






Market Cap for NASDAQ IPOs (1998-1999)




Market Cap for FLOSS IPOs (1998-1999)




Combined Market Cap for NASDAQ IPOs (1998-1999)




“Mature” and “Production” SourceForge Projects (n=29,821)
Median: 1




SourceForge Projects Downloaded ≥ 99 times (90th percentile) (n=15,096)
