Programs At-A-Glance

- Next Chapter at Nebraska- Over 16 visits, 92% of Eustis-Farnam class of 2025 explored careers & colleges, financial aid, & application processes to transition after high school.
- 45 youth, ages 9-18, attended the 7th Annual Agronomy Youth Field Day, held on NE College of Technical Agriculture. Older youth reported a 291% increase in plant biology & anatomy knowledge.
