

Lennox hopes to maintain small-time feel in major record company

Universal tops expectations in first post-merger year

Things are good at Universal these days, and President Randy Lennox is hopeful that they'll stay that way. The key, he reiterates time and again, is to maintain the company's overall humbility factor. To act as several smaller, more artist and retail friendly labels, rather than one huge conglomerate. It's important to keep an eye on the prize (namely market share), but it's equally important not to get carried away by their own success.

Having just reached their first financial yearend following the merger with PolyGram, Universal is solidly atop the Canadian record company pile when it comes to both market share and total revenues. The company finished that fiscal year with four of the top five records in the country (The Tragically Hip, Eminem, Bon Jovi, and Mission: Impossible 2), and held a 37% share of the market.

Furthermore, the company achieved the financial quotas set out for them in terms of their

gross revenue and the overall bottom line (\$300 million).

Of course, just when the company was ready to celebrate that strong first year, word came down of the proposed Vivendi purchase of Universal. Record company employees tend to get a little greyer when the words 'merger' are mentioned, but according to Lennox, the music side of Seagram's could very well be strengthened, rather than submerged.

"We had a three-hour world satellite communication involving Jean-Marie Messier, the head of Vivendi, and he was very bullish on music, and cites it as one of the principal reasons for the purchase. The fact that Edgar is going to retain his status as head of music bodes extremely well. Overall, we feel very confident in an excellent marriage. They feel that we are complimentary, but not similar, in our product lines. Their Internet portal is really the AOL of Europe. They showed us examples of some of the technological achievements,

succeeding weeks, placing in the top of the 15 Basic

Cable US ratings chart.

The series is also a hit with YTV's tween audience where it placed in the Top 10 overall for non-animated programs, a favourite with viewers between 2 and 17 years.

The starring role of Caitlin is taken by Lindsay Felton (Thunder Alley, 3 Ninjas: High Noon at Mega Mountain). Co-stars include two Canadians: Cynthia Belliveau (ENG, Wind At My Back) as Dori Lowe and Ken Tremblett (Millennium, The Outer Limits, Dead Man's Gun) as Sheriff Jim Lowe, with Jeremy Foley (Dante's Peak, Chicago Hope, Buffy the Vampire Slayer) adding comic relief in the role as the teenage son Griffen Lowe.


Mytown, who's self-titled CD is available on the Universal label (RPM New Releases - April 24th/00), appear in the All Night Long episode.

Caitlin's Way is already airing in Australia on Nickelodeon and will soon have a worldwide audience where it will be viewed in the UK, Spain, Portugal, Eastern Europe, Africa, Middle East, the Netherlands and Greece. The series has translated into German, Italian, French, Brazilian Portuguese, Spanish and Latin Spanish.

and what they can do with a cellular telephone boggles the mind."

To further solidify the post-merger unification process, Universal Music Canada as a whole will be moving into their new state-of-the-art facility on Victoria Park in late August. With the company still spread out among five different Toronto locales, the en masse move into the one building will aid in the

unifying process.

Until then, Lennox adds, the goal will be to continue in the development of artists, particularly those on the domestic side. The current success of homegrown acts soulDecision and Matthew Good bode well for the company's domestic development. On the immediate horizon is a newly signed pop artist out of Winnipeg, and a new national talent search initiative in conjunction with Global Television.

"We've signed an artist out of Winnipeg named Remy, who is a 21 year-old multi-talented artist, writes and performs all his own material. And we just concluded a deal with Global Television and Lone Eagle Productions on a national talent search, which is going to be a prime-time television show beginning in January. We concluded a deal which will result in an album and videos on this national talent search, which will take place in September of this year.

"We're investing larger amounts on slightly fewer artists, and in that process, really focusing on bringing our talent to the world."

Lennox adds that Universal as a whole will continue to restrict its focus to two or three new artist signings per year, as well as the licensing of several projects on an indirect basis. The structuring of Universal as a series of smaller companies under

Caitlin's Way filming second series in Alberta

Caitlin's Way, the popular children's television drama, has returned to Alberta where filming is underway for another 26 episodes, the second season for the series.

The team of Helene White and Jana Veverka are once again producing the series. White is quite familiar with teenage audiences having previously produced Connecting, Alberta's first syndicated and internationally award-winning talk show series for teens. Veverka's production credits include MOW for CBS and CTV as well as numerous series including Adventures of the Black Stallion, Bordertown, Airwolf and Danger Bay. She also produced Lonesome Dove: The Series in Alberta.

Fireworks Entertainment, a subsidiary of CanWest Global, is the international distributor and financier of Caitlin's Way, in association with the Tom Lynch Company in the US. Financial support is also provided by the Alberta Film Fund. The series was created by Tom Lynch, whose other credits include The Secret World of Alex Mack and 100 Deeds for Eddie McDowd.

The March 11 premiere of Caitlin's Way in the US on Nickelodeon was reportedly the "highest rated premiere" in the television network's 20-year history, making it the most successful Canadian production in the US children's live-action drama series market. The show has remained very vibrant over the

one corporate umbrella "allows us to have a custom approach to the artists we sign."

Lennox frowns on the image of Universal as a massive corporate behemoth, swallowing up artists and spitting out others. He prefers to think of Universal as strictly a corporate name tag, with the company largely acting as the distributor and guiding hand for the 'independent' labels working underneath.

But while he hopes to maintain that small label attitude within the larger confines of Universal, he also defends the multinational mega-mergers that seem to be the trend in today's financial world.

"These types of mergers are the next steps. They need to happen, and are ultimately very good for our business. Our customers tell us that our methods of doing business really haven't changed. And if that stays within reason, and these major companies are subdivided into several label groups, then custom artist service and custom marketing service are still available under the larger umbrella. So judging by our example, I see it as an evolution, rather than a negative. Progress is what it is, and we need to act accordingly."

While Universal is enjoying the fruits of their labours, Lennox still harbours concerns for the business overall. His concerns touch on a variety of different areas, including radio and the Internet.

It's hard for someone as exceedingly upbeat as Lennox to admit to being concerned about something, without arching back and trying to turn the negative into a positive.

Take radio, for example. Lennox admits that record companies continue to have the same discussions about radio that they did 20 years ago. Having said that, he also feels that webcasting could have a revolutionary effect on broadcasting, and change the way music is developed.

"In terms of playing new music, the concerns we've had for years remain, specifically cross-reliance on US airplay. That said, it's nice to see some formats, like KISS here locally, getting into a genre that can serve the community. The music and radio industries will always be at cross-purposes. I think webcasting is an opportunity to actually shore up some of the missing developing artists opportunities."

As he goes on to point out, youthful consumers today are raised in a culture of expedience. Everything is now, now, now, and those same youth couldn't be bothered with three-hour movies, two-hour dinners or hour-long albums. It's hard to imagine a movie like Lawrence Of Arabia being released today, and it's similarly difficult to imagine an album like The Wall being released in today's cultural environs.

Thus, while album sales may be affected by the dreaded MP3, Napster file-swapping ways of youth, singles sales may actually rebound. Keeping up with that fast-food type of culture isn't easy, but Lennox feels that the record companies, Universal in particular, are attempting to meet the challenge.

"Youthful consumers have less patience to listen to a 70-minute album, and are veering towards singles yet again, which obviously explains the download situation, as well as the compilation business. Kids want variety, and they want it quick and easy. So webcasting plays beautifully into that process. I also think our Jimmy & Doug's Farmclub, which is running on MuchMusic, really hits that spot, in that it's a really fast-paced television show that deals with this issue of the eroding attention span. And this is the form of entertainment we'll see in the future.

"Our Canadian side is involved with the US via FarmClub. And we are having demos uploaded on a weekly basis via MuchMusic and MusiquePlus. We are actively soliciting demos via FarmClub - we've become the Bob Barker of the Internet."

Still, while the record companies may finally be catching on to the technological possibilities of the 'net (including the sale of secure downloads,

U2 finally launch their own official web site

Currently in the studio putting the final touches on their much-anticipated new album, U2 announced an alliance with World Online that has resulted in www.U2.com, the band's first official website.

Fans can go to the site and see live images of the band in studio, working out the final kinks of the new album, which is expected sometime this fall. Since going up live, the site has attracted more than 3.2 million page requests, representing over 500,000 visits to the site every day.

The current site, which is actually a precursor to the official site, will track the developments of

the new album, and includes live 24-hours-a-day video images from the band's Dublin studios. Visitors to the site will be able to explore the studio online via a 360-degree revolving web-cam. They will also be able to receive e-mailed updates with band news.

The final official U2 site will be completed by September, and will include a host of impressive new web features, highlighting the past, present and future of the band. With the exception of a temporary touring site set up during the PopMart world tour, this is the first time the group has developed their own official internet presence.

According to The Edge, "Up until now we've felt that there was so much high quality U2 information on sites run by fans that we shouldn't add to it unless we could do something significantly different. But now, with technological advancements, we're in a position to offer something unique."

U2 manager Paul McGuinness added, "We waited a long time before committing to an official U2 website but the time is right and this is going to be great."

Finally, World Online's Tom Bennett noted, "World Online sees this as a unique opportunity to partner with U2, one of music's all-time most compelling and cutting-edge bands, to produce a state-of-the-art website. It will enable U2 fans worldwide to become part of a community which actively seeks to provide a unique and rewarding experience with material new and old that has never been seen anywhere else in the world. We intend to make this site the measuring stick for all other artist-related sites."

New study says Napster users aren't freeloaders

A new nationally-syndicated research study by In The Name Of Cool says that, despite frequent Napster usage, most Canadian Napster users are committed music fans, and continue to actively support the artists.

The third edition of the In The Name Of Cool survey is based on a telephone survey of 1,415 Canadians, aged 12 years and older, between May 8th and 30th of this year.

Among the findings of the survey are that approximately 1.8 million Canadians (15% of Canadian Internet users) have used Napster at least once to download MP3 files. The study also found that the typical Napster user is much older than one might have expected – 39% of users are 25 years of age or older, and that 72% of users are male.

According to the survey, the average user downloaded seven MP3 files per week. However, the survey also indicated that 73% of Napster users

had bought at least four CDs in the past six months, compared to 49% for the rest of the population. Napster users also spend an average of 2.8 hours per day listening to music (compared to an average of 2.1 hours).

Finally, when asked to name the first music-related web site on their mind, 19% of those surveyed mentioned Napster or MP3.com, as compared to just 6% that mentioned MuchMusic.com.

"The widespread use of Napster points to a need for the music industry to rethink its business model," noted Edward Skira, project consultant for In The Name Of Cool. "The music industry has to wake up and recognize that the one-hit, 15-song CD isn't working anymore. The music buyer wants choice, and if the industry doesn't provide that choice, they'll explore the options that technology provides."



US federal judge puts the nail in Napster

A US federal court judge has ordered a halt to the trading of music on Napster, saying the online service encourages "wholesale infringing against the music industry." The decision was announced on Wednesday afternoon, with the injunction to go into effect by 3 am on Saturday. Napster is appealing the decision.

The Recording Industry Association of America (RIAA) originally sued Napster back in December of 1999. Napster countered that they were protected under the Digital Millennium Copyright Act of 1998, but Judge Marilyn Patel rejected that notion. Napster then argued that the personal copying of music is protected by federal law. But the RIAA responded by noting that there was no precedence in US law that would allow the wholesale copying and distribution of copyrighted works.

Napster chief executive Hank Barry said his lawyers would work around the clock to try and overturn the ruling before the 3 am Saturday deadline.

"We understand the ruling and basis for it. We disagree with it, and we will continue to work hard between now and tomorrow to allow Napster users to continue to use our service by preparing for the Court of Appeals."



which Universal hopes to begin doing by the fall), there's still that annoying little element known as Napster.

As noted in RPM three weeks ago (RPM – July 10/00), today's youthful music listeners are more than happy to swap musical files with their pals via the much-denigrated software, rather than spending \$15-20 on a new CD. But recent research indicates that Napster users may actually be among the more active music purchasers, buying in excess of four new CDs per month.

Lennox raises a good point, as well, in terms of the record clubs. As he notes, at one point, five years ago, Columbia House and the other record clubs were siphoning off 29% of the retail business, all for the price of a penny. That number has declined significantly in the last few years, to where it now rests at about 13%.

And while the loss of retail sales to Napster and other Internet sources is significant, it doesn't come close to the numbers that were being lost to the record clubs. In other words, as Lennox says, it's better than a saw-off for the industry, it's a chance to make some gains.

"From a displacement standpoint, the industry has not lost business, it's just gone from one medium to another. Columbia House has gone from 29% to a new low of 13%, and 16% of the Canadian music business is one heck of a lot of business to pick up. Retail has the opportunity to pick that up either online or via their bricks and mortar stores, and it gives us an opportunity to do so online, without solely taking away from that 16% opportunity."

According to some on the retail side of the business, the latest tactic employed by the younger crowd is a simple one: apply to the record clubs for those 10-15 CDs for a penny, upload the best songs from each CD to their computer hard drive, and then send the CDs back to the clubs. Once the songs are one the hard drive, the en masse swapping can begin – and it's cost the consumer exactly one cent.

"Columbia House has always been campusdriven," adds Lennox, "and to my knowledge, the number of MP3 files floating around campuses today is frightening. To that end, we will be undertaking an industry campaign to educate the Canadian consumer on the value of music, very much like

Metallica is doing. So there will be an industry undertaking to address this issue very shortly."

From a domestic standpoint, Universal, as noted, continues to roll with soulDecision and the Matthew Good Band. In the case of soulDecision, the album has already topped platinum in Canada, and the first single released in the US (Faded) is already in the top 15 at American Top 40 radio, with more than 3,000 spins per week. The full album will be released in the US August 22nd, shipping close to gold out of the box.

And the international numbers should look good as well, with every international Universal office agreeing to release the album, led by the UK and Germany in September, followed by the rest of Europe, Australia and Japan in October. Add in an opening slot on Christina Aguilera's upcoming US tour, and things couldn't look better for the trio from Vancouver.

Lennox is more than thrilled with the early returns on soulDecision, and gives credit not only to the band but the entire Interscope/Universal marketing, sales and promotion team for the success. Selling a domestic pop act is no easy chore, and the amount of money needed to make it work can be daunting, making the soulDecision succes that much more gratifying.

"It is very, very expensive to run a pop artist in this country, and that's why it is imperative to have world-class production and world company commitment. You cannot have a pop band sound like a 'B' group - the marketplace is way too competitive. To compete world-wide, the investment is exponential, even compared to rock, and the marketing commitment is exponential, compared to rock. That said, when you have a properly produced, 'A' level pop band, the opportunity for income down the road is escalated. For example, with soulDecision coming out in every Universal territory, Canada is the repertoire owner, which allows us the opportunity for income three, six and nine months down the road."

Universal Canada's domestic side is also reaping the benefits of Matthew Good's latest effort, Beautiful Midnight, which is now double platinum in Canada. The album has received a boost in recent weeks with the release of the latest single, Strange Days, with an accompanying video that Lennox feels

is "probably the best video they've done." In addition, Beautiful Midnight will be released by Atlantic in the US in the near future.

Meawhile, the Hip's latest, Music @ Work, is already at triple platinum after just seven weeks. Jann Arden's latest, Blood Red Cherry, is now well over gold and on its way to platinum, and hopes are high for the new solo effort from former Northern Pikes member Bryan Potvin.

Also upcoming are new studio releases from Holly McNarland, Age Of Electric's Paul Kearns, the aforementioned Remy, Big Sugar, and a solo album from Hip frontman Gord Downie

Ah, but what about Shania? With Come On Over now over double diamond in Canada, Lennox says that Twain and husband Mutt Lange are taking a well-deserved break.

"Shania spent over two years not missing a show from the last album. She and Mutt are taking a well-deserved year off, and we expect an album from her early next spring, and they're doing writing for that now in Switzerland."

From an international standpoint, there's obvious strong potential in upcoming releases from Limp Bizkit and U2, as well as The Wallflowers, Erykah Badhu, and hopefully soon, Peter Gabriel.

In terms of current international releases, the numbers speak for themselves. Eminem, which has reigned atop the album charts for more than eight weeks, has topped sales of half a million units in Canada thus far. Mission: Impossible 2 is closing on triple platinum, Dr. Dre (2001) is at four time platinum as is Enrique Iglesias (Enrique), both Bon Jovi (Crush) and Nutty Professor II are already well over platinum, Blink 182 is over 400,000, 3 Doors Down should reach platinum by the end of August, while Sting should hit double platinum by September.

Again, though, Lennox continues to stress that Universal Music Canada isn't resting on its laurels. The important thing, he emphasizes, is to not get carried away by the first-year success, because the music business is far too volatile, and there's little room for complacency.

"The one thing we recognize is that business is cyclical, and we never take anything for granted. I'd like to think that our attitude hasn't changed from when we were just little 'ole Universal."



NEXT UP Various Artists TVT-64902-J

Next Up may be a clever angle to market another rap compilation, but it is also an ideal tool to expose new talent. The spin: established artists showcase their choice wannabe rapper. Of the ten tracks, only a few of the newcomers stand out lyrically: Cuban Lynx and Triple Sese (Up In Smoke), Third Rail (Club Bangers), Mecca - the lone female (Blackhand), and Napoleon (Sidewalk Confessions). For party tracks and useful rhymes, check out High Rollers featuring Consequence laying on the Q-Tip sound, Larger Than Life with Montage, and Yeah Yeah by Drag On, incorporating splinters of Ruff Ryders chemistry. With only ten tracks, Next Up comes up short on value but could be a historical source for a future American hip-hop star.



BEENIEMAN Art And Life Virgin-496792-F

Yes I ah! The Jamaican dancehall reggae superstar, who was catapulted into the mainstream consciousness with his hit, Who Am I, has arrived at a major label near you. Beenieman currently dominates the international, contemporary reggae scene in much the same way Shabba Ranks did almost a decade ago. And his popularity has spawned an album release through Virgin Records. Clearly, Art And Life is aimed at the hip-hop and R&B market with its fusion of hip hop, funky beats, and the incorporation of R&B and Rap stars (Mya, Wyclef and Redman). The first single, Girls Dem Sugar with Mya is the lyrical sequel to Who Am I, set to an East Coast R&B riff. Another track, Love Me Now is complemented by Naughty By Nature's OPP riff, while I've Got A Date rides the Staple Singer's I'll Take You There rhythm. Although the club grooves dominate, the dancehall licks that have become Beenie's shed are present on Analyze This, Trus Me, Crazy Notion, and Original Tune. The album is not without pleasant surprises in Art & Life – a Buju Banton styled ballad, or 9 to 5 – an uptempo, stripped down, funky-smooth ditty. It's doubtful that anything here will excite hit radio programmers immediately. Regardless, Beenie's name, video, and club play will excite old fans and garner new ones.



IDEAL Ideal Virgin-43226-F

Those R&B music fans who are familiar with the single Get Gone and Creep Inn from Ideal's debut album, released in 1999, may ask: why review an 'old' album? The answer is simple: The group and its record company have added two tracks - a new single Whatever and a remix of Get Gone - to the Texas quartet's album and re-released it. The process is called "stripping in". The decision to strip in the new song occurred after Ideal's members recently went into the studio with Kay Gee (Naughty By Nature) and P2 (Next) and emerged with a radio/club friendly, uptempo, summer song in Whatever. With no immediate plans for another album, the second single, Creep Inn had stiffed, and the possibility of the new single becoming a hit, the decision was made. That decision leaves those consumers who purchased the original album with a dilemma. Those who have yet to hear the album will be pleasantly surprised by the smooth and sexy grooves, laced with compelling harmonies. On the tracks Sexy Dancer, I Don't Know Why, and Tell Me Why, one can hear traces of K-Ci & Jo Jo, Usher, or Toni Braxton (bit of a stretch). Nevertheless, this album bodes well on its own merit, having received a new lease on life with the addition of a potential hit single



Burn Curb/EMI-77977-F

JO DEE MESSINA -Country/Pop

With the release of That's The Way, the first single, Messina has already laid the foundation for retail success for this release. Written by Annie Roboff and Holly Lamar, after only nine weeks, the single hits #5 on the RPM Country 100. A solid face-to-face promotion schedule will also help bring this CD home, the followup to I'm Alright which sold two million units in the US. And, with the crossover potential this one is expected to equal if not surpass that number. The single is being serviced to A/C radio. As Messina explained, Burn, the title track written by Tina Arena, Pam Reswick and Steve Werfel fits nicely into her own personal misadventures, "My career is working better than ever and my personal life is in a more secure place. But I had to go through hell to get there." A nice take on the Billy Montana, Helen Darling penning of Bring On The Rain, a duet with Tim McGraw, but it's that unmistakeable shimmering Messina vocal that adds the necessary punch ... she appears at ease with the message. That Messina styling also makes immediate ear impact on Downtime, written by Phillip Coleman and Carolyn Dawn Johnson, Saturday Night from the team of Annie Roboff and Tim Nichols and These Are The Days, written by Holly Lamar and Stephanie Bentley. A left-fielder could be If Not You from the songwriting team of Tom Shapiro and George Teren. With the support of country and A/C radio, Messina should be the hot item for the sun months. Produced by Byron Gallimore and Tim McGraw.

CLAY TYSON Kick It Down

Borealis-126 (Independent)

You might say Tyson is a chip off the old blocks, but be careful. He's a product of his own making. Influences? That's probable, but again, be careful. The younger Tyson has a voice that appears tailored to meet today's needs, not a

lot of warmth, but more matter-of-fact. He has handle on the traditional and the contemporary, and that includes all those interesting music genres, like folk, country, pop and rock and there's even a bit of a jazz influence. All tracks are 100 per cent MAPL and all are Tyson originals ... solid message fare with enough tongue-in-cheek to enhance that story line. It's tough to pick a favourite. Campus radio programmers will be all over this release. Patch into Kiss Is Kiss, Good Intention, Stitch In Time, Key and The Heart Is, and that's five potential singles. There are a couple of left-fielders as well; Ditch Digger and the title track. Produced by Danny Greenspoon, who also contributes lead, dobro and rhythm guitars, the other session musicians comprise the Breit Brothers: Kevin on guitar, mandolin, mando-cello and baritone mandolin and Gary on Keyboards, bassist Chris Gartner, drummer Gord Fynes and Leah Salomaa and Helena Kamika on background vocals, and, of course, Tyson on acoustic guitar. LEE AARON Slick Chick Barking Dog-007

We deplore rock- -- don't really consider it an art form -- but muchly admire the talents of some of its performers. So, it's an especial delight to hear rock vet Lee Aaron turn her considerable vocal skills to standard pop/jazz.



On this, her first album in four years, the liner notes confirm that she's paying homage to some of the singers who have inspired her including Nina Simone, Peggy Lee and even, Dinah Washington. She makes no attempt to imitate any of them however, other than to eschew the rock idion. By and large she succeeds in her mission. And, what a pleasure to hear again, Teach Me Tonight, a more or less torch standard from the days prior to the sexual revolution. Best track? Probably the title one but each auditor must make a personal decision. And, let us hope that radio PDs will give this much deserved airplay. The fact that it's Canadian content is simply frosting on this tasty cake. Produced by Aaron and Jane Milliken and recorded at Vancouver's Quantum Sound and Barking Dog Studios.

- Life BACCHUS/CLEMENT/DANNA Wilderness Mysterium Farthaven-1102

The late Charles Kuralt would end his On The Road TV programs with scenes of natural beauty that quite relaxed viewers watching on a lazy Sunday morning. Wilderness Mysterium is rather more exhilarating than relaxing as original compositions for mostly electronic instrumentation are heard foregrounding actual sounds of Canada's wilderness areas. What one hears are sound portraits that are, we believe, distinctively Canadian and, for the most part, wondrously enjoyable. As a younger man we used to take our children camping and still recall the distinct sounds of the night when the wee ones were asleep and one could listen in solitude. We can't say that the musical accompaniment here adds anything to them but it most certainly doesn't detract.





BRYAN POTVIN Heartbreakthrough

Klementine Music-21992-J

Given his experience both with the Northern Pikes and as part of the PolyGram/Universal A&R team, Bryan Potvin should know full well what it takes to find some radio airplay and sell some records these days. Getting a piece of Cancon played on the radio is one thing, but turning that airplay into record sales is an entirely different story, as too many Canadian artists (who shall remain nameless) have discovered in recent years. Potvin's songwriting pedigree with the Pikes obviously serves him well here - it's clear he possesses a good ear for a hook, and seems to effortlessly punch out one pleasing pop/rock tune after another. Too Late, for example, has a tasty melodic verse, followed by a simple yet snappy hook in the chorus. Heaven Is What You Leave Behind, as its title might suggest, is a subtle piece of pop, with a gentle intro disguising a reasonably powerful, almost soulful track. If Memory Serves trips along on a bouncy, hopeful rhythm, while You'll Just Have To Wait is another uplifting pop tune. Darling, You Live In A Dreamworld, perhaps the most



ambitious track on the record, is a beautifully detailed song that shows how far Potvin has evolved from his days with the Pikes. Free As A Bird is a simple, almost folky tune, with Lesley Stanwick aiding Potvin on some fine harmonies. Red Summer Sun, on the other hand, is back to the kind of straight-forward rock and roll from those ole' Pikes days. What Will I Do? features the harmonies of Emma Brown, and sounds almost Beatlesque in its construction. And finally, the title track is a quiet but effective conclusion to the record, and the one song that managed to quiet the industry grazers at Potvin's recent Toronto showcase. Potvin knows full well the way the rock and roll world works. When you take into

consideration his obvious familiarity with the process of breaking records, and the affection felt for Potvin within the Universal family, there's probably pretty good odds on this one breaking

Independent distributor making gains in video market

Koch has a Vision for the future of home video

The home video/DVD industry is growing at an incredible rate, and while most of us tend to think of only the big-budget feature films being released to video, there's an equally huge market for so-called niche videos, those that may not have a big name star attached, but are solid revenue sources all the same.

Koch Vision is the home video division of Koch International, one of the world's leading independent distributors. While still a relative newcomer to the home video business, Koch has quickly gained a prominent foothold in the industry by placing its focus on said so-called niche videos, and have carved out a nice business doing it.

When it comes to their home video line, the main priority for Koch is still their line of WWF videos, comprised of some 60 current titles, which continue to be hot sellers. Alongside that, in a completely different vein, is their line of product from Halifax's Salter Street films, including videos from the TV series Lexx and Emily Of New Moon.

In terms of the WWF line, Koch Canada president Dominique Zgarka says the main priority is to create zones within the retail outlets, both traditional and non-traditional retailers, and to ensure a good retail placement for those zones.

"In certain cases it's simply audio, video and DVD, with the nice header card in an end rack, or in some cases, it's actually a metal merchandiser, where we invited the other WWF licensees – t-shirts, toys, etc. – to all be on the same rack. And that works extremely well."

Yet, while the WWF videos have been a great revenue source, Koch continues to reap the benefits of the WWF audio CDs as well. Both WWF albums released in 1999 went on to sell over 250,000 units combined.

"You would think, with the WWF being a visual experience, that the videos would be a lot stronger than the CDs. But both properties, both audio and video, sell well."

Not surprisingly, Zgarka notes that audio continues to be far more profitable than video. Videos cost twice the price of a CD to manufacture, and the average video sell price is \$8.17, compared to an average price of \$13.95 for audio CDs. Then there's the P.O.P. materials involved – cardboard or

metal merchandisers, header cards, posters, etc., and the service organizations to deal with non-traditional audio-video retailers like Zellers or Wal-Mart.

Beth Gibbs, vice-president, Koch Vision, adds that "there's also a lot more mandatory advertising with key video titles in the mailer ads. If you want them to be noticed, you have to take four-colour ads, and they're expensive."

Other than the WWF and Salter Street lines, Koch Vision has also entered into a distribution arrangement with Discovery Channel, TLC (The Learning Channel) and Animal Planet, for distribution of their extensive lines of home videos.

The Discovery, TLC, Animal Planet line runs the gamut, with educational and entertainment videos on historical events, science, the military, nature and wildlife, as well as family oriented 'edutainment' videos.

The Discovery line was being handled by Alliance Atlantis (distributed by Universal) before they went to Koch. Zgarka and company saw the Discovery line as a perfect fit for their niche style of marketing. And they also enacted an aggressive price model for the line to make it more appealing to the retailers.

"We went with \$9.99 promotions and \$14.99 promotions, and the sell-through at accounts like Zellers and Wal-Mart and other non-traditional retailers was incredible. And the record stores have been doing extremely well with the line as well. It doesn't do very well in the video retailers. But what

we found is that if you do it in the right price point, you put it in a merchandiser with the right mix of product, and sales are fabulous. Music World's done great promotions with us, Safeway's done two already, and it's the same thing with Costco. So we're really giving it a much wider availability in the marketplace, and it's definitely working."

And while he admits that consumers (and retailers) tend to generalize when regarding product from Discovery, TLC or Animal Planet, pigeonholing it as educational, rather than entertaining, Zgarka also feels that there is a sizeable market out there for such product.

"When you look at the wonderful product it is — I've got three teenage kids who love this product, and they don't necessarily shop at Indigo or Chapters. They shop at HMV or Music World or Chapters Online, for that matter. The demographics are much younger than people anticipated for this line."

Another product line just recently picked up by Koch was the Living Arts line of health and fitness videos. Titles in the line are items such as Stress Yoga For Beginners, Couples Massage, Total Body Workout, A.M. Chi For Beginners, and the Classic Art Of Sensual Massage.

Like the Discovery line, the Living Arts line is obviously a niche genre, but that hasn't stopped the videos from becoming significant sellers at both the traditional and non-traditional outlets.

"We just acquired it (Living Arts) - it's only been about two months that we've been doing it, and the volume we've done in the last 60 days on the Living Arts is equal to the volume we've done on the WWF in the same period. We did tests with Rogers, Costco, Blockbuster - those are the three main ones where we did really large tests - and all three have placed huge reorders already. HMV and Music World have just committed to national promotions in all their stores of the Living Arts line, as have Zellers, Wal-Mart and Future Shop. So we can see that this line is absolutely exploding for us."

Koch has also acquired the distribution rights for Apex films, a line of smaller budget, direct-to-video movies. While the films involved may not be familiar to the average film watcher, the Apex line does carry enough notable names to generate some consumer interest.

As Gibbs notes, the line features titles such as Jane Doe (starring Calista Flockart of Ally McBeal), Gun (with James Gandolfini, of The Sopranos), Dying To Get Rich (Sean Young and Dan Ackroyd) and Coming Soon (Mia Farrow and Ryan O'Neal).

Zgarka knows that viewers may regard such films as 'B' movies, but by pricing them aggressively and getting some decent racking space, they're able to generate some revenue. However, Koch certainly has no plans to get into the feature film business.

"They're just nice, cute movies that do extremely well at the rental stage at Blockbuster, Rogers, etc., and then you aggressively price them at sell-through and you sell some decent quantities. The theatrical business really isn't something we want to get into – it belongs to the Alliance Atlantis's of the world, they're experts at it. We are, to a certain degree, niche players, so in the audio and video markets, we find items to sell that the multinationals may not be that interested in."

The price point of VHS videos is something of a concern in the home video business, especially with the growing penetration of DVD. At one point, not too long ago, the standard SLP for VHS was \$39.98, followed by \$29.98, then \$24, and now \$19. Zgarka says the pressure is on now to reduce that SLP even futher to \$14.98, perhaps even \$9.98.

Such a downward price pressure does not yet exist for DVDs, which is not surprising, given that the format is still relatively new to the consumer. Not to mention the fact that DVDs are seen, like CDs, as more of a collectible item, something you'll purchase once and never have to purchase again.

For those reasons, the current SLP on DVDs of approximately \$32.98 will remain fairly consistent, at least until the overall DVD player penetration increases.

Still though, given the price of DVDs, both Zgarka and Gibbs are surprised at the sales of DVDs, particularly on product like the WWF.

"On certain product lines you expect DVDs to work," notes Zgarka. "People in the industry didn't really think that the average WWF consumer, for example, would buy into DVDs. And yet, we've been blown away by the DVD business we're doing."

"We're selling about 3,500 units each on the WWF," adds Gibbs. "And on the WWF, you're talking about DVDs priced at either \$29.98 or \$32.98."





A loose revamping of Shakespeare's classic mixed with an intense plot and a killer soundtrack means Romeo Must Die will enjoy tremendous success when it hits the streets on VHS and DVD on August 1st. With over \$60 million grossed at the box office and a huge push from Warner Home Video, this release will have all the naysayers shaking their heads in amazement. - SL

THE BIG TEASE Warner Home Video

Craig Ferguson (The Drew Carey Show) plays Crawford Mackenzie in what turns out to be a delightfully witty movie. Mackenzie is going about his normal flaymboyant hairstylist lifestyle in Glasgow when he gets an invitation to Los Angeles for the Platinum Scissors hair styling competition. The news of him going to the US creates such a stir in his hometown that he agreed to let someone go along with him and make a documentary about his trip. Upon his arrival he quickly learns that he had misinterpreted the invitation and he was invited randomly as a spectator and no





MAGNOLIA Universal

Writer/director Paul Thomas Anderson is quickly becoming the Orson Welles of his generation. Welles, as most film buffs know, directed and starred in his masterpiece, Citizen Kane, when he was just 25 years of age. Anderson, who looks like he should be cramming for his mid-terms, has already written and directed the now-classic Boogie Nights, as well as the lesser known but intriguing Hard Eight (starring John C. Reilly, Phillip Baker Hall, Samuel L. Jackson and Gwyneth Paltrow). This latest opus begins with a curious depiction of some alarming, almost laughable coincidences, before melting into a day in the lives of an amalgamation of various characters, all of whom are subtly connected. There's the over-the-top chauvinistic sex guru (Tom Cruise) who's got something to hide; the aging millionaire (Jason Robards) who's dying mainly because of cancer, partially because of guilt; the humdrum LA cop (Reilly) who's probably too nice for his own good; the drugaddicted woman (Melora Walters) who's clearly been scarred by her past: the dying game-show host (Hall) who's also hiding a dark secret from his past; the

millionaire's spaced-out wife (Julianne Moore) who uses profanity like a defense mechanism; the former game show wiz kid (William H. Macy) who's now down-on-his-luck; and the current game show wiz kid, who's trapped into his newfound fame by his callous father. Each of the characters experiences a form of revelation during this one day, and the secrets and scars of their past eventually rise to the surface, bringing a convergence to the story. The eventual apocalyptic conclusion would seem almost laughable in circumstances, but given the converging flow of the storylines, this ironic epiphany seems profoundly apropos. The film generated three Academy Award nominations, including best original screenplay and best supporting actor (Cruise), although it's tough to single out Cruise among so many brilliant performances. The question now is, what does Anderson do next? - RR




STRESS RELIEF GIFT SET Living Arts (Koch)

Koch has done an admirable job of procuring the distribution rights to a number of niche video lines, and their latest acquisition is the Living Arts line of health and fitness videos (see Koch story page 15), ranging from Tai Chi, to yoga to sensual massage to fitness work outs. This package, nicely priced at just \$24.99 SLP, is obviously packaged up as a nice gift item for someone special. The principal element of the package is a 30-minute video featuring noted yoga instructor Suzanne Deason presenting a series of yoga exercises to relieve stress. In addition, there's a bottle containing an ounce of balancing oil, which is a mix of 'rich oils, Ayurvedic herbs and plant and flower essences.' And finally, the package contains a CD entitled Adagio: Music For Healing, a 60-minute collection of relaxing melodies composed and produced by Peter Davison. Koch has wisely opted to rack this one in the health and fitness departments of the non-traditional retailers, and it could be a consistent seller come the holiday season.

JAWS AND CLAWS Discovery Kids (Koch)

For those kids who just can't get enough of creepy, slimy things, this Discovery Kids video is right up their alley. This 45-minute video, subtitled Creepy Komodos And Slimy Snakes, is part of a three-part Jaws And Claws series that also features Wild Dogs And Fierce Felines (hyenas, lions and tigers, oh my!) and Really Big Teeth (sharks and



crocodiles). Kids will eat up (no pun intended) this particular video, which includes a trip to Indonesia to check out the Komodo Dragon, an excursion to India to meet the Red Spitting Cobra, and a visit to Venezuela to see the giant anaconda. Each video in the series is priced at \$14.99 SRP, with the combined three-pack available at \$39.99.



ISLAND OF THE DRAGONS (The Exotic Creatures Of Indonesia) The Discovery Channel Video Library (Koch)

Take a trip to Indonesia to visit the world of the Komodo Dragon, a creature that grows to 10 feet in length and weighs close to 300 pounds, in this 60-minute video from The Discovery Channel. Directed by John McKenney, and written and produced by Barry Clark (with Jack Randall acting as technical adviser), this video explores the myriad of creatures that are native to the 13,000 islands that make up the Indonesian Archipelago. audio product. The in-store P.O.P. is far more extensive, and naturally, far more expensive.

And as Zgarka points out, the marketing and promotion of home video isn't like that of audio CDs, where the first targets are radio and MuchMusic. Koch feeds as much info as they can to the press, but the lack of a consistent home video industry press makes getting proper coverage and reviews difficult. Thus, a lot of the marketing and promotion takes place directly at the retail level.

"And it depends on the lines too," Gibbs adds. "With the WWF, because it's such a visual medium, we have a huge TV advertising campaign that we book annually, so we do send a lot of advertising in that direction. With Discovery Channel as well, when they've got Shark Week or Snake Week, it's the best opportunity for us to buy ads."

The next step for Koch Vision is a further investment in the children's home video market, an expansion that will occur with potential distribution deals with a pair of as yet unnamed Canadian video lines. There are also some US based children's video companies that have approached Koch regarding distribution. Koch has already enjoyed some strong sales success with their Pokemon audio product, and can naturally see the benefit of being in the kids video field.

At the moment, as mentioned earlier, VHS remains the medium of choice for video consumers, with DVD slowly edging its way towards the top. Most video retailers believe that DVD will likely overtake VHS by the end of next year, given its current rate of growth.

Zgarka says the commitment from retailers to DVD has been surprisingly quick and extensive, and that commitment will only add to consumer confidence in the format.

'It's about 75-25 right now (VHS vs. DVD), and we would expect that by the first quarter of 2001, that it would be 50-50. You now see DVD players priced at \$300, so you know it's going to be a huge Christmas gift item. Last year was a pretty good year for hardware, but there still wasn't enough software available, and Blockbuster, Wal-Mart, Zellers, etc., had not made that commitment to DVDs yet. Now they have, Blockbuster and Rogers both have wonderful DVD sections, and if you check out Wal-Mart you'd be amazed at their DVD collection. So the consumer is now seeing that the product is available on both a rental and sales basis, and that will help convince them to move to that technology."
