**RULING AND ORDER OF DISMISSAL**

On November 6, 2019, Petitioners were ordered to file documentary evidence, on or before December 14, 2019, to prove that Petitioners are not indebted to the Department in the amounts claimed by the Secretary. *Notice of Docketing, Order, and Stay of Referral* ("Order"). Petitioners failed to comply with that *Order*. The *Order* advised Petitioners as to whom to contact to obtain documents related to the loan, and specifically required Petitioners to file documentary evidence to support their position in this case. The *Order* also permitted Petitioners to file an affidavit, declaration, or other evidence supporting any claim of financial hardship. It has now been 30 days past the December 14, 2019 due date. Having failed to comply with the *Order*, the Court, therefore, finds that Petitioners are indebted to the Department in the amounts claimed by the Secretary. Accordingly, Petitioners' appeal is DISMISSED, *sua sponte*, and *without prejudice*. It is

**ORDERED** that the Secretary is authorized to seek collection of Petitioners' indebtedness to the Department in the amounts claimed by the Secretary, and at the maximum garnishment rate permitted under applicable regulations. It is

**FURTHER ORDERED** that the *Stay of Referral* of this matter to the U.S. Department of the Treasury entered in this case on November 6, 2019 is hereby **VACATED**.
