A Word from Doug Gellatly, OFSAA Executive Director



The labour situation of this past winter brought to mind Joni Mitchell's song 'Big Yellow Taxi' in which she sings, "Don't it always seem to go, that you don't know what you got 'til it's gone."

As you know, in most high schools in the public system, sport programs and other extra-curricular activities ceased to exist from December

to March. This brought about a new appreciation for school sport and what it provides to students, teachers, and schools. Until this year, school sport went about its business, contributing to student success, enhancing the lives and education of students, and building better citizens, with little recognition or thought. It was taken for granted.

That changed suddenly in December as the media, parents, politicians, and administrators realized there was a major void in the education system. People began to have more of an appreciation for the value of school sport.

While this was happening, OFSAA had just finished off work with Rob Williamson, a masters student at the University of Ottawa, who was studying the impact of school sport on youth development and on teacher-coaches. Data was gathered by surveying student-athletes, parents, teacher-coaches, and by comparison, students who did not participate in school sport.

The results reinforced the reason why so many took notice when there were no sport opportunities in most schools this past winter. Quite simply, the study confirmed that school sport is making a positive contribution to youth development and it plays a major role in the education of Ontario's students.

Here are some of the conclusions drawn from the report:

- Parents who participated in high school sport believe the experience helped them develop important life skills.
- Coaches feel student-athletes are developing skills such as leadership, communication, goal setting, perseverance, teamwork, responsibility, and respect.
- Student-athletes scored higher on 40 of 41 developmental assets compared to students who do not participate in school sport. On 21 of the 40, the difference was statistically significant, meaning there were true differences between the two.
- Student-athletes appear to be more engaged and enjoy school more as a result of participating in high school sport.

- Sport is not the most important aspect of a student-athlete's life, meaning that high school sport seems to be developing a balanced individual.
- For coaches, the dual role of teacher and coach increases job satisfaction and contributes to building positive relationships with students.

More details about the results of the study are contained in this issue of the Bulletin (see pages 8-9).

If you're a teacher-coach, then the report is likely telling you what you already knew. It is important though that the message gets out to the media, parents, administrators, and politicians because they need to know that school sport is a big part of our education system, and what better time given the attention it received over the winter due to the void in our schools.

Hopefully we don't have to be reminded of Joni Mitchell's lyrics again when thinking of school sport because clearly the work of teacher-coaches and other volunteers is making a real and positive difference.

TRYday . . . another successful year

Over 11,000 Grade 9 students and over 12,000 students from other grades learned a new or non-traditional sport, and in 75% of the schools, the equipment purchased will allow future students to benefit also. Hopefully these 'Try Day' programs motivated grade 9 students to continue their participation in school sport and to get involved in sport within their community. In a difficult year in many schools, it was refreshing to still see these new activities introduced.

Ontario Students Take Part in Nike High School Grand Prix

Students from two Ontario high schools participated in the annual Nike High School Grand Prix Invitational Track and Field Meet in Toronto from May 9 -12. Ontario was represented by the girls' team from École secondaire catholique Thériault in Timmins, and the boys' team from Marshall McLuhan Secondary School in Toronto.

Varsity Stadium played host to the event which featured 280 athletes and 50 teacher-coaches from 10 provinces and two territories, as well as 30 officials and 60 volunteers.

The participants were treated to a full cultural and educational experience during their stay in Toronto including a tour of Toronto, visits to the CN Tower, Royal Ontario Museum and Bata Shoe Museum, and a specially designed Nike Lounge. The awards banquet was held

at Arcadian Court in downtown Toronto following the competition. For most participants it was their first visit to Toronto and in some cases their first trip on an airplane.

An athlete panel, featuring 400 metre hurdler Sarah Wells of the 2012 Canadian Olympic team, provided students with inspirational stories and messages.

It is truly a one-of-a-kind experience open to one female and one male track and field team from each province and territory. Teams are selected based upon leadership, school involvement, and track and field experience.

OFSAA Sanctioning for Events

For OFSAA-sanctioned invitationals

- All participants must be OFSAA eligible
- A teacher-coach, approved by the school principal, must be present and responsible for the participants throughout the event

The process to obtain OFSAA sanction:

A. For an event you are hosting:

- Complete the appropriate form from the website and **submit to your Association representative** as listed on the inside Bulletin cover
- The OFSAA rep signs the forms and send it to OFSAA
- If all is in order, your event will be sanctioned, listed on the OFSAA website, and confirmed with a letter to you, copied to your principal

B. For an event you are attending:

- Complete and submit the appropriate OFSAA form from the website directly to OFSAA
- If all information is provided, the school principal will receive a letter confirming OFSAA sanction for the school to attend the event, with a copy to the supervising teacher-coach
- The OFSAA website will indicate what schools have been sanctioned to attend specific invitational events

- You **MUST** get OFSAA sanction for events in other provinces and for state or NFHS-sanctioned events.

Please remember:

- Get your requests for OFSAA sanction in at least **30 days** prior to the event
- Hosting convenors must indicate in their promotional information that the event is 'OFSAA-sanctioned'.
- Hosts wishing to have their event listed in the Bulletin must apply for sanction by the **Bulletin deadline dates:** Fall- July 1; Winter - December 1, Spring - May 1
- Schools attending a **single** exhibition game out of province are **not** required to get OFSAA sanction.
- Schools travelling **out of country** (other than the US) for sporting events are not required to obtain OFSAA sanction. However, if a letter is requested to indicate your school is a bona fide member in good standing, please contact me and I can provide one..

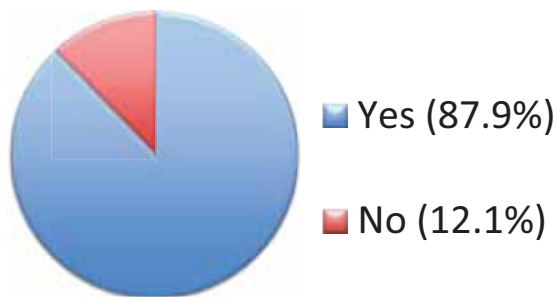

OFSAA collaborated with a Masters student at the University of Ottawa to help further understand the development of youth through high school sport, and the experiences of high school teachers who volunteer their time as a high school coach. Data was collected through a survey of parents, teacher-coaches, and students (athletes and non-athletes) and compiled into a final report.

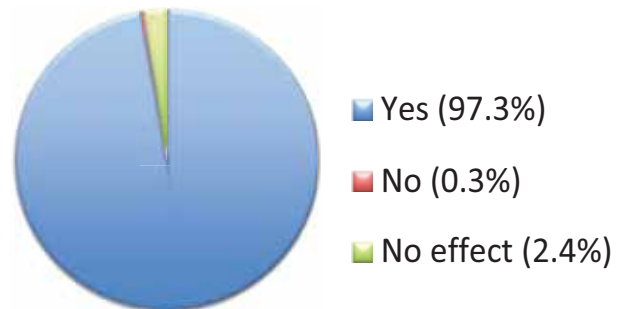
The results confirm that high school sport is making a significant and positive contribution to education in Ontario. The full report can be viewed on the OFSAA website at www.ofsaa.on.ca.

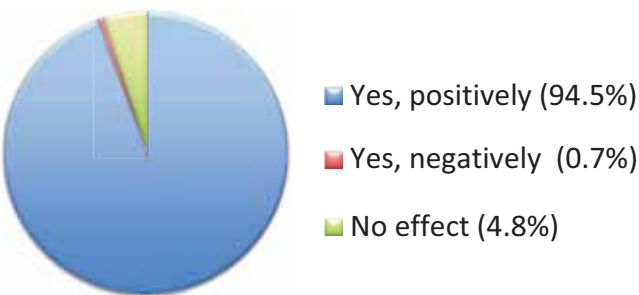
Coaches were asked if they believe high school sport helps students perform better academically.



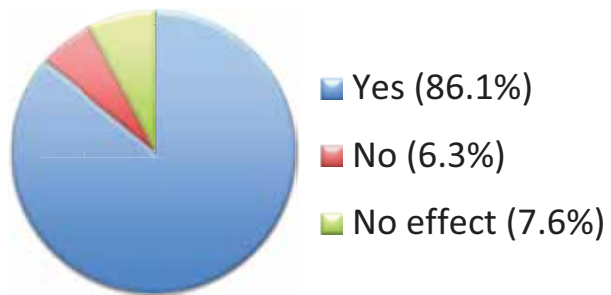
Coaches were asked if they believed that being a coach helped them create better relationships with their students.



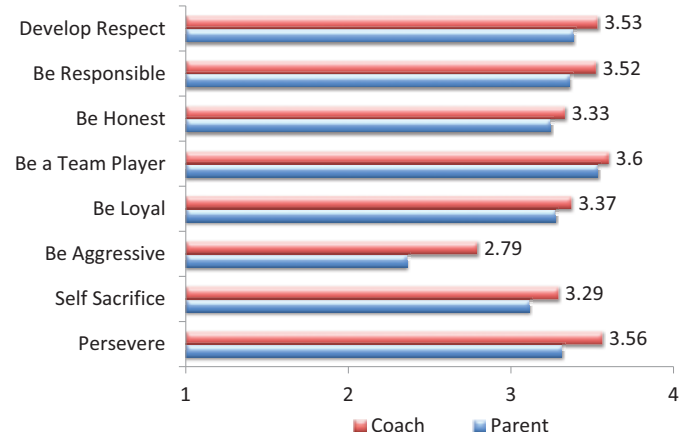
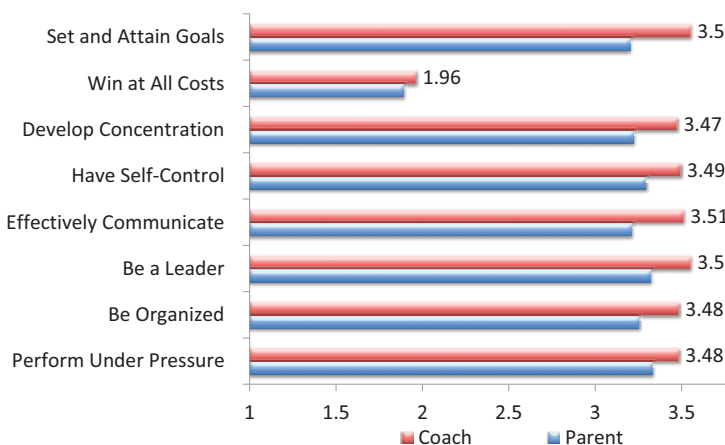
Coaches were asked if they believed their role as teacher and coach had an effect on their overall job satisfaction

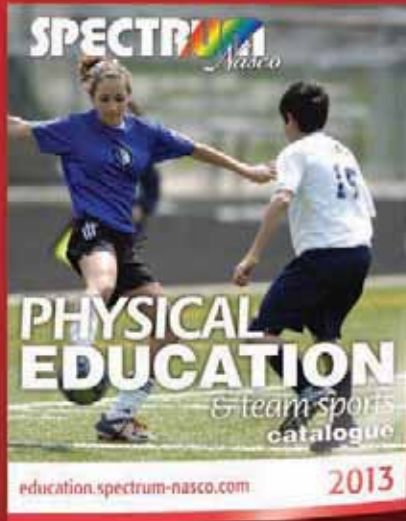

Changes to OFSAA Playing Regulations

Badminton

1. Clarification on defaulting matches: "Athletes must participate in all aspects of the championship, any defaulting of games will result in disqualification from the tournament and a report sent to the Board of Reference-Sanctions."
2. Intentionally losing matches: "Any athlete that is determined to have lost their match intentionally will be disqualified from the tournament and a report sent to the Board of Reference-Sanctions."

Boys' Basketball

All classifications will include a consolation round and guarantee a minimum of 3 games for each team at the championship.

Boys' Rugby

Game sheet requirements: "The player/game roster sheet provided by the convenor prior to the start of each game must identify 22 players to compete in each game including identification of 5 players who are suitably trained and experienced to play in the front row. During the course of a game, if a team cannot replace a front row player with an identified front row sub from your game sheet then you must play with a 7 man scrum (number 8 removed) that is de-powered

with a total of 14 players on the field. If a situation arises in which a 2nd front row player needs to be substituted, the de-powered scrum becomes a total of 6 players with both flankers removed from the field and a player returns to the number 8 position."

Wrestling

1. Unlimited weight class for boys is now 120kg and under.
2. Unlimited weight class for girls is now 115 kg and under.
3. When using video for a protest a video of the entire match must be presented.

OFSAA Nominees Honoured at Ontario Sport Awards

The Ontario Sport Awards are presented annually to recognize volunteers and corporate sponsors who have contributed to the development of amateur sport in Ontario, and also to recognize those athletes and coaches who have distinguished themselves nationally and internationally. This year the OFSAA nominees were Martin Ritsma (WOSSAA) for the Syl Apps Volunteer Achievement Award, Yonex for the Corporate Citation, and Helen Gurney for the Sport Builder Award, and all three were selected as recipients. The awards were presented at a special dinner on April 18th.

Syl Apps Volunteer Achievement Award

Martin Ritsma, current principal of Stratford Northwestern Secondary School, is this year's recipient of the Syl Apps Volunteer Achievement Award. During his teaching career he was a volunteer teacher-coach in the sports of basketball, soccer, rugby, volleyball, badminton, hockey and track and field for over 20 years. During these years, he also coordinated basketball tournaments and camps, convened locally and at the Association level, and coached city league basketball. He has also coordinated many international educational trips for student-athletes during his career to give them experiences beyond their own community.

Despite his busy schedule when he entered school administration, he still found time to be totally involved in volunteer activities in his school, his local Association, in the Western Ontario Secondary School Athletic Association (WOSSAA), in his community and at the provincial level. Martin provided strong leadership for OFSAA in his roles as WOSSAA principal's representative, vice-president, president, and past president of OFSAA. In addition he has convened six OFSAA championships and served as a member of the Transfer Committee. Currently Martin continues his involvement with OFSAA as the chair of the Canadian Sport for Life Committee. OFSAA appreciates the time Martin has given to OFSAA and to school sport to make sure the young people in our schools have every opportunity to participate in sport in a safe and fair environment.

Helen Gurney, recipient of the Sport Builder Award

Helen Gurney can be described as a pioneer and a true builder of women's sport in Ontario. After graduating from the University of Toronto in the early 1940s, Gurney began a teaching career in physical education which helped launch her into several leadership roles with a variety of provincial and national organizations. At the time, sports were male-dominated, yet Gurney quickly became known as a respected educator, coach and basketball official. She inspired many young women to participate in sports and worked tirelessly to provide them with fair and equitable

athletic opportunities. Gurney takes pride in women's sports and the progress she has witnessed during her career. She published two books to record this: "A Century of Progress - A History of High School Sport", and "A Century to Remember - 1893-1993: The Story of Women's Sports at the University of Toronto". She has been a mentor for young women, teachers, and coaches and has always encouraged them to strive for excellence.

In 1951, Gurney was on the founding Board of the Ontario Federation of School Athletic Associations (OFSAA) and the only female member of that group. Later, as a Ministry representative to OFSAA, she continued to advocate for strong athletic school programs, more women in leadership positions, and fair and equitable competition for all student-athletes. Throughout her career Helen Gurney has been a true friend to sport and her efforts have built and strengthened many organizations and programs. Helen is a very deserving recipient of the Sport Builder Award.

Yonex Canada, Corporate Citation

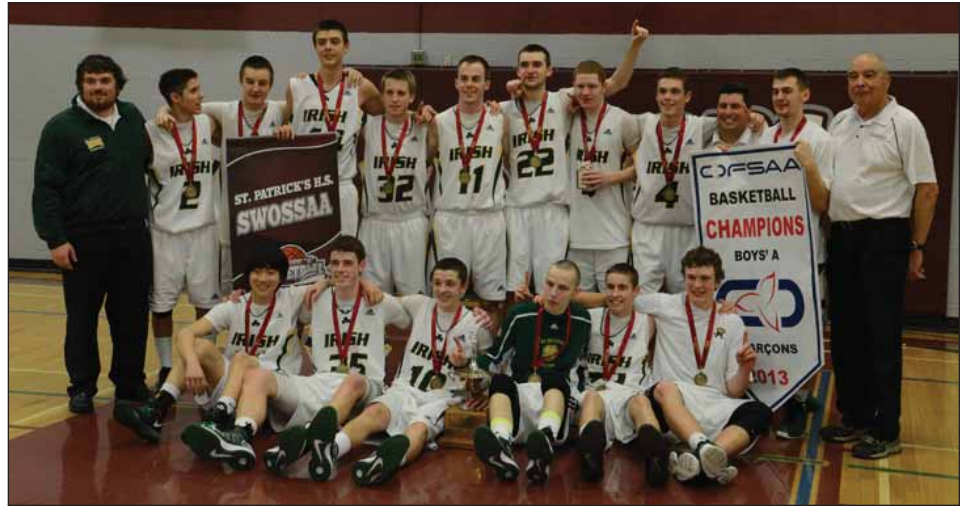

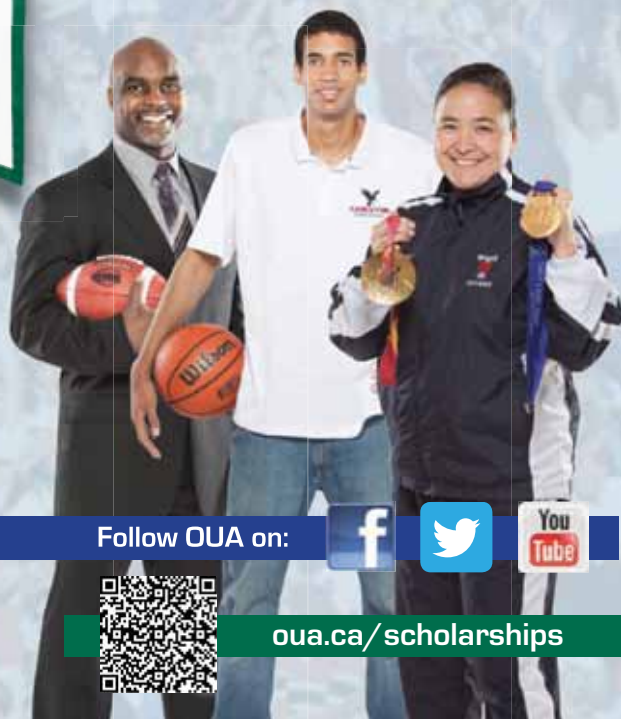

- Entering student-athletes with an average of at least 80% are eligible to receive up to \$4,000 annually from their university of choice.
- Non-entering student-athletes can receive AFAs up to \$4,000 annually provided they attained 70% on all registered course work.
- Athletic Scholarships are based on athletic talent and are determined by the university the student-athlete may wish to attend. Consult the university of your choice for more details.
- In addition to athletic scholarships, student-athletes may be eligible to receive academic scholarships and financial need based awards.
