- 1. To develop a strategic approach to research for the [Arts and Humanities/ Social Sciences/ Sciences] that aligns with the University Research Strategy.
- 2. To act as a mechanism whereby departments and Faculties can feed into the development of research policy, prior to final approval by University Research Committee.
- 3. To communicate University research policy and provide support for its implementation into departmental procedures.
- 4. To develop, as appropriate, proposals in relation to research matters, for consideration by University Research Committee.
- 5. To identify resourcing issues relating to research, for referral to the Faculty Executive Group and other University bodies as appropriate.
- 6. To refer, as appropriate, issues for discussion across all departments to the Research Forum.
- 7. To share good practice in supporting departmental research performance.
- 8. To share good practice in the development, delivery and tracking of impact.
- 9. To engage with the work of the York Graduate Research School [and with the Humanities Research Centre / and with ReCSS]
- 10. To support and facilitate the engagement of the Research Champions and Research Themes with the interdisciplinary aspirations and ambitions of departments.
