI program...." This information was written by the intake coordinator that did the initial assessment with resident #1. In the same intake document, resident #1 answered the following question: "Do you want to do this program or are you being made to do this program by someone else? Please explain." Resident #1 wrote, "I am finishing this program to take care of some court issues so I can get my drivers license back...."

During an interview with staff #2, staff #2 acknowledged writing a document regarding resident #1 when resident #1 was being transferred from the Newport Beach Narconon facility to the Warner Springs Narconon facility. This document stated that resident #1 had a "legal issue" and [he was] "To Complete (DUI)."

"While documentation suggests that resident #1 was informed by the San Diego County Court arsonnel that he was required to attend a "certified outpatient...Multiple Offender Program...", it does not alleviate the program's responsibility to determine if they are in a position to assist a resident in providing documents needed to obtain a driver's license, when this is a known goal of the resident. The program could have requested a copy of resident #1's court order or contacted the court to see if the program would be able to assist the resident with this order. Ultimately, program staff discovered that they did not have the proper state-issued license that allows them to issue a form entitled, "DL101."

While resident #1 successfully completed an intensive four-month residential alcohol and drug treatment program, it did not satisfy the requirement of form "DL101." The program should have found out whether or not they had the appropriate license that could assist resident #1 in obtaining his DMV license before admitting him into the program—not after resident #1 completed four months of treatment.

I am writing concerning the situation involving your son, certain what it is that you want this organization to do, as current problem appears to be with the Department of Motor Vehicles and we do not deliver programs for that agency. I am, similarly, not certain what type of counseling you are asking us to certify to that agency.

It is my understanding that you were told, at the time that you decided to send to our program, that we would intervene on his behalf to handle existing legal situations related to his drug abuse and addiction. We do this type of thing on a regular basis. It is, further, my understanding that we did, in fact, intervene on his behalf, and did so successfully. We did not ever claim that we could or offer to handle any situations involving driver's license. It is true that we are not recognized by the DMV as a counseling service and we make no claims that we are so recognized.

While I believe I understand your upset I cannot agree that Narconon failed, in any way, to deliver the service that was promised. He completed our program successfully and we are certainly willing to attest to that fact

While I normally stand ready to talk to any student or family member, in light of the nature of your correspondence I must require that all communication between us be restricted to written form. This understood, I look forward to hearing from you.

As I reviewed the paperwork I was given upon his admission, there is nothing in writing about assisting us legally in any manner, but verbally we were told over and over again promised legal assistance. If DMV isn't a legal matter I'll eat my hat. Why if nothing is in writing did they assist in one thing but not in another?

One of the counselors, named George Villacaqus (spelling), even drove to court one day. I was also present that day. Narconon has been caught and now, as you said they would do, they are claiming they never said they would help legally. This current problem is the same problem had when he was admitted, it is not a new current one. Legal is legal in my mind. M D Kobrin doesn't even have a clue what form is needed according to the first paragraph. (DL 101)

On the last paragraph he doesn't want to talk to me and that is o k too cause I don't want to talk to them either but when you show up Monday I'd love to be a little mouse to see their reaction. All I ask from this point on after our conversation and your sommendation is Narconon must notify unsuspecting people who are stressed out the way be told right up front in their written material they are not licensed to teach DUI and Motor Vehicle work. This should be a law for any counseling group.

as you can see from Anderson & Associates Counseling Services, Inc. is already enrolled and that paper has been filed in the Superior Court in Vista. He was given a 30 day leave of absence to get it changed from 18 months to 3 and we took that paper back to Anderson's and first class is next Tuesday at 12:00 noon.
