

Seventh BIRDIEST FESTIVAL in AMERICA April 24-28, draws birders from Alaska, Australia, Canada, Netherlands!

During Friday evening Keynote Speaker Cameron Cox's reception at April's *Birdiest Festival in America*, your editor chatted with several visiting birders snacking on gourmet sandwiches and sipping drinks. Amazingly vibrant after a day in the wild, they eagerly shared why they picked Corpus Christi with so many other festivals nation-wide, and some of their favorite experiences here. While some eat, sleep and dream birding, traveling to several cities yearly, others consider birding festivals a "vacation," just attending one or two!

Here are some of their comments:

"The name of your festival got me right away!" "We'd birded in Texas before, but not on the Gulf Coast." "Activities on the website were varied and intriguing." "I'd heard the amazing Cattle Tyrant story and wanted to see him!" "Everyone says Texans are friendly; and it's true. Made so many friends!" "We are beginners and saw experiences we'd feel comfortable with." "Figured it wouldn't be snowing like at home!" "Was happy to find several other single women to hang out with." "I really was fascinated by tombstones on the historic cemetery tour."





NUMBERS & BIRDS: Although 2024 registered birders were fewer than last year, they exceeded expectations in species sightings, beating 2023 counts!

FIVE-DAY FESTIVAL COUNT : Total Species Count was 274 during five-day festival, compared to 268 last year! **RARITIES:** Our famous *Cattle Tyrant*, a cooperative *Black Noddy*, and *Nuttings Flycatcher* on final day!

RIO GRANDE VALLEY pre-and post-trips (16 birders) counted 211 species, 16 not seen during five-day festival. **MEGA RARITIES:** Southern Lapwing, Mangrove Cuckoo; plus Muscovy Duck, Altamira Oriole, Chihuahuan Raven, Elf Owl.

Construction starts in June to make Oso Creek Loop Trail 10-feet wide with permanent surface, and American Disabilities Act (ADA) compliant. Improving lowland trail will open up new learning, exercise opportunities!

Even after money was awarded, it's taken nearly two years obtaining permits and approvals to begin long-awaited improvements to the Oso Creek Loop Trail wandering through the Botanical Gardens & Nature Center's lowlands along Oso Creek and large wetland.

Thanks to \$89,000 City of Corpus Christi 'Type B' funding, and a \$200,000 *Texas Parks & Wildlife Department* (TPWD) grant, the 4408-ft (.8 mile) walking trail lined with Mesquites will be cleared of grass, widened to 10 feet, based with recycled crushed concrete, covered with a liner, overlaid with decomposed crushed granite mixed with aggregate, and finally topped with a surface stabilizing seal. Low spots will be elevated with high areas leveled out for ADA compliancy.

The trail and end of the Wetland Awareness Boardwalk will meet at the same elevation for continuous access from the upland garden area walkways, along Brennecke Nature Trail, across the boardwalk, around Oso Loop Trail and back.

Extra rest benches will be added, with trails eventually distancemarked for exercise walking. The new trail surface will prevent extreme washout when Oso Creek overflows its banks in large rain events.

The project required TPWD approval through Texas Department of Transportation, ADA plan reviews and a surprise archeological review due to an Archeological Conservancy-owned burial ground further east along Oso Creek.

"This newly accessible environment will let guests experience acres of Botanical Gardens wildlife and plant life most haven't seen before, once there's improved walkability down to Oso Creek and large wetland," emphasized Executive Director Michael Womack.

"This new feature will be ideal for school field trips, camps, birding and adult exercise programs too," added Marketing Director MaryJane Crull.



Dr. DeWitt and Jane Harvey, founding members of now South Texas Botanical Gardens, also were leaders in Corpus Christi's medical, arts, gardening and wildlife conservation communities.

Children David DeWitt Harvey, Anne Lenore Harvey O'Shell and Thomas Bradner Harvey recently commissioned friend H.W. "Buddy" Tatum, Jr., former local artist now residing in New Braunfels, to create a life-sized bronze sculpture titled "Sandhill Cranes," installed near Gator Lake in May, and dedicated at a private memorial service June 2.

Thomas DeWitt Harvey (1930-2022) graduated from Texas Tech University and UT Medical Branch, Galveston, marrying Jane in 1955, joining the Navy in 1957 serving in Corona, CA, in 1961

becoming a long-time Family Practice physician at Thomas Spann Clinic.

Jane Bradner Harvey (1932-2018) attended UT-Austin, earning her Bachelors in Education at Mills College, Oakland, CA, teaching in Alameda. She got a Master's in Interdisciplinary Studies at now Texas A&M-Corpus Christi, worked in real estate, enjoying tennis, hiking, running and skiing at their Taos, NM vacation home.

The Botanical Gardens is fortunate to cherish Jane and DeWitt as part of its past, and be gifted this striking sculpture for its future!
