The on-site judges' results were tabulated along with the votes from viewers across America to decide who will be the next "Great Communicator." On a three to two vote, Tyler Ly from Monte Vista High School in Danville, CA was named the National Champion.

Ly said, "The Reagan Great Communicator Debate Series (GCDS) National Championship was truly an experience of a lifetime. And the fact that I won a scholarship which will help me achieve my goals in the future made it even better. The starkest difference between other debate competitions and GCDS is really the community. I have never been to a tournament where the staff and judges were so genuinely interested in connecting with me. Nor a tournament where there is so much emphasis on connecting with fellow competitors."
