C. O. D. Orders must be accompanied by one-fourth cash.

Packing will be charged at cost on all orders except bulk truck or car shipments.

6% interest charged on past due accounts.

PRICES in this list cancel all previously published prices and are subject to change without notice. Order in multiples of 10 of a variety and grade. These prices apply on the following quantities:

### Fruit Trees, Shade Trees, Shrubs, Roses, Vines, Perennials, Bulbs

300 or more @ 1000 rate (where published).

30 to 300 @ 100 rate.

10 to 30 @ 10 rate.

Under 10 @ 20% above 10 rate.

All grades and varieties in any one class allowed to make total. For example: All fruit trees are considered one class, all shrubs one class, etc.

### Small Fruits, Hedge-plants, Privet, and all Seedlings:

300 of same variety and grade @ 1000 rates.

Under 300 of same variety and grade @ 100 rates.

### Evergreens, B. & B.

30 trees (any assortment) @ 100 rate.

5 trees (any assortment) @ 10 rate.

Less than 5 trees @ each rate.

Note: Classifications as given above are understood to be as listed under general headings in price list. For example: Fruit Trees, Vines, Bulbs, etc.

Broken lots of less than 10 of any one variety and grade will be billed at 20% above the 10 rate.

BOXES will be charged at cost. BALES will be charged at actual cost of material and labor. No charge for loading bulk trucks or cars.

SHIPPING—Please tell us how to ship your order, whether by rail freight, motor freight, or express, stating route if you have a preference. In the absence of definite instructions we will forward shipment the way we think best, without assuming responsibility. We are on the Santa Fe and the Missouri Pacific railroads. All shipments travel at risk and expense of purchaser.

NON-WARRANTY—We give no warranty, express or implied, as to quality, life or productiveness of stock we sell. It is mutually agreed that our liability for stock proven untrue to name shall be limited to replacement or refund of original purchase price. All contracts subject to crop.

CLAIMS—All claims for any cause must be made immediately upon receipt of goods. We will not entertain claims which are filed after goods have been accepted or which are not made within five days after arrival of stock.
