Judge rejects Napsters defense in copyright lawsuit

A US federal court judge rejected Napster Inc's defense against an RIAA lawsuit, a defense that argued that Napster is protected by digital copyright law.

The industry association sued the California-based Napster back in December, arguing that the music file swapping software violated copyright law.

The RIAA accused Napster of encouraging users of its software to openly trade copyrighted music without permission of the artists or labels.

Napster lawyers contend that their service is legal, because it does not directly provide the

copyrighted music only the means to get it. Napster is also facing a separate lawsuit from Warner Music metal band Metallica.

The company sought to have itself defined as an internet service provider, thereby limiting its liability under the Digital Millennium Copyright Act.

However Judge Marilyn Hall Patel refused to grant Napsters request that the suit be dismissed, noting that Napster is not entitled to the safe harbour under the Digital Millennium Copyright Act because it "does not transmit, route, or provide connections

for allegedly infringing material through its system."

The safe harbour provision of the Digital Copyright Act was designed to protect ISPs such as America Online, AT&T, Worldnet, etc., from illegal actions committed by users.

Patel further noted that although the Napster server conveys address information to establish a connection between the requesting and host users, the connection itself occurs through the Internet.

RIAA president Hilary Rosen responded to the judges decision by adding, "This hearing was Napsters attempt to escape responsibility."

Digital delivery set for EMI recorded product

Ken Berry, President and CEO of EMI Recorded Music, has announced plans for the release of more than 100 albums and 40 associated singles as part of a "digital download" trial. Among those earmarked for the trial are Susan Aglukark, D'Angelo, deTalk, Janet, Moist, Anne Murray, Pink Floyd, Selena, Frank Sinatra, Snoop Dogg, Spice Girls and Tina Turner.

Beginning July 1, the downloads will be available for sale through major retailers where, it was pointed out, EMI "will work with its digital service providers to enable the retailers to sell EMI's digital products initially in a single format, Windows Media," where it will ensure "the consumer experience is as easy and straightforward as possible."

The suggested retail pricing for the albums and singles will be similar to that which it uses for traditional retail sales. The trial is expected to expand outside of North America by the end of the year.

"Berry explains "Digital delivery will eventually become part of our standard release pattern. We are committed to making high quality music available to the consumer in a variety of media. This will allow our artists' fans to take advantage of new ways of consuming music while ensuring that artists and producers are compensated for their work. This trial is just the beginning: a small portion of the great catalogue of music from EMI."

Richard Cottrell, President of EMI Music Distribution, points out that the company "is capitalizing on our strong relationships with our

existing retail customer base and their strong brands, their market positions and their unique consumer knowledge. This is the first step in building the necessary framework and infrastructure for the digital future."

It was also pointed out that EMI "will ensure that consumers have the flexibility to use downloads on home computers, to burn CD-R's, and to transfer copies to portable devices." Up to two re-installs of a download will be allowed onto consumer systems

Iceberg Media.com has announced the appointment of Ted Boyd as president and chief operating officer. Boyd, the former president of Indigo Online, will replace current president and COO Jim Hardy, who will remain on the board and serve as a consultant to Iceberg.

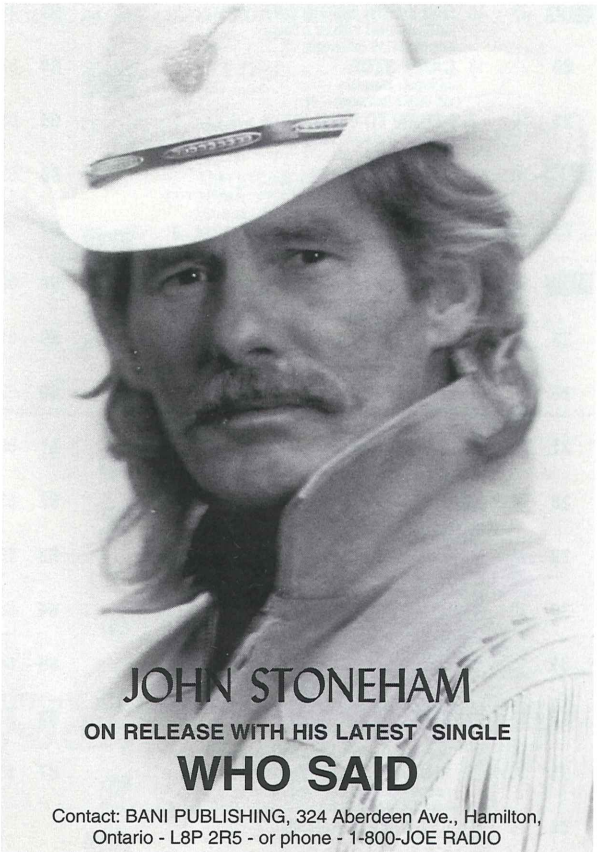

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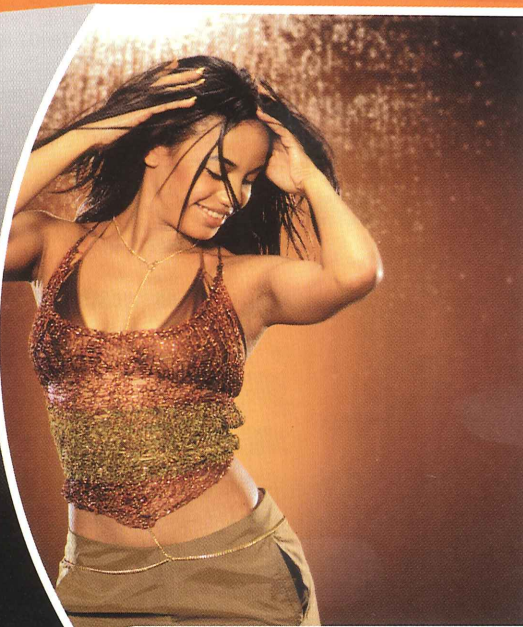

Shirley Myers has the ear of Nashville's Music City Row. No One, a song she wrote with fellow New Brunswicker Rod Nicholson, impressed the Warner Bros people, who suggested that she do a duet of it with Chad Brock. It's now a done deal and is to be included on the upcoming New Country 7, released on the Warner Bros label. It's possible however, that No One will be released as a single before the album. In the meantime, Myers has shifted dates around so as to attend both the Variety Club Salute To Big Country Luncheon on May 24 where she and Brock will perform the duet, and at the Big Country Awards show on June 9. Myers and her manager Peter Leggett haven't missed the Variety Club and Big Country Awards dates since she launched her career in 1991. Myers is currently chalking up impressive spins at country radio with her latest single, I'm Missing You, which bullets up to #33 this week on the RPM Country 100 after only two weeks. The song was written by Myers, Nicholson and Duane Steele and is included on her Stony Plain CD There Will Come A Day. Myers was in Toronto this past week where she appeared on the Mike Bullard's Open Mike CTV show and the next day taped a segment for Canada AM.

Faith Hill continues to make incredible gains at both country and A/C radio. The Way You Love Me moves into the #1 slot on the RPM Country 100, and Breathe, the title track of her Warner Bros CD, holds at #1 for the second week on the A/C chart. Breathe had previously hit #1 on the country chart on Dec. 20/98.

Tim McGraw has the biggest mover this week. Some Things Never Change, a track taken from his Curb/Capitol CD Everywhere, jumps up to #42 from #77.

Lonestar hits hard with the release of What About Now, the follow-up to Smile which is still charting (#67) after 32 weeks. Interesting too is that Amazed, the band's crossover giant, enjoyed 49 weeks of country chart action and topped the RPM A/C 100 on April 17/2000 for three consecutive weeks and still holds at #2 after 38 weeks. All three tracks are included on Lonely Grill, released on the BNA label. The CD is the top 3 country seller at retail right behind Shania Twain and Dixie Chicks.

Rick Tippe makes a strong showing with When You Say Jump, the follow-up to More Where That Came From, that enjoyed 21 weeks of charting. The new single, a Tippe original, enters the chart at #63. The track, taken from Tippe's Moon Tan album, Shiver 'n' Shake - Get Hot III, is also included on a three-song promotional CD which also includes a radio edit of the track and Texas Is Where It's At, also a Tippe original. The album was produced by Tippe, Chris Rolin and Raymond Arthur Harvey.

Pop recording artist Jason Allan just may do the opposite by crossing over into country. Promoter/songwriter James Collins, who is guiding Allan's career, detected enough country in Allan's recording of Frozen In Time, that he has launched a major campaign to country radio. Initial response has been very positive. "The release could turn into a crossover wedding day type of song," says Collins. Produced by Anthony Vanderburgh, well-known guitarist who backs many of Canada's top recording artists including Amy Sky, the track is included on Allan's 8-song EP, released on the Popular label distributed by EMI Music.

Lorrie Church kicks in with chart action on I Never Gave Up Hope, a song she wrote with Cyril Rawson and Kim Tribble, which enters the chart at #71. The single is the title track of Church's CD released on the Eaglehill label which is based in Gallivan, Saskatchewan. It's not clear where the track was recorded or what Cancon properties it has.

Canadian Songwriters Night turned more than a few heads in Nashville at the 8th annual Tin Pan South celebration of songs and songwriters. Hosted by Carolyn Dawn Johnson the showcase was held (April 6) at Radio Café. Highlights of the evening included Johnson, performing her version of her

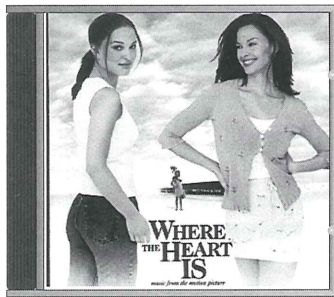

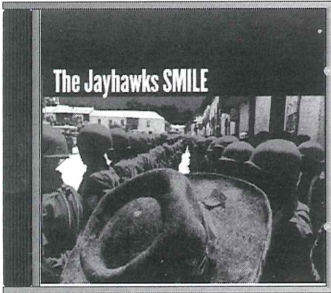

age. Country queen Martina McBride contributes There You Are, a nice ballad quite typical of McBride's AC/country sound. The Corrs offer So Young, with that poppy, almost-too-cute Corrs harmonizing. And then there's Mr. Lovett, with a delightfully sixties sounding cover of Ray Charles' classic, What'd I Say. Ms. Harris teams with Patty Griffin on the rhythmically oriented Beyond The Blue, while Jennifer Day pops in with another ballad, Completely. Other notables here are Osborne with Tommy Sims on the almost satirical R&B tune, Rowdy Booty Time; red-hot country favourites Lonestar doing up the Platters' classic Only You in their typical over-the-top Lonestar fashion; and Hiatt, with his wonderful grassroots sound on Let It Slip Away. Soundtracks tend to be hit and miss most of the time, with labels often using them simply to unleash their latest signees. But this one's solid from top to bottom. And in keeping with the Lyle Lovett rule, there's probably another rule suggesting that any movie with Ashley Judd can't be too bad. **-RR**



THE JAYHAWKS - Pop Smile

Columbia/American-69522-H
Put together a list of the best records you've heard this year, and then put this near the top of the list. Slap the disc into your CD player and listen to the gorgeous harmonizing on the title track, and you'll, well, smile. Then segue into the Wilbury-esque lead single, I'm Gonna Make You Love Me, and you'll just keep smiling. Oh, and it just keeps going with the third song, What Led Me To This Town, with its ultra laid-back bridge and almost gospel-like chorus ("Blue lights are shining over my life"). A standard slice of rhythm programming leads into the fourth cut Somewhere In Ohio, with its singalong Ba-Ba-Ba-Ba-Ba-Ba chorus. A Break In The Clouds is just sweeteett, with another terrific hook in the chorus ("Everytime I see your face/It's like cool, cool water running down my back") and more absolutely pure harmonizing. Queen Of The World is perhaps the most obvious indicator of the presence of producing guru Bob Ezrin, who agreed to produce the record after hearing a 30-song demo sent to him by the band. Life Floats By is another up-tempo number, probably the most rock-oriented track on the record, and again, that Ezrin touch is very apparent. Broken Harpoon is a subtle little ditty written and sung singlehandedly by frontman Gary Louris. Pretty Thing features some particularly scathing lyrics from someone who obviously had a bad female experience, while Mr. Wilson contains one of those rambling choruses that sounds eerily Beatlesque. (In My) Wildest Dreams, co-written by Ezrin, is another very countryfied sounding song, although Ezrin's artsy rock touches turn it into something decidedly different. Better Days has a nice bit of echo harmonizing in its verse, and don't overlook the nice Canadian references in the lyrics ("Made love in the Toronto rain/From Hamilton I took the train"). And finally there's Baby, Baby, Baby, a sprawling electrified picture of a car crash. Okay, so there may be a couple of tracks on here that don't really have the hooks to stand on their own. So this music's so undefinable that radio won't really know what to do with it. It's still tremendously refreshing to hear such a host of quality songs, instead of the usual overproduced blase boy band banality or rap/metal trailer trash. **-RR**

WHERE THE HEART IS - Pop/Country Various Artists
RCA-67963-N

There's probably a rule out there which suggests that any soundtrack/compilation album that contains a Lyle Lovett track can't be too bad. Add in the likes of The Corrs, Emmylou Harris, Joan Osborne and John Hiatt, and you've got a tasty little package of electric country. Beth Neilsen Chapman's Shake My Soul doesn't do much for the listener, but that's probably just a trifle. BMG's hot new rock 'n blues teen queen, Shannon Curfman, appears with Few And Far Between, a song that thoroughly belies her diminutive



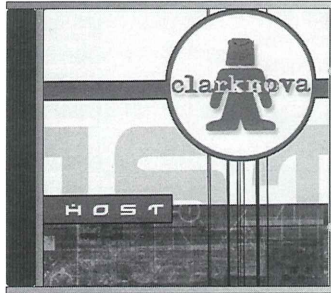
MISSION: IMPOSSIBLE 2 O.S.T. - Rock Various Artists

Fred Durst must have been just licking his chops at the prospect of hammering out the theme song for M: I-2. After the laid back, almost funkified version provided by U2's Adam Clayton and Larry Mullen on the first soundtrack, album producer Mitchell Leib obviously had a desire to crank things up a notch this time out. The result is a smattering of mashing metal mavens, led by the ubiquitous Limp Bizkit, who's Take A Look Around (Theme From M: I-2) is not only in typical Bizkit style, but is also indicative of the hard core heavy guitar sounds of the rest of the tracks. The lead single comes courtesy of Metallica, who offer I Disapper, which sounds like, well, Metallica. The oh so frightening Rob Zombie pops in with the daintily titled Scum Of The Earth, as do the Butthole Surfers with They Came In. Perhaps the choicest cut of the bunch is the Foo Fighters, teaming up with Queen alumnus Brian May on Pink Floyd's Have A Cigar. There's several relative unknowns here, including The Pimps (Rocket Science), Uncle Kracker (What U Lookin' At?, produced by Kid Rock), Apartment 26 (the thoroughly undecipherable Backwards), Tinfed (Immune) and Australia's Powderfinger (Not My Kinda Scene). But then there's Tori Amos?!, with the very circus-like Carnival, which sounds like it belongs on another album. The movie should be huge, and with the likes of Limp Bizkit and Metallica present, the soundtrack should be equally monstrous. **-RR**

CLARKNOVA - Rock Host
Resort Records-0158800132-Oasis

There's nothing like some good Canadian industrial rock to start off the summer. Clarknova is on the Resort Records label, now distributed by Oasis Entertainment, and judging by the sounds of this first CD, could

provide a strong alternative (no pun intended) to current Canadian rock heavyweights Matthew Good or Our Lady Peace. The tunes are absolutely guitar driven, that churning Pearl Jam-esque guitar that so many young bands have fallen in love with. However, unlike a lot of other metal mashers surviving today, Clarknova seems to have a good musical ear, and if you sift through the fuzz, you can actually discern a credible melody in most of the songs. Besides their affinity for a real decent hook, the other thing that seems to separate the band from so many other pretenders is the voice of lead vocalist Steve Kulba - he sounds like a cross between Ed Roland and Richard Patrick,



deep and heavy, with that sort of deep down dirtiness that can take an ordinary song and turn it into something slightly nastier. Kulba's bandmates - bassist Chris Ferguson, drummer John Lord, and guitarists Scott Wilson and Greg Caines - are solid players, and can definitely rip it when given the chance. If there's one quibble, it's that Kulba's voice often gets overwhelmed by the guitars and industrialized production. Newmarket, Ontario used to be known as the home of the baby Leafs and Serial Joe - now they can boast Clarknova as well. And touring nationally with the Headstones won't hurt either. Produced by Paul Northfield and Brad Nelson, and recorded at Toronto's Great Big Music, Morin Heights and Newmarket Multimedia. So hey rock radio guys, it's fully Cancon, which gives you no excuse not to play it. **-RR**



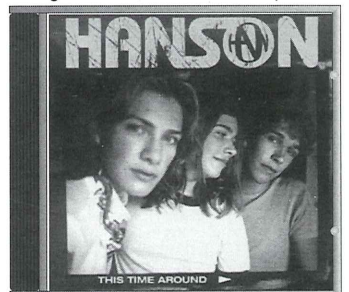
PAN OUT NOW - Rock/Pop

What do you call this music? Well, it's not really rock, although a quick listen to lead track Satellite reveals some real raunchy guitar licks and fairly substantial percussion. But then there's also some nice bouncy keyboard work, and some rather ear-pleasing harmonies - so it's hard to know what to call it. Pan Out Now consists of Tim Foley (vocals/keyboards), Stephanie Sheri (vocals/keyboards), Darren Poirer (guitars), Charlie Morgan (drums) and occasionally Mark Shannon (bass on a couple of tracks). Foley is obviously the principal player in the group, penning most of the songs and handling most of the lead vocals, along with Sheri. And Foley is certainly a songwriter with some talent. Tracks like the aforementioned Satellite, the more pop oriented Life, the rhythmically quirky Fever Pitch, the acoustically ambitious Here Now In The Knowing (with Sheri's beautiful vocals), are reflective of a songwriter who prefers to work outside the normal ABACA boundaries of musical charts. And there's definitely a message in the music, relating the struggles of Canada's aboriginal community, most clearly evoked in Nations. The message may occasionally overpower the medium, as is the case with their cover of Bruce Cockburn's Stolen Land, an angry, guitar-oriented rant. Five Long Days is a sad yet surprisingly uplifting picture of the death of a loved one. Chronomes slips back into a heavy guitar groove, with a satirical look at the nineties lifestyle. And Reverie is just that, a sweeping

HANSON - Pop
This Time Around

There is a difference between boy bands and boy groups. Boy groups, like the Backstreet Boys, *N Sync, Five, and so on and so on, generally sing songs written by professional writers, and concentrate on the show, with the choreographed dancing, the clothes, the hair, the crystalline production, and the million-dollar videos. Boy bands, on the other hand, are the ones that actually play their own instruments, write their own songs, and can really play live, instead of singing to a back-up band or a DAT. The Hanson boys started off sounding very much like a boy group, with that make-the-girls-scream first, infamous single, MMMBop. But a few years later, with puberty obviously behind them, the brothers are starting to sound like a real pop, dare we say, even rock, band. There's no wimpy pop preening here, no soppy ballads, no computerized rhythms or digitized sampling. This is real rock and roll, and it's good. The years in between their first album and this have not only deepened their voices, but also allowed their instrumental and songwriting talents to grow. The first couple of tracks on this record are straight forward rock numbers, with both You Never Know and If Only showing the Hanson lads at their guitar-grooving best. Lead single This Time Around, with its sing-along chorus and gospelish piano backing, is a clearcut sign that the Hansons have moved on from their poppy Mmmmbop days. What's terrific about this record is that there's actually some depth here - not the kind of cheesy pop banality that we're used to hearing from so many boy bands/groups, where one song sounds exactly like the next. Runaway Run is more guitar pop, with a solid hook that should attract radio attention. Save Me is a slower, more soulful tune, again showcasing the lads' more mature vocals. Dying To Be Alive has another great hook, while Can't Stop has a potent guitar intro and, hey, another great hook. Wish That I Was There sounds a little more like the Hanson of old (if that's possible), with its harmonized chorus, but then things slow right down on one of the few ballads on the record, appropriately titled Love Song. There's still more familiar pop sound on Sure About It, while Hand In Hand affords the boys a chance to demonstrate their advancing songwriting talents, with its slow buildup to, yes, yet another good hook. And In The City rocks as well as any tune on the record, with a few scratches and bluesy riffs thrown in to give a solid, street-level feel. The Hansons have obviously grown up on the kind of seventies rock and roll they should really be too young for, and it's clearly filtered in to their songwriting. The only question now is whether occasionally ultra-biased programmers will give this record the chance it deserves. **-RR**

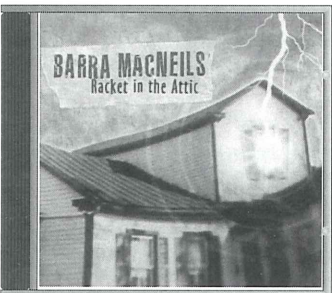

NEIL YOUNG - Pop

If Neil Young were any more divided, he'd be schizophrenic. There's the Neil Young that all the kids love, the one who records with Pearl Jam and is called the Godfather of grunge - and then there's the other Neil Young, the one who worked with Crosby, Stills & Nash, and recorded Harvest, and then Harvest Moon, and now this album, which is another reflection of those midwestern Canadian country roots. Compared to Rockin' In The Free World and Downtown this album is almost sleep enhancement. Therefore, the kids might not be after this one, but all those aging Yorkville hippies who flocked to the CSNY show last month will probably eat it up. Silver & Gold is all about acoustic guitars, harmonicas and very simple harmonies, with the songs reflecting Young's folksy/countryfied upbringing. The production here (by Young and Ben Keith) has been scaled way back, with the percussion barely visible, and that unique Young falsetto taking centre stage. There's definitely songs here that country radio will take a hankering to, including the title track, the Harvest-like Great Divide, or the prophetic Buffalo Springfield Again, in which Young talks about his desire to reunite with his old bandmates (this one was recorded just prior to the CSNY reunion). Old friends Linda Ronstadt and Emmylou Harris contribute backing vocals on the short but sweet Red Sun, which also features a nice pedal steel solo. The drums are actually quite audible on the almost sixties sounding Distant Camera, while Razor Love is one of those epic folk tracks Young fans love to hear. And Without Rings provides a sombre conclusion to the record. It's hard to see radio getting very excited about this very laid back album - but those countless Young fans are out there, and the retail numbers should reflect that. -RR



BARRA MACNEILS - Celtic

The Barra MacNeils are back. Lucy (lead and backing vocals, fiddle, bodhran, celtic harp, stepdance); Stewart (lead and backing vocals, accordions, Irish flute, whistles, electric and acoustic guitars); Kyle (lead and backing vocals, fiddle, mandolin, electric mandolin, acoustic guitar); Sheumas (backing vocals, acoustic piano, keyboard), the tightly-knit, celtic-driven and vocally-pure family band from Sydney Mines, Cape Breton. And, they pull no punches with this release produced by Danny Greenspoon. Although they strayed a little into the pop world with a couple of Steeleye Span and Fleetwood Mac covers (Second Hand News and Misty Moisty Morning respectively),

suffice to say, their musical signature overrides any real intrusion into that genre. The CD is cleverly programmed to highlight every imaginable talent the quartet has: as multi-instrumentalists, as lead and harmony vocalists, as tunesmiths and, with a little stardance as an added ingredient for listener entertainment. As arrangers, they've also added their own spin to traditional fare like Rattlin' Roarin' Willie (uilleann pipes and whistles by Paddy Maloney), Misty Moisty Morning (vocals by Great Big Sea) and Tullochgorum. Queen Of Argyle, written by Andy Stewart with Kyle up on lead vocals, has been taken as the first single. The album was recorded at Puck's Farm in Bolton, Ontario with additional recording at Toronto's Canterbury Studios. -WG

SUE FOLEY - Blues

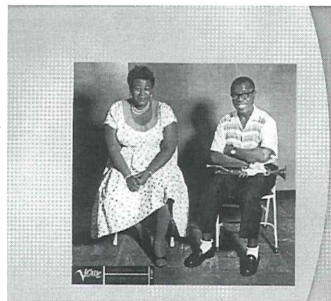
Ottawa born Foley, a name that stirs memories of her 1991 release of Young Girl Blues, returns to her roots ... blues. And Foley knows how to wail with the best of them. This is her sixth album release since then, and not too many blues artists can boast an even half-dozen albums. So, there will be a natural intent to compare. Well, stop right there ... Foley has expanded on her vocal methodology with the blues, not a niche, but rather an open book on her interpretation of the genre. Nothing complicated, which is in keeping with the whole program ... simple, touching, but the direction is straight to the heart. As a matter of fact, to savour that full vocal elegance, patch into Wow



Strong first and the rest is the gravy. She had the creme de la creme of session pickers as well, including guitar impresario Colin Linden, who also produced the album and he does it with dobro, baritone, high-string, acoustic and electric guitars throughout the session. He is joined by Terry Wilkins (string bass), Richard Bell and Ken Pearson (organ, piano), Bryan Owings and Miche Pouliot (drums), Richard Price (bass), Joe Cabral (sax) and Mark Mullins (trombone). And, Foley's no slouch on the guitar (nylon string, electric and acoustic). Favourite track? There are 12 of them. But check out Empty Cup, written by Foley and Montreal's Ray Bonneville. What makes this track special is the "smokey harmonies" of Lucinda Williams, and it's country blues to boot. Each track has a memorable side of its own: Mediterranean Breakfast, which borders on flamenco, the guitar work courtesy of Foley; Same Thing is a blues standard written by Willie Dixon and made legendary by Muddy Waters; and Oh Baby (We Got A Good Thing Goin') written by '60s Texas troubadour Barbara Lynn are made even more memorable with Foley's treatment. Most tracks are 100% Cancon. Recorded at the Tragically Hip's Bathhouse Studio and mixed at Daniel Lanois' Kingsway Studio in New Orleans' French Quarter. -WG

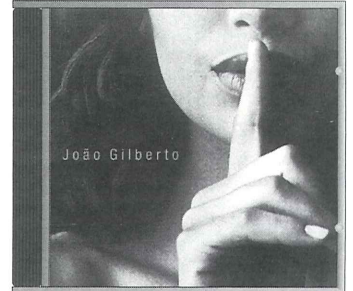
ELLA FITZGERALD - Jazz Vocal

Hard to believe that the L.P. first appeared 44 years ago. Even harder to believe is the accompaniment provided by the Oscar Peterson Trio (Brown and Ellis) and Buddy Rich on drums. Though it could have been dominant it's properly subservient, Peterson et al play melody only and Buddy Rich employs brushwork almost exclusively ensuring that the enterprise belongs to the principals. Lovingly and meticulously re-engineered, the album presents them at the arguable peak of their powers singing and playing standards a la mode de jazz, simply and uncluttered. As for

Gentle, oh so gentle, yet sensual music played and sung by the man who brought Latin American pop to North America on its own terms. The liner notes are entirely in Portuguese which is not our strong suit among languages and, so we can't say whether this is a reissue, an album of "all time hits" or a new production. Frankly, it doesn't matter. What does, is that



his soft voice and dulcet guitar fall pleasantly upon the ears. You'll be tempted to play the album, which of course includes Desafinada as late night relaxation or possible seduction music. That's alright one supposes but it deserves to be heard with one's full attention It's an artistic triumph and, we repeat, oh so gentle. -BW

BEN WEBSTER - Jazz

We weary sometimes, of reviewing so many jazz albums that feature tenor sax as the lead instrument. But, when an album features saxmasters Webster, Coleman Hawkins and Budd Johnson playing together, it becomes a positive pleasure. Adding to the pleasure are supporting artists Roy Eldridge (trumpet),



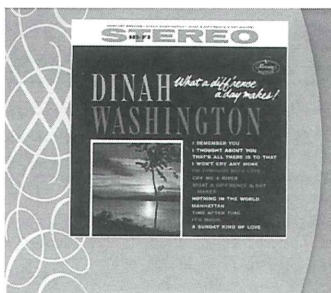
Jimmy Jones (piano), Les Spann (guitar), Ray Brown (bass) and Jo Jones (drums). This is a studio work from 1959 after the advent of 33 1/3 LP and the musicians, especially Webster, clearly revel in their freedom from the old 78, three to five minutes max, format. There are only five tracks. None are shorter than 4:43 and the lead one is an astounding 20 minutes and 23 seconds of Ellington's In A Mellow Mood. The others are Webster's own De-Dar, Young Bean and Budd Johnson and a beautifully modulated Time After Time by Styne and Cahn. On each, the artists have sufficient musical space to spread their musical wings and do so delightfully. A top flight album, in more ways than one. -BW

the oft repeated comment that Armstrong's embouchure was not at its best during the recording session, our ear couldn't detect anything less than his usual lip. A release from the 1957 Newport Jazz Festival in which the three singers appeared but not together, at least not on recordings so far as we are aware. Miss Fitzgerald delivers ten superb tracks that include textbook scat on Air Mail Special and a wonderfully accurate take on Louis Armstrong with I Can't Give You Anything But Love. Lady Day is heard on six tracks doing her patented coquette bit and, we suspect, using vocal trickery to overcome possible offstage problems. And, still sounding great, just great. We come now to Carmen McRae and her eight selections. It's probably unfair to include her on an album with the other two. Oh, she's good -- bloody good -- with a gut approach to her material (all the songs on the album are pop standards) but, compared to them, she sounds -- sorry to write this -- almost amateurish. Here's a tip for listeners. Play Miss McRae's tracks first. She deserves the courtesy. -BW



DINAH WASHINGTON - Pop Standards
What A Difference A Day Makes

On a re-issue of 1959 studio dates Dinah Washington is backgrounded by an orchestra and chorus led by Belford Hendricks, playing and singing his ultra lush arrangements. There are those who feel that had she not died so young she might well have equalled or even surpassed Ella Fitzgerald. This reviewer refuses to join in such speculation. We know only that each of the fifteen tracks recorded here are pure gold to hear. Released separately they might well have achieved pure platinum in sales. Her voice is ardent but always true and always disciplined. Just don't play the album with late night seduction in mind; your partner will be too interested in listening -- actually listening -- to the songs, especially I'm Through With Love. Damme! -BW

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LJ Daylee continues to build her fan base as she releases Natural Fact, a song she co-wrote with a writer identified only as T. Couturier. The new single is the follow-up to Dancing With Elvis and I Saved The Best For Last, which were released last year. All three tracks are included on her self-titled CD which was produced by Rob Hewes and recorded at Turnkey Audio in Edmonton. The CD is distributed by Royalty Records. Allix Bean Radio Promotions is handling the tracking for the single. 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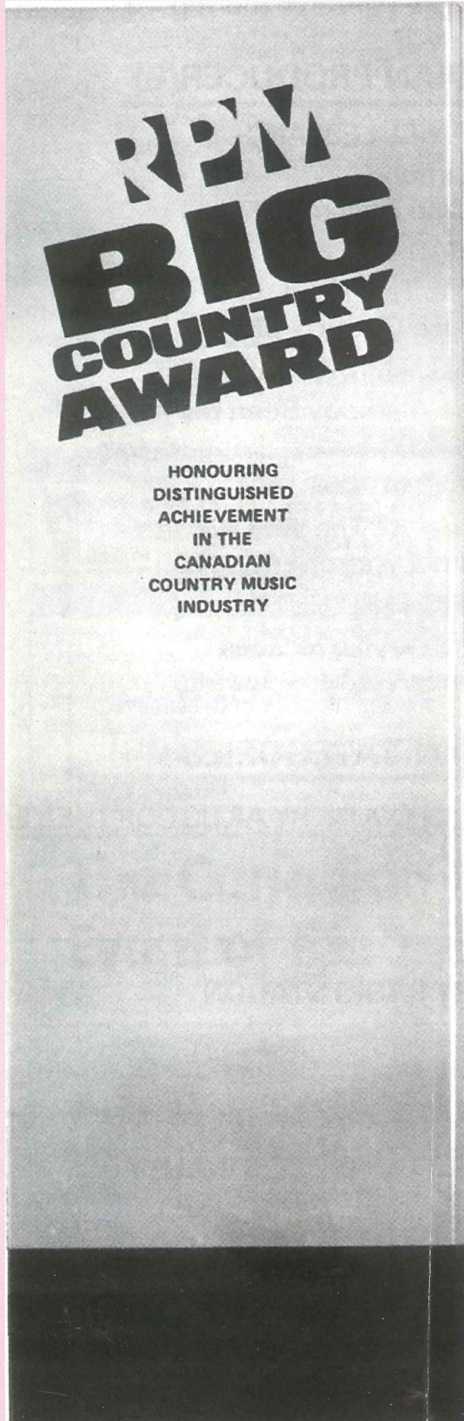
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Big Country Awards celebrate 25th anniversary this year



Q: What are the Big Country Awards?

A: It all began as a two-day conference in September of 1973. In 1975, the first Big Country Awards banquet was held in the Café de L'Auberge of Toronto's Inn on the Park. Subsequent award banquets were held in Edmonton, Ottawa, Regina and Winnipeg. This year marks the 25th anniversary of the awards.

Q: Are there two events as part of Big Country?

A: A charity luncheon is held on Wednesday May 24 when the Variety Club of Ontario (Tent 28) salutes Big Country and Canadian country music. This is a charity event to raise funds for Variety's Kids. Two weeks later the Big Country Awards banquet takes place at which time television cameras cover the announcement and presentation of the awards to the winners.

Q: How are the nominees picked?

A: The nominations are based on chart action in RPM during the previous year. The ballots are mailed to RPM subscribers. This system allows for a good mix of voters and makes it less possible for groups or blocks of votes to influence the outcome.

Q: Do the awards feature live musical performances?

A: The Variety luncheon does. But the awards dinner is followed by the opening of the envelopes and the announcement of the winners. The event is designed for the industry to get-together, a chance to network industry VIPs. It's a very unique evening set aside for the industry.

Q: Are meetings and conferences a part of the event?

A: No. We believe there are enough conferences throughout the year and there really isn't a need for more. There is a greater need for industry camaraderie.

Q: How many categories are there?

A: There are 16 categories. The Big Country Awards are prestigious and we limit the number each year. It brings greater importance to each award.

Q: How long have the awards been televised?

A: This is the ninth year on television. The show is an inside look at a closed industry event. The public will have a behind-the-scenes look at Canadian country music stars and the people who continue to make the Canadian star system such an important part of Canadian country music. The show will be aired at a later date. You can sit at home and watch it.

Q: Isn't \$100 per person a little expensive for a banquet?

A: Once the \$100 is paid (plus GST), that's it. There are no other charges for drinks or wine at the table. The evening will be a posh affair in a very elegant setting designed to bring prestige to the Canadian country music industry. It's an event for the industry.

Q: What about tickets?

A: After you have ordered and paid for your tickets, they will be waiting for you at the door. TICKETS ARE NECESSARY! Cocktails begin at 7 pm and dinner at 8 pm. Dress elegant chic, not black tie. The best you've got.

Q: Is it possible to reserve a table?

A: Yes. Tables of 10 can be reserved ahead if you get a group together and arrange that they will all pay in advance. Mail all payments in the same envelope. We must have all names in advance.

Q: Is it possible to pay at the door?

A: Definitely not! For an event of this kind, advance planning makes it impossible to arrange any additional meals. You must be confirmed at least four days prior to the banquet.
