As the Bureau is aware, on May 30 and 31, 1965, a proposed conference to form coalition of militant Nagro radicals was held in Washington, L. C. At that time the National Black Coordinating Committee (MBCC) was organized and it was stated that the purpose of the organization would be to assist member organizations to help plan and participate in their activities. At that time W. S. McINTOSH, from Dayton, Ohio, indicated he planned to stage a sit-in at the City Hall of Dayton, Ohio, on July 4, 1965. The NBCC indicated it would assist him in the endeavor and that McINTOSH's proposed of Dayton, would host the new organization on that date.

He has been publicly identified as a member of the Communist Party (CP) at Dayton from 1947 to 1949. There has never been any evidence that McINTOSH was active in the CP. He appears to be a "con" man who has no visible means of support. He has been a constant thorn in the side of the Dayton Police Department and a source of embarrassment to legitimate Regro organizations and leaders in Dayton, Ohio.

Some years ago he had an organization named the West Side Citizens Council in Dayton. Later he obtained a charter for a chapter of CORE. Over a year ago CORE revoked the charter and kicked McINTOSH out, at which time he formed the NVDAC. The Police Department has received several rumbles over the years that McINTOSH obtained money for his organizatio and/or his own use by going to businessmen on the West Side of Dayton and threatening to picket them if they did not contribut There have been one or two occasions when a complaint was almost filed against McINTOSH. He constantly complains about the Police Department to the city fathers, sometimes several times a week.

As an example of the type of action in which MeINTOSH engages, a couple of years ago he began picketing the Rike-Kumler Department Store in Dayton, alleging discrimination in hiring. Eventually he had a sittle and was arrested.

The Advancement of Colored People in Dayton, advised that of all business firms in Dayton, the Rike-Kumler Company was the least discriminatory in hiring practices. She said that they would hire all the qualified people NAACP could obtain for them and that McINTOSH knew this.

It would appear that McTMTOSM's main objective is to obtain publicity and be looked upon as a leader of the West. Side people. This he has failed to do.

After the May 30-31 meeting in Washington, the following events have taken place in Dayton:

On June 7, 1965, McINTOSH was ousted as Director of the NVDAC for spending \$200.00 on telephone calls the previous month, cashing a check which bounced and caused embarrassment to NVDAC, failing to investigate complaints presented to NVDAC, and threatening to picket business presented to NVDAC, and threatening to picket business presents if they did not contribute to his cause. The establishments if they did not contribute to his cause. The fact he was custed received considerable newspaper publicity; fact he was custed received considerable newspaper publicity; however, the reasons for the ouster were not publicized.

On the night of June 11, 1965, Patrolman J. W. MORGAN, Dayton Police Department, was attacked by a Negro, TOY GREEN, JR., who apparently knocked MORGAN to the ground and then came at him with a broken whiskey bottle while he was down. Patrolman draw his weapon and killed GREEN before GREEN could stab him with the bottle. McINTOSH immediately called a mass meeting of about fifty to one hundred people in a West Side church on the night of June 16, 1965, at which time he and JESSE GRAY called for mass action and unity within the Negro community to protest the killing of a West Side man by a white McINTOSH predicted some kind of demonstrations within the next two or three weeks. He said, "People are going to be coming here from all parts of the United States. of us will probably go to jail." A photograph of McINTOSH and GRAY appeared in the "Dayton Journal Herald" in connection with this meeting and his statements.

The Cincinnati Division feels that at this point McINTOSH and GRAY had every intention of creating a major disturbance over the July 4 week end in connection with their meeting. However, a barrage of letters to the Editor from many citizens, including a substantial number of Negroes, many citizens, including a substantial number of Negroes, condemning McINTOSH's action and upholding the police officer condemning McINTOSH's action and upholding the police officer went a long way toward discrediting McINTOSH and GRAY. The Went a long way toward discrediting McINTOSH and GRAY. The "Dayton Daily News" on 6/18/65 carried a lengthy article reflecting an interview with Municipal Court Judge ARTHUR OF TISHER, a Negro, in which he denounced a proposed demonstration and strongly defended the police officer.

The "Dayton Daily News" of June 19, 1965, carried an interview with TOY GREEN, SR., the shooting victim's father, who said he has "no hard or ill Feelings" toward Patrolman

MORGAN, who fatally shot his son. He said he told McINTOSH to drop plans for protest rallies or demonstrations as "I don't want my son's death to be misused or the GREEN family's name to be used for other purposes. His daughter, Mrs. WANDA CRAY, said, "We don't want him (McINTOSH) using our family name for whatever reason he might be using it."

The June 18, 1965, issue of the "Dayton Journal Herald" carried an article reporting the awarding of damages of \$5,000.00 to a Middletown policeman who had been libeled by the "New Ohio Eagle," a newspaper which was organized in July, 1964, for circulation primarily among Negroes. It was edited by McINTOSH. In one of the very first issues of the newspaper it carried a story which said a Middletown, Ohio, woman had been beaten by policemen who arrested her without The story also said the woman had filed a suit against the officers. Court records showed no such suit was ever filed by the woman. The Middletown Police Officers sued. The newspaper had to go into bankruptcy. In awarding the damages Judge CECIL EDWARDS, Montgomery County Common Piecs Judge, said "This type of publicity makes the business of enforcing the law more difficult. The fact that the testimony was unrefuted indicates that none of the statements made by the paper were true."

On June 23, 1965, the "Dayton Daily News" reported that WILLIAM T. INGRAM, Montgomery County Chairman, National States Rights Party, had asked the City Commissioners for a full scale Justice Department investigation of McINTOSH because of alleged testimony concerning McINTOSH given at a hearing conducted by the Ohio Un-American Activities Committee in the early 1950's. INGRAM said that JOHN C. MITCHELL, an ex-member of the CP, testified under oath that McINTOSH and his wife had been members of the City Club of the Communist Party. INGRAM also referred to the fact that JESSE GRAY was recently brought to town by McINTOSH and cited quite a bit of public source information concerning GRAY's past activities.

On June 24, 1965, the "Dayton Daily News" interviewed JOHN C. MITCHELL, who stated that McINTOSH joined the CP in 1947 and was still on the membership rolls in 1949 when he, MITCHELL, quit the Party.

On June 24, 1965, the "Dayton Journal Herald" carried a story in which City Manager HERBERT STARICK said that the Justice Department would be asked to comment on statements made against McINTOSH.

The following week Baltimore, Chicago, and New York informants began to report that the organized meeting of the NBCC previously proposed for Dayton was being changed to Chicago. At a proposed rally of West Side citizens on the night

It is believed by Cincinnati that trouble in Dayton on the week end of July 4 was averaged as a direct result of the vast adverse publicity received by MaINTOSM. It is believed at this time that he is completely through in any capacity as a racial leader in Dayton, Ohio, as evidenced by the meager showing at his rally on the night of July 1. Responsible Negro leaders in Dayton are embarrassed and ashamed of McINTOSM and his actions and have been struggling for years to discredit him. It appears this has now been accomplished.

The "Journal Horald" and the "Dayton Daily News." morning and afternoon newspapers, respectively, of general circulation in the Dayton, Ohio, area, carried articles in their 1/21/65, issues regarding a cancellation of a scheduled program featuring a Ku Klax Klau (KKK) speaker on 1/20/66, at a meeting or the Political Science Club of the Fairment West High School, Kettering, Ohio. meeting was to be held at the school, at the request of the faculty advisor of the club. He advised the newspapers that the students were interested in listening to speakers of varying viewpoints. The meeting was cancelled at the last moment by the high school principal due to the publicity and protests the school had received.

The articles revealed that about one hundred students arrived for the 7:30 p.m. program, and milled around in disappointment when told it would not be held. Also, three persons representing the KKK appeared, and left when informed. the meeting had been cancelled. The photograph of one of these individuals, who called himself "Tr. The Cincinnati Office has advised that on January 20, 1966, a representative of the Ku Klux Klan was scheduled to speak at a meeting of the Political Science Club of the Fairmont West High School, Kettering, Ohio. This unusual engagement was arranged at the request of the faculty advisor to the Political Science Club at Fairmont West High School.

Pressure brought to bear by the "Journal Herald" and the "Dayton Daily News," morning and afternoon newspapers, respectively, of general circulation in the Dayton, Onio, area caused the appearance of the Ku Klux Klan speaker at Fairmont West High School to be cancelled.

Although the engagement was cancelled, approximately one hundred students arrived at 7:30 p.m., January 20, 1966, at the Fairmont West High School, and expressed disappointment when it was revealed that the Klan speaker had been cancelled. Three individuals representing the Ku Klux Klan appeared at the appointed time and place and also departed when informed that the meeting had been cancelled.

One of the Klan representatives mentioned above identified himself as "Mr. X." A photograph of this individual was taken by the news media covering REC- 19 157-9-10-8 this incident.

'You Are Known Member Of Klan,' Ohio Cards Say

Ohlo Ku Klux Klan members have been stunned in the past few days by a small pink postcard they have received in the mail, a Klan leader reported Monday.

received in the mail, a Klan leader reported Monday.

The postcard has a caricature of a FIRIK member in his hood and robe and reads: "KLANSMAN: Trying to hide your identity behind your sheet? You received this—someone KNOWS who you cards were in a mailbox

are!"

The Klan leader, who asked not to be identified, said the card is going to many dues-paying members and "is very embarrassing to them. Many are prominent businessmen and public officials who are secret

sympathizers."

He reasoned, "Someone has apparently gotten hold of our membership rolls. I suspect it is an inside job since there has been some dissention in the ranks since the recent hearings in Wash-terien."

"IF THEY SEND cards to all members, several thousand persons will be involved." he said, "but so for they have just gone to local leaders and prominent businessmen."

Since it is a postcard, the Klan Leader said, "some postal employees and neighbors of these people are getting some juley items for gossip."

The postmark on most of the cards is New Concord (Muskingum County), Ohio.

William C. Duff, posumaster in New Concord, asknowledged "first seeing a half dozen or so of the cards last Friday." He said the

cards were in a mailbox along US 40 and "we think someone passing through town dropped them off."

THE ENQUIRER has one of the cards postmarked May 13—also mailed from New Concord.

A spokesman for the Cincinnati cities of the Federal Bureau of Investigation acknowledged hearing about the cards.

"We don't know who's behind it, but we have received complaints from people receiving them," he said. "Our information shows some of these people are allogethy Klansman,"

The Bureau has established a fictitious National Committee for Domestic Tranquility (NCDT) as a counterintelligence vehicle for attacking the Ku Klux Klan from a low-key, commonsense and patriotic position.

The NCDT has issued two newsletters attacking certain Klan leaders and urging Klansmen to "Quit the Klan and back our boys in Victnam."

The Executive Director of this organization has been identified only as Harmon Blannerhasset, a fictitious person bearing a name which appeared in early American history.

Blannerhasset issues the newsletters over his signature and the only return address utilized to date is "dateline Dayton."

We presently have 19 offices involved in mailings of the NCDT newsletter and are endeavoring to give the impression that a chapter exists in each of the states where Klan activity is concentrated.

We have studied the Klan reaction to the newsletter through informant coverage and now believe that the NCDT must have a post effice box for its National Office so that we may receive correspondence from Klan members who may desire to express their reaction to the newsletter, REC-21 157-9-10-11

(UKA), are making strong efforts to organize in the State of Ohio, the Cincinnati Office is requested to submit imaginative and aggressive counterintelligence proposals which will disrupt the growth of those organizations in Ohio.

Clairtel 7/11/66 reveals that Robert Shelton, Imperial Wizard, UKA, has issued an official charter to the UKA unit being organized in the Cincinnati, Chie, area.

This is to inform you that the Bureau is most interested in causing the revocation of the national MCA charter on file in the State of Georgia, and various local UKA charters which may be issued by Shelton.

The UMA purports to be a corporation and to legally conduct business in various states. It appears that corporations must have a charter filed with appropriated state authorities, and/or a state certificate to do business.

You should determine if the State of Ohio requires all corporations to register with the Secretary of State, and if such corporations must furnish revenue reports to the state and local revenue authorities. Also determine if the State of Ohio would allow a publicly identified vehicle of violence to become a legitimate corporation within the State of Ohio. REC- 43

Insure that your inquiries made in this matter are handled through reliable established sources only.

In the event your determination indicates that the UKA must register with the Secretary of State, file revenue reports, or meet other requirements, then you should submit counterintelligence proposals which will bring to the attention of the Ohio Public and their representatives the fact that the UKA is not operating in conformity with Ohio laws, and that the State of Chio should not give legal image to the UKA.

Also advise the Bureau if you have a substantial source in the newspaper, television, and radio media, influential enough to cause the Ohio State Assembly to pass a resolution condemning Klan activities in Ohio and in a position to afford state or national publicity regarding such a resolution.

Understand that no counterintelligence activities can be placed into effect without prior Europa authority.

NOTE:

Klan growth has been evidenced in southern district of Ohio. Counterintelligence activities are necessary to reduce the growth of Klan organizations in Ohio.







The Cincinnati Office has pointed out that this information has not been corroborated; however, the Eureau believes that Cincinnati's alerthess to this matter opens an interesting area for counterintelligence activity.

Since Klan activities have involved burnings, beatings, the use of explosives and other risk type of activities, it is most probable that reliable insurance companies would be delighted to cancel the life insurance, motor vehicle insurance, or fire insurance coverage of Klan leaders. The revocation of an individual's personal insurance program is a substantial pressure which might well cause others to leave the Klan in order that they might preserve their personal insurance programs.

Recipient offices, encluding New Haven and Cincinnati, advise the Dereau of any information indicating the identity of the insurance companies who have underwritten the personal insurance programs of the United Klans of America, Inc., Grand Dragons in your states.

New Haven, since Hartford, Connecticut, is the recognized insurance capital of the world, advise the Bureau if you have a substantial and thoroughly reliable source in the insurance business who is in a position to know if Klan membership would be sufficient reason to revoke a Klan leader's or member's personal insurance program. This source should also have the capacity to project the idea that Klan membership rates a "poor risk" insurance rating throughout the insurance capital so that same may be picked up by news media and amplified throughout the country.

New Haven give close consideration to this proposal; and, if you have such a source, advise the Eureau of his identity, reliability, and willingness to protect the FBI interest in this matter. Your advice should be accompanied by a specific request to contact the source for the purposes discussed in this communication. Your assistance in this matter might well curtail Klan activities and potential violence. Take no additional action, other than that specifically requested by the Eureau, without prior Eureau authority.

ReClairtel states that the United Klans of America, Inc., (UKA) was scheduled to hold a meeting on December 3, 1966, in Cincinnati, Ohio. The meeting hall was arranged for with a great deal of Klan security.

Reairtel also indicates that the UKA Imperial Wizard was in Cincinnati on December 2 and 3, 1966, and might appear on television during his stay.

The Cincinnati Coffice should be more alert to counterintelligence possibilities offered in Klan investigations. The December 3, 1965, UKA meeting might well have been disrupted if the fact were made known publicly that the meeting was a UKA gathering and not just another private meeting. Cincinnati should also be in a position to discredit the UKA Imperial Vizard whenever he appears on television.

In the future when such possibilities are presented, immediately submit your counterintelligence proposals to the Bureau for consideration. Understand that counterintelligence activity cannot be undertaken without prior Eureau authorization.

To date, SHELTON is unaware of the outcome of trial and no positive decision has been made concerning his suspension.

Birmingham is suggesting, if the Bureau approves and the Cincinnati and Cleveland Divisions believe it feasible, the following steps to discredit the BOBERT M. SHELTON:

- (1) Discreet contact with reliable news media at Toledo, Ohio, to give maximum publicity to trial, especially emphasizing the Klan involvement.
- (2) The possibility of having informants of the Cincinnati and Cleveland Divisions sound out the UKA membership feeling against possibly causing the membership to make known to BHKLTON any adverse feeling at Ohio. This alternative is feasible only if it is determined the membership feeling in Ohio is anti-Ballard in nature.

Birmingham is suggesting the above as a possible means to discredit since SHELTON has indicated that he is disturbed and disgruhtled as to behavior and at this time has made no decision as to future with the WKA in Ohio. The feasibility of implementation by the Cincinnati and Cleveland Divisions will of course depend on local conditions in their respective divisions.
