**RULING AND ORDER OF DISMISSAL**

On April 5, 2018, Petitioner was ordered to file documentary evidence to prove that Petitioner was not indebted to the Department in the amounts claimed by the Secretary. *Notice of Docketing, Order, and Stay of Referral*, dated April 5, 2018 ("*Notice of Docketing*".) Petitioner failed to comply with the *Notice of Docketing*. On March 6, 2019, Petitioner was issued a *Show Cause Order* again directing Petitioner to file documentary evidence to support her case. The *Show Cause Order* specifically stated that "[s]hould Petitioner fail to comply with this *Show Cause Order*, the appeal will be dismissed forthwith." Petitioner also failed to comply with the *Show Cause Order*. Accordingly, it is

**ORDERED** that Petitioners' appeal is hereby **DISMISSED**, *sua sponte*, and *without prejudice*. It is

**FURTHER ORDERED** that the *Stay of Referral* previously entered in this case on April 5, 2018, is hereby **VACATED**.
