The public servant's ethical decision making

\* Rule of law and rules of procedure

→ whatever his actions, it will be within the defined laws and rules. He will not cross rules to do from ethical way.

\* Influence of seniors and working culture

→ whether he will be punished for going out of the way. It might lead to risk aversion and status quoism.

- \* Personal values and personal code of conduct: Whenever he believes in integrity, equality, democratic decision making, will impact his decision.
  - \* Future result of his action: will his action result in problem in future due to accountability mechanism.  
We see open in value neutral bureaucracy civil servants become pedantic and ~~gullible~~ become end in themselves defeating the whole purpose of public service.
- There is a need to include ethical and emotional aptitude and move towards a positive notion of developmental bureaucracy.

Ethics relates to the study of moral standards of right and wrong and what is the best action to take.


Peter Steward said "Ethics is knowing the difference between what you have right to do vs. what is the right thing to do."



- Emotional components will help us understand other person and take appropriate ethical behavior. ➤ telling lie to a suicidal person is not wrong if it is to save his/her life.




"Leaders are the one who ~~says~~ knows the way, ~~and~~ of the way and shows the way."

## Disadvantages

- It will establish them as a vested interest. This can cause problem in future.
- Hindrance to development of signific temperament as directed fundamental duties.
- May lead to blinding trust between administration and people and faith leaders will become permanent intermediaries.

## 2 (c) Other options for breaking behavioral bias
