- Last year 233 birders sighted 268 species bringing our six-year total to 341 species.
- Festival host South Texas Botanical Gardens bird walk saw 92 species in three hours.



Elizabeth and Floyd McGown Charitable Fund, liquidating its assets, donates more than \$74,000 for generators, heaters; animal quarantine building, more!

Grant arranged through San Antonio Area Foundation

n time for January's hard freeze and potential power outage, a \$74,349 grant from the Elizabeth and Floyd McGown Charitable fund arrived to install natural gas generators for our Visitors Center, Orchid and Bromeliad Conservatories and Parrot Education facility! Power outages, winter or summer, are a threat to survival of our plant collections, parrots and reptiles. The generous donation, made through the San Antonio Area Foundation, also includes replacing old natural gas Bromeliad Conservatory heaters; installing a dropped ceiling in the Parrot facility to reduce summer heat buildup; and a small prefabricated animal quarantine building.

HDR Foundation awards \$10,000 grant for local company employees to help with favorite Botanical Gardens volunteer projects.

n September, HDR employee Angie Quiroga Torres, successfully submitted a \$10,000 request to the company-wide HDR Foundation set up to fund employee volunteer projects at nonprofits. The grant included framework for Shelia Rogers' four additional Holly Days Eco Christmas Trees, volunteering at Holly-Days; educational signage for Brennecke Nature Trail and Wetlands Awareness Boardwalk; tables/chairs sponsorship for 2024 Birdiest Festival in America.

HDR's Corpus Christi prior support includes *Moonlight in the* Gardens, pro bono engineering design services and furnishing our modular buildings when remodeling/expanding its offices! HDR is an international company with 225 offices and 12,000 employees.




