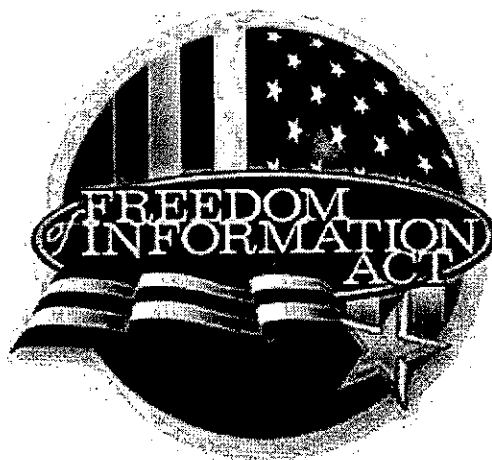

For information of offices having received no prior information concerning the matter set forth below, ROBERT M. SHELTON, Imperial Wizard, United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (UKA), utilizes a Wide Area Telephone Service (WATS), to contact Klan subordinates, etc., throughout the United States. Information was also received which indicated SHELTON had conspired to defraud the telephone company, by utilizing his WATS line in a manner to keep Klan expenses down. There was a question as to whether SHELTON's use of WATS line was in violation of Title 18, Section 1343, United States Code (ITSP - FRAUD BY WIRE).

Miami presented the above mentioned facts to United States Attorney, Miami, who advised such was not a violation of the above section. Miami, with Bureau authority, confidentially furnished the Southern Bell Telephone and Telegraph Company information indicating SHELTON was defrauding that company, by the misuse of his WATS line.

By airtel dated 11/7/66, Miami advised that the phase of the investigation in Alabama concerning SHELTON's WATS telephone and his use thereof, was being conducted by telephone [redacted] Birmingham. Miami also advised that there was being conducted a survey of SHELTON's WATS service, in order to determine if SHELTON was abusing this service.

On January 16, 1967, [redacted] advised SA(A) [redacted] Birmingham, that he had just completed a survey of all calls made on SHELTON's WATS telephone line, number 073-4848, for the period December 3, 1966, through December 31, 1966. [redacted] SAC Contact of the Birmingham Office. [redacted] made available data concerning the dates of calls, telephone numbers called, and cities to which calls were placed, on a confidential basis. *(u)*

Referenced Bureau airtel authorized Birmingham to submit data relating to the above mentioned telephone calls made by SHELTON during December, 1966, to interested offices. Birmingham is herewith enclosing for the Bureau and each designated office one Xerox copy of the list of calls obtained from [redacted]

As directed by the Bureau, the recipient offices are instructed to identify telephone subscribers residing within their territories, through indices and established sources only. All offices are to insure that no action is taken which might jeopardize our pending counterintelligence activities against SHELTON's Wide Area Telephone Service. The Bureau also directs that no action should be taken in regard to this information, other than as specifically requested.

Referenced Bureau letter pointed out that [redacted] was the newly elected [redacted] United Klans of America, Inc., (UKA), State of Alabama, and the [redacted] Greenbriar, Alabama. This letter requested Birmingham give consideration to counterintelligence activity concerning [redacted] in an effort to enhance the possibility of developing [redacted] as a confidential informant.

b7c Referenced Birmingham letter pointed out that contacts with [redacted] were then continuing in an effort to develop him as a confidential racial informant and that should such efforts prove unsuccessful, recommendations would later be made in regard to counterintelligence activity in this regard.

In view of the above, Birmingham sets forth the following information:

Some Birmingham racial informants have on various occasions made mention of the fact that Alabama [redacted] when he addressed Klan groups, "preached" to them. These informants made known that they would rather take part in some types of Klan activity than have [redacted] or any other person tell them how law-abiding they should be.

"Birmingham, Alabama

"Something has been bothering me for several months. It just isn't right and I think you should know about it. I have wanted to talk with you about it but don't feel real safe in doing that. Every time I see you, there are others close around and I don't want to take a chance.

"On at least eight different occasions, since you were [REDACTED] and after you had made a talk at some Klan activity I have heard some of your so-called friends and brothers make slurring remarks about the way you had talked and how you had acted. I know that some of these even profess to be your friends and yet they talk about you always preaching and not even doing a good job of that according to them. Some of them even say that the only reason you are doing what you are doing is because you like the publicity and as some of them say it is an easy way for you to make "some quick bucks." I think you are doing a good job and ought to have the backing of all of us but I just want you to know that there are a lot of members that would do anything to hurt you or to make you a real goat if it would serve their purpose or gain them anything.

"You may know who some of the ones talking against you are but I just will mention that some of them are in our Birmingham Klavern. Hope this will mean something to you and will help you.

As mentioned in reairtel, the Bureau has a continuing program directed against the American Nazi Party (ANP) and the various Klan organizations throughout the United States. It was also pointed out in reairtel that the general public did not distinguish one Klan group from another and normally attributed white supremacist activity to the Klan as represented by ROBERT SPELTON, Imperial Wizard, United Klans of America, Inc. (UKA).

On one or more occasions during the past few months, news articles have appeared in some daily newspapers concerning the propriety of Klansmen serving on juries. It was stated in one article that one judge, when questioning potential jurors concerning their availability and whether qualified, remarked that although Klan membership would not automatically disqualify an individual, he would dismiss every person who admitted Klan membership.

In line with the above train of thought and reasoning, Birmingham requests the Bureau to take one of the following courses of action in regard to this situation:

1. To present this factual situation to the interested offices for suggestions as to the best means of exploiting such a judicial approach to Klan membership.
2. To give consideration to contacting trusted members of Congress on a strictly confidential basis to see if legislation might be submitted by them disqualifying Klansmen from jury duty. It is believed that some offices would probably have such trusted friends of the Bureau who would be willing to take such action.
3. To check Bureau files for such news articles as above mentioned and furnish suitable data to selected offices either for anonymous mailing or to be made available to selected and trusted newspaper, radio or TV officials for possible use in preparing editorials, or suitable news items.
4. To request offices participating in captioned program to submit news articles published in their territory concerning jury duty status of Klansmen and/or whether a judge has expressed an opinion from the bench as to such a situation.

1. On a highly confidential basis, contact selected officials of leading newspapers in the Birmingham Division and furnish them a copy of the enclosed article. It is to be noted that many such newspaper officials in the Birmingham Division are either SAC Contacts or established sources.

...than a week ago, one of the Ku Klux Klan groups held a rally at Vero Beach, at which Shelton, imperial wizard for his encounters with national subcommittee chairman his sub-street organization speaker.

...the platform with Shelton, a leader in Klan activities, was Leon Blanton, who could not have been at Democratic politics has fared poorly in his 1964 Democratic nomination to the Senate.

The word is that Mr. Blanton has other plans for a political career. He'd say he's burning up Florida, with any through such an organization as the Klan.

Total theme of the rally at Vero Beach, Jan. 20 was pure hate — for Jews, Catholics, Negroes, Communists and anyone who has interfered on the Klan's purpose. In some ways sounds like the Klan (and some other splinter groups) find Communism everywhere that their acceptance is less than wholehearted.

Oh, yes, reportedly Shelton

has a formula for detecting Federal Bureau of Investigation agents, and his description of it drew laughs but apparently was not suitable for publication in a family newspaper.

He could be assumed to dislike FBI agents because that agency watches Klan activities just as it does any trend that may threaten the security of this nation.

The Klan is an organization that seems to want to run the country according to the rights of its personnel, with little or no regard for the law of the land that the FBI is dedicated to protect. This is the way to rule by emotion and ignorance.

It is not the American way — Caucasian, Negro, Jewish, Catholic or Protestant — and we believe most thinking people would agree.

We don't really need this Klansman's way of life.

We don't really need the Ku Klux Klan or its avowed precedents anywhere in our neighborhood.

And fortunately, where there seems little evidence the movement is really catching on.

For information of all offices, Charlotte in referenced airtel dated 2/17/67, advised that Inspector JOSEPH A. SULLIVAN at Meridian, Mississippi, telephonically advised the Charlotte office that the Department of Justice desired all data concerning interstate communications relative to Klan business. Charlotte stated that Inspector SULLIVAN was apprised of the fact that SHELTON has a WATS line and had made numerous telephone calls to various Klan officials in North Carolina. Referenced Charlotte airtel called attention to referenced Birmingham airtel and requested the Bureau, in accordance with instructions of Inspector SULLIVAN, to authorize Birmingham to contact the telephone company for the purpose of obtaining information concerning calls placed by SHELTON to North Carolina during the period from November 25, 1965 up to the present time or for whatever period records were available during this period.

For information of all offices, the Bureau in referenced Bureau airtel advised that the matter of authorizing Birmingham to make further contact with the telephone company for the purpose of obtaining information relative to calls placed by SHELTON, is now under consideration at the Bureau. The Bureau also instructed Birmingham to furnish the information presently in Birmingham's possession to the Bureau by letterhead memorandum immediately in a form suitable for dissemination.

In accordance with the above, Birmingham is herewith submitting the enclosed letterhead memorandum. Birmingham is preparing sufficient copies of the letterhead memorandum for local dissemination to Military Intelligence Agencies and the U. S. Secret Service, Birmingham; however, such dissemination is being withheld until Bureau approval of the letterhead memorandum and such dissemination is received.

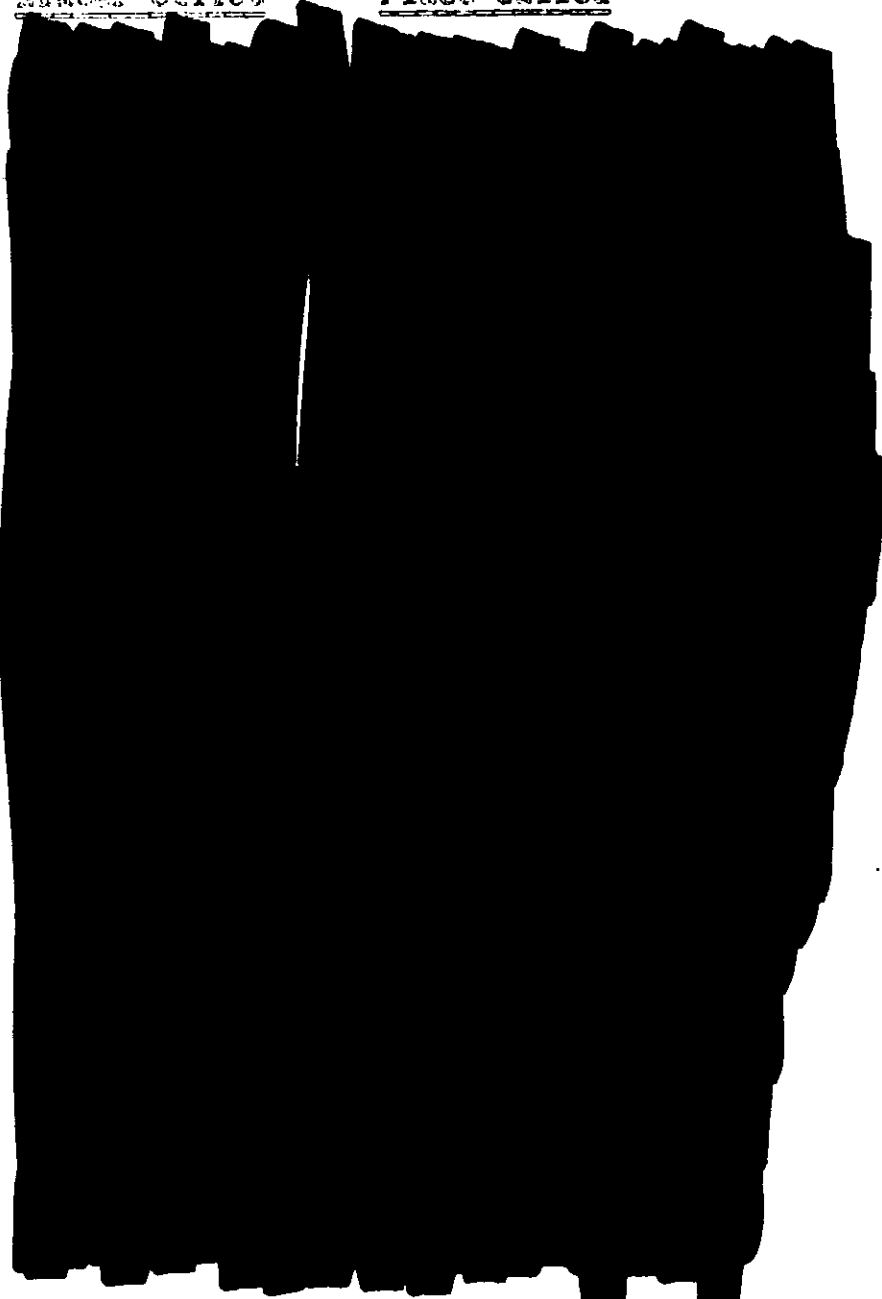

APPENDIX

UNITED KLANS OF AMERICA, INC.,
KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN (UKA)

Records of Superior Court of Fulton County, Georgia, reflect that this Klan organization was granted a corporate charter on February 21, 1961, at Atlanta, Georgia, under the name United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc.

A source advised on February 27, 1961, that United Klans was formed as a result of a split in U. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Inc. According to the source, the split resulted from a leadership dispute and United Klans has the same aims and objectives as the parent group. These are the promotion of Americanism, white supremacy, and segregation of the races.

The first source and a second source advised in July, 1961, that United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc., merged with Alabama Knights, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan. The merged organization established headquarters in Suite 401, Alston Building, Tuscaloosa, Alabama. (The organization is directed by ROBERT SHELTON, Imperial Wizard, and is the dominant Klan group in the South, with units in several southern states.)

Second source advised that at a meeting in Prattville, Alabama, on October 22, 1961, the U. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, merged with the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan.

Third source advised on May 25, 1966, that the UKA is currently an active organization, with Klaverns in several states. This source said that ROBERT M. SHELTON is the Imperial Wizard of this organization and was elected to this position on September 5, 1964, at a National Klonvocation in Birmingham, Alabama. Source stated that during April, 1966, the national office was moved from Suite 401, Alston Building, Tuscaloosa, Alabama, to the carport of SHELTON's residence, #18 Lake Sherwood, Star Route, Northport, Alabama, which space he had converted into a room.

We Don't Need Them

Less than a week ago, one of the Ku Klux Klan groups held a rally near Vero Beach at which Robert Shelton, imperial wizard and noted for his encounters with a congressional subcommittee investigating his sub-strata organization, was a speaker.

On the platform with Shelton, and openly a leader in Klan activities hereabouts, was Leon Blanton, the Vero Beach cobbler who tried his hand at Democratic politics last May and fared poorly in his bid for Democratic nomination to the Legislature.

The word is that Mr. Blanton has further plans for a political career. We'd say he's barking up the wrong flaming cross, with any approach through such an organization as the Klan.

Total theme of the rally near Vero Beach, Jan. 20 was pure hate — for Jews, Catholics, Negroes, Communists and anybody who has frowned on the Klan's purposes. It sometimes sounds like the Klan (and some other splinter groups) find Communism everywhere that their acceptance is less than wholehearted.

Oh, yes, reportedly Shelton

has a formula for detecting Federal Bureau of Investigation agents, and his description of it drew laughs but apparently was not suitable for publication in a family newspaper.

He could be assumed to dislike FBI agents because that agency watches Klan activities just as it does any trend that may threaten the security of this nation.

The Klan is an organization that seems to want to run the country according to the lights of its personnel, with little or no regard for the law of the land that the FBI is dedicated to protect. This is the way to rule by emotion and ignorance.

It is not the American way — Caucasian, Negro, Jewish, Catholic or Protestant — and we believe most thinking people would agree.

We don't really need this Klannish way of life.

We don't really need the Ku Klux Klan or its avowed precincts anywhere in our neighborhood.

And fortunately, we are told, there seems little evidence that the movement is really catching on.

A fellow up in Alabama named Robert Shelton, who carries the uncontested title of being the top coward in the Ku Klux Klan, made a speech the other day in which he blamed "Communist agents" for all the trouble.

It is a bit difficult to follow Shelton's logic. Apparently he is saying that before Communist agents infiltrated this idyllic land of ours, the Negro was content with his lot.

Then, says the top Kluxer, some party Commies gave Christians "a sense of guilt." That started the reworks, such as the Watts riots, millions against segregation in homes, schools, restaurants, buses, trains and airplanes. This "guilt" prompted Congress to pass civil rights laws, and the courts to uphold them.

But at this point we become even more confused. What Christians, whites or colored, felt a sense of guilt?

We don't think communism deserves this credit. In truth, communism embraces all the injustices, discriminations and deprivations which this country is now trying to diminish and ultimately to eliminate. Perhaps Mr. Shelton is trying to hide his own sense of guilt.

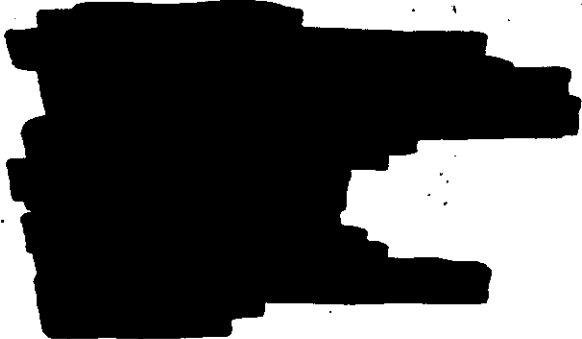

Birmingham requested authorization to prepare and mail an anonymous letter to [redacted], the newly elected [redacted] of the United Klans of America, Inc., for the State of Alabama. We do not desire to "flood the market" at the present time as regards sending anonymous letters to Klan leaders. It is noted that several of these letters have recently been approved for various divisions in the field. We are encouraging counterintelligence activities which will cause disruption on a broader basis.

The following is a status letter covering the previous three-month period:

(1) Potential Counterintelligence Action:

Birmingham continues to devote considerable time to the gathering of information concerning the residences and possibly other real estate holdings of ROBERT M. SHELTON, Imperial Wizard, and [redacted], both of United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (USA). As the Bureau is aware, should information be developed indicating that SHELTON [redacted] have real estate holdings other than an interest in their residences, such information will be passed on to the Internal Revenue Service of the U. S., which is conducting a "Sensitive Investigation" concerning the possible use of KKK funds by SHELTON [redacted] for their personal use. Of course, Bureau approval will have to be obtained prior to the furnishing of any such information to Internal Revenue Service or any other agency.

Birmingham continues to feel that the mailing of cartoons, anonymous untraceable cards, leaflets, and similar type literature to known Klansmen can serve as a very important disruptive action in the Counterintelligence Program. The Birmingham Office is also definitely of the opinion that the

proper use of anonymous telephone calls on a selective basis to certain UKA leaders and for active members can be, and in the past has been, used successfully by the Birmingham Office. At the appropriate time or times in the future, Birmingham plans further use of such calls in appropriate situations with Bureau approval and the Bureau will be contacted concerning same in all such cases.

(2) Pending Counterintelligence Action:

By letter dated 1/16/67, the Bureau made known that it was in receipt of information indicating SHELTON utilized an electronic recording device in connection with the telephone service installed at his residence. The Bureau offered for consideration a message which was set forth in Bulet of 1/16/67, and this letter and message concerned counterintelligence action directed toward [REDACTED] of the UKA. Subsequent to receipt of Bulet of 1/16/67, Birmingham received information further substantiating the information concerning SHELTON possessing such a recording device on his telephone, and thereafter Birmingham requested authority of the Bureau to send such a message as above-mentioned to SHELTON's telephone, using the recording device only, and no message is to be left if the recording device is not in operation at the time of the call. This request is presently under consideration at the Bureau.

In January, 1967, with Bureau approval, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] Birmingham, Alabama, was contacted and made available a survey of all calls made on SHELTON's Wats telephone line for the month of December, 1966. The information obtained from [REDACTED] was, with Bureau authority, made available to the various FBI field offices involved by SHELTON having placed calls to telephone numbers in their respective territories. Information received from investigation conducted by the various field offices, as instructed by the Bureau, is still being obtained and in certain instances utilized. Birmingham, with Bureau approval, is continuing contacts with [REDACTED] above-mentioned, in an effort to obtain additional information of value to the Bureau in regard to captioned program and other Bureau cases.

As the Bureau is aware, Southern Bell Telephone and Telegraph Company is aware of a possibility that SHELTON may now or in the past may have been misusing his Wats telephone service. At present, Birmingham does not have any information to the effect that the Southern Bell Telephone and Telegraph Company is planning any move against SHELTON in the form of a civil suit; however, Birmingham feels that it is in a position to be apprised of any such contemplated or specific action taken by the Telephone Company due to the fact that [redacted] above-described, is an SAC Contact of the Birmingham Office, [redacted] and can be trusted to protect the FBI's interest in any matter and in any case.

In February, 1967, the Miami Office enclosed for the Bureau and Birmingham copies of a newspaper editorial critical of the Klan. This article appeared in "The News Tribune," Ft. Pierce, Florida, on 1/29/67. On 2/14/67, Birmingham requested Bureau authority to contact certain selected officials of leading newspapers in the Birmingham Division concerning this situation and this counterintelligence endeavor is currently in the process of being carried out.

In February, 1967, Birmingham also suggested to the Bureau that consideration should possibly be given to the Bureau requesting various offices to submit news articles which have appeared in some daily newspapers concerning the propriety of Klansmen serving on juries. In the letter suggesting such action, it was pointed out that in one article a Judge, when questioning potential jurors concerning their availability and whether qualified, remarked that although Klan membership would not automatically disqualify an individual, he (the Judge) would dismiss every person who admitted Klan membership.

In March, 1967, Birmingham recommended to the Bureau that Birmingham be authorized to submit an anonymous letter to [redacted] of the UKA. This letter was prepared as though being sent by a fellow Klansman to the Alabama Grand Dragon and as though the sender was friendly with [redacted] and just wanted [redacted] to know that some of the UKA members who attended meetings presided over by [redacted] had somewhat mocked or made fun of the manner in which he conducted the Klan meetings.

In February, 1967, the Birmingham Office also received Xerox copy of an article derogatory to the Klan from the Tampa FBI Office. This article appeared in the "Tampa Times" of Tampa, Florida, under date of 2/11/67. A Xerox copy of this article was furnished to the Bureau with the request that the Birmingham Office be allowed to contact certain trusted news media in order to get such sources to either publish the article or write similar articles concerning this derogatory article. This counter-intelligence recommendation is still pending.

On two different dates in March, 1967, Birmingham made specific request of the Bureau to furnish Birmingham with additional copies of certain specific cartoons, which the Bureau had previously furnished to the Birmingham Office. Birmingham is presently awaiting receipt of such additional cartoons, which Birmingham feels can be anonymously mailed to certain selected Klan members with the desired effect of further disrupting Klan activities in the Birmingham Division.

(3) TANGIBLE RESULTS

Birmingham continues to place great significance on the fact that there has been almost no trouble, violence, or disturbance on the part of the UKA or any other hate group in the Birmingham Division for many months. Birmingham continues to feel that such inactivity on the part of the various hate groups, including the UKA, can to a great extent be attributed to and considered tangible results of the counter-intelligence activity of the Bureau and various FBI Offices participating in captioned matter.

During the current reporting period, Birmingham has received information from one or more of its racial informants to the effect that ROBERT SHELTON, Imperial Wizard, is of the opinion and has so stated that the FBI has numerous Special Agents who somehow manage to know a great deal about his activity and activity of other UKA officials. SHELTON reportedly has made statements to the effect that regardless of where he may be traveling, when he stops to eat he quite often sees persons whom he believes to be Special Agents of the FBI also eating at the same restaurant. SHELTON and other UKA officials continue to openly express great concern

is to just how the FBI continues to know so much about the UKA's activities, their officers and members. It is believed by Birmingham that such concern on the part of SHELTON and other UKA officials has had a great deal to do with curtailing the activity and plans of the various UKA units throughout the Birmingham Division and throughout other UKA organizations or units, and this fear is believed to have resulted in great part from counterintelligence activity on the part of the FBI.

Birmingham also feels that quite a number of the UKA members throughout the Birmingham Division have either withdrawn from the UKA or ceased attending meetings and taking part in other UKA activities based upon the fact that they had in some manner by having received anonymous postcards or other communications showing that their Klan membership was known been kept from taking part in any UKA activity.

Birmingham is also of the opinion that the counter-intelligence activity of the Birmingham Office and other offices has raised doubt in the minds of numerous UKA officials and/or members concerning whether or not some of their acquaintances, associates, and friends might not be UKA members merely for the purpose of informing on them. One such instance is the case of [REDACTED] Alabama, who until recently was [REDACTED] Alabama, Klavern of UKA. [REDACTED] was expelled from the UKA for drinking, running around with UKA members' wives, and because of the fact he was suspected of being an informant as he was spending more money than the UKA members thought he could make from his employment. It is to be noted that [REDACTED] was not an informant or potential informant of the Birmingham Office of the FBI.

SHELTON, Imperial Wizard, [redacted] both of United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (UKA). As the Bureau is aware, should information be developed indicating that SHELTON [redacted] have real estate holdings other than an interest in their residences, such information will be passed on to the Internal Revenue Service of the U.S., which is conducting a "Sensitive Investigation" concerning the possible use of UKA funds by SHELTON [redacted] for their personal use. Of course, Bureau approval will have to be obtained prior to the furnishing of any such information to Internal Revenue Service or any other agency.

Birmingham continues to feel that the mailing of cartoons, anonymous untraceable cards, leaflets, and similar type literature to known Klansmen can serve as a very important disruptive action in the Counterintelligence Program. The Birmingham Office is also definitely of the opinion that the proper use of anonymous telephone calls on a selective basis to certain UKA leaders and for active members can be, and in the past has been, used successfully by the Birmingham Office. At the appropriate time or times in the future, Birmingham plans further use of such calls in appropriate situations with Bureau approval and the Bureau will be contacted concerning same in all such cases.

(2) Pending Counterintelligence Action:

During March, 1967, Birmingham made available to various FBI Field Offices having an interest in this matter information relative to telephone calls reportedly placed by ROBERT M. SHELTON, Imperial Wizard, UKA, Inc., KKKK, which telephone calls were reportedly placed during the period 12/3-31/66. During the current reporting period, various field offices have had this information available for use in regard to captioned matter and other cases pending and/or of interest to their particular offices. It is believed that some of the information made available in the LHM submitted by Birmingham to the Bureau and the interested field offices has been and probably is being used at the present time in regard to instant matter.

During April, 1967, with prior Bureau authority, Birmingham made available to certain selected news media sources of the Birmingham Office an editorial highly critical of the Klan. This editorial was captioned "We Don't Need Them" and was made available to the selected officials of leading newspapers in the Birmingham Office on a highly confidential basis.

During April, 1967, the Birmingham office also made available to certain selected officials of leading newspapers of the Birmingham Division area copies of another article highly critical of the Klan. Prior Bureau authority was also obtained in regard to this situation and as the Bureau is aware, the article involved was captioned "Kluxer's Logic Impossible". As the Bureau

is aware, the articles mentioned in this paragraph and the preceding paragraph were made available to the selected officials of the leading newspapers of the Birmingham area for such action, use and/or publication and distribution as they might think appropriate and suitable.

CHARBOM is the case involving the bombings of the homes of four Negro leaders in Charlotte, N. C., 11/22/65, together with 15 other incidents of racial violence. Department is currently determining what, if any, Federal action will be taken in this matter.

In February, 1967, John Doar requested toll and wats line information concerning calls made by Shelton to N. C. in an apparent effort to invoke the immunity provisions concerning interstate telephone calls. This would have enabled the Department to obtain testimony by giving immunity to certain Klansmen and force them to testify before a Federal Grand Jury which might be called to consider this case. This information has been obtained by Birmingham and Charlotte and furnished to the Department for the entire period covering the CHARBOM investigation. No information was obtained linking any of the calls with incidents investigated in connection with CHARBOM. It would not appear that any calls by Shelton subsequent to CHARBOM could be of assistance.

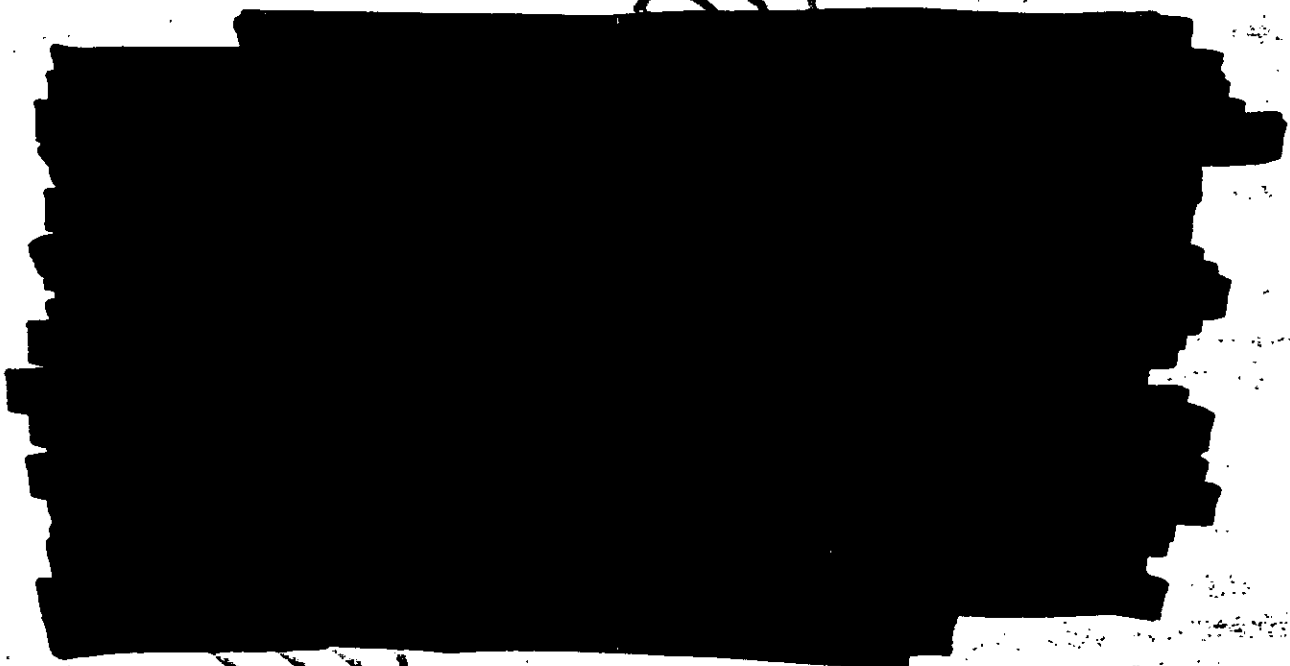

Birmingham presents the above-mentioned situation to the Bureau for consideration in regard to captioned matters with the thought in mind that such a drawing or program might be in violation of the interstate transportation of wagering paraphernalia (ITWP) or amount to the operation of a lottery.

This situation could become serious if Shelton persists in his plans and our whole Klan informant program could be jeopardized.

The Birmingham Office is requested to review this overall situation and forward to the Bureau some concrete proposal or proposals which would be aimed at deterring Shelton once and for all. In this connection, your office might be able to utilize a friendly newspaper source to contact Shelton regarding

This information has received publicity in the past; however, a direct interview by a newspaper reporter who could sound out Shelton on this subject and point out the dangers of utilizing sodium pentothal to utilize the drug. If the reporter would publish his plans on this with Shelton, we might have our informants follow up to see if they can point out that there has been entirely different results on this matter and that Shelton should be warned of the health hazard. The big thing to be emphasized, of course, is the health hazard.

If other offices receiving this airtel have any observations in this matter, these are solicited by the Bureau.

NOTE:

Robert Shelton, Grand Dragon of the UKA, has threatened on various occasions to use the truth drug, sodium pentothal, on Klansmen in an effort to ferret out Bureau informants. This could seriously affect our informant coverage. Effective counterintelligence measures are being sought in an effort to end this threat once and for all.

Birmingham feels that the time may be right for the various offices participating in captioned program to allow their informants to sow seeds of discontent within their local units or state units of the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, concerning the activities and finances of ROBERT M. SHELTON, Imperial Wizard, and several other Imperial Officers of the UKA.

As the Bureau is aware, Imperial Wizard ROBERT SHELTON drives a late model Chrysler Imperial automobile and resides in a private residence valued in the 20 to 30 thousand dollar bracket.

in the State of Alabama have been called upon to contribute to the purchase of a late model Buick automobile for [REDACTED], and he has been driving this automobile for several months.

Birmingham also feels that several other state units of the UKA have similar situations wherein the State Officials of the UKA might have placed themselves in a position to be criticized as taking advantage of their positions in the UKA for financial gain, such as owning expensive late model cars or expensive homes, and, therefore, might be vulnerable to the criticism of living "high on the hog."

Birmingham feels that, should the Bureau concur with the above-mentioned approach to this counterintelligence situation, the Bureau could authorize the various offices taking part in captioned program to request authority of the Bureau to proceed in a manner best suited to their local situations in regard to taking advantage of this matter. Birmingham also wishes to point out that, as Birmingham has made known to the Bureau and other offices concerned with UKA activities, the Imperial Office of the UKA has been devoting a great deal of time, money and energy to money-making propositions in regard to the printing of brochures, leaflets, bumper stickers, and decals, which are being prepared for the sale by various states, UKA Units, in regard to political campaigns in different sections of the United States. It is also felt by Birmingham that the Bureau might authorize the various FBI Field Offices taking part in this program to make subtle statements or hints insinuating that the present Imperial Officers of the UKA seem to have gone to making the UKA merely a means of providing themselves with jobs wherein they receive great financial gains, and have lost sight of the real goal or true aim for which the UKA was founded. It is felt that many informants would not have to make direct accusations in regard to any of the above-mentioned situations, but just ask if certain situations were not so, or why should the above-mentioned Imperial Officers of the UKA reap all of the benefits.

In the event that friendly press contacts are used to publicize SHELTON's intention to administer sodium pentothal to various Klansmen, it is felt that following this publicity discreet contacts could possibly be made with the state medical boards in the various areas involved to determine the possibility of the various state medical boards publicly taking the position that a physician administering sodium pentothal under the circumstances and for the purposes advocated by SHELTON would be guilty of an unethical practice of medicine. The possibility that the administering physician might also be subject to various state and local criminal action for the administering of this drug under these circumstances and for the purposes desired by SHELTON could also be publicized by the state medical boards.

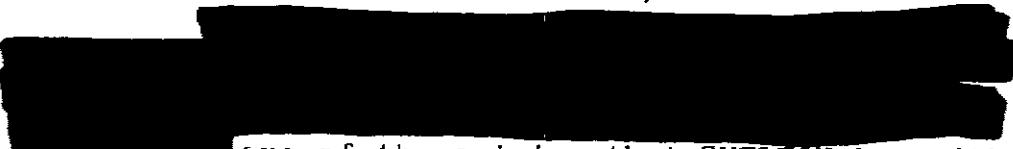

One of the above informants advised that the Louisiana doctor whom SHELTON had planned to use to administer the truth serum, namely on [REDACTED] Louisiana, reportedly continues ill and not in a position to do anything in regard to this project.

Both above mentioned informants have also expressed themselves as being of the opinion that any current contacts with SHELTON, by anyone, concerning plans for the use of the truth serum by the UKA would only awaken a "sleeping dog", and would be unwise in their opinion.

Should the Bureau desire to take affirmative action at this time to resolve the truth serum situation, Birmingham submits the following proposals in the order of Birmingham's preference concerning these proposals. Birmingham feels that many Bureau informants will learn of this as proposed hereinafter, and be in a position to express their opinion concerning the effect of publicity concerning the truth serum situation on the good of the Klan.

PLAN ONE

Prepare and send a letter to all Imperial Officers of the UKA, all Grand Dragons of the UKA, and such other UKA State Officials as various FBI Field Offices may recommend. The letter to be prepared on paper and sent in envelopes which cannot be traced to the FBI. The letter to be sent either anonymously or mailed from Atlanta, Georgia, as though sent out by JAMES VENABLE, Imperial Wizard of the National Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, who is known to be greatly interested in getting all UKA Klaverns, members, and State UKA organizations to switch over to the NKKKK.

Do you want to belong to the UKA or any Klan group that would risk your life or health just because they do not trust you? Is it worth it?

Information has been received that Imperial Wizard ROBERT SHELTON in late 1967 announced that Imperial Officers, State Officers, and some Exalted Cyclops of klaverns in the UKA, would be given a sodium pentothal drug to test them. This sodium pentothal is known as a truth serum and SHELTON threatens its use on any and all persons associated with the UKA.

It is entirely possible that persons being subjected to injections of sodium pentothal could suffer serious effects or die as a result of taking the drug.

A prominent medical authority has furnished the following concerning the drug, sodium pentothal:

Sodium pentothal is a drug used as an anesthetic and usually requires the services of several people to administer. It cannot be used with any degree of safety outside the facilities of a medical establishment. It is possible for one person to administer such a drug, but in so doing, he may place the patient's life in jeopardy. This drug is a depressant and consequently any stimulant would in some way counteract or change the effect of the drug. The excessive use of any stimulant by a patient may in some way jeopardize his life, since a doctor administering sodium pentothal might not realize the extent of stimulants, other drugs, or other substances taken by the patient, and consequently the doctor could give a lethal dose of sodium

pentothal to such a patient in an effort to obtain a desired response. The drug has been used in a great many instances as an anesthetic, however, it is never given to a patient who has a history of either rectal bleeding, nose bleeding, or is suffering from any other type of ulcerated condition. It was further stated that sodium pentothal is a dangerous drug to administer to any ulcer history patient since it could likewise jeopardize the patient's life. It was also stated that the drug could be effective, however, it is usually a hit or miss proposition when used in regard to its effect as a truth serum.

What kind of a Klan is the UKA if its leaders have to or are willing to, risk the lives of its leaders and members just because of the whim or fear or distrust of its leader?

Birmingham suggests that Imperial Wizard ROBERT SHELTON of the UKA might be impressed more forcibly by a contact concerning the possible use of the truth serum from some syndicated columnist rather than from a friendly Birmingham newspaper source.

Should the Bureau know of a cooperative and trustworthy syndicated columnist, Birmingham suggests that information from the proposed letter set out under Plan One above, be furnished him with appropriate instructions and any other pertinent data available to the Bureau.

PLAN THREE

Bureau authority is requested for Birmingham to utilize a friendly newspaper source to contact SHELTON regarding his possible use of sodium pentothal. If directed to do so, Birmingham will contact a reliable newspaper source and request his cooperation in this matter along the lines set forth in referenced Bureau communication. If authorized by the Bureau, Birmingham would also furnish this newspaper source with information from the proposed letter set out under Plan One above with the request that this source attempt to stress the health hazard involved in this matter to Imperial Wizard SHELTON.

Birmingham suggests that the Bureau make available to some syndicated columnist a copy of the proposed article as prepared by Birmingham and set out below. Birmingham feels that the publication of such an article would probably have great disruptive effect in several states upon the success of the UKA to operate under the secrecy of the "Action-By-Citizens" Committee as detailed in the proposed letter which is set out as follows:

UKA HIDES BEHIND SHEETS

The United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan ~~UKA~~ hides behind its sheets in an attempt to avoid it becoming known that the UKA is backing the "Action-By-Citizens" (ABC) Committee.

In the State of Virginia the UKA is very active in behalf of the political candidacy of former Alabama Governor who is running for President of the United States. The ABC Committee was formed by the UKA to assist Wallace in his campaign. However, do not forget that this is really a "money-making endeavor".

Since the ABC Committee is attempting to become active in many states, including Virginia, numerous "unsuspecting non-UKA members" may sign petitions, buy equipment or give contributions to the ABC Committee and by so doing, will be helping the UKA.

Birmingham has at various times received information indicating increased activity on the part of some members of the UKA, Inc., with special reference to ROBERT SHELTON, Imperial Wizard of the UKA, who is one of the leaders of the organization. Birmingham has previously reported that at present, at the National Headquarters of the UKA, the families are living off of or being financially supported from the Imperial Office of the USA.

The operation of the National Office of the UKA amounts to the operation of a gold mine for the families working in this office in Northport, Alabama, and in other areas North Carolina and several other states, and large sums of money to the UKA National Headquarters. It is also known that JAMES VENABLE, Imperial Wizard of the National Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, of which the Atlanta Office is active in Georgia, would like to alienate as many UKA members and UKA leaders as possible and have them join the NKKK.

JO [unclear] [unclear] of the Ku Klux Klan

In view of the above, Birmingham suggests the Bureau authorize the preparation and mailing of a letter which might read as set out below. The letter should be prepared on paper that could not be traced to the Bureau. It is also suggested that the mailing should be made in Atlanta, Georgia, since the National Office of the UKA is in that area. Should the Bureau approve the sending of this letter, Birmingham suggests the Bureau request Atlanta Office assistance in having such a letter sent to and received by the prospective recipients. This data can be secured from Birmingham, Atlanta, or Atlanta, as the Bureau desires. Birmingham suggests the preparation and handling of this project.

The proposed letter should read as follows:

Did you know that there are four families living off of funds sent in by you and other UKA members to the Imperial Office? How many times have you heard that funds at the National Office are depleted and contributions are needed from all units? What else would you expect?

Robert Shelton, your Imperial Wizard, lives with his wife and children in a house valued at over \$20,000. He drives a late-model Chrysler Imperial. He and his wife are full-time, paid employees of the Imperial Office.

At this time, there are two other full-time, paid employees of the National Office in Northport, Alabama. The Imperial Officers have their own private airplane which Shelton and [redacted] use to travel about the United States. It is interesting to note that this airplane manages to wind up in Florida several times each winter. It should interest you to know that a short time ago the Realm of Alabama was called upon to purchase a late-model Buick for [redacted].

Did you know that the UKA Klavern at Tuscaloosa, Alabama, where Shelton and [redacted] sometimes attend meetings is almost inactive and yet is very near National Headquarters? Did you know that many of the klaverns in Alabama have folded up and are inactive?

Did you know that even though the Realm of North Carolina sends in the most money of any state, Shelton, [redacted] and the airplane never seem to spend time in North Carolina but are usually to be found along the beaches of Florida, sometimes with their families? Does any of this suggest anything to you? Isn't it about time to sit down and think of what is going on? The klan under Shelton and his gang has withered and is about to die. Many of its most valuable leaders have quit in disgust. They have gone elsewhere to seek their place in the history books. Look

around you. There are others who have joined in our struggle for a free America. The UKA is doomed. Look around.

"The Pure Klan"

Charlotte, Jackson, Miami, and Richmond should furnish the Bureau, Atlanta, and Birmingham with a list of approximately ten names and addresses of pertinent klan members to whom this communication should be mailed. Birmingham should furnish the Bureau and Atlanta with a list of those persons residing within the Birmingham Division to whom this communication will be mailed. In furnishing the names, consider klan leaders, persons who have shown dissatisfaction with the UKA in the past, those who can be expected to furnish this information to Shelton, and those who are in a low-income bracket.

Atlanta should prepare the communication. A manual typewriter and commercially-purchased paper should be utilized. The communication should be mailed by Atlanta, within the City of Atlanta, and not from Tucker, Georgia, which is the home of James Venable. Atlanta should additionally furnish the Bureau and Birmingham with approximately ten names of persons as described above.

All offices receiving this communication should insure that Bureau interests are protected and strict security is maintained. Advise the Bureau and Birmingham of positive results achieved. If a positive response is noted, Birmingham and other offices should request additional dissemination of this material either within the field divisions or in offices not included in the initial mailing.

NOTE:

Birmingham has suggested an anonymous mailing of a letter to various klansmen pointing out the affluence of klan leaders. They wished to attribute this to James Venable, the leader of a rival group called the National Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, who is attempting continually to recruit

UKA members. We are authorizing the proposal but do not feel that Venable should be specifically mentioned as the source at this time. Birmingham has stated that full security can be maintained. The following is a status letter covering the previous three-months period:

(1) Potential Counterintelligence Action

Birmingham continues to feel that the mailing of cartoons, anonymous untraceable cards, leaflets and similar type literature to known Klansmen can serve as a very important disruptive action in the Counterintelligence Program. The Birmingham Office is also definitely of the opinion that the proper use of anonymous telephone calls on a selective basis to certain UKA leaders and for active members can be, and in the past has been, used successfully by the Birmingham Office. At the appropriate time or times in the future, Birmingham plans further use of such calls in appropriate situations with Bureau approval and the Bureau will be contacted concerning same in all such cases.

By airtel dated 3/11/68, Birmingham furnished the Bureau a copy of a proposed letter with the suggestion that such a letter be prepared and mailed anonymously to quite a number of officers and/or members of the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (UKA), throughout the various states in which the UKA presently has State Units. This letter dealt with facts indicating that the operation of the

National Office of the UKA in Northport, Alabama, amounted to the operation of a gold mine for the families of the Imperial Officers living in Northport, Alabama, and working in the Imperial Office in that area. This anonymous letter was prepared in a manner to indicate that the letter probably had been prepared by JAMES VENABLE, Imperial Wizard of the National Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, with the thought in mind that greater animosity might be aroused between these two Klan organizations in addition to the discontent aroused among the various leaders and members of the UKA.

By letter dated 3/12/68, Birmingham suggested that the time might be right for various offices participating in the counterintelligence program to allow their informants to sow seeds of discontent within their local units or State Units of the UKA concerning the activities and finances of Imperial Wizard ROBERT M. SHELTON of the UKA and several of the Imperial Officers of the UKA. In this letter, Birmingham furnished considerable details and specific information in regard to the somewhat expensive homes, automobiles, UKA plane, etc., of the Imperial Officers of the UKA residing in the Northport, Alabama area and operating the Imperial Office of the UKA as full-time paid employees of the UKA.

By airtel dated 3/13/68, Birmingham furnished the Bureau with three plans which might possibly be used by the Bureau to deter Imperial Wizard ROBERT M. SHELTON, UKA, from further consideration on his part of the use of sodium pentothal (truth serum) on Imperial Officers and/or UKA members at any time or in any situation in regard to Shelton's effort to uncover the identity of any individual furnishing information to the FBI in regard to the UKA.)

By letter dated 3/27/68, Birmingham furnished the Bureau a proposed article captioned, "UKA Hides

"Behind Sheets", with the suggestion that this article might be made available to some syndicated columnists for publication in various newspapers through the country. It was felt by Birmingham that the publication of such an article would probably have great disruptive effect on several states upon the success of the UKA to operate under the secrecy of the "Action-By-Citizens" Committee.

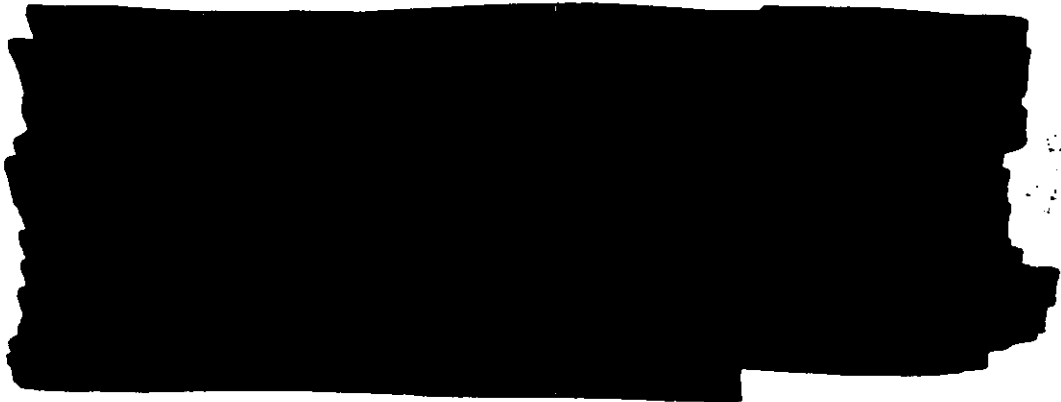
(2) Pending Counterintelligence Action

During the current reporting period, Birmingham, with prior Bureau authority, mailed cartoons to selected UKA members. The mailing of these cartoons has been carried out over a period of time, and as previously pointed out to the Bureau, only a very small number of the cartoons have been mailed from any one mailing station, and only a few cartoons have been mailed on the same date.

At the present time, Birmingham is awaiting the possible use by [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] "The Birmingham News", Birmingham, Alabama, of information set forth in a copy of the HCUA report, which was made available to him recently. This report was captioned, "The Recent-Day Ku Klux Klan Movement", released 12/11/67, and the report was furnished to [REDACTED] on a highly confidential basis for the possible preparation and publication in his newspaper of articles detrimental to the UKA.

As has previously been pointed out to the Bureau and of course the Bureau is fully aware of this situation, at the present time the Birmingham Office [REDACTED]

(3) Tangible Results

As Birmingham has previously expressed, it is felt that great significance should be attributed to instant program concerning the fact that there has been almost no trouble, violence or disturbance on the part of the UKA or any other hate group in the Birmingham Division for many months. As Birmingham has also previously expressed, Birmingham continues to feel that such lack of activity on the part of the UKA and the other hate groups quite logically and easily can be attributed or considered to be tangible results of the counterintelligence activity of the Bureau and various FBI offices participating in captioned matter.

The Birmingham Office has suggested that we make available to some syndicated columnist information indicating that the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku-Klux Klan (UKA), has set up a group known as the Action By Citizens Committee to promote George C. Wallace, former Governor of Alabama, for President. It is recommended that this suggestion not be approved.

The UKA is the foremost klan organization in the country. Through the Action By Citizens Committee it is promoting the campaign of former Governor Wallace. To date, this Action By Citizens Committee is not publicly known as a klan-supported organization. We have developed considerable information regarding the klan support of this organization and have disseminated this data to interested agencies.

The UKA magazine "The Fiery Cross" openly espouses the campaign of former Governor Wallace and one of the recent editions of this magazine advertises various items favorable to the Wallace campaign such as bumper plates, stickers, decals, buttons, books, and pamphlets.

Since the klan could be expected to back Wallace for President; since we have disseminated data regarding the

The following is a status letter covering the previous three-months period:

(1) Potential Counterintelligence Action

Birmingham continues to feel that the mailing of cartoons, anonymous untraceable cards, leaflets and similar type literature to known Klansmen can serve as a very important disruptive action in the Counterintelligence Program. The Birmingham Office is also definitely of the opinion that the proper use of anonymous telephone calls on a selective basis to certain UKA leaders and for active members can be, and in the past has been, used successfully by the Birmingham Office. At the appropriate time or times in the future, Birmingham plans further use of such calls in appropriate situations with Bureau approval and the Bureau will be contacted concerning same in all such cases.

In accordance with Bureau instructions set forth in bulet dated 3/28/68, Birmingham furnished the names, addresses and other data to the Bureau and to Atlanta of certain individuals to whom Birmingham desired the mailing of the letter authorized in bulet of 3/28/68. As the Bureau is aware, this letter authorized by bulet of 3/28/68 was proposed by Birmingham in connection with captioned matter and contains considerable information believed to be of a nature to serve as a disruptive activity on the part of the Bureau in its effort to eliminate the activities of the various Klan organizations throughout the country.

 This information was furnished at the request of the Chicago Office, as set forth in Chicago airtel dated 4/23/68. Chicago had requested information as to whether one [REDACTED] a "Hippy", who had been arrested by the Chicago Illinois Police Department, might be a relative of ROBERT M. SHELTON, as claimed by [REDACTED]. Birmingham suggested that Chicago, with Bureau authority might possibly get a friendly and trustworthy newspaper official to use information in regard to [REDACTED] and his alleged kinship with Imperial Wizard, ROBERT M. SHELTON in a story which might prove to have a ridiculing effect on the UKA and Imperial Wizard SHELTON.

By letter dated 3/27/68, Birmingham submitted a proposed letter captioned "UKA HIDES BEHIND SHEETS" under captioned program. This proposed letter was submitted by Birmingham with the thought in mind that the "Action-By-Citizens" Committee's association and affiliation with the UKA might be made known through the anonymously sending of this letter to certain selected individuals throughout the United States. The Bureau advised Birmingham that the sending of this letter was not being authorized at that time, due to its political ramifications, however, it was stated that Birmingham might keep the situation in mind and resubmit the proposal at some future date if Birmingham thought that such action was desirable.

(2) Pending Counterintelligence Action

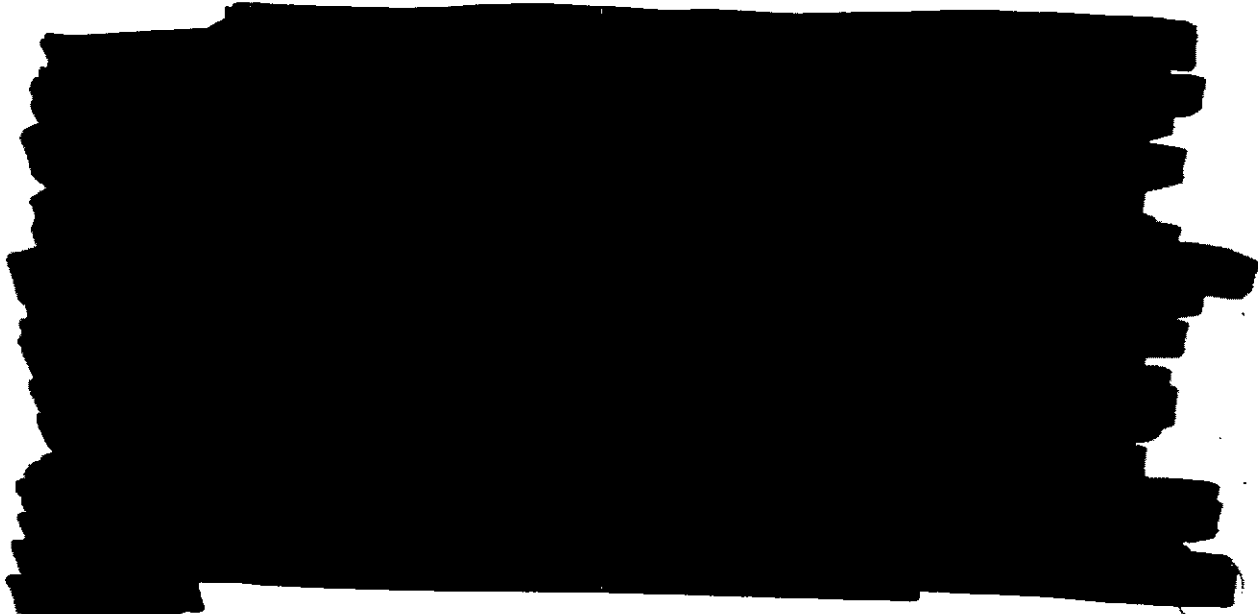
During the current reporting period, Birmingham, with prior Bureau authority, mailed cartoons to selected UKA members. The mailing of these cartoons has been carried out over a period of time, and as previously pointed out to the Bureau, only a very small number of

This project is pending at the present time.

(3) Tangible Results

As Birmingham has previously expressed, it is felt that great significance should be attributed to instant program concerning the fact that there has been almost no trouble, violence or disturbance on the part of the UEA or any other hate group in the Birmingham Division for many months. As Birmingham has also previously expressed, Birmingham continues to feel that such lack of activity on the part of the UKA and the

"I am directing this communication to alert you to a situation which will definitely injure the reputation of the Ramada Inns on a nation-wide basis if it becomes known. I must remain anonymous as my job would be in peril if my identity was known. The facts I present can be easily checked and if prompt action is taken, a great deal of harm will be prevented.

"The Ramada Inn located in Tuscaloosa is going to hold a large convention of the Ku Klux Klan over the weekend of October 5-6. This is the klan which is led by Robert Shelton. Many reservations have already been made and even the large banquet hall has been hired by this group.

"I am not in sympathy with Shelton and his crew and firmly believe as a stockholder that the Ramada Inns are not in sympathy either.

"I am writing this to warn you of this convention and I sincerely hope that you are able to make the operators of this motel get rid of this trash. They can only bring embarrassment to Tuscaloosa and the good name of Ramada.

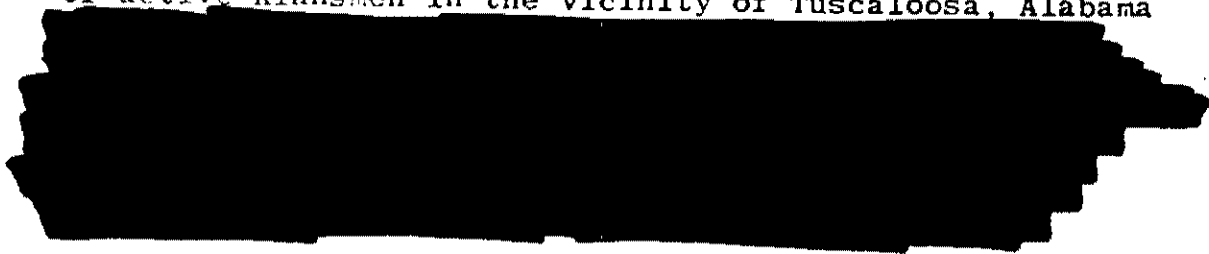

The Bureau is vitally interested in the disruption of the UKA and it is believed that the situation mentioned below lends itself favorably to accomplishing this goal, as it for one thing may result in the criminal prosecution of [REDACTED]

Referenced Atlanta teletype pointed out that 17 Klansmen, including [REDACTED] had been arrested at Swamquarter, North Carolina, on 7/4/69 according to [REDACTED]

Referenced airtel of 7/14/69 enclosed an LHM setting forth details concerning the shooting incident at a UKA meeting on 7/4/69 at Middleton, N. C. This LHM set forth the names of several Negroes arrested in regard to this incident. This LHM also stated that [REDACTED] of Alabama had been employed to defend the UKA Klansmen involved in this matter.

Referenced airtel of 7/7/69 enclosed an LHM which set forth considerable additional detailed information concerning the 7/4/69 incident. This LHM set out the names of several UKA Klansmen who were arrested and charged in this matter and one of these UKA leaders was [REDACTED]. It is to be noted that although [REDACTED] was present and participated in the incident in the UKA meeting on 7/4/69, he was not arrested and as of this date, it is believed by Birmingham that he has not been identified and charged in regard to his participation in this shooting incident. This LHM on Pages 5 and 6 sets forth information reflecting that [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] had furnished description of several rifles, shotguns, and/or revolvers taken from the UKA Klansmen arrested, but due to the excitement at the time of the arrest, it was not known positively which weapon belonged to the individuals arrested.

Referenced Birmingham airtel enclosed LHM, a part of which is a UKA Newsletter, dated 7/15/69, which was published by the Imperial Office of the UKA. This Newsletter set forth information as to the steps being taken by the Imperial Office of the UKA to raise funds to take care of the legal expenses incurred in regard to the defense of the Klansmen arrested on 7/4/69 in N. C. and to provide for funds to take care of other expenses and defenses of Klansmen in regard to other court proceedings.

Birmingham has received information indicating that several of the above mentioned UKA Klansmen arrested on 7/4/69 in N. C. have pled guilty in regard to their participation in the shooting incident on that occasion.

Birmingham is furnishing Charlotte the enclosed copy of "The Fiery Cross" for use in regard to this matter. It is to be noted that, as mentioned above, [REDACTED] was present and participated in the Klan meeting involved. It is known that [REDACTED] were traveling together on this trip to N. C. in a [REDACTED]

The Bureau is requested to authorize Charlotte to take the following action:

1) To contact some selected official of the North Carolina Highway Patrol, or other proper North Carolina law enforcement official, on a highly confidential basis and furnish him a copy of the above described "Fiery Cross."

2) To point out to this official that SEXTON's photograph appears on Page 2 of the above described "Fiery Cross" and that SEXTON was present and participated in the incident in North Carolina and that SEXTON's gun was taken up on this occasion, but that he had gotten away without being identified or arrested. It is believed probable that SEXTON's photograph may be identified by the North Carolina arresting officers as one of the leaders in this incident.

3) To furnish pertinent information from referenced communications to the North Carolina Highway official, with the specific admonition and understanding that the Bureau does not have anyone who can testify in regard to this situation.

4) To possibly make known to appropriate North Carolina Highway officials that [REDACTED] who was identified, arrested, and pled guilty, is disgruntled and very unhappy with the conduct of [REDACTED] on that occasion and the fact that [REDACTED] escaped arrest. In addition, the administrative process of the UKA will also be disrupted during the period of time that Sexton was in custody.

As the Bureau is aware, ROBERT M. SHELTON, Imperial Wizard of the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (UKA), was committed to a United States Prison at Texarkana, Texas, in February, 1969.

[REDACTED] is committed to the Federal Correctional Institution, Danbury, Connecticut.

Highly placed Informants of the Charlotte Office have recently made known that 17 UKA Klansmen were arrested in Hyde County, North Carolina, on 7/4/69, and a trial was held at Swan Quarter, North Carolina, in July, 1969. Informant on was also furnished which reflected that during the period from July 12 through July 19, 1969, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] of the UKA, was in North Carolina and stayed at the Holiday Inn Motel, Washington, North Carolina. [REDACTED] is married and resides with his wife [REDACTED]

[REDACTED], who as mentioned above is in prison, is married to [REDACTED] and she stayed at this same above mentioned motel at the same time as [REDACTED]. She was in [REDACTED] company a great deal of the time during this period and everything indicates that [REDACTED] ate together alone on several occasions. They also were alone together in [REDACTED] motel room for long periods of time, and everything points to their having sexual relations with each other.

Bureau authority is requested for Birmingham to prepare an anonymous communication to exploit this situation. 

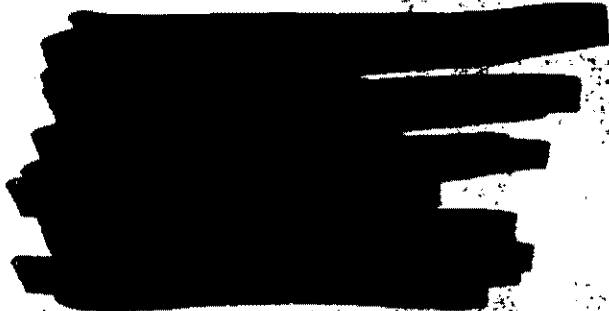

Note is made in the letter of Birmingham dated 9/9/68, that the envelopes containing the letters would bear the return address of approved correspondents, but no mention is made whether or not the letter would bear the purported signature of the correspondent. If the communication should be anonymous, it should be noted that all correspondence to inmates are opened and read by FCI authorities and an anonymous letter would not be delivered to him. SHELTON in the past has received letters from sympathizers not on his correspondence list and he has not been permitted to receive or read these letters. SHELTON is aware of this and has, in fact, registered a protest concerning the fact that he was not permitted to receive such correspondence of an irregular nature and not in accordance with the rules of the FCI of which he is cognizant, would immediately arouse his suspicion as to their origin and possibly render them worthless with respect to this program.

Therefore, the following suggestions are made with reference to the proposed correspondence. The letter of a correspondent should bear the purported signature of the approved correspondent, since an anonymous letter having only the return address of the correspondent on the envelope would involve complications and problems. In the alternative the following procedure might be followed. At least two letters of fictitious non-approved correspondents could be sent to him, which would eventually go to his Parole and Counseling Office [redacted] has established a good relationship with SHELTON and he would then permit SHELTON to read the letters together with the two anonymous communications already received but not delivered to him.

He would not be permitted to retain the letters. This procedure could be handled in an approved manner by [REDACTED] and would be least likely to arouse suspicion in the mind of SHELTON. Since that interview by Buagents, [REDACTED] has been removed from his official positions as [REDACTED] of the UKA and also as [REDACTED] of the UKA. It is felt that the contact with [REDACTED] by Buagents in October of 1969, may possibly have good Counterintelligence activity possibilities in the future and the Birmingham Office is keeping this situation in mind. *b7c*

(3) Tangible Results

As Birmingham has previously expressed, it is felt that great significance should be attributed to instant program concerning the fact that there has been almost no trouble, violence or disturbance on the part of the UKA or any other hate group in the Birmingham Division for many months. As Birmingham has also previously expressed, Birmingham continues to feel that such lack of activity on the part of the UKA and the other hate groups quite logically and easily can be attributed or considered to be tangible results of the Counterintelligence activity of the Bureau and various FBI offices participating in captioned matter.

It is also quite apparent in the opinion of Birmingham, that ROBERT SHELTON, [REDACTED] and other high-ranking officials of the UKA, are greatly concerned in regard to the activity of the FBI, the probability that the FBI has highly-placed informants in the UKA, and the fact that the FBI is probably in a position to have immediate and/or advance notice of any plans of any nature on the part of the UKA.
