Marsden programming content with theiceberg.com

Still just three years in existence, theiceberg.com has quickly become the preeminent provider of online entertainment content in Canada. Via its four separate and distinct entertainment portals, theiceberg.com provides live on-demand audio programming in a variety of formats and genres, readily accessible 24 hours and day, seven days a week.

The man responsible for the programming of all this content is a name instantly recognizable within the music industry. Dave Marsden, who helped revolutionize Canadian radio through the formation of Toronto's CFNY-FM, has seen his radio accomplishments recognized by the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame in Cleveland. In fact, legendary media philosopher Marshall McLuhan dedicated an entire chapter to Marsden in his now-classic text *Understanding Media*.

Marsden eventually left the Toronto radio scene, settling in Vancouver in the mid-eighties, where he lived for the next ten years. It was while living in Vancouver that Marsden came to some conclusions not only about radio, but about the Toronto-centric attitude evident in Canadian media.

Marsden has always had something of a gift for foresight. It's that foresight that led him to move from AM to FM radio in the seventies, despite the abundant naysayers who said that FM would never be a popular broadcasting outlet. It was that same foresight that led to the foundation of CFNY, clearly the most cutting-edge Canadian radio station of its time.

Now, that same foresight has led Marsden to forsake traditional radio broadcasting altogether, opting instead to delve into the world of Internet broadcasting.

Iceberg Media.com's prime directive was to

provide the kind of alternative entertainment content that can't be found via standard media. The umbrella portal, theiceberg.com, currently plays host to four distinct sites - 1groove.com, 2kool4radio.com, Ill Noiz Network and primeticket.net.

The first, 1groove.com, is described as the site 'where the world comes to play'. The site features a host of DJs offering a diverse mix of dance music. The DJs, most of whom are highly regarded in the North American club and rave scene, include Mitch Winthrop, Matt C, Andy Roberts, Nick Holder, Dr. Trance, DJ-MC Flipside, The Vinyl Syndicate and Deadly Hedley Jones, who also serves as the site's music director. DJ Trance (aka Don Berns), oversees the site as program director.

1groove.com recently became the first Internet broadcaster to move to an over-the-air broadcast signal, providing programming for the 12 am to 6 am slot on Toronto's CIUT-FM.

2kool4radio.com provides live, on-demand programming with a variety of alternatives. Alternative music magazine Exclaim! hosts Exclaim! Radio. Music journalist Karen Bliss provides in-depth artist interviews on Lowdown. 'Wicca witch of the north' Kate Whittaker provides a slice of spiritual content with her program Akasha. And the program ringside offers the latest news from the world of professional wrestling.

Mixed in with these various programs is a mish-mash of music content, ranging from indie rock, to punk, to pop, as well as loungecore, latin, and metal. Handling the specific programming of

2kool4radio.com is music master Brian Willett.

For those looking for live entertainment, primeticket.net is described as a '24/7 audio-visual digital concert hall', where audiences can listen to an event live, or access it on demand via the site's archives. Thus far, the site has offered live coverage of concerts by Fatboy Slim and Mixmaster Mike, Ben Harper, G Love & Special Sauce, the Red Hot Chili Peppers, and others. Most recently, the site also featured live coverage of the Toronto Downtown Jazz Festival, the Dyke March and the Gay Pride Parade. Handling the programming is channel master Gary Cormier, a veteran of the Canadian concert scene.

The newest portal at theiceberg.com is the Ill Noize Network, dedicated to urban music and videos. The site offers a mix of hip hop, R&B, reggae, roots, rocca, dance hall, Latin and more. The site features live performances and interviews on Drop The Beat, urban music and culture on roots, and calypso and soca sounds on the Calypso Summit. The site, which began as a six-hour segment on 2kool4radio.com, premieres as a 24-hour separate channel in August of 2000.

Finally, theiceberg.com's latest venture is Deeper, a monthly online magazine exploring a diverse range of music, art, fashion, politics, film, television and humour. The site is handled by editor-and-chief Mitch Winthrop, a DJ who has also penned articles for numerous magazines, including Chart, Venue and Streetsound.

Guiding the ever-growing ship is Marsden, who sees nothing but good things in the future for theiceberg.com. As far as he's concerned, radio has

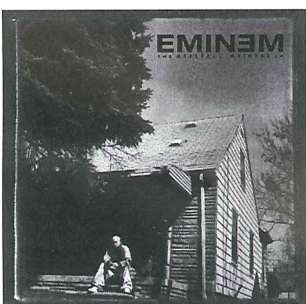

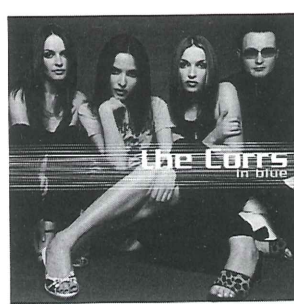

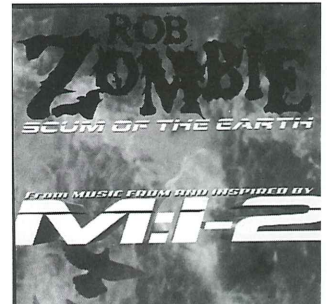

become a stale format, with most radio programmers afraid to take any sort of chances musically. That won't be a problem with theiceberg.com.

When Marsden first arrived from Vancouver, there was no Iceberg Media. He arrived to find an empty office building, without phones or furniture, and certainly without staff. A year later, things are decidedly different.

"Now, there's 33 full-time staff, 47 disc jockeys, and five fully-equipped studios, which are on the system at all times, and two production studios. So it's definitely an exciting time."

Marsden knows all about venturing down an uncharted path. After all, Marsden was one of the first Canadian radio personalities to make the then unprecedented jump to FM, which at that time (mid '70s) was still unknown territory for pop and rock music.

He likens that unparalleled move to his new venture online with theiceberg.com. As was the case thirty years ago, he's heard the doomsayers predict that online broadcasting would never work. And again, he's beginning to prove some people wrong.

"The point is, when I left AM, a lot of my friends, who are still doing AM to this day, felt that I was crazy to go to FM. What's interesting is that now, there's a whole lot of music out there that radio won't play - about 50% of the music sold, radio won't play. So sitting out in Vancouver, it seemed to me that there had to be a way to get some of this stuff played. And just as people were saying that FM wouldn't work, they're saying the same about the internet.

"Technology is always driven by the ability to make something and then sell it. Within 24 months, I would say you will be listening to Internet radio in your automobile. You will be listening to Internet world-wide radio on your stereo system, and you won't need a PC to do it. You will be listening to

Internet radio on your NetMan. All these things will come to pass. The prophets of doom will always be there to tell you why something isn't going to work. But there are few people who will tell you, 'yes it will work and here's how'."

Aside from having thoughts on the future of Iceberg Media.com, Marsden is still loaded with opinion concerning radio. He admittedly still loves radio, and wishes that programmers would display some more imagination at their stations.

But if radio is going to continue to play it safe, and concern itself strictly with the bottom line, then Marsden will continue to push the outer edges of the entertainment envelope with Iceberg.

"What I see theiceberg.com as being is the world's greatest entertainment portal. So today we have four full-time channels - I suspect we'll have 50 channels before whatever period of time passes. There's no stopping what we do. And people say to me, 'well I guess radio's dead'. But I definitely don't think radio's dead, but it's gonna have to reinvent itself, which it's done many times over the past number of decades. My forecast is that the reinvention of radio must be driven exclusively by localization.

"Radio stations today seem to be all the same. You can drive from here to Vancouver, and then south to LA, and then back up to New York, and you're never far from a radio station that sounds exactly the same as the one you just tuned out of. And maybe that's why people, particularly the under 30s, are tuning out. It's not interesting, it's homogenized, it's what I call McRadio. Now let's understand that I love radio, but I think it has to reinvent itself. It has to become more local, and that's the one thing that the Internet doesn't do very well. The Internet is about entertainment, and it's about community, but it's a community that's not driven by where people live, but rather by what they like."

And as with the case when he began CFNY, one of Marsden's prime mandates is to help foster the development of new talent. Again, it somewhat goes back to radio, and their hesitancy to play new music and artists.

He sees theiceberg.com as an outlet that will fill in the holes left vacant by radio's insistence on playing it safe. He fails to understand why today's radio listeners are forced to listen to the same music over and over again. And he hopes that portals like 2kool4radio.com, 1groove.com and the Ill Noiz Network will enable listeners to hear music they might not hear elsewhere.

"There's just so much music that's so good, and nobody is getting to hear it. I don't believe that our children, and our children's children, should still be worrying about The Doors or The Beatles. That's just silly, that's like people who still think that Elvis is the King. I'm amused when I see DJs that I used to know still busy playing all that music they were playing 25 years ago. Doesn't that get boring?"

"But I love radio so much, that I get annoyed that the broadcasters have chosen to break the habit. It used to be that you got up in the morning and turned on the radio. Well now, people get up and turn on the TV, or go online. And eventually, you'll be able to dial up your cell-phone and find everything you need in terms of information. But we are a content company. As vice-president of entertainment, my job is to think up content. And right now, I'm trying to find the holes that are left by radio, and that's not that difficult, really."

Up to this point, the CRTC has stayed away from the Internet, choosing not to impose any sort of regulations until they have a firmer grasp on what the 'net will really be all about.

Marsden is hopeful that their decision to leave

In that Gary was wearing thin because he also managed CFRB and The MIX in Toronto, he wants it known that he recently announced two major appointments:

Pat Holiday is now Vice-President and General Manager of CFRB 1010 AM. This comes at a good time because Holiday had pretty well worn out his welcome after four years as manager of Standard's two Calgary stations, CKMX and CJAY 92.

J.J. Johnston is now Vice-President and General Manager of The MIX 99.9. As the word "beg" may be a bit harsh, let's just say that Johnston has finally reached his goal after slugging it out in the program trenches for five years with Standard Radio.

A nervous David Coriat keeps his present title of Executive Vice-President and Chief Financial Officer. The bean counter has actually proved of value in a number of surprising ways, particularly when he stick-handled the company out of that messy Toronto Raptors situation.

Allan Slaight, who lifted Standard Broadcasting from Conrad Black and the gang at Hollinger in 1985, bestows upon himself the title of Executive Chairman of the Board of Directors, although he dismissed his directors some years ago. He will continue to constantly meddle in corporate affairs, which include twelve radio stations in Canada's top seven markets; video and audio post-production; film processing; video, DVD and electronic games distribution; outdoor signs and retail marketing services.

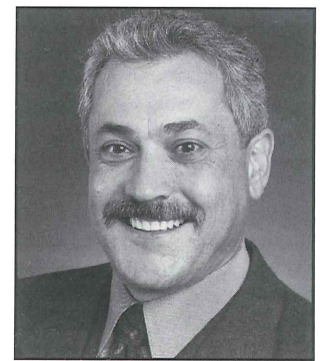

HMV.com has now begun selling Digital Downloadable Music (DDM) from EMI Music via a new partnership with Supertracks Inc., one of the leading enablers of the legitimate distribution of DDM. The digital download program will initially consist of more than 100 albums from the EMI catalogues, including releases from Spice Girls, Mel C., The Tea Party, Moist, dc Talk, Pink Floyd, Tina Turner and Frank Sinatra.

The initiative represents the largest release of for-sale downloadable music from a major record company.

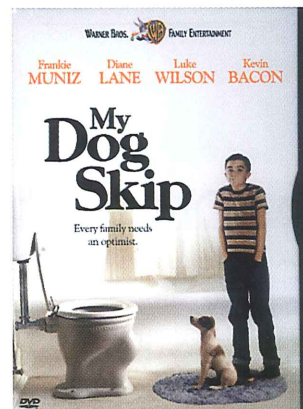
Hard to imagine that it's been 25 years since Steven Spielberg's epic monster movie, a film that in many ways changed the way people go to the movies. Jaws was truly the first blockbuster (with apologies to Star Wars fans), the first movie that people went to see over and over again, the first movie to break the \$100 million mark, a movie that remained the top box-office champ for years. Despite the inflationary rise in ticket prices over the past quarter-century, Jaws remains among the top grossing films of all time, with more than \$470 million worldwide. For this special 25th

anniversary edition, available on both VHS and DVD, Universal has launched a somewhat unprecedented promotional campaign for this release, hoping to capitalize on the obvious consumer familiarity with the film. The Anniversary Collector's Edition contains some 75 minutes of bonus footage, including a one-hour 'Making Of' documentary, as well as outtakes, deleted scenes, photos, storyboards, production drawings, the original theatrical trailer, and more (for the VHS version the extras are contained on a second tape). DVD exclusives include a new Dolby 5.1 audio track, a Don't Go In The Water trivia game, and a PC screensaver. Jaws has been unavailable on home video since 1996, and has sold a mere 800,000 units worldwide since it was first released on video 20 years ago. Given the response from major retailers thus far, this could be one of the biggest re-releases of all time. As for the movie, Jaws remains one of the great adventure tales ever filmed, as enjoyable today as it was in '75. The Making Of documentary points out, again, how troublesome the mechanical shark proved to be, and you can't help think of it when you watch the film again. But Spielberg wisely chose to keep the shark off-screen for the first half of the film, and his initial on-screen appearance ("We're gonna need a bigger boat") works very well. Given the torture encountered by all in the making of the film, the resulting entertainment is almost that much more satisfying. - RR

Sylvia Tyson mounts classic stage show

Sylvia Tyson has put together a stage presentation of River Road and Other Stories, a flashback and fast forward of her life as she envisioned from her own perspective.

It was in the early sixties when Sylvia and husband Ian, known as Ian and Sylvia, began making inroads into the Canadian recording industry. They were nominated for an RPM Gold Leaf Award as Top Folk Group in 1966 (RPM - Jan 17/66), but were beat out by Malka and Joso and the Courriers. They had a solid folk fan base however, and went on to become the darlings of folk music. Their first national hit was titled Lovin' Sound (RPM - 3/67), followed by Creators of Rain (Sept. 11/71). Unlike Gordon Lightfoot, who was embraced by radio beginning in 1965 with I'm Not Sayin' (RPM - June 28/65), Ian and Sylvia gained their recognition through playing clubs and festivals.

Ian did the solo thing in 1973 and gained radio support with Love Can Bless The Soul of Anyone (RPM - Sept. 29/73), which signalled the inevitable, a split. Ian eventually moved west where he became a rancher in the foothills of the Rockies where he still resides. Sylvia remained in the Toronto area where she raised her son Clay (RPM New Releases - July 24/00).

Memories and more memories, good times and not such good times were enough to obviously influence Sylvia to let it all hang out in her own production of River Road and Other Stories, a theatrical presentation that incorporates songs, stories and personal anecdotes. She lays out her life, which has been described as her beginning as "a precocious and observing child, as an individual fallen on hard times, as an elderly person battling loneliness and fighting for dignity."

There is no doubting that Sylvia Tyson is a Canadian music icon, who has mastered the challenges of a writer, producer and TV and radio host who has fostered and promoted Canada's music heritage. It was through these endeavours that gained her the recognition of the Government of Canada who bestowed on her the Order of Canada.

Interesting too is that the concept for River Road came to her as a vision during the 1997 national tour of Timothy Findley's Piano Man's Daughter, in which she shared billing with Findley, Veronica Tennant and Joe Sealy.

The Toronto date for River Road, which opens Aug. 9 at the Canadian Stage's Berkeley Street Theatre, is the third stop on Tyson's cross-Canada tour. She did her try-out in small town Ontario, Fergus, to be exact, to a packed and appreciative house and does the same in Chester, Nova Scotia, before her Toronto date.

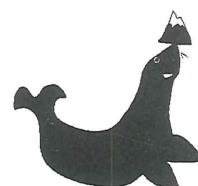

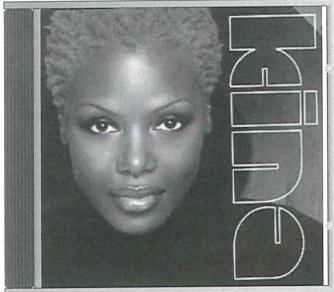

New Releases



KINA - Pop/Rock
Self-titled
 Dreamworks-50113-J

Judging by the reception she received at her recent Toronto showcase, which attracted many of the city's retail and radio heavyweights, the buzz is already red-hot for this release. The good folks at Universal believe Kina could be one of the big breakthroughs of the year 2000, perhaps along the same lines that Macy Gray broke through for Sony. Don't try to compare the two soundwise, however. Kina has obviously been fostered on some soul and R&B, but she's not afraid to take that soul/R&B sound and crank it up a notch. Case in point is the lead single, *Girl In The Gutter*, which has a terrific hook and should be a no-brainer for radio programmers. *I Love You*, which was clearly one of the highlights of her showcase, is another powerful track, with that wall-of-sound type of production that gives the tune that epic feel. Kina co-wrote the tunes with cohort London Jones, who also produced the record. And the good stuff just keeps coming, as *Have A Cry* is another tune with clear-cut hit potential, a slow-building verse which explodes into a wonderful sing-along chorus ("Is it alright if I cry/Without no positive speeches/Don't need no lessons from God/He knows I'm human, I got weakness"). Stop has an almost country-esque guitar flourish, and the song builds from bottom to top, finally capped by Kina's plaintive vocal ("Hey you, I wanna live"). *Give And Take* is an emotional ballad, with some persuasive lyrics ("Give me what you need/I'll meet you halfway"), while *Me* is far more upbeat and uplifting. *U Don't Know* has some hearty rock guitar riffs, and shows a bit of Kina's nasty side. *Loser* is a strong description of drug addiction, which, like *Have A Cry*, again builds from a subtle start to a potent conclusion. *Hurt So Bad* is perhaps the record's most soulful song, putting Kina's vocals on fine display, while *Insanity* is a surprisingly positive track, in spite of its curious title. Finally there's *Still Here*, a beautiful and emotional piece that closes out the record quite nicely. If you are looking for the top new artist of the year 2000, look no more. -RR

TEGAN AND SARA - Folk 'n Punk
This Business of Art
 Superclose/Universal-012 159 399-J

Like a Chinook from their native Calgary, sisters Tegan and Sara have conjured up a warm sampling of their poetic/creative genius which is just a little left of centre. But the appeal is obvious. Universal's Meghan Symsky describes the album as "a portrait of complexities." The acoustic feel and the street-smarts lyric content put the pair in today's niche of acceptable entertainment for the 16 to 30 age group. They have a funky, folk/punk approach, some of it with an edge, but with a toneful respect for the listener. The First, which drips with radio appeal and taken as the first single, is a good choice to make an immediate impact. And a perfect lead-in to the more wailful offerings like *Frozen*, *My Number*, *Freedom*



and *Not With You*. Vocally, the pair project as individuals, a little at odds with each other, but that adds to the appeal. Superstar could be a left-fielder. All the music and lyrics were written by Tegan and Sara who also provide acoustic guitar inserts. Nice pristine and simple production by Hawksley Workman, who does the lion's share of accompaniment on drums, bass, keys, guitar and harmonica with Karl Mohr on keys and drum programming. Recorded at Hawksleytown Studios and Umbrella Sound in Toronto. No MAPL logo, but it's assumed all tracks have some Cancon properties. The pair is signed to Neil Young's Vapor label for their US release. -WG

BUDDY MacMASTER - Instrumental
The Judique Flyer
 SMP-1012 (Independent)

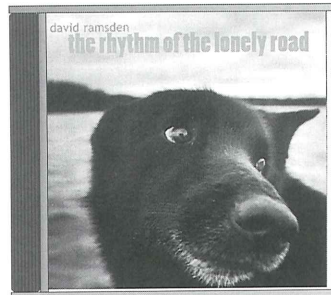
K.E. Dunlay, music historian and author, suggests that Buddy MacMaster of Judique, Nova Scotia "surely must rank alongside Neil Gow as one of the greatest Scottish fiddlers ever to have lived." The 76-year old MacMaster who, by the way was born in Timmins, Ontario, not too important in the world of fiddle music, was rescued early in life when his fiddle-playing father and his mother, who specialized in "mouth music" moved to the fiddle/celtic wonderland of Cape Breton where he has now been recognized as the Island's "master fiddler". So, the trick was to find if producer Gordie Sampson, who recorded this CD at



Lakewind Sound in Point Aconi, Cape Breton, was able to capture that sound on these 14 tracks. Suffice to say, he did. Interesting too is that this is only McMaster's second album, the first was released in 1989. Adding to the entertainment value of this release was the harnessing of the talents of 14 of Cape Breton's finest fiddle and piano accompanists: Berry Lou Beaton, Joey Beaton, Hilda Chiasson, Joel Chiasson, Tracey Dares, Jackie Dunn, Howie MacDonald, Mary Jessie MacDonald, Mary Elizabeth MacLinnis, Dave MacIsaac, Marie MacLellan, Doug MacPhee, Maybelle Chisholm MacQueen and Mac Morin. Who they are and what they play are all supplied by the inserted booklet, which also contains some very important and informative information about the history of the Judique Flyer, a steam-driven passenger train that replaced the old stagecoach line which ran between Inverness and Point Tupper on Cape Breton's west coast. Obviously they're not looking for that radio hook (there's no MAPL logo displayed), but it's assumed all tracks are Cancon. Step Dancing, toe-tapping, jigs, reels and laments are all rolled into a celebratory 62 minutes of enchanting fiddle music with the steady and almost overpowering thump, thump of the Heintzman upright piano heard on a number of tracks. -WG

DAVID RAMSDEN - Vocal
The Rhythm Of The Lonely Road
 Appeal

David Ramsden, a Toronto-based man of all performing arts, here turns his talent to an album of his own songs clearly composed and performed from the heart. Critical acuity demands one to comment that there's a certain



sameness about the melodies but the lyrics quite capture the soul of their writer as well as the attention of the listener as sung by him in a manner that rather reminds one of early Neil Diamond. The only bothersome thing about this 100% MAPL production might be an engineering fault. Ramsden's voice is so soft that one must give strict attention to hear it. Perhaps it's intentional, if so, it works -BW

THE JAZZ MANDOLIN PROJECT - Jazz
Xenoblast
 Blue Note-243-25251-F

The late and beloved humourist Robert Benchley (grandfather of Jaws author Peter Benchley) was also an accomplished mandolin player. One can only guess at his bemusement



somewhere in comedic heaven over Xenoblast. The Jazz Mandolin Project is comprised of Jamie Masefield (mandolin, compositions and production), Chris Dahlgren (bass) and Ari Hoening (percussion). It was

conceived with the intention of extending the mandolin in public perception to include jazz. The mandolin and jazz are not strangers to each other. In fact, it and its cousins -- banjo and ukulele -- were once its mainstay but it was a different kind of jazz; filled with a joyous beat and eminently danceable. What TJMP presents on the nine tracks of *Xenoblast* isn't that kind. It's more sophisticated and even, arcane with a sound reminiscent of that heard in the Middle East coffee houses. Not bad mind you, but decidedly not jazz to the mandolin's potential. Sorry. -BW

MANHATTAN TRINITY - Jazz
Make Me A Memory
 Fable-85365-43732-P

Manhattan Trinity -- a clever if overweening title -- consists of Cyrus Chestnut (piano), George Mraz (bass) and Lewis Nash (drums). On three of the ten tracks they're joined by Teodoss Avery on tenor and soprano saxophones. The music is of the late night kind which is to say laid back but not so much so as to be soporific.



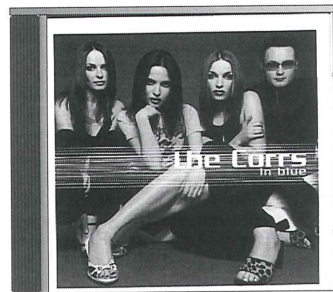
The album is dedicated to the memory of Grover Washington Jr. who wrote the title song but there's more than his memory alone throughout the album. Some of the tracks are insidiously familiar though whether by accident or design is difficult to say. Dexter Gordon's *Catalonian Nights* for example, makes one recall Romberg's *When I Grow Too Old To Dream* and the same composer's *Cheese Cake* bears more than a passing resemblance to *Delicado*. Quite interesting. The best track is the final one; a brief and gentle treatment of Smetana's *Moldau*. It's delightful, not simply as a novelty but as a genuine jazz treatment of a beloved classic. -BW

THE CORRS - Pop
In Blue
 143 Records/Lava/Atlantic-83352-P

The family Corr didn't take long to become one of the Atlantic's more valuable international properties, enjoying crossover success throughout the world, particularly in Europe. Their most recent effort, an MTV Unplugged release, surprisingly didn't do all that well at retail, a surprise given the quality of the material, particularly the enormously catchy single *Radio*. This new release finds the Corrs delving even further into the pop vein, with just a hint of the celtic base that got them started. Lead single *Breathless*, co-written and produced by Mutt Lange, debuted at #49 on the AC chart, which makes sense, given that it's a natural for AC radio. Elsewhere there's plenty of crossover material to carry this album for some time. *Give Me A Reason* is another upbeat catchy pop ditty, while *Somebody For Someone* is a soft yet poignant track, despite the somewhat simplified lyrics. All *The Love In The World*, another Lange co-write, features the kind of high-pitched harmonies that remind one of the glory days of Wilson Phillips. *Radio*, which, as mentioned, was first heard in its acoustic form on the



Unplugged album, is given the full studio treatment, although the studio polish seems to have taken away some of its soul. Nevertheless, it's definitely one of the better songs the group has written. Irresistible, also co-written by Lange (maybe he needs the money), has the sound of Shania written all over it, and could be another single possibility. *One Night* is one of the slower tracks on the record, a teasing ballad about a one-night affair. *At Your Side* is pure Corrs, with the basic rhythm and acoustic accompaniments so familiar from The Corrs early work, while *Hurt Before* is another sombre selection, one of several tracks co-produced by veteran Mitchell Froom. This album may not have the overall commercial viability of some of their earlier work, but the group does have a solid core of fans, particularly overseas, and this one should produce some good numbers. -RR

the 'net alone will continue. While he doesn't think the old FM regulations were that detrimental, he does feel that trying to legislate the creative freedom of the Internet would be a disastrous decision.

"What we are doing is new and fresh and invigorating - it doesn't need any type of regulation to it. In fact, that would probably completely destroy it. If people go back and check out the history of FM, the three original FM stations (CFOX, CHUM-FM and CHOM) all did things differently. They did things because they felt good about it. And all that stuff that was created out of passion, is what the CRTC used when they laid out the original paper for the FM regulations. And the minute they laid down those regulations, they took the heart and the passion from FM. You cannot legislate art or creativity."

"When the FM regulations were originally coming in to play, I admit that I was a big supporter of that. I thought it was a way to drive even the non-creators into doing creative radio. Unfortunately, the non-believers will often take regulations and find a way to make them not work."

Finally, what separates the Internet broadcaster from the radio broadcaster is the size of the playing

The end of an era - Ed's Warehouse

The last of Ed's Warehouse Restaurants, Old Ed's, the gathering place for showbusiness people, the swells and tourists alike, will be shuttered on Sept. 9. The restaurants were famous for their eye-popping decor of antiques and roast beef dinners.

Launched in 1963 by Ed Mirvish to complement his newly restored and reopened Royal Alexandra Theatre, getting into the food business was almost as risky as the live theatre business. Situated on Toronto's King Street West, Mirvish was faced with putting a new face on an abandoned collection of warehouses, thus the name and which it is known today as Toronto's Entertainment District.

Ed's Warehouse Restaurants were comprised of ten dining rooms stretched over three stories in three separate buildings and once boasted more than 2,800 seats. Mirvish began bowing out of the restaurant business a few years ago.

Located at the corner of King Street West and Duncan Street, the restaurant property is a prime location between the Royal Alexandra and the Prince Of Wales theatres. The Mirvi will retain the building and property, which will be leased to another party for a major renovation and redevelopment.

field. While radio stations are dealing with strictly a local audience, Internet broadcasters are dealing, potentially, with a worldwide audience.

The size of that audience would seem to mean a different scope in terms of programming. But Marsden feels instead that theiceberg.com and other Canadian-based Internet entertainment ventures should primarily be Canadian. It's an ideal opportunity, he feels, to bring the country's cultural community closer together, and then take that more cohesive culture and spread it out throughout the world.

Canadians, says Marsden, still have a very Toronto-centric attitude when it comes to culture. It's a way of thinking that's caused a subtle dissension within the country, and it's that type of political and cultural disparity that the Internet could heal.

"It is a Canadian venture, but we get all kinds of spill-over into America, we get spill into Europe, the UK, Australia. I had a guy the other day send an email through from Jerusalem, asking to hear more Canadian music. So of course we started a 24/7 channel of Canadian music (via Canoe). So, it is a worldwide service, but it's a service that has the ability, all by itself, to bring a lot of what we are about to the world.

"I lived in Vancouver for about a decade, and I had not understood until then what it's like to live so far away from the perceived centre of the country. So much of Canadian culture emanates from one place. And I think a lot of that problem is because of TV. I remember CTV was doing a story on something in Seattle. And Seattle's only about an

hour and a half from downtown Vancouver. And after the piece, Lloyd Robertson says '...and now, closer to home, in Caledon today...' And I thought, half the people in this country don't know what Caledon is. But when you're out on the west coast, it's like you're not involved in anything."
