Logging is carried out in accordance with national legal standards. - Wood that generates positive social impacts: wood must be harvested in a way that respects human rights and local communities in general. On this note, it is important to set up a procedure to guarantee the UTB's commitment to legality. The system chosen is that of due diligence, which is not mandatory for the market in Africa unlike the European Union Timber Regulation (EUTR), but its gradual adoption can help the artisanal sector to get out of illegality. In order to set up this due diligence system, the FORETS project proposes to continue the collaboration with the spin-off ETIFOR, which has the necessary expertise for the development of this legality system.
