



## **5. DIVERSE TYPES OF ARTICLES PUBLISHED IN 2022**




In 2022, LCM published 36 articles, including original articles, review articles, case reports, editorials, editorial commentaries and visualized Chinese medicine.

Among the list, **Review Article(22)**, **Original Article(5)** and **Editorial(4)** rank the top three of the most common article type.




#### 6. DIVERSITY OF CORRESPONDING AUTHORS IN 2022

#### 7. PAGEVIEWS FROM GOOGLE ANALYTICS IN 2022




Pageviews of LCM from Google Analytics in 2022 reached 80,455 in total. Especially, it reaches its highest point in August with 8,193.
