## INTRODUCTION

The Occupational Employment Statistics Program (OES) was developed by the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics to meet a demand for current occupational information. The program is designed to: (1) provide staffing profiles by industry, (2) identify emerging and disappearing occupations, (3) assist in the development of educational and training programs, and (4) provide current occupational information for employment and educational counselors.

The OES survey covers all nonagricultural industries, excluding private households. The survey is conducted over a three year cycle. Its purpose is to obtain employment by occupation by industry. Manufacturing and hospital industries are surveyed in the first year; one-half of the nonmanufacturing industries in the second year; and the remainder of the nonmanufacturing industries in the third year. Data are collected from employing establishments primarily by mail; telephone followups and personal visits are used when an establishment's response is critical to the survey. The survey is based on a random sample, stratified by industry and size; it is designed to represent the universe of establishments covered by the survey. The data obtained from the survey are then used to estimate employment by occupation and industry.

The one exception to the random sample procedure that was used was in State Government (TABLE 12). Since State Government is all inclusive and is considered as one employer, the data shown in TABLE 12 represents the entire universe (i.e., State Government was surveyed as one unit).

A major component of the OES system is the development of an industry/occupation matrix system, a model representing the occupational staffing patterns of each industry. Basically, it reflects the typical staffing pattern of each industry in terms of the ratio of occupational employment in each industry to total employment in each industry. The data are arrayed in the form of a grid, industries by occupations. The value of the matrix in this form is that it shows where people work and what they do.

The information contained in this publication portrays the results of the OES transportation, communication, public utilities, wholesale and retail trade, and state and local government survey.



## METHODOLOGY

The Sample. The sample for this survey was selected from the ES-202 report, which is a listing of all employing units within the state covered under the unemployment insurance law. The units within the universe were stratified by industry, 3 digit Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) and within industry by size. Each sample cell was assigned a sample ratio based upon the employment within the cell. The present survey consisted of a sample of approximately 3,900 establishments with more than 100,000 in employment.

The Survey Questionnaire. The questionnaires used for the OES survey were tailored to each specific industry's occupational structure. For example, the questionnaire for a trucking firm did not list "blueprint machine operator" as an occupation. Each questionnaire was limited to a maximum of 200 occupations; residual categories, such as "all other professional workers" were included so that total employment could be listed. Employers were asked to identify occupations and duties listed in the residual categories so that these occupations could be identified.

Respondents were asked to report each worker in the appropriate occupational category listed on the form. Each employee was to be counted only once.

Estimating Procedure. The estimating method used in this survey was a ratio estimate. Each unit within a size class within a three digit SIC was assigned a weight. The weight assigned was the inverse of the sampling ratio, the probability of sample selection. Estimates were calculated by 1) taking the total employment and the employment for each occupation reported and multiplying them by the sample weight for each establishment in the estimating cell; 2) deriving the ratio of the weighted employment for each occupation for each cell; and, 3) the ratio derived in the previous step was multiplied by the benchmark employment for that estimating cell as of the reference date of the survey (April, May, or June of 1982) yielding the occupational structure of each estimating cell.

Limitations of Data. The estimates in this report were based on a sample. It is unlikely that the numbers would be exactly the same had it been possible to take a complete census of all establishments in each industry. The probable error resulting from sampling is indicated by the estimates relative error for each occupation. Nonsampling errors may also taint the accuracy of the estimates. These errors arise from faulty response to survey questionnaires, physical errors in processing surveys, computational errors, etc. Great care was taken to minimize these errors as much as possible. Employment counts were not complete. All employment data in the report relate to the nonagricultural wage and salaried class of worker exclusively. Those excluded from the counts were agricultural workers, self-employed and unpaid family workers. Finally, the "work-force" concept of employment was used in the study; that is, the counts reflect the number of jobs and not the persons holding the jobs.



## TABLES

Table Format. The following tables are a listing of the individual industry/occupation staffing patterns resulting from the OES estimating system. The data have been edited following BLS criteria. The tables are set up with the industry number and name followed by the SIC definition.

### Table Definitions.

SIC	The Standard Industrial Classification is a taxonomy developed by the federal government to define industries in accordance with the composition and structure of the economy.
BENCHMARK	The benchmark is the specific employment figure which existed for the industry at the reference point.
CODE	Code refers to the OES occupational survey code for a particular occupation.
OCCUPATION	The occupations in the OES survey are broken down into seven categories: managers, professional workers, technical workers, service workers, production and maintenance workers, clerical workers, and sales workers. Subtotals of each category are provided.
EST EMP	The estimated employment is produced by the OES estimating system. Published estimates are rounded to the nearest ten. Occupations with less than ten are merged with appropriate residual occupational categories.
VAR	The variance is the average of the square of deviations of the measurements about their mean.
RE	The relative error is a measure of precision and expresses the absolute sampling error of an estimate as a percentage of that estimate. From an accuracy standpoint, the higher the relative error the less accurate the estimate. If the relative errors exceeded fifty percent, the employment from these occupations were added to the appropriate residual category.
% DIST	The percent distribution reflects the rate of occurrence of an occupation or category of occupations in an industry.
UN RPTG	The units reporting indicates the number of establishments reporting an occupation.
EMP	The employment reflects the raw count reported by the establishments for each occupation.
NA	Indicates that the data for this item is either not available or not applicable.
