## RULING AND ORDER OF DISMISSAL

Petitioner was ordered to file documentary evidence on or before March 6, 2019 in support of Petitioner's appeal in this case. Notice of Docketing, Order, and Stay of Referral, dated February 6, 2019. Petitioner failed to comply with that Order. In her Request for Hearing, dated December 10, 2018, Petitioner stated that her title company committed certain errors and omissions in connection with the sale of her property, and that the title company failed to discover HUD's recorded mortgage for the debt at issue in this case. Request for Hearing, p.1. The Court finds that that argument, however valid, is immaterial to the issue of Petitioner's alleged debt in this case. Petitioner also requests that the Court stay this proceeding pending the outcome of her claim against the title company. That request is DENIED. Accordingly, it is

**ORDERED** that Petitioner's appeal is hereby **DISMISSED**, sua sponte, and without prejudice. The Stay of Referral of this matter to the U.S. Department of the Treasury previously entered on February 6, 2019, is hereby **VACATED**.
