RULING ON SECRETARY'S MOTION TO DISMISS

Petitioner filed a timely request to present evidence that a past-due, legally enforceable debt of Petitioner to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD") should not be collected by the Secretary by means of administrative offset. Pursuant to 24 C.F.R. §§ 17.152 and 17.153, the Administrative Judges of the HUD Office of Appeals are authorized to determine whether the debt that is the subject of this proceeding is past due and legally enforceable. As a result of Petitioner's hearing request, referral of the debt to the U.S. Department of the Treasury was temporarily stayed by this Office. (Notice of Docketing, Order, and Stay of Referral, dated February 26, 2010.)

On March 16, 2010, the Secretary filed a Motion to Dismiss advising this Office that "Based on records maintained by HUD's Financial Operations Center, Asset Recovery Division, HUD received a payment on Petitioner's account of \$11,000 from the Department of Treasury on January 27, 2006. Therefore, the Secretary considers this debt settled via compromise." (Declaration of Brian Dillon – Exhibit A.)

Therefore, upon due consideration, the Secretary's Motion to Dismiss is **GRANTED**. It is hereby

ORDERED that this matter is **DISMISSED** with prejudice.

The Stay of Referral of this matter to the U.S. Department of the Treasury issued by this Office on February 26, 2010 shall be made permanent.
