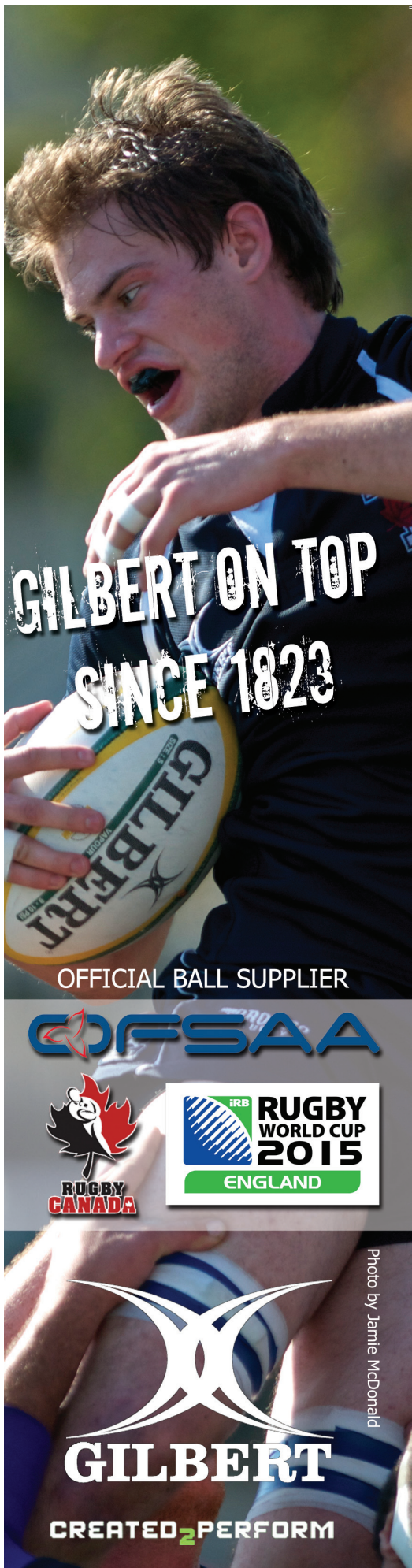

Before working with the Provincial Government, she worked in Planning and Policy at Toronto Public Health for 10 years, as a Physical Activity Consultant.

Donna was Co-chair of the Ontario Society of Physical Activity Promoters in Public Health where she advocated for physical activity as a public health priority in Ontario through education, engagement, advocacy, and partnerships.

A Word from Donna Howard, OFSAA Executive Director

I am delighted to be joining OFSAA as their 7th Executive Director. OFSAA has kept a wonderful collection of their history including Bulletins dating back to 1961. It is fascinating to read the information presented in the Bulletin over the last 50 years and see a combination of similar issues as well as great progress in school sport.



I have spent my first few weeks getting to know the office staff and OFSAA's structure – the committees, councils, and boards. I am looking forward to meeting the many passionate people who volunteer their time and help provide students with positive high school sport experiences.

Born and raised in Australia – a country with a strong history of sport culture, I participated in both community and school sport. It was a time where you were encouraged to play a variety of sports throughout four seasons and school terms. I participated in just about every sport except those that involved snow or ice (Western Australia does not have weather that produces either). Our hockey is field hockey, our football is soccer but "real" football is Aussie Rules! High schools had sports including surfing, lifesaving, rugby, netball and cricket. These were popular Australian sports, conducive to a more temperate climate.

My first teaching position was in a rural community with a population of 6000. We spent a great deal of time encouraging Australian Aboriginal families to find a way for their children to attend school. My main purchase as a teacher specializing in physical education were mini trampolines and heavy thick mats. Movement and physical education were what these students knew and needed and was the motivation to all things academic.

I then spent a few years teaching in the city, before making a move to Toronto, Canada. Upon completion of my Master's Degree in Education,

I began to move more into the health promotion area. I spent some time working with OPHEA and then moved into Municipal government with Toronto Public Health. Training teachers on new physical and health education resources was one component of my work.

In 2009 I started with the Provincial Government as a policy advisor and evaluation consultant. I spent the next 6 years creating and refining policy on sport and recreation as well as funding and supporting organizations in the not for profit sector. In 2013 I took a leave to take on the role of Athletic Director at Havergal College. This was a fabulous experience and my first direct exposure to OFSAA. I attended a couple of championships and appreciate all the work from teacher volunteers, Principals, Associations and the OFSAA organization.

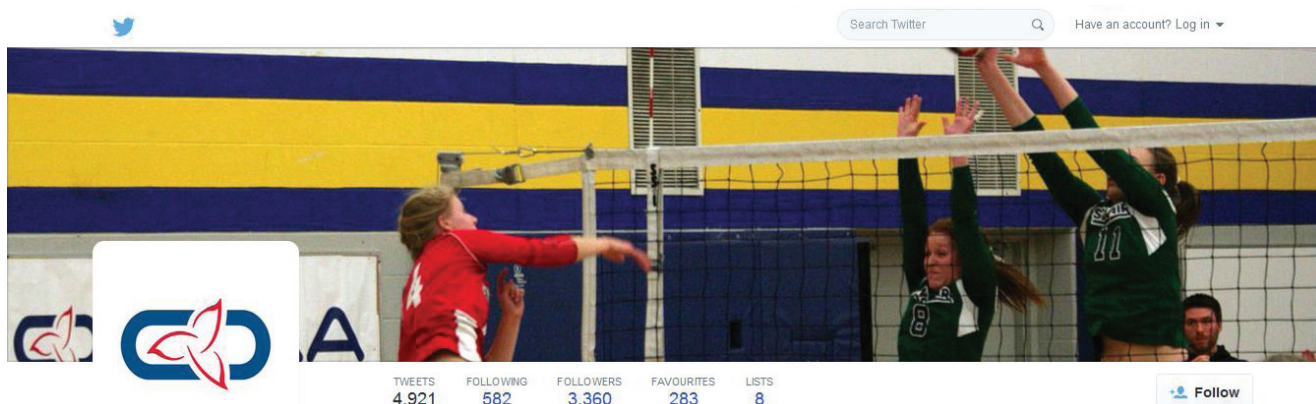
What I hope to bring to this position is personal experience in all aspects of who OFSAA touches. That is the athlete, parent, teacher-coach, athletic director, and government stakeholder. Understanding the relationship between OFSAA and these individual

roles helps create better partnerships.

I would like to see those teachers new to their profession, become more involved in high school sport and reap the benefits of student-teacher relationships and increased job satisfaction. We have many great mentors who work with OFSAA and have a great deal of passion and knowledge to impart.

I'm looking forward to attending many OFSAA championships to see all the hard work in action and enjoy the competition. I will leave you with a quote from a famous Australian athlete by the name of Sir Donald Bradman – a true gentleman.

Planning on hosting a Tournament or Meet, or attending Invitational Events outside the province?

Important Reminder to schools ... This year your team may only play OFSAA-eligible students in all your games (league and invitational) if you wish to be eligible for OFSAA and OFSAA-approved invitational events within or outside of the province.

You MUST obtain OFSAA sanction for:

- Any interprovincial tournament or meet you are attending
- Invitational events you are hosting that involve out-of-province participants
- Any state or NFHS-sanctioned tournaments or meets you are attending in the United States (Some American tournaments do not indicate whether they are sanctioned so it is best to obtain OFSAA sanction to be on the safe side)

Failure to obtain will result in penalties by OFSAA, and may cause the out-of-province invited teams to be penalized by their home association.

At Sanctioned events:

- All participants must eligible under the rules and regulations of the Provincial or State Association of which they are members

- A teacher-coach will be present and responsible for the athletes throughout the duration of your event.

Note: OFSAA sanction is not required for one exhibition game out-of-province.

The Process:

- All forms are on the OFSAA website - use the up-to-date form!
- Apply for OFSAA sanction at least 30 days prior to the start of the event.
- Hosts must indicate in their promotional mailing that the event is 'OFSAA-sanctioned'.
- The form to obtain OFSAA sanction to host an event must first go to one of your Association Representatives for their approval and they will then forward the request to OFSAA.
- Applications for sanction to attend out-of-province events come directly to OFSAA.

Once you have applied for sanction, check the OFSAA website to make sure your paperwork has been received and processed ([ofsaa.on.ca/Events/Sanctioned Events](http://ofsaa.on.ca/Events/Sanctioned%20Events)), and that all the details are accurate, Questions regarding sanctions should be directed to Diana Ranken, Sanctions Coordinator, at diana@ofsaa.on.ca.

2015 Playing Regulation Updates

Clarification

- OFSAA has returned to three classifications, eliminating the AAAA designation. Split Championships (Hockey, Rugby and Lacrosse) will still be played in two Championships: "A/AA" and "AAA." Results from previous "AAA" level Championships will be used when there is a second entry available at an OFSAA event.

Badminton

- Current ratings must be obtained from the Ontario Badminton Association. A maximum of eight (8) positions in each event shall be seeded. If at all possible Ontario-ranked players should not meet in the first round. Players from the same association should be placed in opposite halves of the draw in "A" flight.
- In the event of an Association not having a full entry or in the event of a late cancellation, the Association host is allowed an additional entry in that event and will be placed in a draw at the discretion of the Championship Convenor.

Baseball

- New bracket schedule added to Appendix C
- Tie games will be broken as follows: with no outs in their offensive half of the extra inning the teams will place a runner at second base (last player who made an out) and play extra innings until a winner is declared.
- With the exception of the pitcher, each starting player may re-enter the game once. A pitcher once removed from the field may not pitch again

Basketball

- New entry structure added to Section 5(b) coinciding with transition to three levels of OFSAA competition.
- Beginning in September 2016, OFSAA adopt the FIBA playing regulations for both boys and girls basketball with the following modifications:
 - A 35 second shot clock will be used. Full reset on foul shot attempts and shots off the rim
 - Fouls and offensive rebounds would result in 35 second reset
 - Federation lines will be used even when FIBA lines are available
 - Federation game length will be used (including overtime)
 - Federation time-out procedure will be used
 - No dunking in the warm-up will be permitted (technical foul)

Cross Country

- Each Association shall be permitted to enter two teams of five members, and five individuals who are not a member of the representative team) in each of the three classifications

Football

- Drones must not be used in the field of play
- Any communication devices within the helmet or on any part of the athlete is not permitted
- A new Bowl Game association draw format has been confirmed

Girls' Golf

- Distance finders are permitted as per RCGA rules but must be pre-approved by officials at the site of the festival before competition begins and can be brought forward for approval by student-athletes only. Devices with distance finding functions only are permitted.
- Starting 2016-17 the Festival will operate as a two-day competition. One division over 18 holes with a shot-gun start on day 1. On day 2, the field will be split into two flights over 18 holes with shot-gun start.

Boys' Hockey

- An athlete who receives a fighting major, match penalty, or gross misconduct is suspended for the remainder of the Championship plus the following year's OFSAA Championship, subject to appeal.

Track & Field

- 400m Wheelchair event removed. 800m Intellectually impaired event added.
- Names will be allowed on the backs of jerseys if they are consistent with the school and no nicknames.

Volleyball

- A minimum of 5 minutes will be allowed for warm-up time, officially beginning 13 minutes before game time. Serving team has first five minutes, receiving team the next five, and the final three minutes reserved for pre-match protocol.

Wrestling

- An athlete must compete at OFSAA at the weight class he/she qualified at.

Coaching captains to be leaders

Story by Stephanie Schleuder, from *The Art of Coaching*

To be successful, teams must have at least one player who can bring out the best in others, but it doesn't happen by accident. Coaches play a big role in creating good captains by mentoring them along the way.

Almost every coach I have ever known has lamented over the need for more or better leadership on their team. The mystery is why we think it will magically happen. My experience is that it does not happen without a meaningful and thoughtful investment by the coach. Start at the beginning by evaluating the way you organize the process of selecting your captains. Taking some time to lead a discussion with your team related to leadership will give them a better foundation for having a meaningful part in the process of selecting captains. A quick caution — don't underestimate the importance of this first step.

Definition of leadership

- A leader assumes responsibility for the performance of others and the outcome of the quest.

Principles of leadership

- Leaders should move toward influential acts of encouragement, empowerment, support, facilitation and service, avoiding the desire to direct, control and manipulate.
- Leaders help the team define the vision, help plan the strategy and give effort to create victories. We are all in this together.
- Leaders assist in communicating the expectation message, mental preparation, delegation of responsibility, and group and personal ethics (integrity). Learning what the team needs is critical.
- Leaders strive to create a team environment of shared responsibility and accountability.

Selecting captains

There are myriad ways captains can be selected: nomination by the players, election by players, selection by the coach or a combination of methods.

It seems important to have players input so they will feel an investment in the results. Once the players have a better understanding of leadership, they will likely give more valuable input to the process. I personally believe it is an advantage to have more than one captain. If you have a strong core of returning players, it can be a good thing to select captains in the spring or summer. That gives you time to begin coaching them to be effective leaders.

10 keys to training captains

1. Your players are inexperienced young adults who have little or no training in communication and public speaking. Don't expect miracles without engaging captains in extensive training and discussion.
2. Captains will have natural fears about taking on a role where they are expected to communicate individually with a teammate or with a group of teammates. Let them know this is OK.
3. One of the first sessions should deal with communication. Be sure to emphasize the importance of listening and observing teammates.
4. Emphasize the role of the captain as one of honor and responsibility.
5. Captains should form a "team within a team." Each captain can have different responsibilities that match their individual personality and leadership skills.
6. The coach should lead extensive discussion of leadership principles such as communicating the expectation message, mental preparation, delegation of responsibility and group and personal ethics (integrity). All of this leads to the overriding principle that a leader assumes responsibility for the performance of others and the outcome of the quest. Learning what the team needs is critical.
7. Do not impose coaching responsibilities on the captains. Coaches should retain responsibility for personnel or playing time choices, game strategy and training regimens.
8. There will always be players who are defiant, resentful, distracted or unmotivated. Coaches may or may not be successful in dealing with these players. Captains have a unique capacity to deal with these individuals on a peer-to-peer basis. The principles of duty to the team and the integrity of the captain's position are critical to being able to deal with these individuals.
9. A team is a social organization. It has a complex social structure, a chain of command and a variety of skill sets distributed among its participants. There are mood swings from euphoria to bitter deflation. The captains must understand that they should rally the team in times of despair, creating a culture of resilience. With the ability to be resilient comes growing confidence in the ability to succeed.
10. Before the season, the coach must determine what the team's biggest obstacles will be and shape the priorities for the captains. For example, will it be overcoming previous lack of success and lack of confidence, or will it be living up to expectations of previous success?



SIX A SIDE HIGH SCHOOL FOOTBALL

The Eastern Ontario Six a Side Football League was formed in 2010 by a group of High Schools that were struggling to get enough football players to compete in traditional Twelve Man Football. Six a Side Football had been played in Saskatchewan for over 50 years, so the Ontario coaches contacted their counterparts from Saskatchewan for details.

Six a Side Football looks very different from Twelve Man Football at first glance, but further examination reveals that this is not necessarily true. It is the same in that it is played on a field that has end zones that are 110 yards apart with sidelines, and goal posts, as well as that it involves the skills of Tackling, Blocking, Running, Kicking, Passing, and Catching from individual players. Because it has fewer players on the field, each player must have a broader skill set than Twelve Man. For example, a linebacker is often called upon to cover receivers on one play while filling a hole on a running play on the next. Six a Side also has a significant component of Strength, Stamina, and Teamwork.

Six a Side has many differences from Twelve Man, most notably that the Field is 40 yards wide, rather than the traditional 65 yards. The End Zones are 10 yards deep instead of 20. Of the Six Offensive players on the field 3 must be on the Line of Scrimmage when the ball is snapped. Of those three, the two on the outsides are eligible to catch passes. This is great for Offensive Linemen, as they get to catch passes as well as block, another example of players having a broader skill set than Twelve Man. The game is 40 minutes long instead of 48. The reason for this is that there is more scoring than Twelve Man, so the clock is stopped more for converts and kickoffs. In Six Man a convert is worth 2 points if it is kicked between the uprights and 1 point

if it is run or thrown into the End zone. This places more emphasis on the skills of Long Snapping, Holding, and Kicking.

From a school standpoint, it is less expensive because there are not as many players to equip, as well as being possible to coach a team with one or two coaches, which is a factor that presently keeps plenty of schools out of the game. Any school can play this game, as long as they do not have a Twelve Man team at the same time. Many schools in Ontario are experiencing declining enrolment and have seen the number of football players dwindle to the point where it is not possible to continue playing Twelve Man. Rather than drop football, schools have embraced this fast paced, exciting version of the game. As well, schools that have always been too small to field a team, or only have 1 or 2 coaches on staff, can now get into the action.

Although most of the teams that have played in the league have been from Bay of Quinte and Kawartha Leagues, there have been teams from Kingston and Ottawa areas that have also participated. The league has had Senior Football for 5 years, with 5 different schools winning the championship, and three years ago Junior Football was added. The EOFC (Brockville-Cornwall area) now runs Six a Side at the Jr level, and Renfrew is adding Junior Six a Side for next year.

Barrie Central wins OFSAA Gold as alumni celebrate

Competitive sport can evoke an endless number of emotions.

Excitement. Hope. Anger. Fear. Jubilation.

The Barrie Central Phoenix senior boys rugby team experienced all of those within a span of three minutes.

On the final play of the OFSAA 'A'/'AA' final in Midhurst, Barrie Central's Keaton Porter ran a ball in along the left sideline to give the Phoenix a 27-23 victory and a gold medal.

"It was an amazing way to end off a season, and for many of us, our rugby careers," said Barrie Central's Mat Burke. "There's no better way to end it off, with your brothers.

"It was a nail-biter right to the very end."

As host and top seed for this year's OFSAA 'A'/'AA' championship, the Phoenix were in a dogfight with the Trenton Tigers, trading points for most of the contest.

The Tigers, who had also met Barrie Central in the 2013 gold-medal game, used their physicality to pick up points late in the second half, rumbling in for a try and 20-15 lead.

Unfazed, the Phoenix went back the other way, and after some good passes by Amanie McLaren, Porter, and James Foster, the ball got to Sam Vance, and he punched it in to even up the score.

Porter kicked the ball through the uprights to give Barrie Central a 22-20 lead with just moments left in the game.

"We're a smart team and we've got tons of heart," Burke said. "Even though they're a big team, we pulled together and did what we do best, capitalize on their mistakes and make them pay."

But Trenton had another push left in it, and they continued to drive the pile towards the goal posts.

A Barrie Central foul gave the Tigers an easy kick from just beyond the uprights, making it 23-22 with seemingly no time left.

However, the game couldn't — or simply wouldn't — end on that play, and Barrie Central kicked the ball back to Trenton, which only needed to boot it out of bounds to win gold.

In a scene reminiscent of Friday's dramatic semifinal victory, the Tigers attempted to kick to the touch line, but as was the case in Barrie Central's earlier triumph, the attempt fell short and landed in the hands of Porter.

"I was listening to the (Trenton) coach, and I knew there was no time left, because he was saying to kick it out," Burke said. "I looked over to the side and I saw Keaton."

"I said, 'if there's anyone that's going to pull something out of the hat right now, it's Keaton'."

With a split-second head start on the surprised Trenton defenders, Porter slipped out of the clutches of the first man and eluded the next two, racing down the wing before sliding into the end zone for a thrilling championship win.

"I knew, on that kick, it was the last sequence of possession, so no matter what, I had to give it my all," Porter said. "I was going to stay on my feet and get over that line, no matter what it took."

The Phoenix ran out on the field to celebrate and jump around — everyone, that is, except for Porter, who was down after an oncoming defender slid and connected with him below the waist as the Barrie Central standout flew across the try line.

"It was a little bit my hip, a little bit in a sensitive area, but it's all good in the end," said Porter with a smile.

Both teams shook hands and Mayor Jeff Lehman was on hand to present the OFSAA championship trophy to Barrie Central, which won its ninth boys rugby gold medal since 1994 and third title in the past five years. They've won a medal 19 times the past 22 years.

The stands were packed with alumni, and they joined the current players with a celebration circle at midfield.

"This means a lot," Porter said. "We put a lot of work in, knowing that this was going to be one of our last years ever for Central and just for it to pay off in the end is the best thing in the world."

"We knew we had all of our supporters and everyone else, who, before us, showed they love the game the way we do and would put in the same amount of work that we did on that field."

As the final Barrie Central squad to win an OFSAA rugby gold medal at home, the players know what a special moment it is.

"I feel amazing," Burke said. "Words can't really describe how crazy this is."

"I'm just so happy for our coaches, who have worked so hard for the past four years to get us to this day, and this is really good for all of us."

- Applications must be on the form for the current year, 2015-16, which can be found on both the OFSAA (ofsaa.on.ca) and KidSport (Kidsportcanada.ca) websites
- To determine grant eligibility the committee will consider social and economic barriers facing the student's family as identified by the parents. It is important that the parents' letters include comprehensive information on the family's current financial situation. Funding for eligible recipients is divided into sport seasons so there is only so much funding available each term.

- There will be a maximum amount of funding allowed per student, per school year.
- The endorser must clearly indicate what the fees cover for the specific sport.
- Monies are only approved for interschool participation fees for regular league play. This grant is not intended to cover any costs associated with exhibition matches, tournament play, or additional costs incurred from qualifying for championships.
- A certain amount of funding is allocated for each sport season and students must apply separately for sports in different seasons by the **deadline dates: Fall sports - October 30, 2015; Winter sports - February 1, 2016; Spring sports - May 2, 2016**

BRIAN MAXWELL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP AWARD WINNERS

OFSAA and the Brian Maxwell Memorial Scholarship Fund are pleased to announce the student-athletes who were awarded the 2015 scholarships and Ontario Awards for Excellence.

The scholarship fund is in memory of Brian Maxwell, a successful distance runner. Brian competed in track & field and cross country and achieved success as an OFSAA champion, Canadian junior, juvenile and senior champion and won numerous international marathons. In 1980 he was selected on the Canadian Olympic team and later became a successful entrepreneur who, with his wife Jennifer, co-founded the nutritional supplement PowerBar. Brian was born with a defective heart valve and in 2004, at only 51, died of a heart attack.

Paul Craig was the keynote speaker for the awards ceremony on August 7. Paul trained with Brian Maxwell and described Brian's passion for his sport, a fierce competitor but also an ambassador for the sport who showed courtesy and humility. Paul Craig was a Canadian record holder in the 1500 and 3000 meters, competed in the Olympics, Commonwealth Games, World Championships and once ranked 11th in the world in the 1500 meters.

The Brian Maxwell Memorial Scholarship awards \$5,000 each year to a male and female student athlete in Ontario who will continue their post-secondary education at a Canadian College or University. These scholar-athletes must also display qualities of honesty, integrity, compassion and an unwavering quest to accomplish the best academically and athletically while supporting fellow team members.

The 2015 recipients are **Hannah Woodhouse** of Meaford, and **Sergio Raez Villanueva** of Mississauga.



Hannah Woodhouse graduated from Georgian Bay Secondary School with a 94% average. Hannah finished 2nd in OFSAA cross country in grade 12 and in OFSAA track & field 3000m placed 3rd in grade 11 and 2nd in grade 10. At National Indoor Track Championships in 2015 she placed 1st in both 3000m and 1500m races, came 1st at the Canadian Cross Country Championships, and led Canada to 1st at NACAC in Columbia. She also participates in nordic skiing and gymnastics. Hannah was a member of student council, music council, school orchestra, athletics council, and involved in promoting literacy and community water safety. Hannah will be studying biomedical engineering at University of Guelph.



Sergio Raez Villanueva is a graduate of John Cabot Catholic SS and finished with an average of 95%. He competed in OFSAA cross country every year, and at OFSAA Track & Field came 2nd in steeple chase in 2015 and placed top-10 in 3000m three times, and 1st at Athletics Ontario Indoor Championships 2015. He was student of the year in 2014 and 2013, a member of choir, tennis, badminton, and swim teams, involved in leadership initiatives with younger students and attended Students on Ice Arctic Expedition in 2014. Sergio will be studying biomedical and life sciences at McGill University in the fall.

The Brian Maxwell Memorial Scholarship Fund also organizes the Ontario Award for Excellence that presents a \$1000 scholarship to student-athletes continuing to a Canadian University or College. This year, the Fund elected to recognize four student-athletes with this award. The 2015 recipients are **Alison Head**, **Danielle Jossinet**, **Liam Passi**, and **Ben Workman**.



Alison Head recently graduated from Lorne Park Secondary School (Mississauga) with a 92% average. Alison came 8th and 6th in 3000m at OFSAA Track, and 8th at OFSAA Cross Country. Alison was female athlete of the year, a member of student council, VP of athletic council, student mentor, and environmental, humanitarian, and animal welfare clubs. She will be studying honours life sciences at McMaster University.



Danielle Jossinet graduated from St. Mary Catholic Secondary School (Cobourg) with a 95% average. In cross country Danielle finished top-10 at OFSAA in grades 9, 10, and 12 and achieved success on the track culminating with OFSAA silver in 1500m and bronze in 3000m this year. She received the St Mary Gold Triple A Award, was involved

in tutoring, earned a French fluency certificate, involved in rugby and ultimate teams, and Social Justice Club to assist schools in the Dominican Republic. Danielle will study biomedical engineering at the University of Guelph.



Liam Passi wrapped up his high school career at Lasalle Secondary School (Sudbury) with a 97% average, and finished 12th in 3000m and 7th in the 2000m steeple chase at OFSAA Track & Field 2015. Liam is a national champion in Muay Thai (a combative sport) and also played basketball, swimming, alpine skiing, and traveled to Kenya with

Free the Children. Liam will study actuarial sciences at the University of Toronto starting this fall.



Ben Workman graduated from Kingston Collegiate (Kingston) with a 91% average. Ben qualified for OFSAA cross country or track every year of high school highlighted by 3rd in 3000m in grade 10 and 3rd in cross country this past year. He was a member of athletics association, innovators club, musicians' guild and volunteers in the community.

Ben will study human kinetics at the University of Guelph.

"I am very proud and impressed by each and every one of the Brian Maxwell Scholarship recipients," said Jennifer Maxwell, wife of Brian. "I'm so glad that running and academics have been such an important part of all your lives. I wish you much continued success as you go on to college and beyond."

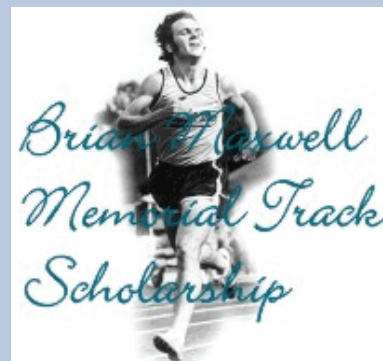
This scholarship is awarded to middle-distance runners with impressive OFSAA results, high academic achievement, extra-curricular participation and significant community involvement.

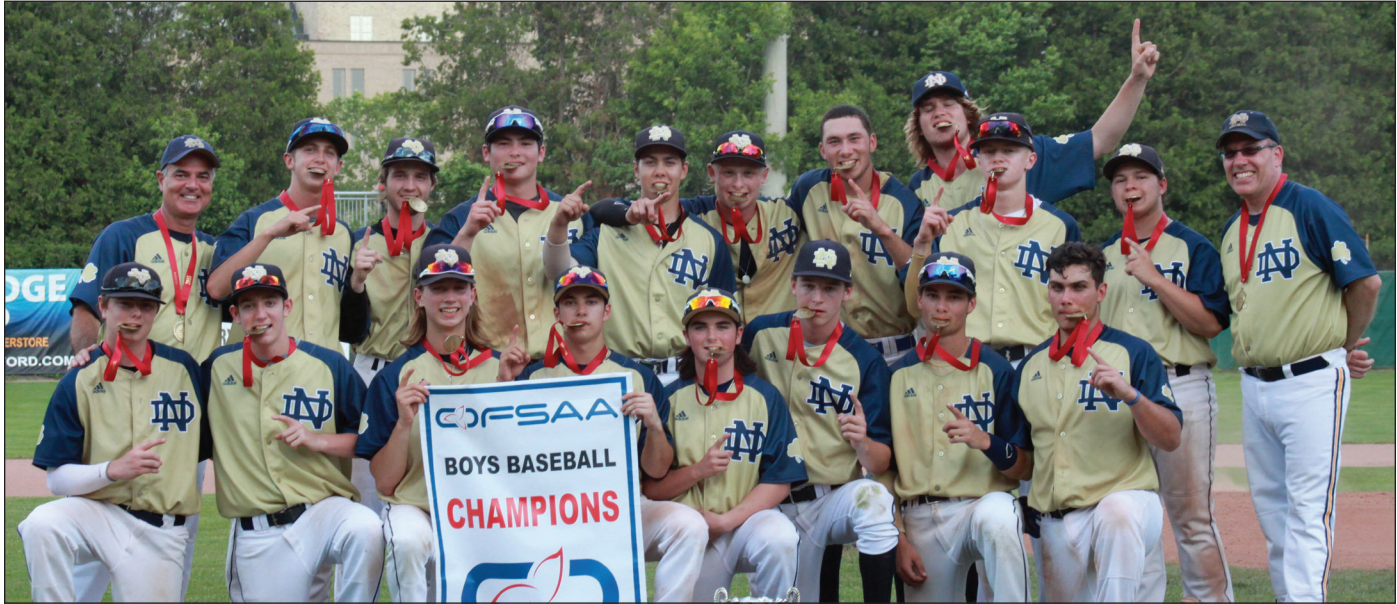

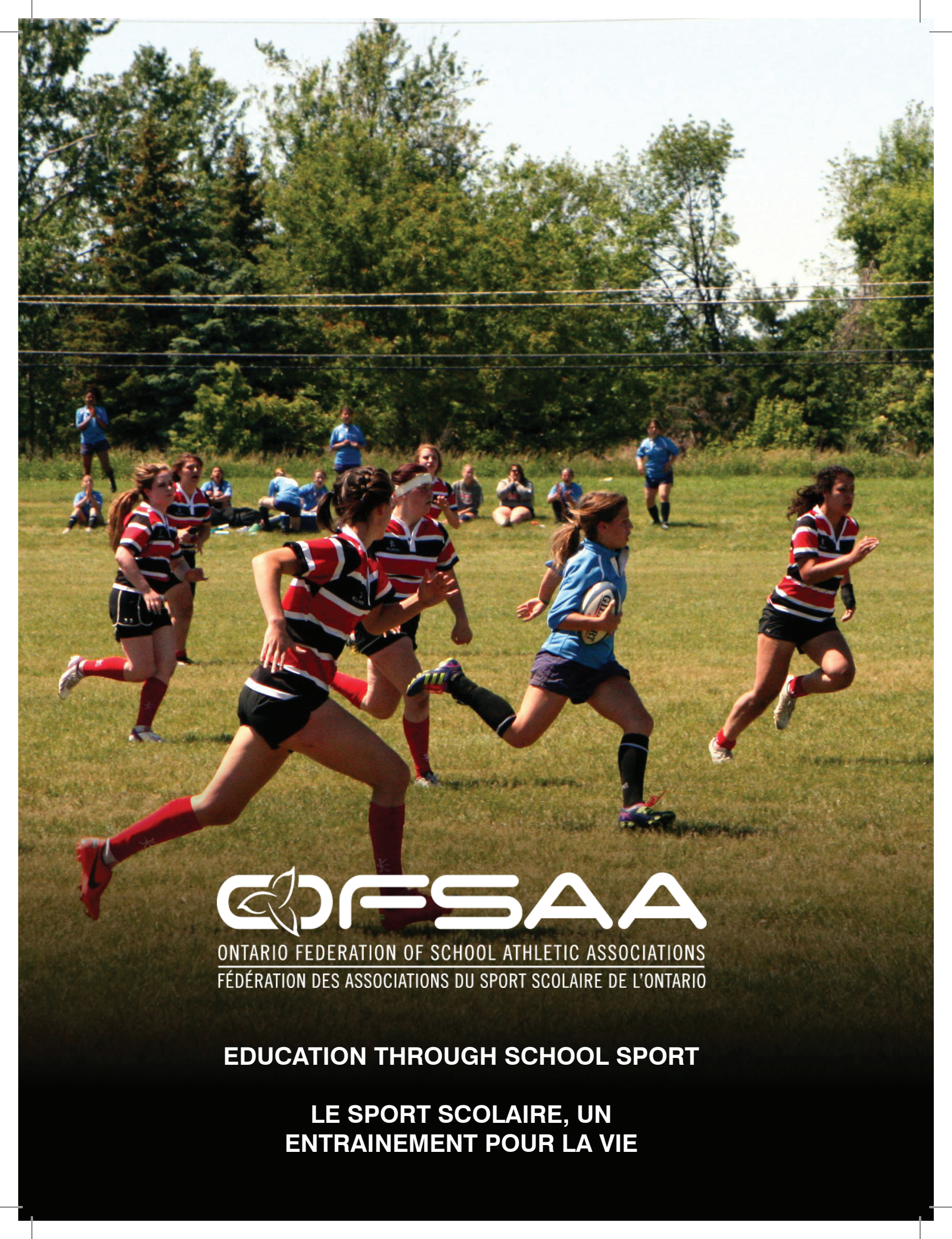
