RULING AND ORDER OF DISMISSAL

On February 6, 2019, this Court ordered Petitioner to file documentary evidence on or before March 6, 2019, in support of Petitioner's appeal. *Notice of Docketing, Order, and Stay of Referral*, dated February 6, 2019. In his *Hearing Request*, Petitioner stated that "[o]nce Mr. Alanko receives copies of [HUD records related to the asserted obligation,] he will be in a position to present evidence relating to the matter." *Correspondence* from James D. Brown, Esq., dated December 28, 2018. The *Notice of Docketing* specifically informed Petitioner that the Court is not in possession of documents relating to the alleged debt in this case, and that Petitioner may request copies of such documents by writing to "Cheryl Dobert, U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, Financial Operations Center, 52 Corporate Circle, Albany, NY 12203." Petitioner failed to comply with the *Notice of Docketing*, and has failed to come forward with any evidence to support Petitioner's appeal.

UPON CONSIDERATION of the record in this case, and for want of prosecution, Petitioner's appeal is DISMISSED, *sua sponte*. It is

ORDERED that Petitioner's appeal is hereby **DISMISSED**, *without prejudice*. The Stay of Referral to the U.S. Department of the Treasury entered on February 6, 2019, is **VACATED**.
