

# Colorado Springs Area Economic Summary




Average weekly wages for all industries by county Colorado Springs area, fourth quarter 2023 (U.S. = \$1,435; Area = \$1,281)

Over-the-year changes in employment on nonfarm payrolls and employment by major industry sector






Over-the-year change in the <u>prices paid by urban</u> <u>consumers</u> for selected categories

### 12-month percent change in CPI-U, July 2024




<u>Average annual spending</u> and percent distribution for selected categories


