Inspiring practices from the Hub's Repository

Belgium

- An interministerial unit developed two action plans for 2021-2025 to address human trafficking and smuggling.
- Staff at reception centers are trained to detect signals and refer victims to specialized centres.
 Legal as well as medical and psychological support is also available.

The action plans were developed in an inclusive and participatory manner

Türkiye

- YIMER 157 is an emergency hotline for calls regarding human trafficking and migrant smuggling that is available 24/7.
- Support is available in 7 languages for a range of topics and a referral system alerts relevant law enforcement officers.

Services are also provided via social media, SMS, fax, and email

This can cause other migration-related phenomena to be wrongly perceived as transnational crimes, leading to confusion among various relevant actors and practitioners, violation of migrants' rights, and hindrance in effective criminal prosecution."
