HMV.com, Liquid Audio to offer music downloads

HMV.com and Liquid Audio are teaming up to offer Canadian music listeners a selection of over 70,000 promotional and for-sale digital music downloads. It marks the first time that a major Canadian music retailer is offering a major amount of digitally-secure music downloads to consumers.

The sale of downloads is expected to begin later this summer, with HMV.com offering tracks from more than 8,000 artists on 1,400 labels, spanning every genre of music. While pricing for the downloads has yet to be finalized, downloadable singles are expected to be priced between \$0.99 to

According to HMV North America president Peter Luckhurst, the expansion into digital download sales is an extension of the download offerings the company began with last year.

"HMV.com began offering a limited selection of for-sale and promotional music downloads last fall. When we offered David Bowie's album, hours, as a download at HMV.com in October 1999, we became the number one site for music downloads in North America. Based on our success with this new digital format, we're offering consumers the largest catalogue of secure music downloads in Canada as the first of many steps into commercial digital downloading at HMV.com.'

HMV is partnering with Liquid Audio in the venture. The California-based software company will provide HMV with delivery services and software, including their Retail Integration and Fulfillment System (RIFFS). This system allows HMV to promote and sell 'net singles with CDquality sound, online lyrics, liner notes and album art, regardless of the format. The system also allows HMV to integrate the downloads into its existing user environment, enabling consumers to purchase the downloads directly from their HMV 'shopping cart'."

Susan Van Hosen, worldwide sales director for online music at Liquid Audio added, "Now, music fans in Canada can preview and purchase their favourite CD-quality music as a digitally-secure commercial download without having to leave the HMV.com web site."

The RIFFS system provides the application software merchants use for distribution, tracking and commerce integration of digital music. Liquid Audio's open music distribution system supports numerous technologies, including MP3, Dolby Digital AAC, Sony ATRAC3, and eventually Windows Media - thus, merchants can sell the downloads regardless of format.

As well, Liquid Audio will be able to integrate support for IBM's Electronic Media Management System (EMMS) DRM technology into the Liquid Audio Music Distribution System.

The system for the consumer is actually quite simple: when the consumer purchases one of the 70,000 titles, a link will appear for the music selected, allowing the consumer to download the track to a specific area of their hard drive. After downloading the track, consumers can listen to the music from their hard drive using the Liquid Player software. This software also allows the consumer to create their own playlists, and transfer the tracks to a recordable CD with the use of a burner.

DKD's Duckfest raises \$50,000 for hospital






Some of the artists from the DKD Group of Labels party at Chairman Donald Tarlton's home.



Festival D'ete De Quebec set for July 6 to 16th

The du Maurier Quebec City Summer Festival was first put together in 1968, and for the past 33 years has offered a diverse mix of music and culture to millions of attendees. From that first year, when a group of artists and businessmen put together a 50-show festival with just four months planning and a \$17,000 budget, the festival has grown considerably.

Between 1975 and '78, the festival grew at a tremendous rate, with performances climbing from 100 to 500, and the budget ballooing to over \$600,000. In 1981, the biggest crowd in festival history, 125,000 people, gathered on the Plains of Abraham to hear Quebec chanteuse Diane Dufresne. By 1987, the festival was celebrating its 20th anniversary, with a lineup featuring over 800 performers from 20 countries.

The 1989 festival featured the introduction of the Francophone Song Awards, along with performances from the likes of k.d. lang, Sarah McLachlan and Bruce Cockburn. In 1992, the festival celebrated its 25th anniversary, and with a \$3.2 million budget, the festival featured 414 performances by artists from 22 countries. After a couple of difficult years, the festival came back strong in '95, thanks to the decision by festival organizers to charge admission for outdoor events. The '95 festival featured 800 artists from 21 countries.

The following year, du Maurier came on board with a \$1.4 million dollar three-year sponsorship, helping the 29th festival present 800 artists from 27 countries at 15 different venues. By 1998, festival attendance had skyrocketed, with 750,000 visitors attending an average of three festival days, meaning an overall festival attendance of 2.25 million.

This year's festival, taking place from July 6-16, will feature a wide mix of music from around the world. Opening night will feature La Chicane and Eric Lapointe at the du Maurier main stage on the Plains of Abraham. The Molson Dry Stage in the Parc de la francophonie will feature the California Guitar Trio (with bassist Tony Levin), to be followed by Colin James & The Little Big Band. Place Metro in the Place d'Youville Square will feature France's Mukta and Scotland's Shooglenifty. The bar scene will feature such diverse artists as Katerine, middle eastern music makers Ikova, Hungarian virtuoso Kalman Balogh, and Cuban cowboy Ned Sublette.

Featured on Friday (July 7) will be Michel Pagliaro (Scene du Maurier), the Mike Marshall Band (Place Metro), the California Guitar Trio with Tony Levin (Pub Saint-Alexandre) and Japan's Fantastic Plastic Machine (Bar Spectacle le d'Auteuil). Saturday's (July 8) lineup features The Tea Party (Scene du Maurier), Brazil's Bebel Gilberto (Place Metro) and Smith & Mighty (Bar spectacle le d'Auteuil).

On Sunday (June 9), the highlights include Taj Mahal at the Scene Molson Dry, and Warner Music Canada's Lullaby Baxter Trio at the Bar spectacle le d'Auteuil. Monday's lineup include Ramasutra (Place Metro), Luck Mervil (Scene du Maurier) and Luce Dufault (Scene du Maurier). Highlighted on Tuesday (July 11) are BMG Music Canada signee jacksoul (Scene du Maurier), Andy Stochansky (L'Emprise du Clarendon), Simon Wilcox (Bar spectacle le d'Auteuil) and Soul Attorneys (Scene du Maurier).

July 12th's lineup include Robert LePage (Place des enfants Desjardins), Robert Charlebois (Scene du Maurier), Jorane (Scene Molson Dry) and Hawksley Workman (Bar spectacle le d'Auteuil). July 13 sees the Stretch People (Place Leclerc), France's Romane (L'Emprise du Clarendon) and Alberta's Barrage (Place Metro). Friday (July 14) will see performances from France's Mass Hysteria (Scene du Maurier), the Cape Breton Barbarians (Pub Saint-Alexandre) and Jorane (Bar spectacle le d'Auteuil).

The July 15 lineup highlights Laurence Jalbert and Dan Bigras (Scene du Maurier), Los Amigos Especiales (Pub Saint-Alexandre) and Quebec's One Ton (Bar spectacle d'Auteuil). Finally, the Sunday July 16 lineup includes Blue Rodeo (Scene du Maurier), Kevin Parent (Scene du Maurier) and Quebec's DJ Gengis Dhan (Bar spectacle le d'Auteuil).

Solomon's World on a String to debut in Germany

Renowned Canadian jazz violinist Lenny Solomon is currently in rehearsals with his latest creation World on a String, a unique string ensemble that is scheduled to perform their debut concert on Canada Day (July 1) in Hanover, Germany.

Solomon brought 10 of Canada's most talented violinists together, with styles ranging from classical and jazz to country and celtic, who will be backed by a five-piece backup band. Solomon as solo violinist, is joined by Lara St. John and Moshe Hammer of the Galaxy Trio; Quartetto Gelato's Peter De Sotto; George Gao, a recognized virtuoso on the er hu, the Chinese violin; Shane Cook, last year's

winner of the Young North American Fiddler's contest; electric violinist Daniel Lapp, who is founder of the BC Fiddle Orchestra and the Daniel Lapp Fiddleharmonic; PEI fiddler Richard Wood, who has toured with Shania Twain; Quartango's Stephane Allard; and Master Bluegrass Player, Ray Legere.

The backing ensemble comprises keyboardist Bernie Senesky, guitarist Bill Bridges, bassist Tom Hazlitt, drummer Tom Jestadt and cellist Wendy Solomon.

The German concert date is taking place during that country's Expo 2000.

Song Corp. rebrands, reorganizes and moves offices

The company formerly known as Oasis Entertainment has undergone a corporate transformation, complete with name changes, relocations and a restructuring of their marketing, promotion and publicity departments.

arm will continue to operate out of its North York offices (20 Railside Road), both Song Recordings and Song Publishing will operate out of the company's new offices at 147 Liberty Street in downtown Toronto.

In keeping with the rebranding of the company, the Song Corp. also announced a restructuring of its marketing, promotion and publicity departments.

Vice-presidents Nigel Newton and Dave Pauk will oversee the integrated group, with Newton handling strategic planning and Pauk overseeing field execution. Andrea Morris has been appointed director of media marketing, and will manage the company's national media promotion. Kevin Shea, as VP of publicity and artist relations, will continue to serve the label and trade publicity requirements.

This group will report to the company's executive committee and will relocate to the new Liberty Street offices.

Label managers Rose Slanic, Graham Garrard, Antonella Padula and Judy Faulds will service the Song Corp's distributed, licensed and proprietary label requirements. All four label managers will report to Newton and Pauk, with certain responsibilities for specific label servicing to be realigned.

Media marketing representative Sarah Lutz will report to Andrea Morris, while press and publicity coordinator Felina Patterson will report to Kevin Shea. As well, new media manager Ryan McMinn will support the groups digital marketing efforts. This group will relocate to the Liberty Street offices.

Finally, the marketing, promotion and publicity group includes four regional media marketing reps — Simon Fauteux (eastern division), Vee Popat (central) Tracey Baunton (midwestern) and Scott Andrews (western). The media marketing reps will be located at the various branch offices and report to the division managers.

Loggerhead's Carson Downey Band is creating a nice buzz throughout the country with their debut CD, All The Way. The group recently performed at Q107's Summer Bash at Toronto's Docks, alongside 54-40 and The Headstones. Upcoming gigs for the band include The Silver Dollar in Toronto (July 7), the Harbourfront Blues & BBQ Festival in Toronto (8), and Mermaid's in Hamilton (9).

The Irish Tenors continue to sell thousands of records throughout North America, as fans just can't get enough of their celtic sound. The trio of Ronan Tynan, Anthony Kearns and Finbar Wright will perform at Toronto's Hummingbird Centre on July 25th, backed up by a 50-piece orchestra. Corp.). In order to thank her fans, Lawson will perform an all-ages show at the Capitol Event Theatre in Toronto (2492 Yonge, north of Eglinton) on July 12. If I Could peaked at #39 on the RPM 100 Hit Tracks chart (June 5/00), with a follow-up single set to be released in early July. Lawson will also appear at the Toronto Street Festival on July 1 at 7 pm at Mel Lastman Square, and at the Yonge and Eglinton main stage on July 8th at 1 pm.

Montreal's CKVL felt the wrath of the Canadian Broadcast Standards Council over an episode of their morning show hosted by Andre Arthur and Martin Paquette. During the show, the hosts discussed the recent murder in Montreal of a black man by a Hindu, and compared the incident to a settling of accounts between biker gangs, a type of murder not viewed as being important to society, since both victim and perpertrator are seen as acting outside the limits of the law. A listener complained, feeling the comments amounted to "a lack of respect for cultural communities and an incitement to racial intolerance that are absolutely unacceptable on the part of CKVL." The Quebec regional council of the CBSC found the comments "abusively discriminatory and in breach of the human rights provision of the (Canadian Association of Broadcasters) Code (of Ethics)." The council also noted that the so-called 'comedic defense' put forward by the broadcaster as justification did not excuse the comments.

CBC Radio has just launched its newest radio service, R3 On The Web, an online and interactive service targeted at young Canadians. The new service will showcase young Canadian talent, and express the thoughts and trends in Canadian youth age 15 and up. "CBC Radio has been providing Canadians with a window on their country, thoughtful content and a mix of current affairs and entertainment programming. It's time we started doing the same thing for younger Canadians. That's what R3 will do," notes CBC Radio VP Alex Frame. The CBC launched three separate sites on the 27th: 120seconds.com, which will feature online contributors and pieces from R3 editors and producers; justconcerts.com newmusiccanada.com. The latter two will be launched later this fall.

Blue Rodeo's Stardust Picnic takes place the weekend of July 8-9 at Toronto's Historic Fort York. In addition to the mainstage lineup of Blue Rodeo, Spirit Of The West, Colin James & The Little Big Band, Iris Dement, Blue Mountain and Tara MacLean, a number of acts have also been added for the weekend. Confirmed for Saturday are Jason Mitchell, Martina Sorbarra, Bruce Henderson, Staggered Crossing and Danny Michel. Appearing on Sunday are Luther Wright & The Wrongs, Feist, Royal City, Tory Cassis and Mia Sheard. The event will also feature a vendor village, and ten different food stations offering sushi, oysters and falafels.

CARLY SIMON The Bedroom Tapes Arista-14627-N


The woman who performed such classics as Anticipation, You're So Vain and Nobody Does It Better has become so recognized for her distinctive voice, that few have paid attention to the fact that she is also a first-rate songwriter. It's something that helps separate her from a host of other MOR female singers, and it's a talent that is clearly continuing to grow, as evidenced on this new Arista release. Simon not only wrote all the tracks on the record, but she also produced for the first time, recording the album in her daughter's old bedroom, now converted into a studio (hence the album's title). The result is perhaps the most personal album Simon has ever released, again, reflective of her maturing songwriting, and reflective of her subtle contentment in middle age. The Bedroom Tapes may not contain the kind of surefire hit that we've come to expect from Simon, but the extent of her involvement in the record makes it feel more personal, more real. The songs also demonstrate Simon's lyrical talents, most evident on Our Affair, the cleverly caustic Big Dumb Guy ("So many tech heads, recent invasion/I stretch out my long legs, and kick away the mouse pad, baby"), the poignantly reflective Cross The River ("When I was 20/ and crazy, as I joke I went/ to bed with a broker/When I was broke/I got used to doormen and limousines and Christmas/ cards from friends/signed by a machine"), and the deliciously vicious We Your Dearest Friends ("We your dearest friends/judge you 'guilty'/ here and now/of thinking you're a star/when it's all over"). For those looking for potent hooks and sonic sublimation, check out the aforementioned Our Affair, Scar, I Forget, Actress, and Whatever Became Of Her. Interesting to note the presence of Canada's own Rankin sisters (Cookie, Raylene, and Heather), who provide backing vocals on five of the tracks, while her son Ben Taylor sings backing vox on a couple of tracks. For the older AC listener looking for something a tad more complex than the usual Mariah. Celine fodder. this is a worthy offering.



BILLIE MYERS - Pop Vertigo Universal-012157683-J

Anyone who caught Billie Myers' recent Toronto showcase at the Bamboo witnessed pure

musical joy - no overly dramatic power pop, no dripping romantic ballads, no overwrought pop diva posing - just a smart, energetic woman having a whole lot of fun. And that is what music is supposed to be about, isn't it? Myers, probably by her own admission, may not be the greatest singer out there, and may not be the best songwriter, but it's the passion and joy she brings to the music that makes her stand out. That joy isn't always easy to transfer from the stage to the CD, but this album is actually a fair reflection of Myers exuberance. Perhaps part of the appeal is the obvious indication that Myers doesn't seem to take herself too seriously, nowhere more evident than the first track, Am I Here Yet?, which borrows heavily from Hot Chocolate's '70s classic You Sexy Thing. Should I Call You Jesus is an obvious single choice, with its effective middle hook and intriguing lyrics ("Religion doesn't violate/bastardize or rape/It isn't vicious of full of conceit/it doesn't/victimize, abuse or persecute"). The title track is an ample showcase for Myers' passionate voice, while Without My Consent is more of a straight forward pop/rock tune. A Room Full Of View is one of the album's more reflective and patient songs, and another single possibility, while Flexible, with its James Bond pastiche, demonstrates Myers bountiful humour. Where Romeo Never Dies is suitably uplifting and definitely ingratiating, while Never Let Them See You Cry is infused with obvious melancholy. Roll Over Beethoven should get anyone up dancing, despite its cynicism, and Afraid Of Spiders is a mellow delight, despite its title. Finally, there's Bitter Fruit (Dead Weight), perhaps the most ambitious and aurally intricate track on the record. Myers seems destined to be one of the artists who will always have that relatively small but loyal legion of fans who love what she does - but the average pop listener might never get it, and that would be a shame




SINEAD O'CONNOR Faith And Courage Atlantic-83337-P

- Pop

At her best, Sinead O'Connor is a singer of powerful emotions, one who's obvious passion and spirituality can overwhelm even the most mundane songs, breathing into it new life and vitality. At her worst, however, O'Connor can fall victim to her own self-righteous pomposity, using her standing as an artist to inflict her own idiosyncratic ideals upon the world. O'Connor's music has always been ambitious, purposeful and inspiring, but it seems whenever she takes a step forward musically, she takes another step backwards in the real world. The infamous tearing up of the Pope's picture seemed to bring her then-bright career to a screaming halt, and her musical work since then has been met with a collective shrug of the shoulders by the music-buying public. It's been some ten years since the cross-theboard success of Nothing Compares 2 U, and one would think she might just stick to making good music. But with an artist like O'Connor, controversy seems to follow her like gum on her shoe. Just in the past few weeks, there's been newspaper stories about her sudden interest in the Rastafarian ideaology, and her announcement that she was, in fact, a lesbian (surprise!). It's a shame, a shame that she can't just keep her political mouth shut and leave the talking to her music. Because this new release is filled with wonderful music, a clear signal that O'Connor is still more than capable of producing diverse, yet sonically exciting pop songs. No Man's Woman is a driven pop track with a terrific hook in the chorus, one that belies the anger in the lyrics ("Cuz a man can fake you/Take your soul and make you/Miserable in so much pain"). Jealous, co-written with the

Eurythmics' Dave Stewart, is a quieter pop number, featuring more of O'Connor's biting lyrical content ("I don't deserve to be lonely just cuz you say l do"). Daddy I'm Fine, another Stewart co-write, is another single possibility, although the caustic verbiage in the verses might trouble radio folks ("I get sexy underneath them lights/Like I wanna fuck every man in sight"). Til I Whisper U Something is a somewhat downtrodden number, again cowritten with Stewart. Other notables are the Robert Hodgens-penned Hold Back The Night: The State I'm In, written by album co-producer Scott Cutler; The Lamb's Book Of Life, cowritten and produced by She'kspere; and the delightfully celtic-sounding If U Ever. If radio programmers can overlook the politics, then they might find plenty of hit possibilities. But someone should say to Sinead, 'just sing, just


BILLY GILMAN One Voice Epic-62086-H

With the release of the title track as the first single from his debut for Epic, this 12-year old has taken country music into another era ... a very positive one. There hasn't been this much excitement in country radio in quite some time. One wonders just how a talent like this is discovered, leaving the door open to speculation that there's more of them waiting to be given that break. With kidcountry there's almost a purification of the music genre. They can't play bars and, in most cases, certainly here, there are strict parental controls in place. There was no doubting the potential of Gilman, right from the start. Everything was in place; tapping the right country programmers, making him the darling of Nashville's print media and the word spread like magic. This isn't a shotin-the-pan, one-trick pony. The kid's got talent, and his voice hasn't broken yet. Breathing, timing, emotion and style ... he's got it all. And, he's got some pretty hot-shot producers doing their thing here as well, like Don Cook, Blake Chancey and David Malloy. Interesting too is that contrary to what many might think, Gilman isn't a Southerner. He was born and raised in Providence (Hope Valley), Rhode Island, which is perhaps why his accent contributes to the clarity of his lyric intrepretation. An interesting take on Bobby Goldsboro's penning of Little Things and Bobby Braddock's The Snake Song, which is stretching the love thing a bit, but nevertheless, an impressive delivery. Also patch into the danceable Little Bitty Pretty One, which could be a left-fielder, but don't overlook What's Forever For, pretty wild stuff. Gilman could be the beginning of a new era in country

KNACKER - Melodic Punk Snapshot

Axis-0001 (Independent)

This Toronto-based "melodic-infectious-noisepop trio," their words, if given the proper recognition which means airplay, could set a new trend out of an old one. Here's an admitted punk rock band who sound like they're having



fun and the listener can interpret what they're doing, and have fun listening to them. Knacker is, brothers Pete on bass and vocals, Dean, on lead guitar and vocals, and member, drummer/vocalist Gerard Ross ... a tight unit who write all their own material and that's where they shine. The song material is hot and snappy and actually has a plot and direction. Don't compare them to any other band ... their sound is uniquely theirs ... punchy vocal harmonizing that grooves into one. There isn't a clunker among the 12 tracks, but real standouts are Rhonda, Yesterday's News, The Waiting Game and Walking On Nothing. Produced by Krisjan Leslie and recorded at Chemical Sound and Umbrella. Check out their website (www.knacker.net).



JAY BECKENSTEIN - Jazz Eye Contact Windham Hill-1934-11521-N

On the early tracks one might think that saxophonist Jay Beckenstein is imitating Kenny G. recording gift shop music. Not bad, but approaching the soporific. Later tracks however, include vocal and rhythmic backgrounds redolent of world music; primitive but almost prim and exciting but not inciting. Anyone who can understand what we've just written will enjoy the album in totality. All other will at least enjoy the fine technique of Jay B ... oops Beckenstein.



MAURICE GORDON - Jazz Guitar Irie Mood

Irie Music-0001 Festival Distribution

Maurice Gordon is a Canadian currently based in Jamaica. Toronto audiences have heard him play with local musicians such as Joe Sealy. Jim Heineman and Carlton Vaughan among others. His music has been described as contemporary jazz delicately flavoured with hints of reggae, funk, rock and fusion. That just about sums up what one can enjoy here as he offers 10 pleasurable tracks of gentle jazz simmering on a backburner ready to boil over at command. Of all his musical shadings the deepest, on this album anyway, is reggae with its gently insistent rock steady rhythms. All the tracks are of his own compositions and all are enjoyable for listening and dancing especially outdoors on a moonlit summer night. Another rum punch over here please.

LAURA FYGI - Latin Vocal The Latin Touch Mercury-31454 24752-J

We hadn't previously heard nor heard of Laura Fygi and don't have much bio material about her. She seems to be from The Netherlands where this album of popular Latin American pop was recorded. Beyond that however, we have no further infor. What we can say though, is that she's just about the most exciting vocalist in the Latin vein that we've experience since the glory days of Lina Romay with a feel for familiar lyrics that makes them come freshly alive. Yet, she's not afraid to depart from the norm as is proven on Amor. There, she eschews the usual sultry, breathy readings of so many others, takes it an up tempo and even




manages the odd throaty chuckle in her delivery which is a true turn on. There are 17 tracks and all winners. In addition to Amor one especially enjoys Quizas, Quizas, Quizas giving one hope that perhaps, perhaps, perhaps someday one might meet this gorgeous woman with the sexy voice and delivery. This one deserves to fly.



ANASTACIA - Jazz Vocal Not That Kind

Someday Tina Turner will retire and when that occurs her place could and perhaps should be taken by Anastacia Newkirk who brings the same kind of nervous, almost frenetic reading to her songs. In fact, she doesn't sound all that much like her but rather Velma Middleton imitating her and that's double barreled good. Anastacia has been around for a while paying her performing dues and the experience clearly shows here. She deserves the top but, regrettably for her, there's only one Tina turner and Anastacia will have to wait until she calls it a day before assuming her throne. Pity -BW



BILLY JOEL 2000 Years: The Millennium Concert Columbia-63792-H

Moving from Beethoven's Ninth Symphony to Big Shot may sound a tad much, but Billy Joel, much like his fellow piano man Elton John, has always liked going just a bit over the top. Back in the seventies, when his record sales went through the roof with the back-to-back smashes of The Stranger and 52nd Street, Joel was considered one of the best live performers in the biz. It was surprising that a live album didn't appear shortly thereafter, but unfortunately, for his fans, Joel didn't release a live record until the somewhat dissapointing record of his landmark tour of Russia, an album that seemed to be released more for its societal value than its musical flavour. The album contained drab versions of his many hits, with the best song on the record being his cover of The Beatles' Back In The USSR. Perhaps the depressing Russian environs seeped into the recording, but for whatever reason, the album just wasn't that exciting. This time out, Joel returned to his own environment, as this recording took place at his New Year's Eve '99 show at New York's Madison Square Garden, just around the corner from his Long Island home. When you go through a release like this, it's then when you realize just how productive

Joel has been over the last 20 years, and how many hits there've been. Only an artist of Joel's stature could leave out such signature tunes as Just The Way You Are, Piano Man, Uptown Girl and Honesty and still produce a live record chock full of hits. The excitement of the dawning of the new millennium (sorry, we won't use that word anymore) must have infected Joel and his band, as the group plays with a verve and exuberance that adds some extra zip to songs that he's obviously been playing for years. The first CD in this double set features many of his older tunes, such as Movin' Out, Summer Highland Falls, Billy The Kid, My Life, Allentown and Only The Good Die Young. On the second CD, he begins with a string of his more recent hits (I Go To Extremes, We Didn't Start The Fire, Big Man On Mulberry Street, River Of Dreams), but also veers into some more oblique territory, covering Auld Lang Syne (obviously appropriate), Dance To The Music and the Stones' Honky Tonk Women. The last year or so have been good ones for Joel highlighted by his induction into the Bock 'N Roll Hall of Fame by Ray Charles, no less. Now that he's gone into something of a semiretirement, this album provides a nice encapsulation of his career.

JASON MITCHELL - Pop The World Is Flat WEA-81774-F

With so many record company head honchos so concerned about signing the next boy band, it's refreshing that at least one record label has decided to go a different route and sign an artist who actually, get this, writes and sings his own songs (can you imagine?). Jason Mitchell is a Toronto native who obviously has honed his craft playing the city's considerable club scene, and this somewhat folksy, acoustic-oriented debut reflects that smoky, folky club influence. The lead single, Bent, had the misfortune of being released at virtually the same time as the Matchbox 20 lead single of the same name, which may explain why so many programmers seemed to miss the boat on this one. But Mitchell's sound is tailor-made for AC radio.




reasonably light, placid pop, but with an intelligence and creativity not normally found in most simple pop records. In addition to some well-crafted hooks and melodies, Mitchell also manages to create some atmosphere with his lyrical content, case in point being the aforementioned Bent ("I walk along with city feet/they move like pots and pans/towards a geographical scrabble set/toward a periodical sunset trip"). Mitchell may not have the most powerful voice in the world - he seems to stutter along with a halting vocal pattern somewhat reminiscent of Gordon Lightfoot but his demure vocals seem appropriate for the material. Anything more powerful would be out of whack with the timbre of the tunes. Every once in a while, as with the title track, Mitchell's music gets a bit more aggressive, with the ferocity echoed in his vocals. And when he gets into a bluesy whale, such as on Frozen Night, he even has a bit of Tom Waits in him, that kind of gravel-in-the-back-of-the-throat vocal quality. Along with the aforementioned Bent, title track and Frozen Night, there are plenty of other choice cuts on the record, including the sublime The Pinnacle, the very folksy Ghost On The Highway, the quiet The Pleasures You Bring, the Steely Dan-esque Starless Lady, and the short but sweet No Small Task. Admittedly, there are probably about four or five tracks too many on this album, with one or two of them sounding like throwaways. But Mitchell certainly has the sound of a songwriter, one who should be on the charts someday soon.

NOAH ZACHARIN Alive

Soffwin-501 (Independent)

Recording an album live in a club setting is pretty risky, considering the usual room obstructions. Well, if there were any, they've been muffled pretty good with this live recording, which might be a first, from Toronto's Free Times Cafe. Zacharin's last album, Silence Spoken Here, made it to this New Release page three years ago. In an intimate setting, this acoustic set smacks of the old coffee house days and Zacharin offers up what he refers to as "a typical mixture of material

that I might perform on any given night." And his material, all original, is on the edge of being both memorable and mesmerizing with a common thread of bottom line understanding running throughout. Zacharin is a pretty creative writer, touching a nerve with each track. With his creative juices running full speed, it's difficult to pick favourites. The powerful story line from Didja Feel It, continues through to the final track Are You Ready To Fly, but if we must choose, Wish Upon A Star, Moon On My Side and Through An Open Window will set the mood, the rest is the icing, so to speak. Zacharin's animated vocal characteristic demands intense listening, just as you would do in an intimate setting and that's the magic he weaves beautifully punctuated with his guitar riffs. There aren't too many artists who can accomplish that, which lends itself to a cult following, and that's not bad. Jeff Wolpert deserves a mention for his technically sound engineering, mixing and mastering, which turned a difficult challenge into a pleasant sound experience. MY NAME IS NED - Alt/Country Anthology Northern Heritage/EMI-72435-27062-F

EMI's Northern Heritage series continues to preserve the history of Cancon recordings from the '80s and earlier with this release, which Shan Kelley of EMI's Strategic Marketing describes as "a definitive anthology of the works of Canadian traditional/alt. country groundbreaker Handsome Ned (Robin Masyk)." The accompanying booklet is quite revealing. And, as Kelley reveals "In the '80s, while most Canadians were in the thrall of Duran Duran, Pet Shop Boys, Glass Tiger etc. Ned was stalking Toronto's Queen Street West, preaching the true faith of Merle Haggard, Hank Williams and Gram Parsons." He was pulling SRO Saturday afternoon matinees at the Cameron House as well as appearing live on Ryerson's CKLN radio show, The Honky Tonk Hardwood Floor Show. Have we got your attention? What's in the grooves here will hold your attention. If you like traditional country with just a trifle leaning toward the alternative, these 33 tracks, lovingly resurrected by Ned's brother Jim and engineered by Peter Moore, is a gentle reminder of what country was and could become again. Handsome Ned died in the first week of 1987. His headstone at Toronto's Mount Pleasant Cemetery reads "There's something' sad and lonely 'bout a freight train slippin' on wet wheels rollin' back to places I've been, Old steam whistle keeps callin' my name again and again." A pretty powerful message reflected here 33 times.

ALBUM PICK

RICHARD ASHCROFT Alone With Everybody Virgin-49494-F

- Pop/Rock

When an artist leaves a reasonably successful band for a solo career, it tends to go one way or the other. Either the artist is exposed as the average talent they really are (we could name names here, but you know who we're talking about), or the artist rises above their work with their former band, and demonstrates a creative maturity that requires artistic solitude. Think of the latter idea and you think of Don Henley, Peter Gabriel, or Sting – artists who's solo works pushed the musical boundaries decidedly more than they did in the group environs. A similar story may be at work with Richard Ashcroft, who rose to fame as the leader of The Verve. That group was frought with internal strife, and ironically, it was shortly after they had their greatest worldwide success (Bittersweet Symphony) that the oft-bickering band finally decided to call it quits for good. Ashcroft always looks like the most downtrodden chap on the planet, but this record is pleasingly upbeat, perhaps reflective of the artist's newfound marriage and fatherhood. It's certainly far more upbeat and more personally evocative than anything The Verve provided. The diversity of Ashcroft's songwriting is at least partly reflected in the instrumentation, which ranges from the standard guitars, basses and keyboards, to flutes, harps, pedal steel, sax, trumpet, and that familiar standby, the



mellotron. Lead single, A Song For The Lovers, might eventually make some chart noise, and the accompanying video is receiving some solid airplay on Much. From a strictly commercial standpoint, however, Ashcroft may find that his music is slightly too demanding for the average radio listener. From the simple yet persuasive Brave New World, to the disjointed New York, and the laid-back You On My Mind In My Sleep, Ashcroft demonstrates a knack for parading out honest emotions in carefully concealed fashion. On A Beach is perhaps the most Verve-sounding track on the record, while

C'mon People has the pop purety to be a solid second single choice. And Everybody has the kind of peace-and-love '70s feel that Ashcroft was obviously spoon-fed in his youth. For those looking for an intelligent, expansive pop record, Ashcroft's solo debut should fit the bill. - RR

The 20 tracks are a mish-mash of newly-recorded Led Zeppelin classics, as well as additional vintage blues numbers. The album first became available for download in March, and quickly made history with the lead single, What Is And What Should Never Be, becoming a top rock radio hit. The airplay success of the single helped make the album one of the most successful internet releases in music history.

The enchanced album material will feature unreleased live video footage from the Greek, as well as 'bootleg' footage of the band's rehearsals and backstage antics. The CD booklet will feature photos from noted photographers Ross Halfin and Butch Belair. The song Mellow Down Easy is previously unreleased and is exclusive to the retail CD.

The Disc One tracks include Celebration Day, Custard Pie, Sick Again, What Is And What Should Never Be, Woke Up This Morning, Shape Of Things To Come, Sloppy Drunk, Ten Years Gone, In My Time Of Dying and Your Time Is Gonna Come. Disc Two tracks include The Lemon Song, Nobody's Fault But Mine, Heartbreaker, Hey Hey What Can I Do, Mellow Down Easy, Oh Well, Shake Your Money Maker, You Shook Me, Out On The Tiles and Whole Lotta Love.

TVT Records president Steve Gottlieb noted, "We're ecstatic that Jimmy Page and The Black Crowes chose an independent label to release this record, appropriately enough on Independence Day. The retail release of this album provides a great case study to see how two competing distribution methods – internet and traditional record retailers – work together. We look forward to proving the enormous potential synergy that can be realized by working the two in tandem."

In a recent interview, Jimmy Page remarked on the Crowes, noting, "I was amazed they had all the (Zeppelin) parts down, because they're difficult to play, and they're also difficult to hear in some places. It just really showed the measure of what good musicians they are. They had all the subtleties of the Led Zeppelin thing, but they also brought The Black Crowes to the party. You can tell by Chris' vocal approach to everything that it's the Crowes and Chris Robinson."

Page and The Crowes will be touring in tandem with the reunited Who, with Page and the Crowes taking the stage either the night before or after The

Who perform at the same venue. Tickets for each show will be sold separately, but fans can get a special deal if they buy tickets to both shows. At press time, no Canadian dates had been announced for the tour.


