- The Hult family donates 1 million USD every year for the Hult Prize—the world's largest social impact competition that challenges young adults from around the world to solve the planet's most pressing problems through social entrepreneurship. 2024 is the Hult Prize's 15th year of funding solution-oriented businesses.
- Hello Zero is EF's goal to reduce our carbon footprint. To date, we have planted 9 million trees in Kenya, Madagascar, Mozambique with EF's forest partner, Eden Reforestation Projects. In 2024, we are partnering with WeForest, to regenerate an additional 2,500 hectares of land in Tanzania.
