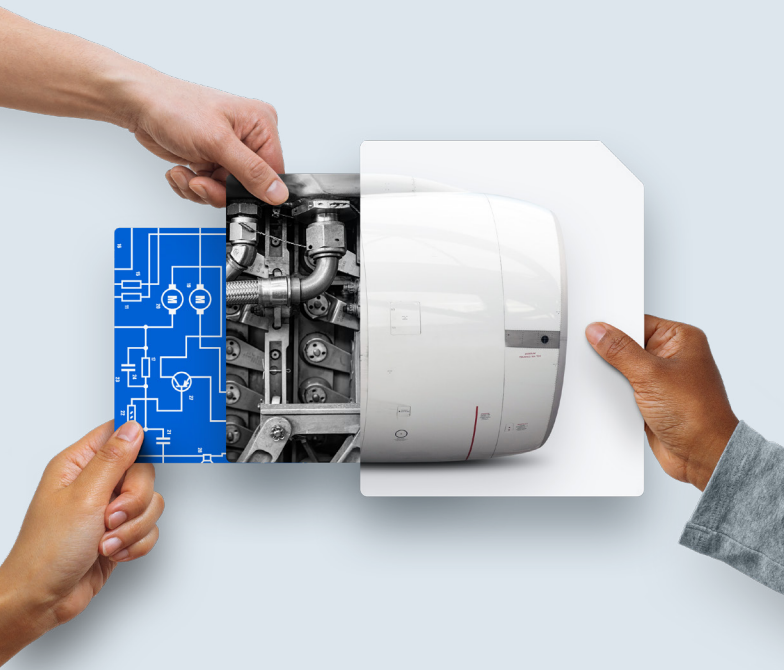

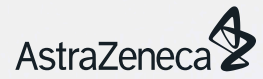

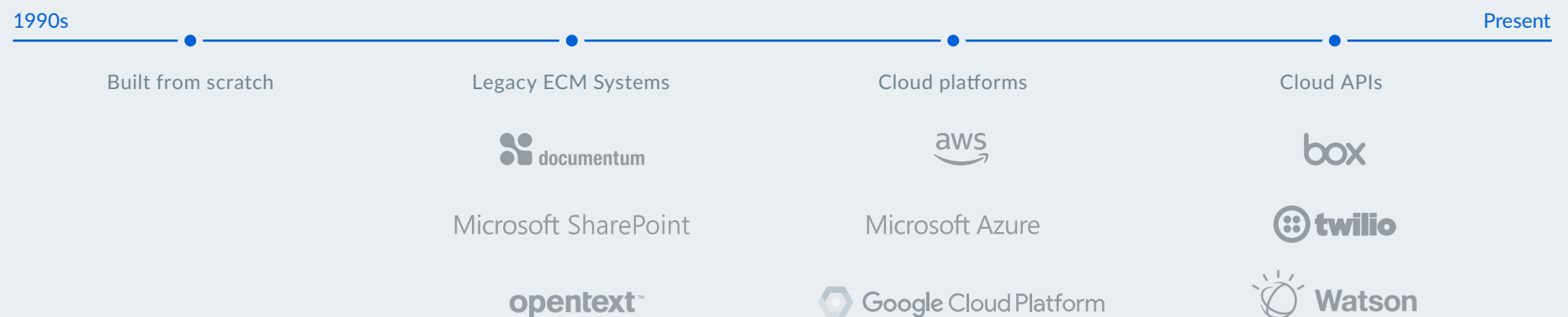
Developers are always on a sprint

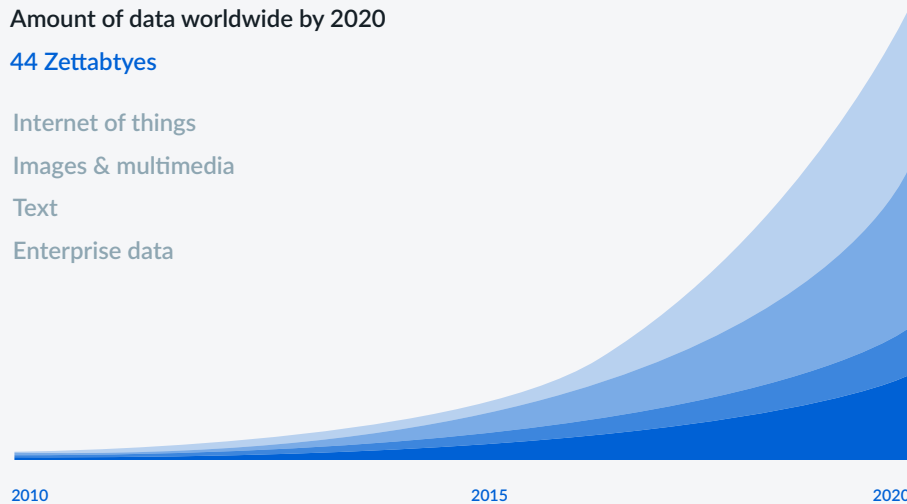

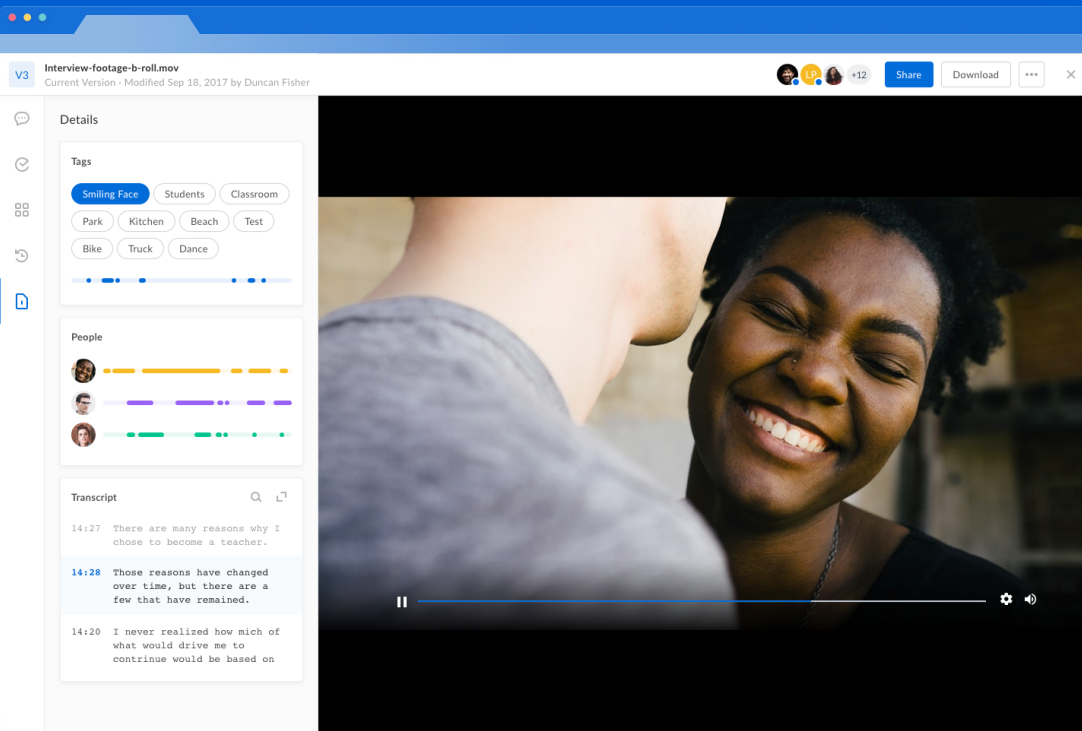


Image recognition

But it's possible with Cloud Content Management

While the digital age brings new opportunities for businesses, it also presents new digital threats. As cyber attacks have become increasingly sophisticated, security leaders now face the daunting responsibility of securing information while still enabling collaboration.

With Cloud Content Management, however, security risks can be reduced without sacrificing the user experience. A small and well-managed attack surface in a single cloud platform is easier to monitor than a highly distributed one, and centralization also makes it easier to add multiple layers of defense.

Cloud Content Management also reduces the use of insecure consumer solutions and email attachments for internal and external sharing. With identity and access management technologies like single sign-on (SSO) and two-factor authentication (2FA), secure mobile apps

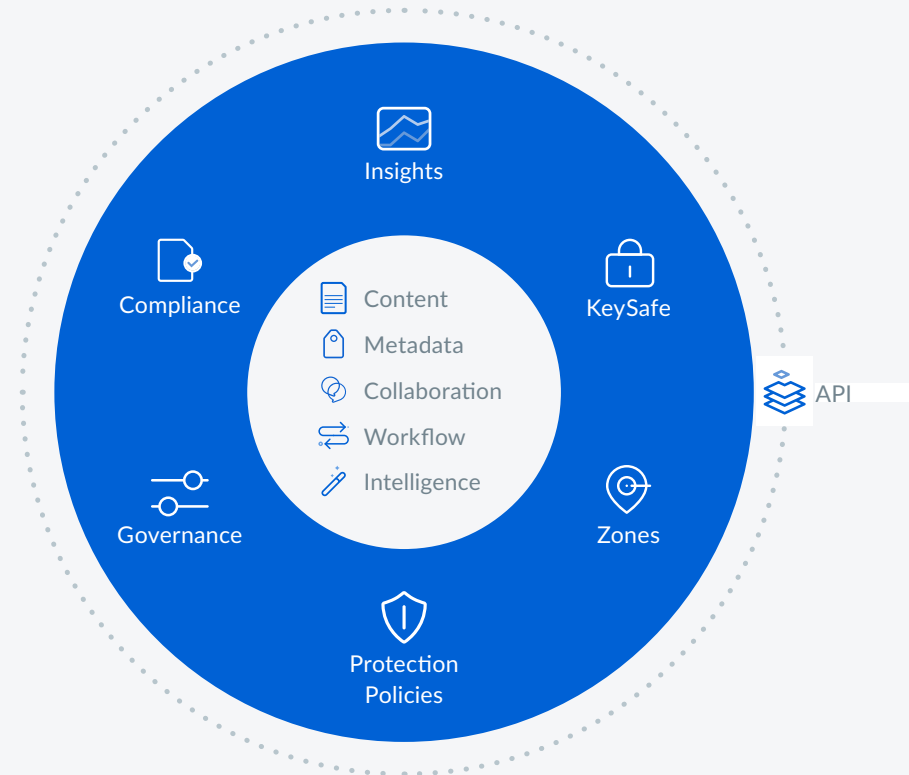


How Box can help
