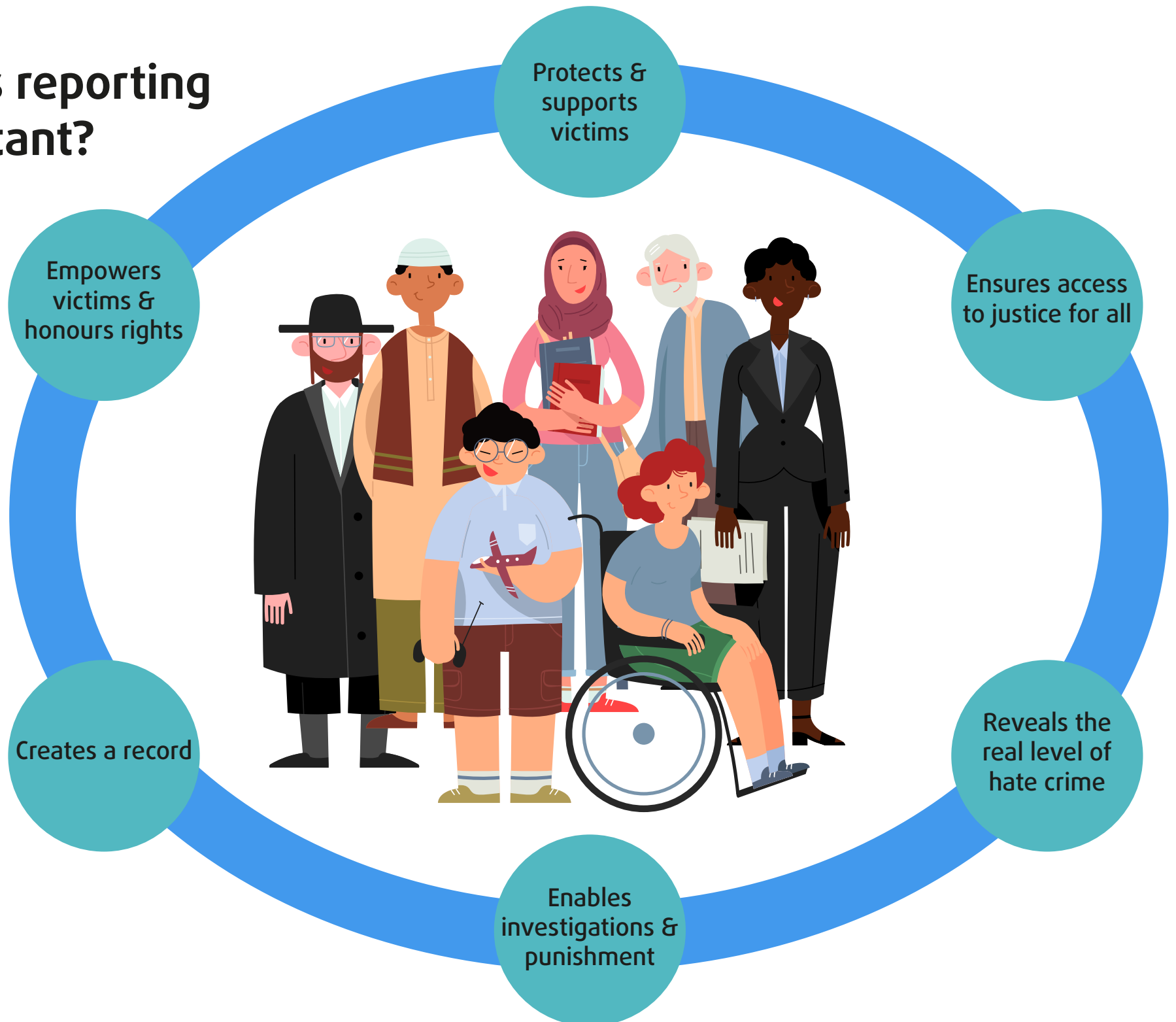




Reporting hate crime

- Combat discrimination & prejudice everywhere
- Publicly condemn hate crimes
- Raise rights awareness and empower victims & witnesses

What must change



Procedures

- Set up alternative ways of reporting & third-party reporting
- Improve capacities to recognise & record hate crime
- Refer victims to support services

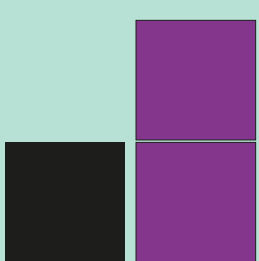


Law enforcement

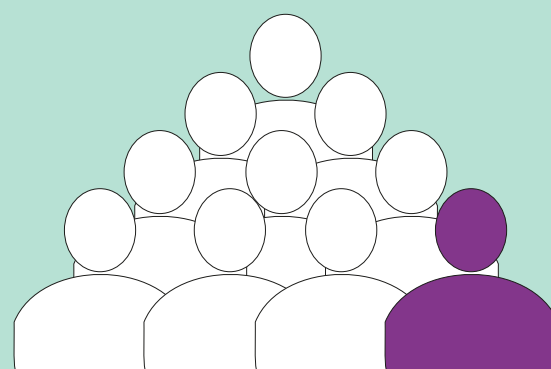
- Provide practical guidance & training to police officers
- Set up dedicated units investigating hate crime
- Cooperate closely with civil society & other organisations

Without reporting, hate crime remains hidden

Many experience violence because of racism & intolerance. It may be because of their skin colour due to their ethnic or immigration background. But it may also be due to their religion, sexual orientation or a disability.



Some groups experience **2x** as much violence as the general population.



Up to **9** in **10** do not report attacks anywhere. Most think nothing would change if they reported it, say it is too difficult to report or they do not trust the police.
