The 4-H year starts with Youth for the Quality Care of Animals training. Since Brody Ahrens, East Oaks 4-H Club member, wanted to show livestock at the Burt County Fair. He made the SMART goal to win the Showmanship class in 4 different species (beef, goat, pig, & sheep) by working with his animals EVERY DAY. Having never shown sheep or swine Brody had to work hard towards his goal learning a hard work ethic, determination, responsibility, & resiliency. Come fair time, Brody started winning all his Showmanship classes one by one, winning in the Senior Divisions in beef & goat.

### Programs At-A-Glance

- Adventure Day Camp: A multi-county summer day camp, where 30% of the campers are Burt Co. 4-H youth. Sessions include healthy living, survival skills, STEM, canoeing, and fun!
- School Enrichment: Beyond traditional 4-H, students at all Burt Co. schools have the chance to receive 4-H programs in class. An increase to 15 different programs in 23 classrooms.
