returns with four weekends of magical holiday cheer; and a family of five Shelia Rogers' Eco Christmas Trees!

... and yes, the beautiful 20' fresh-cut, lighted fir tree which began this seasonal celebration will be back, donated again by board member Joyce Barnette. This centerpiece in the Rose Garden has found its way into many family photo memories, along with Santa, hayrides, petting zoo, several smaller themed trees in exhibits, and lighting displays growing each year.

Internationally-known environmental artist Shelia Rogers brings back our second Holly-Days symbol and recycling masterpiece, "Eco Christmas Tree", created last year and recycled for 2023; and with it four smaller plastic bottle trees of different sizes! Originally funded by a City of Corpus Christi Arts & Cultural Commission grant, the Eco Christmas Tree family will anchor "Emerald Forest" in the Plumeria Garden, empty for winter.
















SHELIA ROGERS' Eco Christmas Tree now a family of five for HOLLY-DAYS!

Fine art photographer and mixed media environmental artist Shelia Rogers gathered enough green plastic bottles over the year to create four more smaller trees, in addition to the 20' masterpiece constructed for 2022—making a bigger recycling statement for the Gulf Coast Capital!

Two new six-foot and two 10-foot trees make a family of five recycled green plastic bottle trees to fill the front half of the Plumeria Garden, empty for the winter while plumeria plants hibernate from the cold. All five are inwardly lit making a stunning photo opportunity after dark.

Earning her undergraduate degree at University of Texas, with post-graduate work in photography at Texas A&M-Corpus Christi, she also studied with artists in France, Hungary, India, Morocco, Russia, Spain, Washington, California, Santa Fe and New York.

"The heart of my work is environmental advocacy, seductively exposing the real and devasting effects of plastic pollution in the world's oceans," says Rogers. While raising awareness of this issue, she says, "Don't throw it away, use it another way!"



BIRDIEST FESTIVALINAMERICA! announces 2024 Keynote speaker!

Nationally-known birding and nature photography guide, author and owner of Avocet Birding Courses, will give the keynote address for Birdiest Festival in America April 26!

An avid birder for 30 years, Cameron's passion is teaching others about birds and nuances of bird identification. He is owner and instructor for Avocet Birding Courses; coauthor of *The Peterson Reference Guide to Seawatching* and forthcoming *North American Terns*, a Photographic Guide, as well as articles on shorebird and waterfowl identification.

Cameron did not discover his love of neotropical birding until his early 30s, now trying to make up for lost time with numerous trips to Costa Rica and an extended period counting migrating hawks at Canopy Tower in Panama. He, his wife and their small herd of dogs and cats split time between coastal Oregon and South Texas' Rio Grande Valley.

Tell the kids — HAY MAZE opens October 21 sponsored by Ocean Drive Garden Club, Botanical Gardens!

One hundred twenty bales of hay have arrived to build the third Hay Maze, with partner Ocean Drive Garden Club. After maze set-up, the Garden Club decorates elaborately for Halloween, then changes themes for the Christmas Holidays (*below*). Opening day is October 21.



Youngsters' sense of direction is challenged by the twists and turns, even though the maze is only one bale high, so parents can keep track of kids while inside. Lots of seasonal photo ops await.

This hay-mazing adventure is included in general admission. The Gardens is open 9 am to 6 pm daily, except Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Eve and Day.

Say "good night" to plumeria plants; "thank you" to Plumeria Society!

For one last look at this year's outstanding plumeria bloom, visit before Saturday, November 4, when the Plumeria Society of South Texas strips leaves, followed by green-housing for winter dormancy November 11. Some of this season's most beautiful blooms are shown here. November 18, the Holly-Days *Eco Christmas Tree collection* (see p 5) will begin assembly.



Education Station remodel includes new floors, paint, skirting!

Of the two modular buildings new in 2012, Education Station gets far more wear and tear than the Administration Building across the deck. Kids, rentals, camps, board meetings, school field trips, kids, kids, kids...left their mark on the tile flooring installed when built.

Thanks to grants from the Earl C. Sams Foundation and Port of Corpus Christi, Education Station now has the newest look in commercial grade grooved gray vinyl floor planks, new paint colors on all walls, new skirting outside and newly-

painted doors. Vinyl cushioned chairs remain in good condition. The Prentiss Butterfly Collection remains on the west wall of the classroom.

In progress is a 6-foot walkway from the new parking area around the building to the ADA ramp leading up to the deck, designed for field trip bus drop-offs.



Permanently surfacing the lower Oso Creek Loop Trail, accessed at the far end of the Wetland Awareness Boardwalk, is expected to begin after an anticipated December permit decision from the Texas State Historical Commission, following completion of an October archeologist survey.


Trail surfacing will meet ADA requirements, provide emergency access to lowland creek areas, better birding opportunity and trail walking for exercise, as well as keep it from grassing over and washing away after heavy rain.

The project was funded roughly three years ago by a Texas Parks & Wildlife Department grant, partially matched by City of Corpus Christi "Type B" funding with assistance from Mayor Paulette Guajardo.

The unexpected archeologist survey was required based on known Native American campsite activity along Oso Creek, and the burial ground east of Staples now owned by the Archeological Conservancy. During Covid, survey bids came in high, delaying project permitting.






