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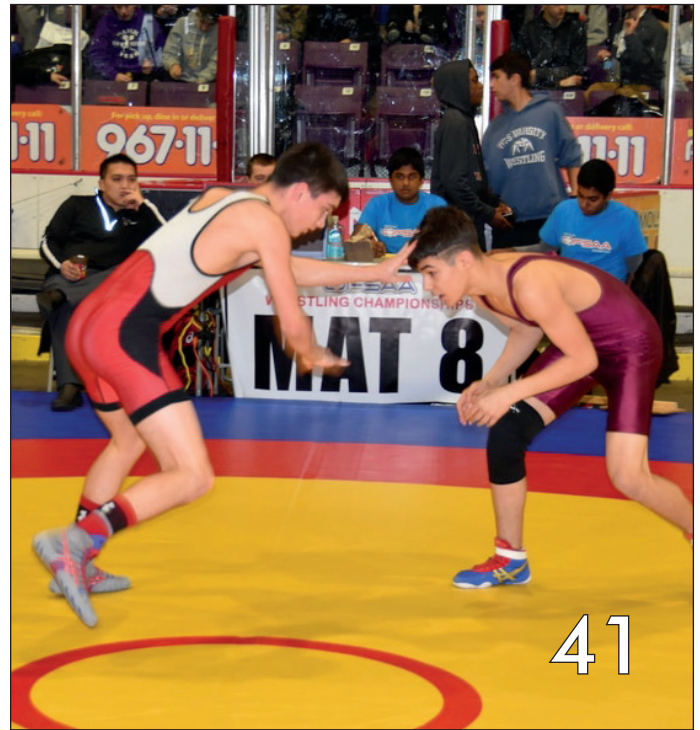

Coaches are reminded that students are eligible to compete for no more than five consecutive years from date of entry into Grade 9. There is no appeal to this rule.

OFSAA: How It Works

When the word governance is uttered, often people's eyes immediately glaze over. While not an exciting topic or one that inspires, it is a necessary component of any organization and OFSAA is no exception.

As its name indicates, the Ontario Federation of School Athletic Associations (OFSAA) is an organization comprised of 18 member associations. Each association runs its own affairs on a regional level, yet collectively they form the provincial body known as OFSAA.

At times those within the school sport system may disagree with a rule or policy, but it is important to note that OFSAA is a democratic organization and change can be affected. If a motion is properly submitted it will be debated and voted upon by the designated council within OFSAA, after being vetted by the appropriate committee.

If a coach, administrator, or athletic director would like to see change, a motion form is available on the OFSAA website, which can be completed and submitted to the OFSAA office (go to www.ofsaa.on.ca and click Forms). At times, you may wish to simply run the merits of an idea by a staff member or committee and it is suggested you call the OFSAA office to get some direction.

The key to remember is that OFSAA is a provincial organization with representation from across the province, and while not everyone will agree on a rule or policy, it is important to note that changes can be proposed and accomplished within a democratic environment.

Listed below are the various Councils within OFSAA, their composition, and a summary of their responsibilities.

Representatives' Council

- Comprised of a female and male teacher from each member association, plus one school administrator from each of six geographic regions.
- Determine sport-specific rules and regulations
- Along with the Executive Council and Principals' Council, determine standing rules for sports and changes to the Articles and By-Laws.
- Voting members at the AGM

Executive Council

- Comprised of OFSAA's president, vice president, past president, six regional members of the Representatives' Council, two Directors of Education, and two members-at-large (current or retired teachers).
- Approve operational policies and annual budget; determine staffing needs and structure; develop strategic plan; monitor programs and services; conduct the business of OFSAA; deal with matters that arise between meetings of the members.
- Along with the Representatives' Council and Principals' Council, determine standing rules for sports and changes to the Articles and By-Laws.

- Voting members at the AGM.

Principals' Council

- Comprised of one principal or vice principal from each member association.
- Report to the AGM and provide input on policies and direction.
- Along with the Representatives' and Executive Councils, determine standing rules for sports and changes to the Articles and By-Laws.
- Voting members at the AGM.

Presidents' Council

- Comprised of the president of each member association.
- Report to the AGM and provide input on policies and direction.
- Voting members at the AGM.

In addition, there are several committees that recommend changes or apply policies already in place. Here are a few examples;

Sport Advisory Committees

- One Sport Advisory Committee for each OFSAA sport.
- Each committee is comprised of six members plus a chair. The members represent each region.
- Evaluate interschool activity within their sport and make recommendations in the form of motions to the Representatives' Council for voting.
- Must review all recommendations.
- Meet at least every two years.

Board of Reference – Transfers

- Consists of not fewer than three individuals, one of whom shall be a currently employed administrator and the other two shall be currently employed teachers/administrators.
- Hear student appeals under the transfer policy and interpret the policy to determine eligibility.
- May recommend changes to the transfer policy in the form of a motion for voting by the Representatives' Council, Executive Council and Principals' Council.

Board of Reference – Sanctions

- Consists of not fewer than three individuals who are currently employed teachers/administrators.
- Adjudicate the level of sanctions to be imposed for sanctions to be imposed for violations of OFSAA Articles, By-Laws, and Playing Regulations, or matters which discredit the aims, objectives, and values espoused by OFSAA.

OFSAA-sanctioned Invitational Events

ALL REQUESTS FOR OFSAA SANCTION to host an invitational event or attend an out-of-province invitational event are to be completed and submitted ONLINE at least 30 days prior to the start of the event.

- Check the OFSAA website and use this method to request OFSAA sanction.

What does 'OFSAA sanction' mean???

- All participants must be eligible under the rules and regulations of the Provincial or State Association of which they are members
- A teacher-coach will be present and responsible for the athletes throughout the duration of your event.
- Schools will only play other schools that are eligible under their province/state

You **MUST** obtain OFSAA sanction for:

- Any interprovincial tournament or meet you are attending
- Invitational events you are hosting that involve out-of-province participants
- Any state or NFHS-sanctioned tournaments or meets you are attending (Some American tournaments do not indicate whether they are sanctioned so it is best to obtain OFSAA sanction to be on the safe side)
- Exhibition games in New York state
- **'Prep teams' that function within a school** but do not play in the local league are still considered a school team and must obtain OFSAA sanction for tournaments/meets in the US that are sanctioned by the host state and/or NFHS or events in other provinces. All the participants must be eligible under their Association and OFSAA rules and regulations, including the supervisory policy.

Forms available on the website:

1. Hosting Ontario schools - form goes online to your OFSAA Association representative and they forward it to OFSAA
2. Hosting out-of-province schools - form comes directly to OFSAA
3. Attending an out-of-province invitational event (USA or other provinces) - form comes directly to OFSAA

Failure to obtain OFSAA sanction may result in sanctioning of your school by the OFSAA Board of Reference - Sanctions, and may cause the out-of-province invited teams to be sanctioned by their home association.

Once you have applied for OFSAA sanction, check under 'Events/Sanctioned' on the website to make sure your school is listed as attending or hosting, and that the information is accurate. Athletic directors and department heads are asked to make sure that this information gets to both teacher-coaches and non-teacher coaches to avoid any last minute problems or disappointment.

Have you changed schools? Thinking about changing schools?

All students who have changed schools are ineligible to play high school sports unless they are cleared through the **transfer policy**.

See your athletic director, HPE department head, or a member of your guidance department for more information, or to obtain a transfer appeal form.

News from the AGM

The OFSAA Annual General Meeting (AGM) was held April 6th – 7th with Association representatives across the province in attendance.

The assembly voted on a number of motions, a selection of which are detailed here.

TRANSFER POLICY

Prep Teams:

- Students who play on a Prep team within a school and then are no longer on that Prep team but remain at the school, are ineligible for the “bona fide” school team for the current school year and the following school year.
- Note 11 be added to read: “If a student moves from their home school to play on a Prep/Elite team within the new school, that is not a ‘bona fide’ school team, he/she is ineligible for any sport played at his/her former school in the previous twelve (12) months (as per OFSAA Transfer Policy) A Prep/Elite team within a school is defined as a team that is not a ‘bona fide’ school team as defined in the OFSAA Playing Regulations.
- Note 12 be added to read “If a student moves from their home school to play on a Prep/Elite team within a school, and then returns to his/her home school, or any other member school of OFSAA, he/she is considered a transfer student and must seek eligibility through the Association transfer process. These students may not apply for eligibility under section b (i) of the Transfer Policy. Members of a school Prep team are considered to have participated in the sport if applying under Section b (ii) of the Policy.”

International Students

The student is an international student who has transferred to an Ontario school from outside

Canada or the United States and is attending the school designated by the school board. (Section a) (iv)

Note 13) International students must meet all of the following conditions in order to apply under a) (iv):

- a) The student is registered in a member school as an international student and pay tuition to that school board according to international student policy and fee schedule.
- b) The incoming international student will be enrolled at the receiving school for at least 5 consecutive months or one semester period.
- c) All other OFSAA eligibility policies apply to the student.

OFSAA Transgender Participation Policy

Transgender: An umbrella term that refers to individuals whose gender identity and/or gender expression is different from what is traditionally associated with their assigned biological sex at birth. Transgender people may or may not undergo medically supportive treatments, such as hormone therapy and a range of surgical procedures, to align their bodies with their internally felt gender identity. Transgender identity is not dependent upon physical appearance or medical procedures.

OFSAA believes in equal opportunities for all students to participate in school sport. OFSAA supports the concept that a student’s self-identification is the sole measure of their gender identity.

OFSAA supports the participation of student-athletes in sport in accordance with their lived gender identity.

Graduated Return to Play and School Guidelines—This suggested guidelines are adapted from the 4th Consensus Statement on Concussion in Sport by the Concussion in Sport Group (2013) and from Gerard A. Gioia (2014). Medical-school partnership in guiding return to school following mild traumatic brain injury in youth. Journal of Child Neurology.

ROCK CLIMBING

- Fun! Challenging!

Physical, Mental and Social Benefits!

Rock climbing has been a passion for Cindy Seligman, a teacher at Middlefield C.I. in York Region, for close to 30 years, as a climber, competitor, coach, and convenor of the sport. She sees the positive impact it can have on students, with far-reaching benefits including the physical, mental/emotional, and social aspects of our well-being. The following article encourages you to consider this activity for your school program and gives you steps to take to make that a reality! Cindy's vision is to one day see rock climbing become an OFSAA sport.

Indoor rock climbing made its debut in the York Region District School Board 24 years ago. Opening a new school, Middlefield Collegiate Institute in Markham, as Head of the Health & Physical Education Department allowed me the opportunity to introduce students to an exciting, non-traditional sport that offers many benefits. Working with an architect, the school board plant department and an indoor climbing gym facility, I received a quote, was given Board approval to proceed, and the walls were installed! Students were extremely excited, trained hard, enjoyed spending time together, and looked forward to competing. Although no other schools in York Region had climbing teams at the time, six schools in Toronto, who went to climbing gyms to train, provided competition for our students. In 1997 rock climbing became a demonstration sport in York Region and 2 years later was declared a sanctioned sport with a winter/spring league.

As a climber myself, I understood that climbing could be a great way to engage students in learning, competition, and physical fitness, and offered a wonderful opportunity for students to connect with others who either share, or will develop the passion for this unique, challenging, and exciting sport. Over the years I've spoken to many climbers who have expressed how climbing reduces stress levels experienced during daily life. When you are focused on the wall, all other issues you may be dealing with seem to be set aside as you focus on how you will complete the route you've selected to climb. Kids are natural climbers and love challenges so the sport is very popular. The support

and encouragement shared between climbers and the appreciation of what they can achieve makes rock climbing truly unique.

We hosted the first competition open to high schools across the province and it was a resounding success. In competitions, climbers train to climb routes or solve bouldering problems using their mental and physical strategies. Success involves the ability to reach the top of various routes without weighting the rope, or completing several bouldering problems without falling off the wall. The physical component involves strength, flexibility, agility, stamina, endurance, and finesse. The mental component incorporates problem-solving, overcoming obstacles, perseverance, determination, and the anticipation of the unknown. Competitions have grown from that first event featuring over 120 competitors from 7 schools, to 300-350 high school climbers. 16 schools in York Region take part in a two day top rope competition and 200 climbers participate in yearly Bouldering competitions.

Local community climbing gyms are bursting at the seams with energetic and highly talented and motivated climbers including students and the general public, so introduce the sport to your students for a new and challenging activity.

Steps to Introduce Rock climbing to your school program ...

1. Bring in an outside provider to offer a 3, 4, or 5 day program to students in your Health & Physical Education classes. There are several outside providers who may already be approved in your school Board, and provide an engaging and fun experience e.g. Junglesport. They focus on safety in each class, and require a waiver from every student.
2. Find an indoor rock climbing facility where your students can climb, in addition to a school weight room for strength, endurance, and core abdominal training.

3. Install a facility in your school's small gym if possible. As mentioned previously, part of this process includes funding for the facility, school Board approval, and then working with the Board plant department, an architect, and a climbing gym facility or company for wall installation.
4. Apply for funding through the OFSAA Try Day program, Outdoor Education grants, Program Enhancement Fees among others. School fundraising is also an option worth considering.

School Sport Canada Online Courses

School Sport Canada currently offers a number of online courses to benefit high school coaches (some of which are offered at no cost!). All courses allow participants to work at their own pace including the ability to save work and return to the course until it is complete. Although these courses are not NCCP certified, participants will be provided a certificate of completion.

Courses can be accessed through www.schoolcoach.ca or through the OFSAA website under "Programs." The following courses are being offered:

All courses have an introductory video which provides a detailed overview of the course.

Athletic Injury Management

A course designed to give you an understanding of athletic injury management.

This course is designed to prepare you, the interscholastic teacher-coach, for all situations that participation in high-school athletics could encompass.

Coaching Basketball & Volleyball Fundamentals

Two new courses designed to plan and organize teachers for a season of skill development. How to plan practices, skills and drills, fundamental movement strategies, and how to provide feedback are discussed at length and targeted specifically towards your sport of choice – basketball or volleyball.

Concussion in Sports - What You Need To Know

Sports-related concussion in high school sports can be serious or even life-threatening situations if not managed correctly.

National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS) and Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) have teamed up to provide information and resources to help educate coaches, officials, parents and students on the importance of proper concussion recognition and management in high school sports.

Engaging Effectively with Parents

Course participants learn essential and effective communication techniques and methods for interacting with parents and guardians.

Fundamentals of Coaching

A Grassroots Course Focusing on Critical Skills and Understanding Athlete Needs; a Must for All Coaches.

*This course is comparable to OFSAA's Coaching in Ontario Schools but does not include the Ontario specific elements and is not NCCP accredited.

Legal Course for Coaches

A course designed to give you an understanding of legal issues in sports.

Teaching & Modeling Behaviour

A course designed to teach coaches how to proactively modify and encourage good sportsmanship.

Tobacco - "Be the NORM"

A course designed to give students and coaches an understanding of the negative effects of tobacco use.

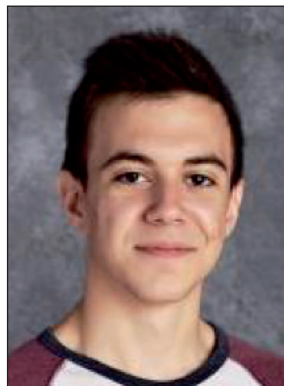

OFSAA and 'KidSport' partner to provide funding to assist high school students in Ontario overcome financial barriers that are restricting their participation in school sports. Monies are available to cover the expenses included in student athletic fees that allow them to participate in the local leagues and meets. Promote this source of funds with your athletes whose families are struggling financially!

The Application Process?

- Applications must be on the form for the current year, 2017-18 (available on both the OFSAA (ofsaa.on.ca) and KidSport (kidsportcanada.ca/ontario) websites)
- Parents must provide comprehensive information on the family's current financial status and their reasons for need
- An endorser, who is familiar with the student and the school sport fee structure, must clearly identify

the areas which basic and sport specific fees cover

Funding Allotment??

- Funding is divided into sport seasons, so students only apply for their sport that occurs in the specific season; can apply more than once however
- There is a maximum amount of funding allowed per sport season, and per student for the school year
- Monies are only approved for participation in regular league competition. This grant is not intended to cover any costs associated with exhibition matches, tournament play, or additional costs incurred from qualifying for championships.
- Deadline dates for applications:
Fall sports - October 31, 2017;
Winter sports - February 1, 2018;
Spring sports - May 1, 2018

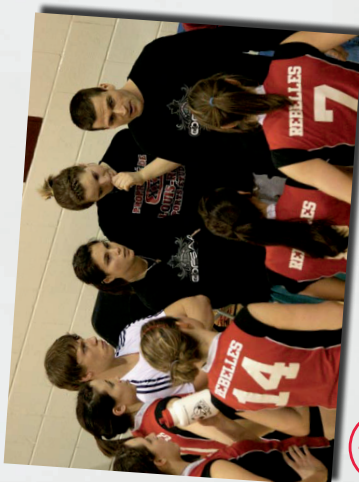
