Economic impact of overweight and obesity

In 2019, the economic impact of overweight and obesity was estimated to be US\$1.68 billion. This is equivalent to US\$407 per capita and 2.7% of GDP. Direct costs and indirect costs made up 17.5% and 82.5% of total costs respectively.

By 2060, economic impacts are predicted to increase to US\$7.7 billion. This is equivalent to US\$2487 per capita and 3.5% of GDP, and represents a 4.5-fold increase in total costs.

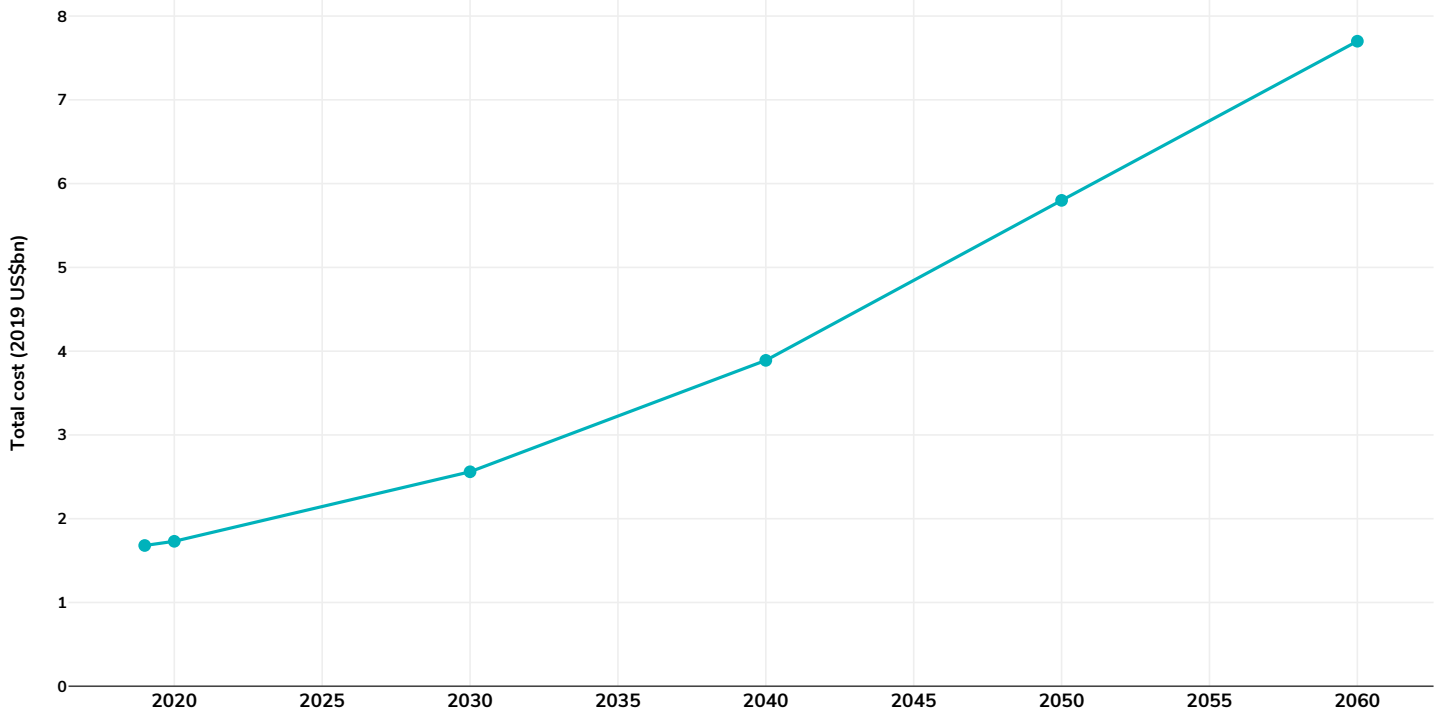

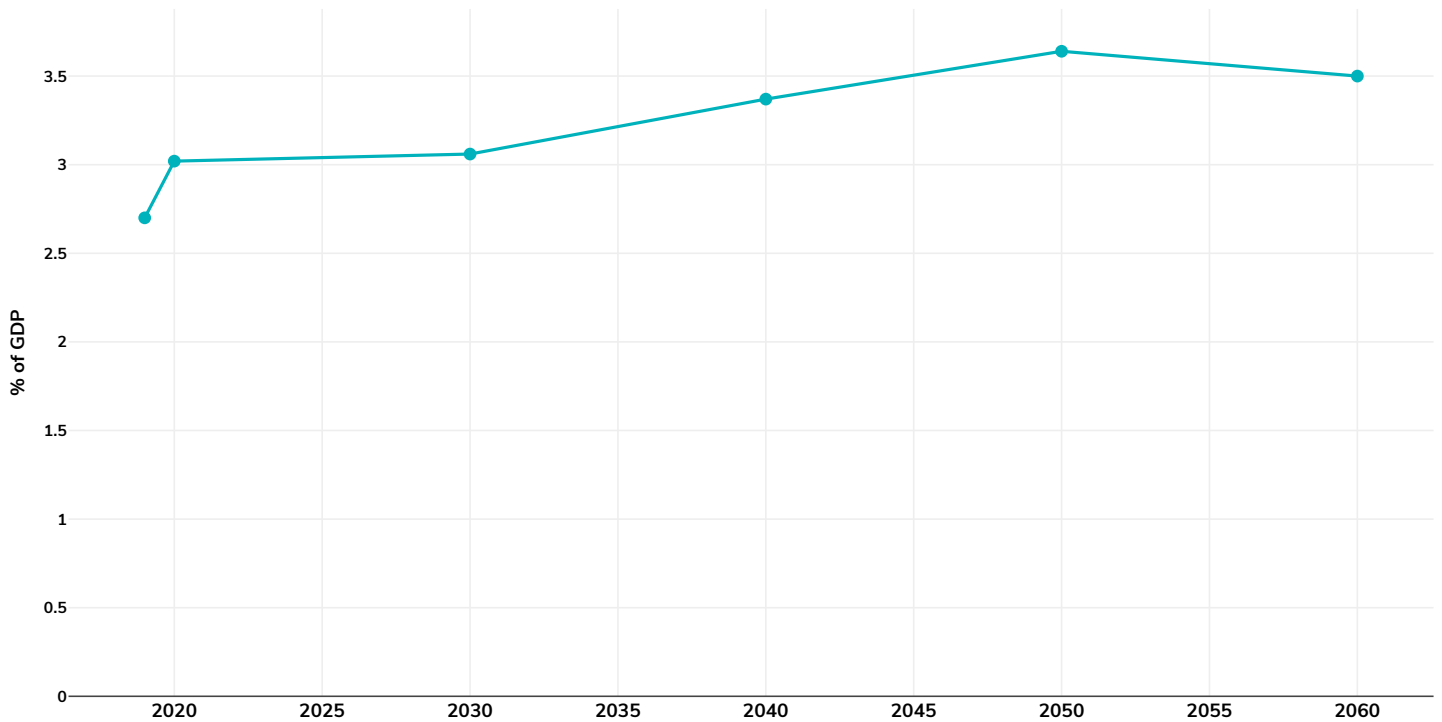

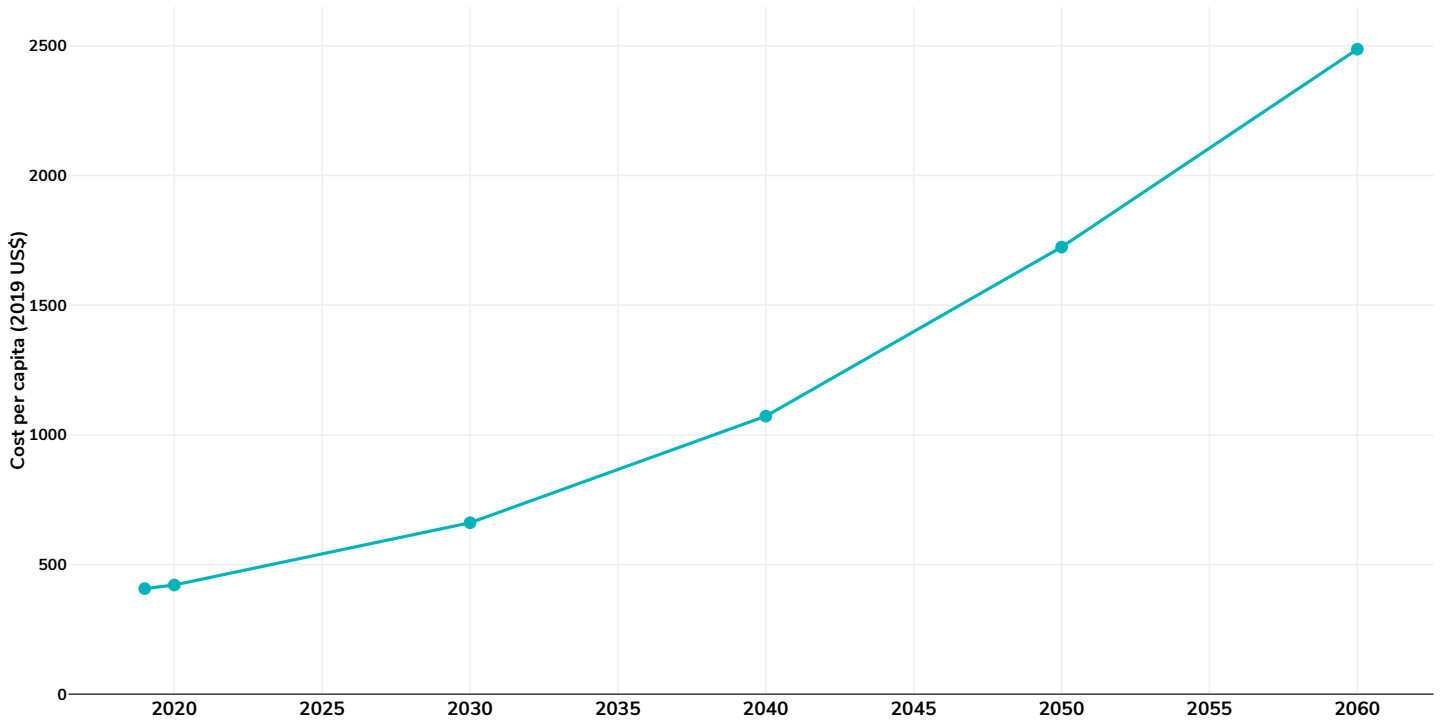
Total economic cost (in billions of 2019 US\$)
