Harry Potter and Voldemort, the two main characters of Harry Potter series presents a curious case of a child who is afraid of the dark and a man who is afraid of light. Harry, who is only 11, when he embarks upon his new journey to the wizarding world of Hogwarts, is afraid of every little thing he comes across. He is afraid of the person who claims to

be his friend - Hagrid, his visit to the wand shop and even the station which was to take him to his destination. His fear, his stint of curiosity is all because of his unawareness of the world - the world which is dark to him, evil enough to kill his parents.

On the other hand, is a man who is responsible for making his darkness, the general awareness of a child about the world, even more darker, Valdemort. He was a great magician in his early days but wanted to use his abilities to become invincible. He didn't stop in his endeavour even when his teachers - Dumbledore and others tried to show him the light - the right path. "Light is divine"


