RULING AND ORDER OF DISMISSAL

On June 20, 2019, this Court ordered Petitioners to file documentary evidence on or before August 19, 2019, in support of Petitioners' appeal. *Notice of Docketing, Order, and Stay of Referral*, dated June 20, 2019.
