OFSAA Executive Director's Message



The formation of sport schools, sport academies and schools offering "prep" preparatory programs is on the rise in Ontario. On the surface, these programs are offered under the premise that student-athletes and families are looking to combine sport skill development in conjunction with academics. Promises of exposure to post secondary athletic opportunities have enticed students to transfer to

high schools offering these programs, but at what cost to the student-athletes and high schools involved?

At the core of OFSAA and school sport philosophy is student participation. Many studies have proven that students who are involved in co-curricular activities during high school have improved community representation, fitness, improved academics, social relationships, and leadership skills; just to name a few. Currently there are approximately 200,000 student-athletes and over 20,000 volunteer coaches participating in high school sport each year in Ontario. The majority of whom share stories of enjoyment, self-improvement, and lifelong personal development.

In recent years, member associations of OFSAA have adopted regulations to address the impact of prep programs in the province and to serve student-athletes who do not participate on prep teams or programs. The goal- to level the playing field and provide fair competition within school sport across the province.

There are some who will claim that the quality of skill at OFSAA championships and festivals has diminished yet others will argue that the growth of prep programs has given students- who may not have had that opportunity in the past- the opportunity to participate.

The question remains, what does the future hold? Within the United States and Canada many state and provincial high school athletic associations are dealing with this same issue, at an increasing rate, and with varying results. Some have drawn a clear line in the sand and do not allow high school programs to compete against prep programs during the school year, while others are finding ways, through policy, for the two to coexist.

In the January 2023 edition of the OFSAA Bulletin, OFSAA president Carolyn Chesney, addressed a new OFSAA five-year strategic plan. A new forward-thinking mission statement has evolved for the plan which reads: "To enrich all individuals in the school community by providing opportunities for overall health, personal growth, and education through school sport."

As OFSAA continues to address the rise of prep programs, it is crucial as an organization to keep in mind the impact they have on student-athletes, coaches, and the schools we serve. OFSAA will continue to explore avenues and opportunities that will lead to increased participation for the entire school community.




Items of interest which arose from April's OFSAA Annual Meeting:


ALTIS Coaching Education Professional Development Course Available





The OFSAA Experience

Submitted By The Marathon Falcons



If you want to know how big Ontario is, just ask the Marathon High School Falcons. The Falcons became the first girls' team from Marathon in 33 years to qualify for the OFSAA volleyball championship by traveling to the NWOSSA Championships in Rainy River in February. The drive to Rainy River runs 720 km west of Marathon and ends at a community nestled beautifully beside the Manitoba/Minnesota border. The Falcons prevailed at NWOSSA and this victory left the Falcons 1900 km from Welland, ON and the OFSAA finals. It is no exaggeration to say that our volleyball team traveled the length of Ontario and between two time zones in order to live out our OFSAA experience.

It's true that Ontario is a huge province and Marathon often feels a long way from everything. Our hometown of 3000 people is at the top of Lake Superior in the middle of the boreal forest- an hour from the nearest town and three hours from the nearest city. In lots of ways, we are remote and the Covid shutdowns made us feel even more isolated. This isolation made our team's dream of making OFSAA even more important to us- not only was it a chance to prove we could play- it was a chance to get away!

Aside from geography, the Falcons also had history against us. No team from Marathon has been to an OFSAA volleyball championship in 33 years. This year's team decided in grade 9 that we were going to change that fact. As a group we committed ourselves to working hard and building our skills. When the Covid shutdowns came we got creative, playing in an abandoned yard beside our local church and rigging up a net in our old community hall which we lovingly called our



'hobo net'. It wasn't always pretty, but we were a team with a dream!

With all this in mind, you can imagine how excited we were when we qualified for OFSAA. We were even more excited when the community rallied behind us and raised the \$20,000 it was going to cost to rent a bus and drive down to Welland. There is no coach bus service to or from Marathon and for most of us it was the first time taking a team bus. We rolled out of Marathon in the pitch black

at 5am along the shores of Lake Superior and watched (or slept) until we drove out of the Canadian Shield and into the urban sprawl of southern Ontario. After 15 hours we were approaching Welland and most of our players were now as far south as they had ever been.

Our OFSAA experience would not have been as wonderful as it was without the hospitality of Ecole secondaire catholique Saint-Jean-de-Brebeuf. From the moment we stepped off the bus, the conveners and vendors took the time to welcome us and make sure that we felt at home. The conveners, Jason and Glen, made sure to talk with our players and make them feel comfortable. Jason also got us to the vendors at the school. It is a bit embarrassing, but the Falcons probably broke the all-time record for OFSAA merchandise purchased at one event! The hoodies and shirts are an important part of the experience and our whole team still wears our merch with pride.



After the Covid shutdowns of the last few years, it was also a new experience to get dressed up and attend the OFSAA banquet. The formality of the banquet really brought home the unique opportunity of an OFSAA championship. The venue in Welland was awesome and our team enjoyed getting to sit with other teams (thank you Woodstock HS!) and to dress up for the night.

One of our biggest challenges in playing at OFSAA was the venue. We have never played outside of a small gymnasium and when we walked into the Canada Games Centre for our first match, we were more than a little freaked out. The formality of a pre-game national anthem, the enormously high ceiling, and the space around the court were all new to us. When we moved to ECS St-Jean-de-Brebeuf there were also announcers! One of the great souvenirs from our trip is the chance to hear our team talked about on the school broadcast. The other thing that was new was the quality of the other teams! It was amazing to share the court with teams as talented as those at OFSAA. We did not win many matches (only one!) but we played our best and really got to see what it takes to succeed at the next level.

We played our last game on Tuesday evening and lost 3-0 despite playing our best. It is funny how sports isn't always



about wins and losses. For many of our seniors, this was the last competitive volleyball game they were ever going to play. On the scoreboard we had lost our last game, but as we gathered our things and thanked the organizers, each of us knew that we had won more than we had lost. Our team did something remarkable and we had learned that hard work can lead to some pretty amazing places. OFSAA provided a space for a little team from Northwestern Ontario to compete at a provincial level. Our hosts at ECS St.-Jean-de-Brebeuf had made us feel welcome and treated us like professional athletes. Our school community had made us feel loved and supported. When our players look back on their high school experience, they are sure to think of this OFSAA trip first.

When asked to reflect on our OFSAA experience, our team was quick to acknowledge all the support it takes for small, remote schools to attend. The Falcons would not have been in Welland without the fundraising of our parents, the time put in by our coaches, and the support of our school community. But none of that would have mattered if OFSAA did not provide an opportunity for athletes to come together and celebrate. There are undoubtedly schools who go to OFSAA almost every year and it might not seem like a big deal to them. Maybe the Falcons are a reminder that OFSAA remains a dream and goal for many teams. It had been 33 years since the Falcons traveled to OFSAA- after such an amazing experience we don't plan on waiting that long again!

Para Sport . . . Wheelchair Basketball A Special Try Day Program in which students learn much more than a new sport



A Try Day grant has led to an amazing opportunity for equity and inclusion for high school students in Ottawa and the surrounding areas.

Pre-pandemic, John McCrae Secondary School applied for the Try Day grant to introduce wheelchair basketball to their physical education classes. They partnered with Emily Glossop of Abilities Centre Ottawa who runs an incredible para sport program and the classes learned about para sports and inclusivity, and got to try wheelchair basketball, a sport which they loved.

This led to the idea of creating a mixed ability wheelchair basketball tournament for high schools in Ottawa. Students with and without disabilities play together and compete for their high school team. All of the high schools playing in the tournament have had a para sport day with Abilities Centre Ottawa which included an education session on para sport and the opportunity to play wheelchair basketball.









Assisted by the athletic leadership class at John McCrae, the tournament was designed with the goals of fostering an environment of inclusivity in sport, reducing stigma and increasing awareness. Students with a disability participate on a team with their peers, leading to increased participation, confidence and inclusion beyond the tournament itself. This event heightened the other students' awareness about disability and the barriers their classmates with a disability face, reduced stigma, and fostered a community of inclusion within the school. Educators gained a better understanding of how they can offer variations to participation within their class curriculum to meet the needs of students with a disability. Coaches selected diverse and inclusive teams to compete in the tournament on behalf of their schools.

Carleton University has been an excellent partner and the



tournament takes place in their Ravens Nest gym. Last year the tournament had eight teams. This year it took place on May 3 and was expanded to include twelve teams with a school even traveling from Arnprior to join. All of the teams that participated in the tournament are getting free tickets to attend an International game at the Ravens Nest to watch Canada's Men's National Wheelchair Team take on the Netherlands team on May 18th.

The John McCrae leadership students partnered with Abilities Centre Ottawa, Wheelchair Basketball Canada, Ottawa Carleton Wheelchair Sports Association and the NCSSAA to make this successful tournament come to life.

Code Of Conduct For Spectators For OFSAA Events

Any OFSAA event must attempt to achieve a standard of organizational and educational excellence which will serve to place it beyond reproach in either area. OFSAA is committed to providing a safe and inclusive environment that is free of discrimination and harassment. Everyone is welcome and should expect to help promote an environment where people are treated in a courteous, professional, considerate and respectful manner by all spectators, staff and participants.

The following points address conduct that is inconsistent with OFSAA's mission, goals and values and detracts from the overall OFSAA experience and is prohibited at all OFSAA events:

- Behaviour that is unruly, disruptive, threatening or violent in nature, including verbal or physical harassment of officials, student-athletes, teacher-coaches, staff or other spectators
- Conduct that is illegal
- Conduct that results in damage to the facility or other personal property
- Displaying signs, symbols, images (including those associated with hate based organizations), using language or making gestures that are threatening, abusive, or discriminatory, including on the basis of race, ethnicity, national origin, religion, gender, gender identity, ability, and/or sexual orientation
- Interfering with the competition, including; entering the field of play, throwing objects of any kind, incidents of distraction (e.g. artificial noisemakers, noise during a serve or foul shot, etc.)

- Throwing objects of any kind, or entering the field of play
- Failing to follow requests from staff regarding event operations, policies and emergency response procedures
- Consumption or being under the influence of any alcoholic beverage or drugs, other than medication prescribed by a medical doctor, whether of legal age or not, at any time during an OFSAA event
- Any disruptive, harmful or disorderly behaviour or any act which, in the opinion of the convenor or OFSAA representative, presents a risk to the safety of other individuals, interferes with the competition or otherwise targets other spectators or other spectators enjoyment of the competition.



International Aquatic and Training Centre to participate in this year's event that was hosted by SWOSSAA.

Convenor Danielle Parent and her incredible committee did a fantastic job hosting the event, in large part because of the number of well-organized student volunteers and community swimming officials who helped over the two days. To put it into perspective, this annual swimming championship is believed to be the second-largest in the world. The Annual Southwest

Ohio Swimming Officials Association High School Invitational in Cincinnati hosts 2,450 swimmers.

As in past years, live streaming has been critical in bringing the event to individuals who could not otherwise attend the championship. This year there were a total of 6918 viewer signins equalling a total of 39,350 viewing sessions. This allowed people from 52 countries to watch student-athletes compete.

At the pre-championship Coaches Meeting, the OFSAA Leadership in School Sport Award was presented to long-time teacher-coach and meet manager Ben Balkwill. The amount of work and effort that went into pre-meet organization was far greater than previous years because of the inability to use the time standard qualification method. Clearly Ben's love for swimming and his commitment to getting things exactly right reflects his dedication and he is a most deserving recipient of this prestigious award. Congratulations and thank you, Ben!




