

1. HIGHLIGHTS

During the Preparatory Workshop of the 3rd Cycle of Periodic Reporting for the African Region which took place in Nelspruit, South Africa, AWHF renewed its 3 year agreement with the Norwegian Ministry of Foreign Affairs. Present for the signing session, were the Norwegian Ministry of Foreign Affairs Director of Section for Cultural Affairs Mr. Eiler Nils Fleischer and Senior Adviser, Ms. Anne-Lise Langoy.

Executive Director of AWHF, Mr. Souayibou Varissou and UNESCO World Heritage Centre Chief of Africa Unit, Mr. Edmond Moukala attended the significant moment. The Norwegian Ministry of Foreign Affairs further will provide annually 7 million Norwegia kroner for World Heritage Capacity building programmes in Africa.

2. UPTREAM ACTIVITIES

2.1 PREPARATORY WORKSHOP OF THE 3RD CYCLE OF PERIODIC REPORTING FOR THE AFRICAN REGION

AWHF in partnership with the Department of Environmental Affairs, South Africa, the Norwegian Ministry of Foreign Affairs and South African National Parks (SANParks) gathered in Mbombela, Nelspruit, South Africa for the Preparatory Workshop of the 3rd Cycle of Periodic Reporting for the African Region from 25th to 27th February 2019.

The workshop gathered 31 participants with the purpose to define the terms of reference and to reflect on the format of the Periodic Reporting Exercise in an inclusive way. The participants had the opportunity to define the work plan and terms of reference for the 2019 -2021 African Periodic Reporting process. The workshop further defined issues and concerns to address at National and Site level, in terms of the reporting procedure. One of the key outcomes of the workshop was the schedule confirming the official launch of the Periodic Reporting Exercise in September 2019 in Cote d' Ivoire.

Since the launch of the First and Second Cycles of World Heritage Periodic Reporting in the Africa Region respectively in 2002 and 2011, the implementation of the 1972 Convention concerning the Protection of the World Cultural and Natural Heritage has shown improvement over the years.

2.2 EXPERT MEETING ON "REFORMING THE WORLD HERITAGE NOMINATION AND EVALUATION PROCESSES"

AWHF participated in the UNESCO expert meeting held in Tunisia from 23rd to 25th January 2019. During the meeting, AWHF met with Tunisian officials with the purpose to introduce the Fund and discuss possibility of collaboration, particularly with the National Institute of Heritage.

The aim was to examine possibilities for reforming the World Heritage nomination and evaluation process and propose recommendations for consideration by the World Heritage Committee in view of increasing the credibility of the World Heritage List.

4.1 ICCROM AFRICA PROGRAMME PROPOSAL DEVELOPMENT MEETING IN ROME, ITALY

AWHF featured at the Africa Programme Proposal Meeting coordinated by ICCROM from 9th till 11th January 2019. The Opening Ceremony took place at the Egyptian Academy of Arts in Rome, Italy. The roll out of the Africa Programme was set to take effect from April 2019. The programme aims at empowering African youth in heritage conservation and promotion in the next decade.

4.3 AWHF MEETS WITH HON. PRITHVIRAJSING ROOPUN, MINISTER ARTS AND CULTURE, MAURITIUS

The Government of Mauritus has been engaged with AWHF since the launch of the organization through financial support and technical interactions. Most recent commitments include the signing session in 2017 of a 5 years agreement and discussions around the organization of a fundraising event in Mauritius.

AWHF embarked on a mission to Mauritius and met with Hon. Prithvirajsing Roopun, Minister of Arts and Culture of Mauritius and to follow up on programmes engagements and collaboration initiatives. Ahead of the mission, a preparatory meeting was held with the High Commissioner of Mauritius in Pretoria, South Africa with the purpose to discuss issues and get advice/support about the mission.

4.4 ARAB REGIONAL CENTRE FOR WORLD HERITAGE (ARC-WH) 8TH GOVERNING BOARD MEETING

The 8th Governing Board meeting of the Arab Regional Centre for World Heritage (ARC-WH) was held on 18th February 2019 in Manama, Kingdom of Bahrain. The Governing Board meets once in a year to discuss the activities implemented in the previous year (in this case 2018) and approve the work plan, activities and budget for the following year (2019). The Fund was invited to the meeting as an Observer. Both institutions (AWHF and ARC-WH) are Category II Centres under the auspices of UNESCO.

AWHF signed a partnership agreement with ARC-WH in March 2018 to jointly promote the implementation of the World Heritage Convention in the Arab State Parties of North Africa. The meeting was chaired by Dr. Mechtild Rossler, Director of the World Heritage Centre

This year, the opening of the annual Francophone Festival was celebrated on 9th March at Pro Arte Alphen Park, an Arts School in Pretoria, South Africa. The three week-long event is a platform available to embassies, institutions, Francophones and Francophiles for the promotion of Francophone cultural and linguistic diversity. More than 25 countries were represented and an array of exhibitions and experiences rooted in the Francophone culture were displayed. AWHF were among the exhibitors who promoted the awareness,

protection and conservation of cultural and natural heritage sites in Africa. Furthermore, AWHF collaborated with the Embassy of Cote d' Ivoire to South Africa during their Ivorian film evening on 29th March and showcased a fundraising video which profiles the Fund and creates awareness about the work of AWHF. The Fund extends its gratitude to Ambassador, His Excellency Mr. Amos Koffie Djadan for providing the platform and ensuring that Cote d' Ivoire play their part in spreading the message of heritage preservation widely.


