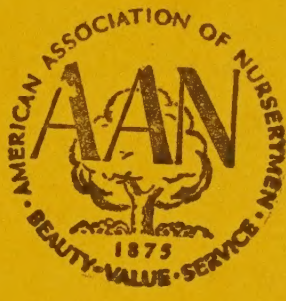

300 or more @ 1000 rate (where published).

10 to 30 @ 10 rate.

Under 10 @ 25% above 10 rate.

All grades and varieties in any one class allowed to make total. For example: All fruit trees are considered one class, all shrubs one class, etc.

Small Fruits, Hedge-plants, Privet, and all Seedlings:

300 of same variety and grade @ 1000 rates.

Under 300 of same variety and grade @ 100 rates.

Evergreens, B. & B.

30 trees (any assortment) @ 100 rate.

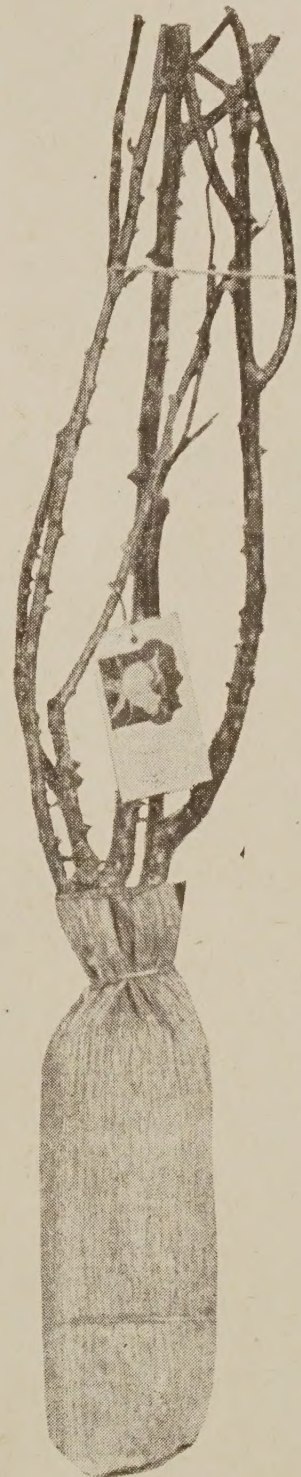
