## Transfer Admissions

### 2025 APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

#### General Requirements - [unf.edu/admissions/transfer/index.html](https://unf.edu/admissions/transfer/index.html)

- Lower-Level Transfer (LLT) - 12-29 transferable credits, either completed and/or in-progress.
  - Minimum 2.50 high school GPA (recalculated by UNF and weighted)
  - Minimum overall 2.25 post-secondary college GPA
  - Minimum 2.00 GPA at last institution attended
  - Must have either SAT, ACT or CLT on file
  - Completion Rate equal to or greater than 67%
  
- Mid-Level Transfer (MLT) - 30-59 transferable credits, either completed and/or in-progress.
  - Minimum overall 2.25 post-secondary college GPA
  - Minimum 2.00 GPA at last institution attended
  - Must have one of the following:
    - Minimum 2.50 high school GPA (recalculated by UNF and weighted) and SAT, ACT, or CLT on file, or
    - Completion of both a college-level English (composition) and math course (intermediate algebra or higher) with a C or better in both
  - Completion Rate equal to or greater than 67%
  
- Upper-Level Transfer (ULT) - 60+ transferable credits, either completed and/or in-progress.
  - Minimum overall 2.00 post-secondary college GPA from a FCS or SUS with an A.A. degree
  - Minimum overall 2.25 post-secondary college GPA without a FCS or SUS A.A. degree
  - Minimum 2.00 GPA at last institution attended
  - Completion Rate equal to or greater than 67%

## Definitions/Terminology

- Lower-Level Transfer (LLT)
  - 12-29 transferable credits, either completed and/or in-progress.
  - Must have at least 12 transferable credits earned after high school graduation.
- Mid-Level Transfer (MLT)
  - 30-59 transferable credits, either completed and/or in-progress.
  - Must have at least 12 transferable credits earned after high school graduation.
- Upper-Level Transfer (ULT)
  - 60+ transferable credits, either completed and/or in-progress.
  - Must have at least 12 transferable credits earned after high school graduation.
- "X" in the course number
  - An "X" in the course number (e.g., ABC X789) is a wild card. That is, the course can be any level from 1-4. For example, ABC 1789, ABC 2789, ABC 3789, or ABC 4789.
- Earned credits (EC)
  - Refers to hours passed with a grade of "D" or higher and/or a grade of "S" (Satisfactory). This category does not include 0 level, vocational, occupational, or technical courses.
- Attempted credits (AC)
  - Refers to any course appearing on the transcript with a letter grade (including a "W" or an "I"). This number is important because some financial aid packages set limits on the number of attempted hours. This category does not include 0 level, vocational, occupational, or technical courses.
- Completion rate (CR)
  - The completion rate is determined by dividing the number of earned credits by the number of attempted credits, not including any in-progress coursework. You must complete at least 67% of credits attempted.

    - MAC X233 (Business Calculus I)
  - Transfer GPA
    - Admit to program
      - If 2.0 – 3.49, must complete both prerequisites.
    - Provisional Admit
      - If 3.5 or better, must complete 1 prerequisite.
  
- Civil Engineering, Mechanical Engineering and Advanced Manufacturing
  - Prerequisites (C or better grade)
    - MAC X311 (Calculus I)
    - MAC X312 (Calculus II)
    - PHY X048/L or PHY X048C (Calculus-based Physics I and Lab)
    - CHM X045/L or CHM X045C (General Chemistry I and Lab)
  - Transfer GPA
    - Admit to program
      - If 2.0 – 2.99, must complete all 4 prerequisites.
    - Provisional Admit
      - If 3.0 – 3.49, must complete 3 prerequisites.
      - If 3.5 or better, must complete 2 prerequisites.

- Electrical Engineering
  - Prerequisites (C or better grade)
    - MAC X311 (Calculus I)
    - MAC X312 (Calculus II)
    - PHY X048/L or PHY X048C (Calculus-based Physics I and Lab)
    - CHM X045 (General Chemistry I without Lab)
  - Transfer GPA
    - Admit to program
      - If 2.0 – 2.99, must complete all 4 prerequisites.
    - Provisional Admit
      - If 3.0 – 3.49, must complete 3 prerequisites.
      - If 3.5 or better, must complete 2 prerequisites.
  
- Financial Technology
  - Prerequisites (C or better grade)
    - COP X220 (Programming I)
    - MAC X233 (Business Calculus I)
    - MAC X312 (Calculus II)
  - Transfer GPA
    - Admit to program
      - If 2.0 – 2.99, must complete all 3 prerequisites.
    - Provisional Admit
      - If 3.0 – 3.49, must complete 2 prerequisites.
      - If 3.5 or better, must complete 1 prerequisite.



## Specialized or Selective Admission Programs for Upper-Level Transfer (ULTs)

### Brooks College of Health (BCH)

- Health Science – Kinesiology
  - Approximately 90 new students are typically admitted each year.
  - Only admits to start in the fall semester
    - The application deadline is May 10
    - Submit all official transcripts and documentation by May 10
  - Students must have 60 earned hours.
  - Minimum 2.75 overall college GPA
  - Completion of all general education, Gordon Rule and prerequisites prior to enrolling in Kinesiology courses.
  - Prerequisite courses (or similar courses) with a C or better
    - BSC X085/L or BSC X085C (Anatomy & Physiology I and lab)
    - BSC X086/L or BSC X086C (Anatomy & Physiology II and lab)
    - CHM X045/L or CHM X045C (General Chemistry I and Lab)
    - MAC X105 (College Algebra or a higher math)
    - PSY X012 (Introduction to Psychology)
    - HUN X201 (Human Nutrition)
    - SPC X608 (Fundamentals of Speech)
    - STA X023 or STA X014 (Statistics)
  - Six of the eight prerequisites above must be completed by the application deadline. The remaining prerequisite(s) must be completed no later than the summer term, prior to the start of the Fall semester.

### Brooks College of Health (BCH) - ctd.

- Nursing
  - [unf.edu/brooks/nursing/admissions.html](http://unf.edu/brooks/nursing/admissions.html)
  - Must have transcripts from every institution the applicant attended to refer (excluding accelerated mechanisms unless required to show standing)
  - NUR1 – RN to BSN Bridge
    - Satisfy UNF General Education & Gordon Rule requirements prior to program matriculation with:
      - Sixty (60) semester hours of courses that fulfill General Education & Florida Gordon Rule per the UNF catalog -OR-
      - An Associate of Arts (A.A.) from a Florida public institution
    - Must have an active RN license in state of practice
    - 2.70 overall undergraduate GPA
  - NUR3 – Regular Prelicensure BSN
    - Must have general education completed by intended entry term
    - 3.00 overall undergraduate GPA
    - Must have prerequisites completed with 3.2 GPA and C or better in each course
  - Prerequisites
    - PSY XXXX or SOP XXXX or SYG XXXX (Sociology/Psychology)
    - DEP X004 or DEP X054 or DEP X000 (Life Cycle)
    - STA X122 or STA X023 or STA X014 (Statistics)
    - HUN X201 (Humanities)
    - MCB X010/L or MCB X010C or MCB X000/L or MCB X013C or MCB X004/L (Microbiology)
    - BSC X085/L or BSC 2085C or BSC X093/L or BSC X093C (Anatomy and Physiology I and Lab)
    - BSC X086/L or BSC 2086C or BSC X094/L or BSC X094C (Anatomy and Physiology II and Lab)

## Specialized or Selective Admission Programs for Upper-Level Transfer (ULTs)

### College of Arts and Sciences (COAS)

- Biology
  - [unf.edu/coas/biology/programs.html](http://unf.edu/coas/biology/programs.html)
  - Students who plan to major in biology will need to have taken the following prerequisite courses with a minimum 2 B's and 2 C's combination:
    - BSC X010C or BSC X010/L (Biology 1 with lab)
    - BSC X011C or BSC X011/L (Biology 2 with lab)
    - CHM X045C or CHM X045/L (General Chemistry 1 with lab)
    - CHM X046C or CHM X046/L (General Chemistry 2 with lab)
  - Admit to program.
    - All 4 prerequisites completed with a minimum of 2 B's and 2 C's
  - Provisional Admit
    - 3 prerequisites completed with a minimum of 2 B's and 1 C
    - 2 prerequisites completed with a minimum of 2 B's
  
- Music

  - To be considered for entrance into the UNF School of Music, you must apply separately to the University's admissions department and to the UNF School of Music via an audition.
  
- Graphic Design
  - Transfer students should apply to the University as a Painting/Drawing/Printmaking (PDP) major. If you are accepted into the program, your major will be changed to Graphic Design (GDDM)
  - Only admits to start in the fall and spring semesters
  - 2.75 overall GPA
  - Portfolio review
  - Have passed all prerequisites with a minimum of a C:
    - ART X300/C (Drawing I)
    - ART X301/C or ART X203 or ART X205 or ART x330/C or ART X310 or ART X305 or PGY X101 or PGY X401 (Drawing II)
    - ART X201 or ART XXXX (2D Design)
    - ART X600 or DIG X000 or ART X602 or GRA X143C (Digital Imaging)
    - ARH XXXX (Art History)
    - GRA X203 or GRA X190 (Graphic Design Principles)
    - GRA XXXX (Any GRA course) or DIG X025 (Design History and Theory)

- Social Work

  - Only admits to start in the summer and fall semesters
  - 2.50 overall GPA, 60 hours of college/university credit (junior standing), and the required prerequisites completed by the beginning of fall 2025.
  - An AA from a public Florida college or university or successful completion of UNF general education requirements; students transferring to UNF without an AA must have 60 credit hours; minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5
  - Successful participation in a panel interview conducted on campus by a committee of Social Work and Sociology faculty and community partners
  - Acceptable performance on a writing assessment administered on campus and reviewed by a committee of Social Work and Sociology faculty
  - Prior to being admitted to the BSW program, students must successfully complete 15 hours of state-mandated common prerequisites with a C or better. Select 1 course in each of the following 5 disciplines (equivalent courses from other institutions are also acceptable):
    - Political Science
      - POS X041 (Introduction to American Government)
    - Human Biology
      - BSC X005 (Principles of Biology)
      - BSC X085/L or BSC X085C (Anatomy & Physiology I and lab)
      - BSC X010C or BSC X010/L (Biology 1 and lab)
    - Psychology
      - PSY X012 (Introduction to Psychology)
    - Sociology
      - SYG X000 (Introduction to Sociology)
    - Economics
      - ECO X013 (Macroeconomics)
      - ECO X023 (Microeconomics)



## Specialized or Selective Admission Programs for Upper-Level Transfer (ULTs)

### College of Education and Human Services (COEHS)

- American Sign Language (ASL)/English Interpreting
  - [unf.edu/coehs/lscsm/asl/](http://unf.edu/coehs/lscsm/asl/)
  - Only admits to start in the fall semester.
    - The application deadline is March 31
  - 2.75 overall GPA.
  - Must have an associate degree.
  - Must hold national certification as a sign language interpreter.
  - Prior to declaring a major in ASL/English Interpreting, students must successfully complete the Prerequisite and Core Requirements courses in the Course Catalog, pass the Limited Access Screening, maintain a 2.75 GPA, and have a 'B' or better in ASL I, ASL II, Introduction to Interpreting, and ENC 1101.

  - The General Knowledge (GK) Exam is **not** required for admission to teacher certification programs; however, it is highly encouraged to pass the GK exam prior to enrolling at UNF. Further, please submit your GK exam results during the admissions process, but this is also not required. Note the GK exam must be passed prior to graduating.
