




Over-the-year changes in employment on nonfarm payrolls and employment by major industry sector





Over-the-year change in the <u>prices paid by urban</u> <u>consumers</u> for selected categories


12-month percent change in CPI-U, July 2024




<u>Average annual spending</u> and percent distribution for selected categories


