Dear Governor Abbott:

As required by Texas Human Resources Code §122.022, the Texas Workforce Commission in conjunction with TIBH Industries has developed the 2016 Annual Report for the Purchasing from Peoples with Disabilities State Use Program.

Senate Bill 212, passed by the 84<sup>th</sup> Legislature, abolished the Council on Purchasing from Peoples with Disabilities and transferred the program to the Texas Workforce Commission (TWC) effective September 1, 2015. TWC maintained the existing contract with TIBH Industries as the program's Central Nonprofit Agency and has worked jointly with TIBH Industries to run the program

The annual report contains a brief description of the program and its benefits to the individuals it serves and its customers. It also outlines the products and services offered under the program as well as information regarding employees with, and without, disabilities and their wages. In addition, for the first time, we have included three vignettes that describe the first hand benefits of the program. Two are about the positive impact the program has had on individuals and a third describes the services a Community Rehabilitation Program is providing to its community.

The State Use *WorksWonders* Program provides Texans with disabilities the opportunity to improve their job skills, gain independence and achieve a better quality of life. The Workforce Commission appreciates the considerable support received from the people of Texas and the executive and legislative branches of our state government.

# HUMAN RESOURCES CODE, CHAPTER 122 PURCHASING FROM PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES

## § 122.001. PURPOSE.

The purpose of this chapter is to further the state’s policy of encouraging and assisting persons with disabilities to achieve maximum personal independence by engaging in useful and productive employment activities and, in addition, to provide state agencies, departments, and institutions and political subdivisions of the state with a method for achieving conformity with requirements of nondiscrimination and affirmative action in employment matters related to persons with disabilities.

## WORKSWONDERS PROGRAM OVERVIEW

► THE TEXAS WORKFORCE COMMISSION’S Purchasing from People with Disabilities WorksWonders Program was modified in the 2015 legislative session by the transfer of the administrative and oversight duties for the Texas WorksWonders Program to the Texas Workforce Commission (TWC). The program’s enabling statute is found in Chapter 122, Texas Human Resources Code.

As originally enacted by the Texas Legislature in 1978, WorksWonders legislation mandated a State Use Program to promote vocational rehabilitation through special work contracts for visually impaired Texans. The legislation also provided for a governor-appointed agency, the Texas Council on Purchasing from People with Disabilities (TCPPD) to perform program oversight functions. To facilitate the day-to-day implementation of the program, TIBH Industries, Inc., a nonprofit corpora-

tion, was designated as the “Central Non-profit Agency” to link Texans with visual impairments to meaningful employment opportunities. During that first year of

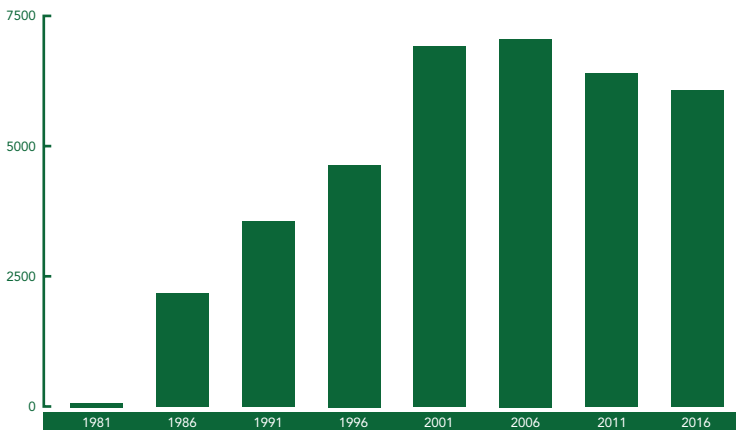

operation, TIBH and TCPPD were able to secure employment opportunities for 22 people with disabilities, through the WorksWonders Program, producing products for sale to state agencies.

In 1981 the program’s scope successfully extended with legislation to include all people with disabilities, not just those individuals with a visual impairment. The following year, the program saw the im-

plementation of its first service contracts, which constitute the majority of today's total contracts. For the next 35 years the program saw increased growth in the number of Texans employed through the WorksWonders Program and the amount of wages paid to those individuals.

In 2016, more than 6,000 Texans with disabilities were employed in 116 local non-profit community rehabilitation programs (CRPs) that participate in the WorksWonders Program. These individuals, whose disabilities include intellectual disabilities (1360), mental health condition (1324), physical impairments (903), learning disabilities (691), chemical disorders (422), visual impairment (438), hearing impairments (147), brain injury (46), and varying other disabilities (713), earned a combined total of over \$39 million in wages in 2016.

When administrative and oversight duties of the WorksWonders Program were transitioned to TWC in September 2015 through Senate Bill 212, the Texas Council on Purchasing from People with Disabilities was abolished. Now, TWC's functions as the program's administrative body in-

clude: 1.) establishment of a 13-member advisory committee consisting of four CRP representatives, four advocacy group representatives, the Executive Commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission or their designee, and four persons with disabilities, two of which are employed in the WorksWonders Program; 2.) review the program rules with input from the newly established advisory committee; 3.) pricing review and approval of new products and services, with assistance from the Office of the Comptroller of Public Accounts for aspects relating to pric-





ing; 4.) the certification and recertification of CRPs; and 5.) oversight of the Central Nonprofit Agency (CNA), TIBH Industries, Inc.

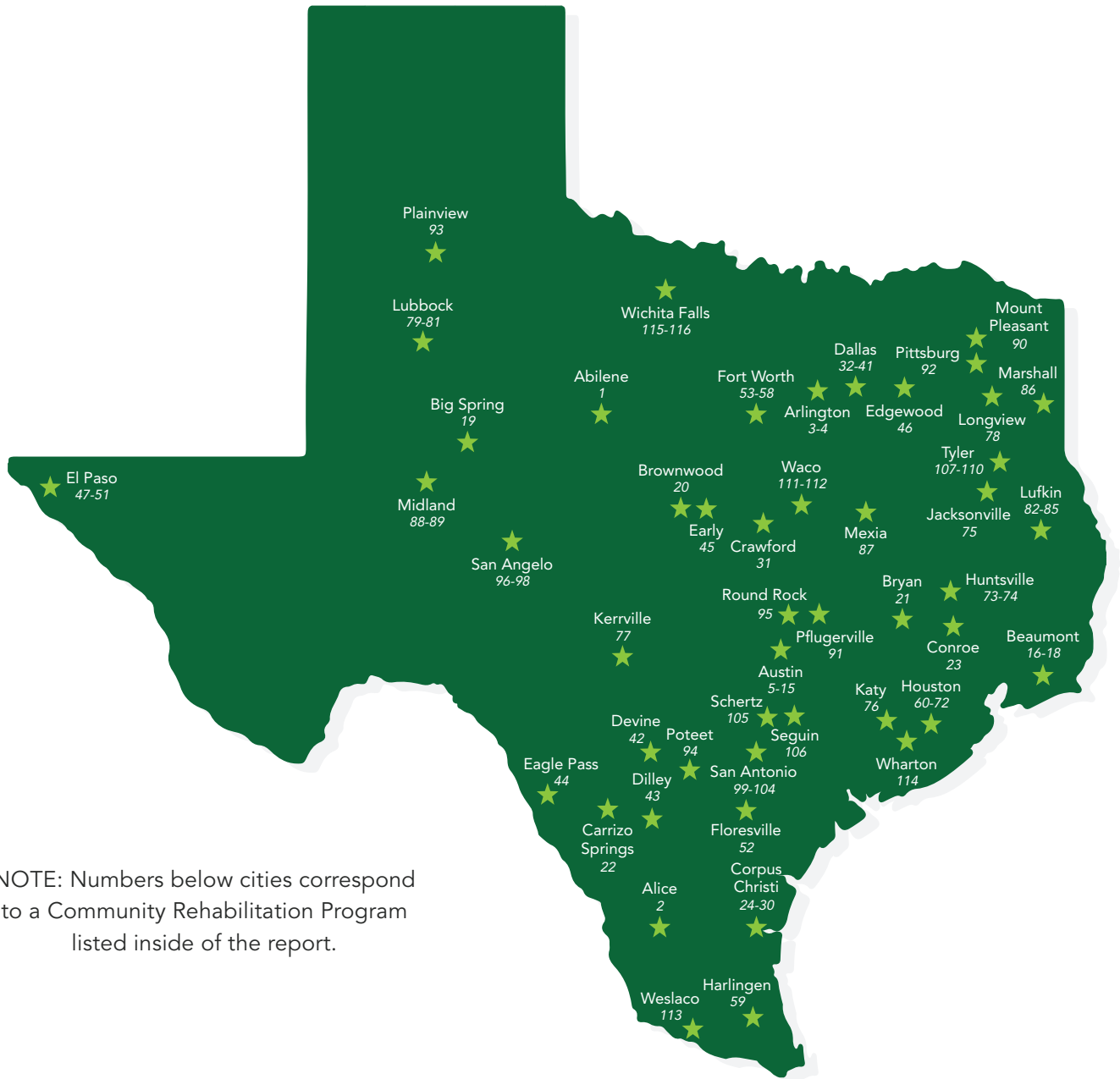
Senate Bill 212 affirmed the previous legislative requirements for the program: 1.) products and services approved for sale through the program remain mandatory for purchase by state agencies, with no

formal bidding process; 2.) exception reports continue to be required for submission by state agencies in situations where they forego the purchase of products and services offered by the program; 3.) cities, counties, ISDs, and special district agencies may purchase products and services sold through the program; 4.) the CNA would continue to manage ongoing marketing, customer relations, training and contract administration for the program; and 5.) the WorksWonders Program was reauthorized under TWC until September 2021, when a new Sunset Advisory Commission review of the program will occur.

## TWC ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- ▶ Successfully transitioned the WorksWonders Program from the Texas Council on Purchasing from People with Disabilities to the Texas Workforce Commission
- ▶ Established an Advisory Committee to assist TWC in establishing performance goals and criteria for certifying a CRP
- ▶ Established a mechanism for the Comptroller to provide input on the products submitted by CRPs for inclusion in the program
- ▶ Added staff to oversee and support the program and included the program in the review cycle of the TWC Internal Auditor

# JESSIE TRAN: GOING ABOVE AND BEYOND



► **THE WIFE AND MOTHER OF TWO** is intent on her work. She carefully threads her needle, beginning to sew the next Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) vest. She is proud of the work she does for the state, and she performs her duties with adept fingers that reflect her years of training.

Tram “Jessie” Tran has a knack for detail and an unmistakable work ethic. Jessie is also blind. Her skills, however, are at such a level that it would take two sighted employees to replace her.

Tran has worked with the Dallas Lighthouse for the Blind, a Community Rehabilitation Program (CRP), for 13 years. She began her career in one of its many production departments and has worked her way through each of them—eyeglass cases, markers, binders, and finally, sewing vests, trousers, and other cloth materials for the military and TxDOT.

“I love it. I love the job,” she said. “I love the opportunity TxDOT gives to us and to blind

people. It’s kind of a challenge. It takes some time, but when you get used to it, you get better. We have a good manager, Fred, training us, and I feel like I can do it easily now, so I’m sure other blind people can do it if they have the chance to do the training.”

Before joining the sewing department seven years ago, Tran had experience sewing as a teenager in her home country. Picking the skill back up didn’t take long, and she now has a sewing machine at home where she often repairs her children’s clothing and creates purses and pouches for them to play with.

“My kids always ask me what I do at my job and I say, ‘I’m sewing,’” she said. “One day, the Lighthouse had some rejected fabric, and I used it to make a purse and I brought it home and they loved it. They said, ‘You can do this, Mom? I can’t believe it.’”

Being able to provide for her family and develop a skill that she can use both in and outside the workplace has given her a sense of independence.

“Because of my disability, there is not much opportunity for me out there, so I’m very happy that there’s a place for blind people like me,” Tran said. “We need jobs to support our families. Everybody needs a job. I love having this place to support not only myself and my family, but also other blind individuals.”

Fred Hill, a supervisor at the Dallas Lighthouse for the Blind, has worked with Tran from the beginning and says her appreciation is evident every day.

“She’s willing to help in any way possible, whether that’s helping a newcomer, being able to cross-train, or moving to a new task fairly quickly,” he said.

Hill considers Tran a model employee, and he says once she is trained in an area, the sky is the limit.

“She’s up to any challenge,” he said. “She was a great candidate for implementing the TxDOT line because she can take anything on. She’s dependable, something you would like to see in all your employees.”

Tran’s story is one among many at the Dallas Lighthouse for the Blind, CEO Hugh McElroy said. As the third oldest Lighthouse in the U.S., open since 1931, the organization’s mission is deeply rooted in the work it does and in its employees.



## DALLAS LIGHTHOUSE FOR THE BLIND DALLAS, TEXAS

“Our mission today is to make jobs for the blind and to help the blind live independently,” McElroy said.

It’s a mission the organization supports wholeheartedly. Because of the Lighthouse, Tran is living independently, performing sighted tasks and fulfilling her goals of providing for her family.

“This means to me a lot,” she said. “I’m so proud of myself and I get to the point that I feel like I learned a lot, and I’m just so thankful for it.”

# IMPACT OF THE WORKSWONDERS PROGRAM

► **WHILE FINDING MEANINGFUL** employment opportunities for individuals with disabilities remains the foremost goal of the WorkWonders Program, a secondary goal is to provide those individuals with the skills necessary to ensure that they are able to perform efficiently in competitive and integrated work environments.

Of the 116 community rehabilitation programs (CRPs) that currently participate in the WorkWonders Program, 87 offer vocational rehabilitation and outplacement services to their employees in an attempt to secure competitive employment that meets their strengths and capabilities. These services include but are not limited to: adaptive visual equipment training, chemical/alcohol dependency counseling, educational training, financial planning, high school equivalency prep courses, interview coaching, job coaching, job placement services, job skills training, and supported employment services.

Placing individuals with disabilities in jobs they want as a career and are ideally suited for, through vocational rehabilitation and outplacement services, has resulted in better retention, higher productivity, more consistency, and higher overall team satisfaction. These individuals are great hires, because they thrive on routine and standardization.



Due to the influence of these services and the positive effect they have on the employees that utilize them, 1,459 individuals with disabilities were placed in either competitive integrated employment or non-direct labor positions within their CRP.

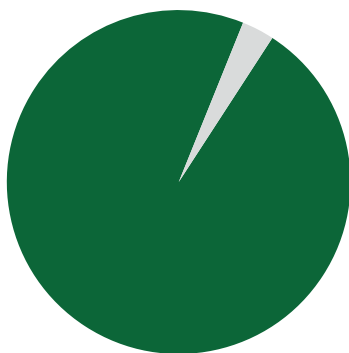

# WAGES & HOURS FOR EMPLOYEES WITH DISABILITIES

A few Texas CRPs participating in the WorksWonders Program utilize a special wages certificate issued by the U.S. Department of Labor under Section 14(c) of the Fair Labor Standards Act (29 U.S.C. 214(c)) to pay certain workers with significant disabilities at a rate below the federal minimum wage. The allowable “commensurate” wage rate involves documentation and calculations of a worker’s abilities and productivity and permits the CRP-employer to pay a lower hourly wage rate approved by the Department of Labor. The process is subject to regular auditing and oversight and permits certain CRPs to offer employment to individuals who may otherwise be unemployed. These day jobs often permit the worker’s parent or guardian to secure their own employment to support the family.

# THE SAN ANTONIO LIGHTHOUSE: EMPOWERING THE COMMUNITY

► **SERVING PEOPLE WHO ARE BLIND** or vision impaired since 1933, San Antonio Lighthouse provides rehabilitation services to the San Antonio community as well as employment for the blind and vision impaired in its manufacturing plant.

In the beginning, the San Antonio Lighthouse offered part-time work to five people who were blind making pillowcases for the military. Since those humble beginnings, the Lighthouse has grown to become one of the largest non-profit organizations in San Antonio and now employs over 250 people who are blind. These employees work on assembling, sewing and throughout the entire organization in other capacities.

With this incredible growth over the last 83 years, it has enabled the Lighthouse programs/services offered to increase exponentially last year providing over 10,000 services to San Antonians who are blind and vision impaired. These services are available to people with vision impairment of all ages. A "one-stop" shop serving birth on upwards.

One reason the Lighthouse was able to experience this extraordinary growth was the Texas WorksWonders Program. The sale of products to state agencies and political subdivision customers has directly impacted the institution of new programs and services for the community.

A partnership with the University of Incarnate Word – Rosenberg School of Optometry was formed opening a Low Vision Rehabilitation Clinic at the Lighthouse Eads location. The clinic has seven state-of-the-art exam rooms where third and fourth year students get practical experience working with the doctors examining low vision patients. With assistive technology, today these students learn the meaning of making a difference in a person's life by helping to maximize whatever vision the patient may have left.



In conjunction with Sight Savers of America and through the Low Vision Clinic the Lighthouse is able to identify children with severe visual impairment. These children often do poorly in school, which can lead to unrealized potential in adulthood. This program places life-changing technology into children's homes improving their independence and self-esteem. The assistive technology provided can have a dramatic effect on a child's life. It is prohibitively expensive and is not covered by insurance. The goal is to provide assistive technology to children



at home so they are able to develop to the best of their ability.

Another program that had been a dream of the Lighthouse for many years finally came to fruition – A Blind Children’s Education Program serving birth through 18 with support

groups for the parents and family. Hearing the news that your child is blind and there is nothing medically that can be done is devastating – This program provides the help in learning everyday life skills, Braille, mobility training and assistive technology. The support group for the parents allows interaction with other parents facing similar challenges.

One of the goals of this program is to supplement the child’s education by providing fun, engaging, and enriching activities. These activities focus on the Expanded Core



Curriculum objectives of literacy, technology, physical fitness, social skills development, art and music.

While the Lighthouse’s products and employment opportunities may have changed over time, their focus on improving the lives of the blind and vision impaired has remained steadfast.







## 2015 ARTIE LEE HINDS AWARDS BANQUET

THE ARTIE LEE HINDS AWARD DINNER is an annual event that recognizes the contributions of the outstanding employees of the WorksWonders Program.

Each year, CRPs from around the state nominate employees that have shown great commitment and dedication to the program, through their work producing products and providing services.

## ROBERT PAINTER: A HOME, A FAMILY, A CAREER

▶ **WHEN ROBERT PAINTER BEGAN** working at Marian Moss in Lubbock, Texas, in 2007, he got more than he bargained for. Fast-forward nearly 10 years, and Robert is still happily and gainfully employed, spending every day with the friends he's made and the family they've formed.

Painter is a landscaper at Marian Moss, a Community Rehabilitation Program (CRP) designed to enhance the lives of Texans with disabilities. The CRP promotes employment options that encompass freedom of choice, increased economic independence and opportunities for personal growth.

"I like everything about it—it's the best thing I ever did," Painter said.

Through lawn maintenance contracts with the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT), Painter

works on the grounds crew running line and hedge trimmers, stick edgers, blowers, lawn vacuums, and walk-behind and zero turn radius mowers, as well as other maintenance equipment.

"When I first started, I wanted to mow, but they had me wait until I was trained," he said. "When I got it down, I could do it like it was nothing. I'm like a pro at it."

Now, Painter can operate every piece of equipment Marian Moss uses, and he has learned to service and maintain the equipment. His attention to detail and willingness to help others is almost like having another supervisor, grounds coordinator Allen Putman said.

"He loves what he does and he'll tell everybody," Putman said. "He takes a lot of pride in his work. We check everybody's work, but I can't remember a time in the last seven or eight years he's ever missed any-

thing. He's so proud of what he does, he wants to do it right and perfectly every time."

Over the years, Painter has come a long way personally and professionally, and he is quick to discuss the changes he's seen in himself.

"My attitude's changed," he said. "I've changed a whole lot. I'm very proud of myself."



Putman has worked with Painter since his first day and agrees that he has transformed for the better. Painter has spent many holidays with Putman's family, experiencing a family environment for the first time.

"He's grown on a personal level, on a work level—every aspect," Putman said. "He's worked really hard to get where he is and it shows."

Painter lived in a group home for much of his life, but he was unhappy with his lack of independence. In June 2015, however, that changed. Ray Morris, a supervisor at Marian Moss and longtime friend of Allen Putman, offered to foster Painter.

"It's awesome," he said. "I have freedom to do what I want."

Painter now has a place to call his own, a routine and even chores.

"He's literally part of the family," Michael "Mike" McDaniel, executive director of Marian Moss, said. "That's what's been missing in Robert's life, is family. It's natural for him to do so much better."

Not only does Painter have a new home, but he also considers his coworkers to be

his adopted family. In fact, when he won the Artie Lee Hinds Award from TIBH Industries in 2011 for his commitment, hard work and dedication, he brought his best friend and coworker, Stephen, with him to the award dinner.

"I think Marian Moss being here and providing him with that family environment, teaching him these skills, has given him that sense of worth and something to work for," Putman said. "I think this program really saved him."

Jeremy Dearing, a transportation engineer with TxDOT – Lubbock, said he's proud to invest in a program that can make such a difference in people's lives.

"It's something that we can't do with our normal contracts," Dearing said. "With this kind of contract, we're able to help them out, and it makes us feel good to help out other citizens that we otherwise couldn't."

With his new home, family and positive outlook, Painter has the following advice for others:

"Keep trying, don't give up," he said. "If you keep trying, you'll succeed in your goals."
