
Phoenix Area Economic Summary




Average weekly wages for all industries by county Phoenix metro area, fourth quarter 2023 (U.S. = \$1,435; Area = \$1,374)




Over-the-year change in the <u>prices paid by urban</u> <u>consumers</u> for selected categories
