

What is a Profession?

Professions includes any work you do to make a living. The difference between a profession and a job is that a job is specific to what you do as a professional.

For example, being a dentist is a specific **job**, but dentist work in the medical **profession**. Medical (or medicine) is not itself a job. It describes the field of work. There are many different jobs in the medical field.

Discuss: What skills, education, training, and personality traits do each of those jobs require? Break into a small group and share what you've learned.








Activity: Exploring Your Profession


Think about your chosen profession. What skills are you going to need to have? And what will you need to do to develop those skills?
