Dear Parents and Students,

Welcome to Scott Middle School for the 2023-2024 school year! This is going to be a fantastic year of learning. Cell Phones (THIS IS A CHANGE! For full policy and information see the posted policy in the SMS Student Handbook):

- Once a student is on campus, phones must be off and put away in their bags.
- No cell phone use is allowed at any time on campus and phones may not be out. This also means earbuds may not be in use, because that indicates a phone in use in conjunction with the earbuds.
- When a phone is taken up, it is taken to the office.
 - o A parent/guardian must retrieve the phone after one of the following occurs:
 - a \$15.00 fine is paid in the office
 - the phone remains in lock-up for 30 days
- Students may contact parents through classroom phones (if teacher allows) or the office phone.
- Forgotten laptops require utilizing a classroom computer. Phones may NOT be used to access Schoology or other online resources during the school day.
- Earbuds and other headphones may still be used in the classroom when connected to chromebooks. All devices should be closed and put away in the hallways.

Morning Drop Off (THE TIME HAS CHANGED!!!!!):

- SMS Doors open at 7:45 to receive students. School begins at 8:30.
 - Between 7:45 and 8:27 ALL STUDENTS enter at the <u>Commons</u>. When dropping off your student, <u>please</u> <u>pull all the way up to the designated drop off spots.</u>
- Students who arrive after 8:30 are tardy and must enter at the main entrance.

Dismissal Procedures:

- 7th grade car riders:
 - Cars should enter from the South end of the main parking lot (on Mirick) and pull up along the edge of the parking lot closest to Mirick. Students will be held in the auditorium until their name is called, at which point they will walk to your car. You may exit onto Mirick at the North end of the parking lot. Please have your brightly colored pink or yellow car sign visible in your front window.
- 8th grade car riders:
 - Cars should enter from the North end of the main parking lot (on Mirick) and pull along the edge of the parking lot closest to the SMS building. Students will be held in the commons until their name is called, at which point they will walk to your car. You may exit onto Mirick at the South end of the parking lot. Please have your brightly colored pink or yellow car sign visible in your front window.
- Only bus students will exit from the West exits to wait for his/her bus.
- All walkers will exit through the Main Office Doors.

General reminders:

- Please review the attached dress code and the student code of conduct available on the District Website.
- Students will each be issued a Chromebook. They will need a backpack suitable for carrying these devices safely to and from school. Students are expected to have the Chromebooks at school (CHARGED) every day.
- Students are not allowed to wear wireless earbuds or other headphones while in the hallways at SMS. They are allowed to bring headphones to use with the Chromebooks in class (with teacher permission) if they'd like.

B.McDaniel / SMS / DHS Dress Code 2023-2024

The dress code of the secondary campuses has been established to promote an orderly environment conducive to appropriate behavior and representative of community standards, while allowing for sufficient comfort and style.

Students should observe modesty and neatness in clothing and personal appearance. The following guidelines are to be followed:

- · Students should wear clothing that doesn't create a disruption in the classroom or on campus.
- · Clothing shall not have holes or tears allowing visible skin. Opaque leggings are allowed under pants with holes.
- · Backless tops or dresses, bare midriffs, see-through blouses and strapless clothing are not allowed (example: halter tops, tube tops, short t-shirts, one-strap or strapless shirts or dresses).
- · All tops, shirts, and dresses must have at least one-inch straps.
- · T-shirts and sweat shirts must have sleeves.
- No exposed cleavage.
- · All clothing worn by students must be free of slogans advertising tobacco, alcoholic beverages or illegal substances and will not display or imply anything derogatory, controversial or vulgar.
- · Shorts, skirts and dresses must be no more than 3" from the top of the kneecap. (Must be appropriate when standing, sitting, stooping, and bending with or without tights, leotards, spandex, etc...)
- · Any form fitting pants resembling yoga pants, jeggings, leggings, or spandex must be worn with a top that reaches the finger tips around the entire bottom hem when standing and arms relaxed at the side.
- · No exposed undergarments (undergarments must be worn).
- · Pants must be worn at the natural waist line. No sagging.
- · No unnatural hair colors or extreme hair styles (examples: spikes, mohawks or any other inappropriate styles).
- · Appropriate footwear must be worn (no roller skate shoes or house shoes).
- · Caps, hats, or any head coverings are not allowed in the building. Hoods are not allowed to be worn.
- · No body piercings, other than in ears. Extreme piercings, even in the ear (spacers, gauges, or other piercings deemed inappropriate) are prohibited.
- · Non-prescription sunglasses are not allowed in the building.
- · Pajamas are not allowed.
- · Blankets are not allowed in the building.

The administration, in connection with the sponsor, coach, or other person in charge of an extracurricular activity, will regulate the dress and grooming of students who participate in the activity. The administration's decision is final in all dress code matters.

Students in violation of the dress code will receive one warning. The student will be allowed to correct the violation and return to class. Repeat violations are subject to the discipline_management techniques for General Conduct Violations as listed in the Student Code of Conduct.
