The system wasn't built for everyone, so how can we change it?

STUDENT TEACHER INTERACTIONS, 3

Many teachers have unconscious biases, without addressing these and having the tools to challenge them, they are not equipped to treat every student equally.

- ~Donate Resources to Educate Teachers.
- ~Push and elect officials who will enforce in-service and pre-service training

CURRICULUM, 2

Having a multicultural curriculum that does not center Eurocentric narratives is essential for every student to see themselves throughout history. While it may not seem like a big change, research shows that it has significant impacts on grades, attendance, and credit.

- ~Donate books, textbooks, and resources.
- ~Demand multicultural curriculum and anti-racist learning in all grade levels.
- ~If classes are offered sign up to make sure they run.

FUNDING AND OPPORTUNITY EQUITY, 7

When schools are funded through property taxes, they are unable to provide an equal education for students in different areas, by changing this system students could be ensured equally funded opportunities.

- ~Donate to organizations who provide programs for all students.
- ~Vote for officials who have equitable tax distribution for public schools, not based on income tax.

DISCIPLINE AND POLICE IN SCHOOLS, 8

Black students are more than twice as likely to be expelled than white students in public schools nationally, and account for 25.8% of school arrests.

~Demand the absence of police presence in schools, or revision of roles.

~Challenge biased disciplinary actions.
